Dear Dr. Silver:

I met you with Dr. Artman at the Religious Education Association at Cleveland.

I am asking you if you will come to Winnetka for the evening of February eighteenth or twenty-fifth and give an address which would be the second in a series of three addresses we are planning.

The first lecture is on "The Spirit of Village Life." We are asking Dr. Chase of the University of Illinois to give this. We want him to deal with all the elements that should be guarded and also if possible to look to the future.

The second, the one we wish you to give. is "Organizing the Community Around the Child." There has been no outstanding pronouncement on this theme as far as I know. The state was once the center around which life was organized but now we are more and more thinking of the child as this center.

The third evening will be a glance back at early ideals and traditions of our village life and a look into the future. Three local men will approach this from the social, educational and religious aspects.

We are a suburb on the north shore of Chicago, organized as a village. Some of us are anxious that the life of this village which has been unique in many ways should not be overwhelmed by the ever approaching city. We do want to look ahead and if possible give direction to the development of our community life. We want to keep what is best and discard the things which ought to be discarded. We are not satisfied just to drift into what we may become.

The Board of Governors of Community House feel that this is a service which we ought to render to our community. So we, believing you can interpret the meaning of community life organized around the child, want you for this very significant piece of service.
