At a meeting of the Board of Directors of Har Zion Temple on Monday, words of tribute were spoken in memory of your dear father, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver. The entire Board rose for a period of silence in expression of our great loss and in thoughtful gratitude for what he did for us, our faith and our people.

The first time I heard your father speak was in Minneapolis, Minnesota, at Temple Israel--I am sixty-one--about forty-two years ago. I shall never forget the impression he made on me. When I was a student in New York at the Jewish Theological Seminary, I heard your father on many occasions speak to the Jewish world--and it was the Jewish world and not just the audience in front of him. I heard your father address a mammoth Teachers Convention of more than 5000 teachers in Omaha, Nebraska, some twenty years ago.

We were privileged to have your father as our guest last June for a disner in honor of one of our members, given by the Israel Bond organization. 



The right words, if there are any, are difficult to find, for none can fill the void left by your father or stop the aching in your own heart. They at best can only ease the pain and sorrow and bring soothing comfort until Time itself mellows loss with reality.

Though many miles away we feel your loss keenly and it will make our trips back to Cleveland just a bit emptier.




