

Dear Rabbi Silver:--

Thanks for the program of the Anniversary of the New York Temple. I have read it carefully, and note that their augmented choir is almost exactly the same size as our regular choir. I have already placed the chairs in our choir platform and find that we can accomodate two more sopranos, one more alto, and one more each of tenor and bass. Except for the temor I have the voices in mind, and will go ahead an get them lined up for January 24th.

I suggest that we consider Mr. Leonard Rose for the instrumentalist for the Sunday morning service. What do you think? On account of the orchestra season we should move a little in advance, so to be able to know where we stand if the orchestra should happen to be on tour for that date.

None of the choir numbers announced on the program you sent struck me as being particularly what we might want. Special settings of 'May the Words' while beautiful, do not seem to rise to the occasion, at least I am looking further at present. I hope to have a list for your consideration shortly.

I appreciate your note, for I am anxious that this occasion should have the best we can give it, and only by working on it steadily and talking it over can we hit upon what is wanted.

The Board of Trustees of The Temple announced that The Temple will celebrate the twenty-fifth anniversary of Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver's ministry with the congregation on January 23 and 24. A Committee has been appointed to plan the details of the celebration.

At Rabbi Silver's request, because of the war situation, the celebration will be limited to an anniversary religious service on Sunday morning, January 24, and to a children's service Saturday morning, January 23. Representatives of the community, and of the important national and international causes with which Rabbi Silver has been actively identified during his quarter of a century in Cleveland, will participate in the Sunday morning service.

The celebration has been delayed a few months in order that it might coincide with Rabbi Silver's fiftieth birthday anniversary, which will be on January 28.
