Dear Rabbi:

I have created a very timely and compelling fiction novel set amid the most chaotic and fearful periods in modern history. The years from Adolf Hitler's ride to power in 1931 to the formation, in the Palestinian desert, of the State of Israel, are among the most trying, terrifying and inspiring times in the long cavalcade of Jewish life. Likewise, they are of equal importance to the Christian world in which they took place.

My novel entitled PROM OUT OF THE ASHES, uses this historical background to tell, and weave together, two stories -- one literal, the other allegorical. I have contrived a plot solidly anchored in contemporary historical fact, yet at the same time, anchored symbolically in the Biblical tale of Israel's bondage in Bgypt, the wandering in the desert and the finding of the Land Of Milk and Honey in Canaan. As well, I have endeavored to render a perceptive and psychologically true portrait of my hero, Martin Espiroso, that parallels that of Moses in Exodus.

Despite the Biblical thread that runs through my story, I have been told by my publisher that this does not overshadow the contemporary people and places about which I am writing. The Biblical and the contemporary each compliment and draw strength from the other.

As a former student of The Temple, I was greatly inspired along the pathway to Zion by your illustrious father; and without this early religious and and historical training, FROM OUT OF THE ASHES, might never have been created.

The novel in question is to be launched sometime this autumn. This is why I wish to ask your kind permission so that I might have the honor of dedicating this novel to the late and great Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver.

I would greatly appreciate hearing from you at your earliest convenience so that I might inform my publisher as to this dedication.
