
Dear Rabbi Silver:

Dear Dr. Silver:

All of us affiliated with the Synagogue Men's Club are pleased by your acceptance of a speaking engagement in Wichita. I thought you might like a brief description of the crowd we expect and some other other pertinent information.

First, the auditorium of the University of Wichita, seating 1,500, has been secured for a talk at 8:30 in the evening. Second, the audience will, of course, be adult and composed of basically three segments: members of the Jewish community, faculty and students of both universities, and clergymen. There will, of course, be others, too, but principally those three major groups.

Both daily newspapers here are carrying the first announcement of the event today, copies of which I will send later.

We have endless opportunity for the creation of public understanding here through your appearance -- the exact nature of which will depend on your pleasure. Television and radio time will be available, and if you want to appear on either of those media I will be glad to arrange it.

The Wichita Beacon has asked that you be guest editor April 7th. Since this would entail only the writing of 300 to 400 words, I hope you will be able to do this for us. The customary way this is handled is for the guest editor to write the editorial for Page One ahead of his appearance. If you can mail something of this nature to me, enclosing with it a photograph of yourself at a typewriter or dictating to your secretary, I will take care of the details here.

One other thing: I need to know as soon as possible the subject of your lecture.

From "On the Theshold of the Fourth Century"

The coming age will be a great age for America. The next hundred years at least seem likely to be known, I believe, as the "American Century," in the same sense as the 19th century was "The Century of Great Britain." Destiny has singled out our beloved country, the foremost democracy on earth, to give leadership to the world and to lead mankind out of the grave, social, political and economic predicament in which it finds itself. I believe that American leadership will prove itself equal to the challenge, if it will take counsel of faith and not of fear, and if it will be guided by the prophetic insights and the wide perspectives of the Founding Fathers of this Republic.

America will lead in finding the way. The way is not that of a global armament race which will impoverish the peoples of the earth - ourselves included - and end as such races always end - in the catastrophe of war. The way is rather that of conference, of courageous diplomacy, of giving urgent leadership in the United Nations to a program of speedy and balanced reduction of armament and the extension of help to the backward peoples of the earth.

To this kind of leadership the world will respond; a leadership which does not wait on the occasion but makes it, which is prepared to take calculated risks for peace, which is eager for negotiation and conference to settle all issues which endanger the peace of the world; a leadership which exerts sincere and unremitting pressure for limitation of armaments and the lifting of the crushing military burdens from the backs of the peoples of the earth; a leadership which aggressively plans for world-wide cooperation to help and guide the backward and impoverished peoples to higher levels of agricultural and industrial development, of well-being, health and page 2

education; a leadership which seeks the liberation of all dominated, colonial peoples and extends friendly help to them in adjusting themselves to their new way of life. This kind of leadership, which is not dictation, which is not imposed by our wealth and power, which is not enmeshed and hampered by commitments to the imperial interests of colonial empires and which flows naturally from the head-waters of our great liberal traditions and history, is sure to re-kindle the hopes of the world.
