

Dear Rabbi Silver,

It was my sad duty to inform you last week of the passing away of your father. He died on Weiness-day, the 12th January, and the news spread rapidly in the whole community of Jerusalem. Mr. Alexander Eliash took charge of all the arrangements with regard to the funeral which was held the same day at 4 o'clock in the afternoon, in the presence of very numerous mourners, among whom, apart from the members of the Rehavia Synagogue, heads of Yeshivot and representatives of orthodox Jerusalem, there were many well-known people, among them Justice Frumkin, Professor Herman Zondek, Dr. Hantke, many prominent officials of the Zionist Executive, the Agency and the Funds. Of the Executive only Mr. Shragai was present, as, unfortunately, all other members of the Executive were outside Jerusalem on that day.

The funeral procession stopped in front of the Rehavia Synagogue where very moving addresses were delivered by the old Rabbi S.J. Hillman (the Chief Rabbi's father-in-law), Chief Rabbi Dr. Herzog, Rabbi Michael Tikocinski, Rabbi Abba Rakovsky, and Chief Rabbi Benzion Uziel. All speakers stressed the scholarship, the piety, humility, philanthropy and generosity of the deceased.
