#### Dear Rabbi Silver:

Continuing a series of successful bi-annual national institutes the National Conference of Jews and Christians will consider at the Williamstown Institute of Human Relations a theme of compelling and urgent interest to Americans: "Citizenship and Religion: A Consideration of American Policy with Regard to the Relations of Church and State."

There will be six evening and five morning sessions on important aspects of this topic, each with a Jewish, Catholic and Protestant speaker. I extend to you a very hearty invitation to speak at an evening meeting on Friday, September 1st, at 7:30 p.m., on the subject "Can the United States Have Cultural Diversity and National Unity?" You would represent the Jewish position. The program assigns about twenty-five minutes for each of the three presentations, which means, of course, that only the most important aspects can be presented.

The National Conference will pay your travel expenses to and from Williamstown, Massachusetts, and your living while there. It will also publish a report of the Institute. We are asking all speakers to prepare their papers in preliminary form at least, by June 1, 1939, and to furnish us with a copy.

I earnestly hope you will want to participate. You will be rendering a real service to one of the most important of causes. The Williamstown Institute in previous years has been very well attended. It has secured wide publicity. Our preliminary study indicates that the 1939 topic will be a particularly timely one.
