

Dear Rabbi Silver:

I cannot tell you what pleasure you have given to me and to our entire community by your kind acceptance of the invitation to speak at the dinner next Sunday night, June 4th. I know how many engagements you have and that you must be extremely occupied after your recent return from abroad, which makes me appreciate your kindness all the more.

If you will let me know, either at my office at City Hall or at my home, 1524 N. 16th Street, on what train you will arrive, I will be on hand to meet you, and I will expect you to be my guest as long as you are in the city. Incidentally, if you could arrive here on Sunday morning we might be able to provide a pleasant day for you either at the shore or in the suburbs.

The campaign will last for a week and the meeting at which you are to speak will be the opening dinner. Your address will be followed by "collecting;" indeed we hope to get the major part of our effort that evening. The goal is a minimum of \$100,000., but we hope to do much better notwithstanding the terrible economic conditions in our city as elsewhere. The fund raised is to be divided in some proportion - not yet fixed - between the Joint Distribution Committee and the Jewish Agency for Palestine.

There is one suggestion I would like to make, and I know you will pardon my doing so. There are a large number in our community, involving some of our richest "prospects," who are (properly) hysterical about the German situation, but who have never affiliated themselves with the Palestine movement, and they, of course, are eager that the money shall go to meet the present emergency situation in Germany. While, as I have said, the Agency is to be one of the beneficiaries of the fund, and while of course Falesting is not to be minimized in the proceedings, nevertheless we would run the danger of losing considerable money if there were to be any marked insistence, upon Palestine being the "only" solution of the Jewish problem. What we have already persuaded our community is that the German and Balestine situations have, for the moment at least, become integrated, and that any money given to Balestine is a direct aid to the refugees from Germany on a humanitarian even apart from any other basis.

You have consistently stated that the young Jew should be discouraged from entering the crowded professions and instead, should learn to work with his hands. Your continual reference to the possibilities of Jewish youth in agriculture have touched a very responsive chord in me.

It is needless for me to tell you about The National Farm School which I have the honor of heading as President, as successor to the sainted Rabbi Joseph Krauskopf. The dream of Rabbi Krauskopf has become a reality after thirty-nine years, and this very day we are admitting ninety splendid young men to the institution which he founded, for the freshman class of 1935.

It has just come to my attention that you will address the Men"s Club of Temple Keneseth Israel, on Monday night, April 8th. It will give as a great deal of pleasare if you can arrange to spend Tuesday in Philadelphie 30 that you can yasit this splendid institution which is carrying out the plan of placing the Jew in agriculture. Of course, we will be very happy to have you address our student body, but my first thought is to have you come and see for yourseld the spleadid physical plant which we have, and meet the Faculty which is doing such a fine piece of constructing work.

This letter is being sent to you air mail, in the hope that it will reach you on Tuesday, and then you can reply in sufficient time to enable us to plan your visit to the School as our guest.

My dear Rabbi Silver:

I have been requested by the members of the staff of The Jewish World, to write to you in their behalf this letter, which, at length, will fully explain the entire matter.

An outstanding event, unique in the annals of American Jewish Journalism will take place on Tuesday, June 14, 1938, Flag Day. On that day the Jewish Community of Philadelphia will celebrate the 24th Anniversary of the Jewish World, Philadelphia's only Jewish daily. It will also mark the completion of three years since the Jewish World terminated its status as a private enterprise and became in the fullest sense of the word a cooperative undertaking.

Incidentally, the present year also marks another great event in the life of the Jewish Community. It was in the year of 1888, just 50 years ago that the first Jewish immigrants from Eastern European Lands began to arrive in large numbers to the hospitable shores of America. Many of them in those early days, found a haven of refuge within the confines of the City of Brotherly Love. Here for the first time they experienced a realization of the GOD GIVEN RIGHT OF LIFE, LIBERTY, AND THE PURSUIT OF HAPPINESS, thus under these happy auspices, they were the forerunners of what is today the third largest community in the United States.

Like all Jewish newspapers, it faces a terrific struggle for existence, but it carries on courageously, and at great self-sacrifice on the part of the men, in order that a tried and true Jewish spokesman, so sorely needed now, may continue to serve the needs of the Jewish people here and abroad.
