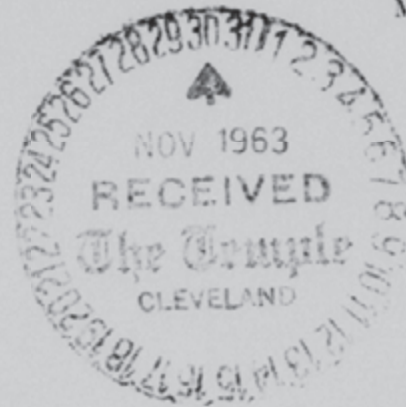



appearance in our community.


His illustrious career shed light on

Dear Sirs and Coreligionists:-

I read yesterday morning in the local Journal about the death, on Thursday, November 28, 1963, of my esteemed older colleague, Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, a former fellow student of mine at the Hebrew Union College, in Cincinnati. In the midst of the general sadness and mourning involved in, and evoked by, the death of this notable and signal Jewish leader, scholar, and rabbi, I take this sad opportunity of adding my voice to the messages of condolence to your Congregation and to the family of the late Rabbi Silver, in sincerity and with a profound sense of loss to the cause of American Judaism and of American Jewry in general. I extend my most sincere and most particular condolences to Mrs. Silver.

I am wondering whether I may take this occasion to inform you -- if you have not already heard -- that my recently published West Virginia Jewish history volumes, of which I enclose a Prospectus -- have reference in many places to Dr. Silver and to the two years -- 1915-1917-- which he spent and served in Wheeling, West Virginia, before he came to Tifereth Israel Congregation, in your city, in the latter year; and ^{contains} a considerable amount of biographical material on this great American Jewish leader, my older colleague; as well as an earlier picture of him, taken presumably in 1915 or 1916, when he was still rabbi in the Wheeling congregation, Leshem Shomayim. It has occurred to me that sets of this volume (these volumes), one for your Temple Library, One for the family of Dr. Silver himself, and one for Western Reserve University, and also one for the Cleveland Public Library, would be fitting memorials to his memory and to his life and work.






My dear Mr. Krohngold,


We can find no suitable words to adequately convey to the congregation of The Temple our profound sympathy on the death of Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver.

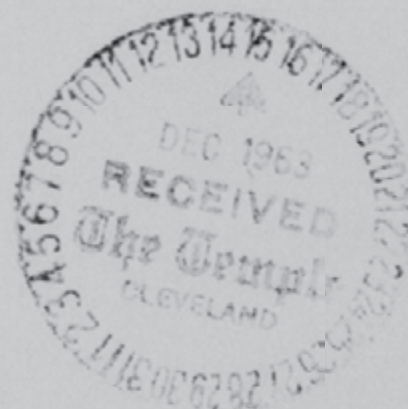


Dear Mr. Krohngold:
