MESSAGE FROM AMBASSADOR HARMAN

I deeply regret that I cannot be with you tonight as I had planned. I am in Israel on a brief visit and am unable to return in time. It is perhaps fitting that I should greet Rabbi Silver from Jerusalem. It was there that I first had the privilege of meeting him. It was in March 1948, just two months before Israel declared its independence. Travel to Jerusalem in those days was fraught with physical danger. But Dr. Silver found his way to us and his presence in our midst lifted our morale and strengthened our capacity to face the future. I remember thinking at the time that it is in things such as this that true leadership finds its expression. It is not just the ability to seek out and define the central historical trends of a people; not merely to give eloquent and moving expression to a people's vital aspirations; not only to bring to bear sound skill and judgment in the pursuance of a policy aimed at realizing those aspirations with all these qualities Dr. Silver has shown himself to be endowed in a measure unmatched in our time. But over and beyond these qualities, leadership and the acceptance of leadership by a people, are dependent on intangibles, such as that visit of Dr. Silver's in the spring of 1948 to a beleaguered Jerusalem.

It is difficult to think of Dr. Silver as being 70 years old. In our days this is no longer to be thought of as old age. Many of us who are younger than he cannot equal him in vigor; certainly we are in need of the wisdom and experience which his long years of leadership and devotion have accumulated for him. So while this is a birthday to be celebrated, it is, I am sure, appropriate that it be celebrated as but a stage, a significant one to be sure, in the unfolding of a career far from being over.

In wishing Dr. Silver long life and health, may I therefore express my hope and conviction that the years ahead will see him where we have grown accustomed to seeing him - at the head of a people's struggle for freedom and dignity, for security and for spiritual creativeness.

I am sure that you will be hearing tonight of the milestones in Dr. Silver's long career of service, in your community, for America and for Israel. For myself, as an Israeli and as a Jew, I would say just this. /We Jews are engaged in a great historic transition, from a status of inequality and rootlessness to a condition marked by rooted citizenship. In this century the larger part of the Jewish people has succeeded in making this transition and the most striking evidence of that is the existence of the great Jewish community of free America and the existence of a free Israel. When the history of these developments is written the name of Dr. Silver will be recorded as one of the central and decisive elements. I am equally sure that in the effort that still lies ahead to bring this transition to its point of culmination he will be out there in front, inspiring us by his eloquence and his courage and moving us forward by the force of his noble example. It is in this spirit that I think of Dr. Silver tonight in Jerusalem and wish him continued health and vigor for many years to come.
