Dear Rabbi Silver:

At a meeting of the Board of Directors of Har Zion Temple on Monday, words of tribute were spoken in memory of your dear father, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver. The entire Board rose for a period of silence in expression of our great loss and in thoughtful gratitude for what he did for us, our faith and our people.

The first time I heard your father speak was in Minneapolis, Minnesota, at Temple Israel--I am sixty-one--about forty-two years ago. I shall never forget the impression he made on me. When I was a student in New York at the Jewish Theological Seminary, I heard your father on many occasions speak to the Jewish world--and it was the Jewish world and not just the audience in front of him. I heard your father address a mammoth Teachers Convention of more than 5000 teachers in Omaha, Nebraska, some twenty years ago.

Together with the late Rabbi Stephen Wise, he was the greatest spokesman for Judaism to the non-Jewish world in this country.

We were privileged to have your father as our guest last June for a dinner in honor of one of our members, given by the Israel Bond organization. He honored us, and we listened to his words with eagerness and appreciation. We knew that the man who was speaking to us did as much or more than anyone else to bring about the existence of the State of Israel; and now in retrospect, we feel the more grateful that he was with us.

The Board of my congregation asks me to express their deep sympathy to you, your dear mother and all the members of your family. We share your grief. We pray that you will find great comfort in the precious legacy of the words and deeds that Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver left for you and for all of us.


I am truly sorry to be so late with this note, but I do wish to express to you my sincerest sympathy at the loss of your father.

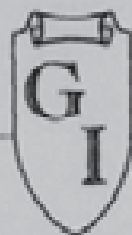

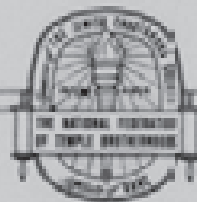

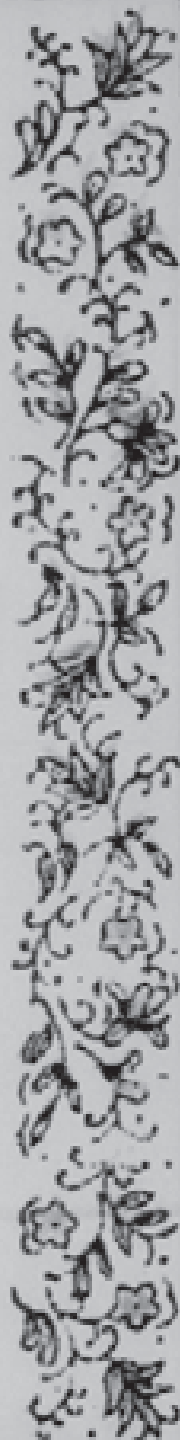
