Mr. Chairman:

The signers of this letter are today no longer a group, working together, hoping together, sharing their thoughts and fighting as a team. But, two decades ago, they did work and fight as a team in one of the most critical periods in the history of our people. We all served on the American Zionist Emergency Council in the forties, and have actively participated in the long, and often desperate, battle for the establishment of the Jewish State.

Today, each of us is engaged in his own pursuits. What brought us together again is a desire to collectively pay tribute to the man under whose inspired and inspiring leadership we worked in those years: The man you honor tonight on the occasion of his seventieth birthday.

It has been said that a general is only as good as the army he commands. The reverse, we believe, is also true. Even the most formidable army would not go far, if commanded by an inept or short-sighted general. The army which fought the battle of the Jewish State on the American political scene - the Zionist movement and American Jewry as a whole - was an excellent fighting force: Disciplined, dedicated and unsparing in effort and sacrifice. Of no less importance, however, was the fact that, in the person of Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, this army had a commander who would neither retreat nor deviate from his course until victory is won.

We do not belong to any one party in Zionism. We have disagreed in the past and may disagree also now on various political issues, external or internal, but on one point all of us who signed this message find ourselves in complete agreement: In our great respect for Abba Hillel Silver, the political leader and the man.

Looking back at the days of the Emergency Council, we remember his far-sightedness, courage and uncompromising faithfulness to the principles of political Zionism. Dr. Silver's faith in the Jewish people, on the one hand, and in the American democracy, on the other, could never be shaken. In the many critical situations which we had

to face, we cannot recall one instance when Dr. Silver would waver in his determination, or would entertain the thought of settling for less than a sovereign Jewish State.

While we must leave to the future historians to arrive at an assessment of the role played by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver in bringing about our ultimate victory and the resulting formation of the State of Israel, we - without claiming for ourselves detachment or objectivity - are satisfied in our minds that Dr. Silver was one of the major architects of that victory.

We salute him on his seventieth birthday and express the hope that he will continue to serve the Jewish people and the Zionist idea for many, many years to come.

As we come to sign this letter, we are sadly aware of those members of the Emergency Council team who are no longer among the living. We feel that Elanche Sheppard, Abe Tuvim, Arnold Kretchmar-Israeli and Leo Sack would have wanted to be among the signers. We also feel that on this festive occasion, when we honor Dr. Silver, it is fitting to remember those of our team who are no longer with us. They, too, did their share for the creation of the State of Israel.



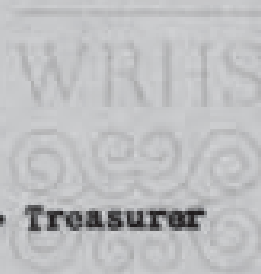
