In connection with your appearance here, we are planning a dinner at a local hotel which will take place about 6 P.M. and at which time several of our leading citizens will be present. It has been suggested that in connection with this dinner there is a possibility of securing about 15 minutes on a local radio station for the purpose of a brief discussion in connection with the subject upon which you will speak. This broadcast will be carried through an Albany station. I am interested to know whether you will have any objections in entering into such a discussion. Incidentally, we have tentatively secured Dr. James Laurence Meader, president of the local Russell Sage College to act as chairman of the evening. Concerning the subject you plan to discuss, I have spoken with several members of our committee including Rabbi Alan S. Green, and it is felt that the subject should basically include a philosphy that could sustain Jewry in its present crisis and that it should also appeal to the general community by indicating how the philosphy, expounded by you, applys to the general scene. I would, therefore, like to know whether you would approve of the following title, "An American Jew Faces the World Crisis." Should you have any other suggestion in this regard, I shall appreciate it.
