

The available dates are Monday evenings, January 14 and 28, February 25 and March 11. Whichever of these dates is most satisfactory to you can be worked out.



Dear Dr. Silver:

On Sunday evening, January 25, 1959, a community-wide observance will be held in Washington, in the form of a Dinner. marking the 20th Anniversary of our Jewish Community Council. The Dinner program will include participation by outstanding non-Jewish leaders like the President of the D. C. Board of Commissioners; the Chancellor of the Catholic Archdiocese; the President of our Council of Churches, the Superintendent of our Public Schools, and others. This will be a community-wide event of considerable importance, and will attract wide attention in the nation's capital.

I write on behalf of our planning committee to ask you to be with us on January 25, and to deliver the principal address at this 20th anniversary celebration. We urge you most respectfully to accept this invitation because of the public significance of this event, and because we believe that are the one person in America's Jewish community who can deliver the kind of message required by such an occasion at this juncture in American Jewish history. Our desire is not for a discourse on the Jewish Community Council, but rather for a broad-gauged address on the basic philosophical principles which are embodied in the work and existence of a council like ours.

Broadly speaking, our Council's program has a dual focus: (1) The fostering of meaningful, creative Jewish religious and cultural life; (2) The uninhibited participation and integration of American Jews in the life of America. This is reflected in the following major aspects of our Council's work:

> The Council performs the functions of a Bureau of Jewish Education, and fosters adult Jewish religious and cultural programming.

- b. The Council is the Jewish community's instrumentality for Community Relations and Intergroup Relations work.
- c. As part of our Community Relations program, we work on interpreting to the non-Jewish community the significance of the rebirth of Israel, and on combatting Arab hate propaganda.
- d. The Council (together with the Rabbis) conducts the Jewish religious and cultural television programs (about 90 each year) on free time given us by the TV stations on a cooperative time-sharing arrangement together with the Protestant and Catholic communities.
- e. We attempt to deal with problems of community planning, and conduct studies like our Jewish Population Survey of last year, a copy of which is being mailed to you under separate cover.

You can therefore readily see how the fostering of Jewish religious and cultural values, including love of Zion, together with the fostering of understanding and cooperation with our Christian neighbors in the general civic area, are intimately interwoven in this Council's philosophy and work. That our Council structure is of a representative, democratic character, is a further indication of the degree to which this dual philosophy is a composite, voluntary expression of the diversity of views present in our midst.

We feel that an address devoted to this dual focus in American Jewish life, and to its consistency with Jewish ideals and aspirations on the one hand, and with the best traditions in American democracy on the other, would be a valuable contribution at this time; and we are convinced that you are the person who can do it most effectively. We believe it to be particularly important that this be done by you, precisely because this is the nation's capital.

We hope that you will be able to say yes. I shall take the liberty of phoning you this Friday, so that I may be able to discuss this with you, and answer any questions you may have.






