

My dear Daniel:

Along with uncounted thousands across the land I felt a deep sense of shock when I learned of the death of your father. In the years in which I have been in Cleveland I have come to hold him and his family in the highest regard and appreciation.

I valued him not only for his magnificent social and religious leadership, but for the tremendous frame of reference he gave to the concept of moral obligations. He had a walking familiarity with the Covenant and he called all men to fulfill that Covenant in their own lives.

By curious coincidence I was reading in your book "In Time of Harvest" on the day your father died. In retrospect I thought of the profound sacrament of his life and how it had elevated the quality of ideals to which we all must give our loyalty and our strength.

There is one other thought which I must express to you. To the world at large Rabbi Silver's monument will be found in the astonishing scope of his achievements. For you, your mother and Raphael, there will be precious, personalized memories of closest significance.

May I say that I am sorry indeed that this particular area of his life and yours could not have had a longer tenure. He was so powerful, so vigorous that it seemed he could have lived for many more years. My sympathy comes to you in the loss of a father who was also, by unique dispensation, the spiritual kin of the world at large. May God comfort you in your loss and quicken in your own life your special obligation to extend his area of service.






May you and your children find some solace in the realization that your sorrow is shared by so many.


Dear Dan:
