



## "-But the Most Wonderful of All Is Man"

Nothing man creates is as wonderful as himself.

—No skycraper, designed and ingeniously contrived to pierce its summit through the clouds,

—No bridge, sensitively balanced and yet stout enough to withstand the impact of immeasurable weight over rivers and valleys.

—No machine, intricately conceived, to catapult through the skies at hundreds of miles an hour thousands of feet above earth, or another fathoms under the seas.

Nothing, neither skyscraper, nor bridge, nor machine, is as wonderful as man himself.

Man is created, and then creates, and nothing man does in his life upon earth is as good, as exciting, as fascinating as that which man does with himself.

Out of a city of skyscrapers, bridges, and machines a city of brick, and steel, and mortar, came a thousand or more men and women to do honor to a man—to his works—to his life—to that which he had done for others, and to that into which he had fashioned himself.

It is good to travel, to see cities other than one's own, to see countries other than one's own, to see people from differing places living under differing circumstances and arising from differing origins and believing and practicing differing beliefs and outlowks.

It is good, too, to live in one's own community, there to see boys and girls become men and women, and men and women become good and great and bring stature, and prestige, and renown to themselves and their families and friends and community and country.

There to see the boy from impoverished home, and even poor marks at school, rise above disadvantage and handicap to become successful beyond the dreams of schoolmates of firmer claim to ultimate place and position among men.

The young rabbi, 24, brilliant but untried, black-haired and serious-browed, stepping from a train in 1917, in hectic, troubled years, to assume his place as spiritual guide for a great Temple—the guest of honor at this great outpouring of fellow-townsmen and the great from other places.

No one, even his most profound admirers, would have dared in those days, 35 years ago, to prophesy he not only would be the most famed of all rabbis, but the p-founder of Israel, homeland of the Jews after 2000 years of wandering the earth's surface without true sanctuary and home.

And yet, centered as it was, around Abba Hillel Silver to celebrate the coincidence of his 60th birthday and his 35th anniversary as rabbi of the Temple, there was something else—something which Rabbi Silver himself would find to be good.

In the thousand or more men and women gathered to pay him homage, were lawyers, architects, engineers, merchants, hankers, public leaders of city, state and nation—and yet, all of them, once small boys and girls, struggling to express themselves, indomitably lifting themselves to become good, and successful, and of purpose and meaning to others, and themselves.

The unforgettable day when Abba Hillel Silver came to town, and it fortunately fell to the lot of the man who writes these words, himself not yet 20, to interview this brilliant young rabbi lately from Wheeling—and from

that day henceforth to observe his weaving of bright threads to fashion that tapestry of world wide fame for which these people came to acclaim him.

Not easy, but difficult many times, and not always sure, but within his heart believing himself right, not always agreed with, but with singleness of purpose moving toward that to which his mind, and beart and spirit committed him.

Not only Abba Hillel Silver, though. The 1000 men and women themselves had many who, like Rabbi Silver, gut together the body, the mind, and the spirit which became theirs at birth, and made of it something worthwhile for themselves and for others.

The Slovenian immigrants' son, nearby at the speakers' table, who lifted himself from obscurity in the St. Clain E. 65th neighborhood to become the most fabulously popular figure in Ohlo's political history, and four times its governor.

And the diminutive son of the tall Dr T. A. Burke, who lived to see that son first become law director of Cleveland, and then mayor of his home community, and whose growing interest in law and government first fascinated the distinguished doctor father and then brought from him a price and enthusiasm for his small statured son which in itself was wonderful to behold.

And the little known Liwyer who became an assistant prosecutor, and whose brilliance attracted such wide attention it became irresistible that he be elevated to the common pleas bench, and thence to a lifetime appointment to the United States court, Charlie McNamee, whose shoolmates and triends again saw in him, in his home town, a man grow to be good and great.

These, only a few of the many great men and women in the great gathering—once boys and girls, like those at this moment everywhere in Greater Cleveland struggling with studies, disciplining minds, expanding interests, fixing purposes, lifting their sights, hoping, dreaming, sacrificing, and helping others, and growing stronger themselves.

Perhaps among them an Abba Hillel Silver, a Thomas A. Burke, a Frank J. Lausche, a Charles J. McNamee, a great industrialist, or lawyer, or painter, or musician, or architect, or engineer, or many others who will bring glory and credit to himself, or herself, and family, and friends, and fellow-townsmen, and country.

Place is not important: Goodness knows no place. Greatness comes from the hearts of men and women, wherever they are placed. One need not have a great banquet in his honor to be great. One may each day be "banqueted" by those from whom he earns respect and admiration by what he does, and the example he sets.

And many men and women who rarely are mentioned in the public prints, and yet quietly go forward in their own sometimes unrewarded ways, which they do not mind, are great and good beyond anything they think of for themselves.

They have all been created to create, to create of themselves that which God intended them to be, more wondrous than skyscraper, or bridge or machine—the most wonderful of all—good men and good women. —L. B. S.





#### DISCUSS WOMEN'S PARTICIPATION IN TERCENTENARY

A distinguished group of Jewish women leaders net December 10th, 1952, at the home of Mrs. Frederick M. Heimerdinger, in New York City, to consider the role of women in planning and organizing the Tercentenary observance.

There are at present 21 women on the Tercentenary Committee of 300, but it was agreed that the number should be enlarged in order to give greater expression to the activities of women in all fields of activity in America. The group also discussed the proposal that a separate Women's Committee be established, to assume responsibility for special women's activities in connection with the celebration. While a majority of those who attended the meeting favored the creation of such a committee, it was agreed to reconsider the question at a subsequent meeting.

Universal enthusiasm for the forthcoming celebration was reported, and a number of national women's organizations have already begun to plan for participation in the mationwide observance.

Present at the meeting called by Mrs. Heimerdinger were Mrs. Sidney C. Borg, Mrs. Henry H. Elias, Mrs. Irving M. Engel, Miss Hannah Goldberg, Mrs. Isauc

Gilman, Mrs. H. B. Levine, Mrs. David M. Levy, and Judge Justine Wise Polier. Ralph E. Samuel, chairman of the Tercentenary Committee, and David Bernstein, executive director, were also present.

#### LOS ANGELES TO CELEBRATE BOTH CENTENNIAL AND TERCENTENARY IN 1954

The 100th anniversary of the Jewish community of Los Angeles will be celebrated in 1954, as part of the city's participation in the nationwide celebration of the Jewish Tercentenary in America. The Los Angeles Jewish Community Council has established a subcommittee, under the chairmanship of Justin Turner, to handle the local observance.

The resolution adopted by the Jewish Community Council at its eighteenth annual meeting early in 1952 follows:

"Whereas, there has been established on the national leval a committee for celebrating the 300th anniversary of the Jewish community in America, to be observed in 1954; and

"Whereas, the year 1954 will also represent the 100th anniversary of the Jewish community of Los Angeles, now, therefore, be it

"RESOLVED, that the 18th Annual Meeting of the Los Angelss Jewish Community Council call upon the Community Council to establish a committee to cooperate with the national celebration and to plan for a local observance commensurate with the importance of the occasion."

#### COMMITTEE OF 300 REFLECTS ENTIRE AMERICAN JEWISH COMMUNITY

The complete list of members of the Tercentenary Committee of 300, overall governing body of the celebration of the 300th anniversary of Jewish settlement in the United States, was recently made public. Prominent Jewish leaders from 41 states, the District of Columbia and the Virgin Islands, have accepted membership on invitation from Ralph E. Samuel, chairman, and Judge Simon H. Rifkind, chairman of the Membership Committee.

Judge Rifkind declared that his committee had sought to establish a membership which would reflect all significant viewpoints among American Jews today. "The observance in 1954," he said, "will provide an opportunity for all American Jews to express, in their own way, the meaning to them of this 300-year American heritage. For this reason, our membership is as broad and as diversified as the American Jewish community itself."

The Membership Committee consists of Judge Rifkind, Chairman, Mr. Samuel, ex officio; Mrs. Irving M. Engel, Dr. Israel Goldstein, Dr. D. de Sola Poul and Alan M. Stroock.

#### NATIONAL COUNCIL OF JEWISH WOMEN TO "COOPERATE WHOLFHEARTEDLY"

At a recent meeting of the National Board of the National Council of Jewish Women, the following resolution was adopted:

"WHEREAS, the three hundredth anniversary of the origin of the Jewish community in America will be observed in 1954, and the American Jewish Tercentemery Committee is preparing a fitting nationwide celebration to observe this Mistoric event, and

"WHEREAS, the National Council of Jewish Women believes that a nation is wise when its people bear in mind the lessons of its history; and that, in these trying times, Americans may draw renewed courage and vision from the recollection of the early struggles of our immigrant forebears on this beloved soil; and

"WHEREAS, the National Council of Jewish Wemen, grateful for the blessings of democracy, desires to recall to this nation what America has meant in opportunities for the Jews and for all who seek freedom and human dignity; and

"WHEREAS, the National Council of Jewish Women believes that Jews have shared in and made a contribution to the work of building an America where the accepted ideal is one of liberty, equality and dignity; and

"WHEREAS, the National Council of Jewish Women recognizes that our nation's hard-won freedom must be safeguarded and extended by our people today, with the same spirit of daring and perseverance which marked the efforts of early /mericans; and

"WHEREAS, the freedom, opportunities and civic responsibilities of American Jews today inspire hope in Jews all over the world who yearn to be free, and inspire in us the desire to see the light of freedom spread throughout the world:

"THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the National Council of Jewish Women cooperate wholeheartedly with the American Jewish Tercentenary Committee, and urge all of its 245 local Sections throughout the country to participate fully in the activities of the Tercentenary Celebration."

#### "IN THE MARCH OF THE HURLAN MIND IT IS IMPOSSIBLE TO RECEDE"

Benjamin Chew Heward (1791-1872) was a member of the Maryland House of Delegates, and later of the U.S. House of Representatives. He was one of the leaders in the struggle for Jewish emancipation in Maryland. Early in 1826, when the bill providing for civil rights for Jews in the State was enacted, he wrote victoriously to a Jewish friend, Solomon Etting of Baltimore. His letter has been called to the attention of the Tercentenary Committee by Dr. Jacob R. Marcus, who is Adolph S. Ochs Professor of Jewish History at the Hebrew Union College-

Jewish Institute of Religion and Director of the American Jewish Archives.

The Howard letter follows:

"Annapolis Jan. 5th, 1326

"Dear Sir

"The Jew Bill passed the House this morning, having previously passed the Senate — the Act of last session is therefore confirmed and I give you my hearty congratulations thereon — Tyson made a beautiful and able argument upon it — It was the best speech I ever heard him make. I held myself ready to reply to any one who might take the field against him but no one stepped forth in such a miserable cause. I thought it therefore unnecessary to come out — The stain upon the Constitution of Maryland is blotted out forever, for in the march of the human mind it is impossible to recede. Accept my sincere congratulations and believe me




