



My dear Rabbi Silver:

Since our return from the National Conference in Philadelphia, there has been considerable interest shown in having you come over to Pittsburgh and repeat your lecture which you gave at the National Conference. Dear Rabbi Silver:-

May we ask your help in the following master?

For several years past, we have been trying to organize opinion in Pittsburgh on behalf of the Hebrew University. Dr. Hegnes was very warmly received there on his last visit to America, and from time to time, efforts have been made to capitalize on the general interest which exists among a number of good people there. Unfortunately, apparently for lack of real leadership, nothing has ever been done in Pittsburgh for the University, and with the exception of a few isolated persons (really outside of the Rosenbloom family and a few people who are members of a Society of Friends of the Hebrew University, I can think of nobody), the University has never enjoyed the support which it certainly deserves in that large Jewish community.

Now another attempt is to be made in the same direction. Mr. Lewis M. Alpern, an attorney, (529 Union Trust Building), has been one of the most active friends of the University there. He writes us that at a meeting held early in November, at the Study of Rabbi B.A. Lichter, of the B'Nai Israel Congregation, President of the Pittsburgh Zionist District, it was decided to attempt to raise special funds for the University through two lectures, the proceeds of which they hope to donate to the Hebrew University. At this meeting, a representation of the Zionist District, the Pittsburgh Chapter of Hadassah, the Junior Hadassah, and the small group known as the Friends of the Hebrew University, were present.

They are very anxious to have you deliver a lecture in Pittsburgh, preferably early in January, or possibly in February. They wish to have the lecture --and they hope to have Dr. Wise for another one -- at the Carnegie Music Hall, the largest and finest hall of

its kind in Pittsburgh. It is their purpose to devote the entire proceeds, above the actual cost of the hall and the printing and distribution of the tickets, to the Hebrew University.

Would you let us know, or write Mr. Alpern directly, whether you can accept this invitation? It was our thought you might find it possible to go to Pittsburgh on one of your tours of the country. I em sure, however, that if it would necessitate your making a special visit there, the group would of course take care of your expenses. If you find the date suggested out of the question, could you let us know when it would be possible for you to cooperate in this way? The Pittsburgh people seem to feel that your presence and the address that you would give would be sufficient not only to draw an immense audience, but to make that sudience part of the regular support so badly needed by the University.

We hope that we may have your favorable reply.

A further word about the subject of your address here next Sunday night. Regardless of the title of the address I wonder if you would be good enough to discuss the value of institutions like the Y. M. H. A. and Jewish Centers and their place in future Jewish communal life.

One of the real problems confronting us, and I understand this is true in practically every large Jewish community, is the veering off of our young people into radical movements and away from things Jewish. As you know there are any number of apparently conservative organizations with extreme radical leadership who are making every effort to bore from within. Radical leaders in youth movements receive an eager hearing and are creating a state of affairs which ultimately will work serious harm to the Jews of America; at least this is my feeling. A discussion of the problem and a warning to our young people coming from one of America's outstanding spiritual leaders would be extremely valuable at this time. If you can do this without running counter to your own convictions in the matter, I hope you will consider it.

If none of the above suggestions is satisfactory use your own judgment as to the text and form of your address. We are all looking forward to having you with us again.
