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Europe a Madhouse and War Is Sure, Declares Rabbi Silver After Tour

Europe today is a veritable mad-

War is inevitable.

That is the conclusion of Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of the Temple. home today after a summer spent

"The situation is worse than it's ever been before." Dr. Silver declared in his study. "Far worse than I remember it in 1914. It's all a madhouse. The amount of mutual suspicion is frightening. It seems to me that war is inevitable."

Dr. Silver delivered one of the principal addresses before the World Zionis Congress in Lucerne, Switzerland, and was elected the American member of the administrative committee of the Jewish Agency for Palestine.

He observed conditions in France.

He observed conditions in France, England, Germany and Russia.

RUSSIA—There is no commun-ism left in Russia. Russia may have been communistic once, but that's past. What remains is a colossal state capitalism. The country is making great strides and, barring war (there is much fear of war with Japan or Germany), its remarkable development is likely to continue unchecked. Russia is the only place in Europe where there s no antagonism toward the Jews. Russia is becoming more bourgoise. It is beginning to realize the value of the family. Marriage and divorce being treated more conserva-

GERMANY-The plight of the Jews is sesperate. The renewed persecution in the last few months is the strongest proof that condi-tions in Germany are going from bad to worse. There is much un-

derground anti-Nazi activity. Jews and Catholics, as well as all lib-erals, have rallied together against Naziism. My own impression is that as economic conditions grow worse, as the liberal forces con-tinue to fight, sooner or later the Hitler regime must break. At the present time it is a menace to the peace of Europe."

ENGLAND—"There is much talk

the Italian-Ethiopian situation. The average Englishman is pro-Ethiopian. He has a sense of out-rage at what Italy is seeking to do. But there doesn't seem much probability that war in Europe will re-sult from Italian-Ethiopian causes. France and England will not jeopardize the league of nations because of Mussolini's activities in Africa.
War probably won't result: Mussolini will be given concessions.
FRANCE—"France is still the great civilized country. There is

increasing unemployment. But France certainly is not on the verge of any radical political change."

Rabbi, Back From Abroad, Reports War Talk Has Citizens Bewildered.

The man on the street in Europe has the jitters. He is bewildered by the shifting alliances of nations and

the shifting alliances of nations and frightened by daily rumors of intrigue. He doesn't sleep well nights. This is the opinion expressed by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of The Temple on his return to the city from Europe yesterday.

"Living standards are being sacrificed." Rabbi Silver said. "A man's bread supply is cut down so that more food for guns may be bought. Everywhere he hears the tramping of military feet.

"Fewer Old Hates Here.

"He goes to the park on Sunday to learn to drop in a parachute and takes a lesson by jumping off a tall

"He reads every newspaper and talks excitedly with his neighbor. His serenity it gone. He is waiting for he knows not what disaster."

"We are fortunate not to have so many neighbors," he said. "We are not in the midst of such a tangled web of intrigue and ancient hurts. We may not have so many old buildings as Europe, but neither have we so many old bates."

The Holy Days of Tishri



THE month of Tishri is the great holiday month of the Jewish calendar, It is ushered in by Rosh Hashannah-New Year Day-a day of spiritual stock-taking. The liturgy of the day and the sounds of the

shofar-the traditional ram's horn — summon men to soul-searching and to the examination of their actions and conduct in life.

There follow 10 days of re pentance culmipentance cuminating in the great Day of Atonement — Yom Kippur. This is a fast day from sundown to sun-



day the wor-day the worshiper is admonished to make his peace with his fellow-men by rectifying whatever wrong has been committed and by granthas been committed and by granting and receiving forgiveness. Forgiveness is then asked of God for
the sins and errors of which no
man is blameless. Thus on the
threshold of every new year, a solemn period of days is set aside for
spiritual meditation and communion
and for repentance and contrition.
These days serve as days of spiritual renewal for the people of renewal for the people of tunl

Five days after the Day of Atonement, there begins the Festival of Succoth-the Feast of Tabernacles -which is the classic harvest festival of Israel, It is celebrated with the building of out-of-door booths commemorative of the booths which the ancestors of Israel built in the wilderness after they left Egypt. The paim and citron, the willow and myrtle are brought to the sanctuary, and homes and places of worship are made fragrant with fruits and flowers, symbols of gratitude and thanksgiving to God's goodness and beauty.

SONG OF OLD RISES IN TEMPLES' HUSH

Sacred Scrolls Emerge as Voice of Repentant Israel Sounds at Yom Kippur.

Hushed and reverential worshipers filled Cleveland's temples and synagogs to capacity last night as Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, most sacred on the Jewish calendar, was ushered in with sunset.

Cleveland Rabbi, Before 2,000 of Hadassah, Says Realism Is Best Policy

Decries 'Forces of Hate'

Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, of Cleveland, speaking yesterday to 2,000 members of the New York chapter of Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America, at a tea in the Commodore, said that Jews throughout the world should organize with other minority groups and be-come realists instead of romanticists, to oppose the "forces of hate" aligned against them.

Jews must stop beguiling themselves with illusions, and should appraise every event with true perspective, he said. They should remember, he added, that the race has survived 2,000 years of persecution, and should free themselves of the inferior attitude that

they are a helpless people.
"Every Jew realizes that we have entered a new era in our historic evolution," he said. "One feature of the new world in the making is the increase in state concentration, and in its dominance and control over the lives of people. The state today is invading many departments of human life formerly not within its province."

political theories now practiced in Europe show the evidence of growing state control, he said. Social control means majority control, which in turn means that every minority group will be disadvantaged. he explained. In certain European countries, he added, some inslienable rights of man, over which the state should hold no veto, have been

HOLDS HITLER

Rabbi Silver Gives His Views on Dictators Following Trip Over Europe

Hitler will go to war as soon as his generals tell him that Germany is ready, according to Rabbi A. H. Silver, The Temple, who spent last summer in European countries getting an estimate of present trends

"The occasion for armed conflict by Germany as aggressor against anyone she can stir into war will be the same that provoked the Italian-Ethiopian war that a dictator must soon go to war or go under," he said.

Rabbi Silver in the first of the season's Sunday morning lectures vesterday said his general impression of Europe is a world unquiet and restless, moving against its will, but irresistably, to some fateful and tragic hour of decision.

"They know they are on the eve of conflict," he said.

"Europe now recognizes that the League of Nations is still a weak and undependable agency for international justice and peace in the world. Dictators sprung up in Europe after the war on the promise of solving the economic problems of the people. Not having any intelligent solution, and at heart pledged protect the interests of the priviledged classes who financed their interests in the first place.

"Mussolini and Hitler have not improved the economic positions of their people. In each country the standard of living of the masses has fallen while the national debt has

"Sphere to Widen."

"The sphere of government," the Cleveland rabbi said, "will be immeasurably wider in the future.

"Our old economic system, largely free from governmental control, has broken down. Government has had to step in, not merely to relieve widespread distress caused by this breakdown, but to salvage "a new day;" that they must be the very system itself. As governprepared for participation in po- ment steps in, it takes more and nore control-at first tentatively; eventually, definitely and permaently. It becomes imperative that government shall come into the hands, then, of the trained, the competent, the morally dependable.

"Indifferent Up to Now."

"And this is possible only if the electorate is intelligent, informed and alert. Up to now we have been a people quite indifferent to politics. The very word among us has had an unsavory taste. Formerly we could get along, even with bad government. No longer. Bad government will wreck our whole economic life."

The setting up of dictatorships in Europe is a challenge to democracy, Dr. Silver said.

"If democracy has any future at all, that future lies with the great democracies of the worldthe United States, Great Britain and France. If in these nations we fail to vitalize our democratic institutions, to improve our political apparatus so that by means of them we shall be able to bring about greater justice and greater security-then democracy will go under-even in this nation."

"The Italian-Ethiopian conflict has brought home to the peoples of Europe two basic facts, not new but now extensively advertised. The first is that a dictator sooner or later must go to war or go under. The second is that the League of Nations is still a weak and undependable agency for international justice and peace in Europe. peace in Europe.

Calls War a Neck-Saver.

"Fascist dictators sprang up in Europe after the war on the promise of solving the economic problems of their people. Not having any intelli-gent or consistent solution, and at heart pledged to protect the interests of the privileged classes who financed their adventure, they have

"Mussolini and Hitler have not improved the economic positions of their people. In each country the standard of living of the masses has fallen, while the national debt has mounted. To save their necks they must compensate their people and divert them with dreams of empire, glory and prestige. Hitler, too, will go to war, and for the same reason, as soon as his generals tell him Ger-

many is ready.

"The friends of the League of Nations discredited it three years ago when they acquiesced in Japan's invasion of China and refused to invoke sanctions. This terrotics voke sanctions. This tempting precedent Mussolini could not overlook. The League today is fighting for its

Explains Anti-Jew Policy.

"If Mussolini is allowed to appro-priate Ethiopia, a member nation, or if Italy, France and England. through secret arrangements proceed to parcel out Ethiopia among them-selves under guise of restoring peace, the League will cease to be a serious agency for the pacification of the world.

"Hitler had nothing to report at the Nuremberg Congress to the credit of his regime, so he thrust forward the Jewish issue again. The Reichstag was convoked, not to solve any pressing economic and social problems, but to pass laws disfranchising the helpless Jewish minority in Germany.

"A systematic policy to effect the economic extermination of Jews is now being carried out. Jews are being forced to liquidate their businesses without the right of exporting their capital. This is a form of official pocket picking unknown in any civilized country in the world.

"The latest edict of Dr. Goebbels was to strike the names of the Jews who died on the battle fields for Germany in the last war from all war memorials. To such depths does a natice shift that has lost its way in mad radicalism and chauvinism." "Hitler had nothing to report at

"As sure as we are assembled here, if the United States refuses

to participate, the other nations will follow, leaving Hitler with his forty million dollar bauble of fool-ery and bigotry. And if we wreck the German Olympics it may bring an end of bloody Naziism."

Beamish was vehement in assail-ing Avery Brundage, president of the American Olympic Association, and General Charles Sherrill, American member of the international Olympic committee, for "sticking out their necks" in sponsoring American participation.

He called Brundage the 'foremost apostle of Hitlerism in the United States.

Calls Probers' Report False.
"This amaing investigator," said
Beamish, "reports no racial discrimination in Germany, and I say he is either blind or a fool or a liar. In Berlin he wined with Hitler and gabbed and gobbled with Geob-bels, (German propaganda minis-ter) and came home to report all fair along the Rhine and we'll receive a royal welcome-as long as there are no Jews in the delega-

Sherrill's warning that American Jews would suffer if the anti-Olympic drive was successful, Beamish charged, was a "threat from Hitler flaunted over free

America.

"Sherrill lies in his throat,"
Beamish continued, "when he says
that the American people are not
concerned. Let Sherrill go to Berlin
to run in the marathon of paganism, but let him run backward into
the medieval mists from which
Hitler sprang."

Good Neighbor and Good Citizen

With so much being done, on a more or less promiscuous basis, by government to relieve popular distress, and with official relief ofte unworthily and none too graciously received a sense of popular responsibility for soci altruism may incline to become somew cy nically inhibited.

This situation seems to be taken into con side ration by the 1935 Mobilization for Human Needs, with the slogan "Be a Good Neighbor," adopted in hundreds of cities which are raising money for community chests and other well'are work. Gerard Swope, chairman of the mobilization, queried representative spokesmen of three religious groups, Catholic, Protestant and Jewish, for a definition of a present-day good neighbor and their replies were identical in substance.

Msgr. Robert F. Keegan, executive director of the Catholic Charities for the New York Archdiccese and president of the National Conference of Social Work, pointed out: "Private charity (in contrast with taxes paid in discharge of civic duty to support social welfare) discharges an obligation of man to his Creator and to his fellow man in return for benefits reserved by the Creator and to his fellow, man in application of the divine mandate. Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself." Dr. Ivan Lee Holt, pastor of St. John's Methodist Episcopal Church and head of the Church Federation of St. Louis, said that, in addition to being a good citizen who pays taxes to help his government and his fellowman, a man "must give to others with a sense of gratitude to God that he has money to give." Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland dectared that the humanitarian duty "is a moral mandate binding upon all men at all times, regardless of what government agencies may be doing to alleviate human suffering."

It would appear that a social conscience is broader than a civic one and, like the quality of mercy, is not strained by contemporary considerations.

Rabbi Sees Peace Periled. Rabbi Abba Silver, of Cleveland, declared that it was not a fight tween Jews and Germans, but a struggle "between civilization and barbarism throwing mankind back

to the dark ages."

"Hitler has violated the very sanctity of sportsmanship on which the Olympics are founded. What lesson in sportsmanship will our youth learn in Barlin?" our youth learn in Berlin?

Rabbi Silver asserted that Nasiism is a menue to world peace and "the argument that Nazi policles does not concern us is stupid beyond words,"

"Those who would countenance American athletes going to the cesspool of iniquity in Berlin," the clergyman said "are unconscious enemies of civilization."

P. T. Fagan president of the Pittsburgh Central Labor Union, and William S. Haddock, president of the Alleghesy Mountain Ama-teur Athletic Association, also ad-dressed the me-ting, spensored by the Anti-Nazi Boycott Council of Pittsburgh.

VER DENIES U.S.

Not in Danger, Not Immune, He Tells City Club; Threat Is From Right

Although the United States is neither in danger of dictatorship nor immune from it, dictatorship, if "t does come, will be rather from the right than from the left, in the opinion of Rabbi A. H. Silver, who spoke before the City Club yesterday on "Some Aberrations of Our Day."

"People who overthrow governments are the patriots, not the Communists, as we have seen in Ger-

ments are the patriots, not the Communists, as we have seen in Germany," he said. "Whenever democratic machinery or legislation threatens privilege, it will stop as nothing. When they tell you Communists are our chief peril, they are trying to befuddle you."

This expression came in the question period. Replying to another query the rabbi differentisted between the attitudes of Soviet Russia and the Third Internationale (international Communist organization) on war. He asserted Soviet Russia has no interest in a war of conquest but does fear attack, hence has the largest armed force. Then he recalled that the Third Internationale," would like to stimulate revolt all over the world." adding "It's true and nobody intellectually honest and knowing the facts, can deny it."

To a question asking whether Hitler is insane, Dr. Sliver replied: "The dictator is not intellectual or educated but is rot a fool. He knows just what he wants and thinks he knows how to get it. His Naxis are tools of the industrialists who believe Jews were responsible for the growth of liberalism and so must be exterminated."

The aberrations of today cited by Rabbi Silver are: Efforts to subject truth and the quest for truth to the political ends of the state; a sanctified ruthlessness in which the sanctity of human life is in peril of being lost; intense nationalism—the sentiment "my country must be free to do what it wishes, legitimate or not," as distinguished "rom nationality which says every country must be free to achieve the legitimate ends of life; aberrations about race.

"The values of civilization are not to be feund in these aberrations." Rabbi Silver said. "They retard civilization. The classic way in which civilization has moved has these four landmarks:

"FREE, UNTHAMMELED quest for truth, not subjecting the intellect

landmarks:

"FREE, UNTHAMMELED quest for truth, not subjecting the intellect to state or church or to any indoctrinating, but to emancipation.

"REVERENCE for human life, tolerance, sympathy—not the way of

OPEN-MINDEDNESS and toler-

"INTERNATIONAL co-operation, racial and religious tolerance, the solidarity of the human family, of human trotherhood.

"This is the way; this is the only good."

Deep Waters Rolled.

Deep Waters Relied.

Dr. Silver began with the statement: "When the deep waters are rolled, much mud comes to the surface. The deepest waters of the world's intellectual and spiritual life have been profoundly rolled in the last two decades and there is much mud and slime in thinking and feeling. No generation has had its nerves wracked quite so much as ours and its mental life subjected to such continuous and furious attack. Changes which have shaken the world in the last twenty years have been like earthquakes or volcanic cruptions, so numerous as to leave the western world dazed and bewildered. Eventually the world will regain its poise, but only through labor and patient leadersh p of these who still can think with a mirimum of bias and feel with a maximum of restraint."

"Ignorance once was the greatest enemy of human progrees. Now that enemy is propaganda." he said.

Rabbi Silver Says It Hits Stampede Stage, Praises Social Security Act.

The Townsend Plan was described as inflationary, unjust to the working classes and a dangerous shortcut to prosperity by Rabbi A. H. Silver, who counseled faith in the provisions of the Federal Social Security Act, in his sermon at the Temple yesterday morning.

"The Townsend Plan is so simple it fairly takes your breath away, and your reason," he said. "What makes it hard to discuss it objectively is that it is linked up emotionally with the care of the aged and every criticism of the plan is by indirection interpreted as hostility and cruel in-difference to them.
"Someone wants to give every

elderly man and woman \$200 a month and you say 'No!' Clearly you are mean and hard-hearted. The Townsend Plan is quickly reaching a feverish propaganda stage, taking on the character of a Messianic stampede, where clear thinking is becoming more and more difficult to great numbers of people."

Calls It Two Unrelated Plans.

The Townsend Plan, Rabbi Silver said, is really a merger of two unre-lated plans: one to provide adequately for the aged, the other to solve the problem of the depression and all depressions.

"Were we not in the midst of a depression, such an old age pension plan would never have been proposed," he continued. "It is clear that a plan which proposes to give 8,000,000 people, who are not them-selves producers, \$2,400 a year each to spend, while 90 per cent, of the actual producers, many of whom have families to support, receive hardly half that amount in wages, is not only fantastic but unjust.

"The Townsend Plan," Rabbi Silver said in The Temple yesterday, "is really a merger of two plans. One is to provide adequately for the aged; the other to solve the problem of depression and of all depressions. The two are not related and, were we not in the midst of a depression, this type of an old-age pension plan would never have been proposed.

"The Townsend Plan suggests that by retiring four to five million people over 60 who are now gainfully employed, you would be creating jobs for that number of people under 60. But how will this contribute to prosperity? How can you increase the wealth of a nation by having one non-producing group exchange places with a producing group?

Doubts Accuracy

"In place of the minimum unemployment relief which the country is aying to the four or five-million jobless, it would be paying what amounts to a maximum unemploy-ment relief of \$200 a month to the ew unemployed,"

Rabbi Elver expressed grave doubt as to the accuracy of the figures on which the Townsend Plan promoters base their belief that a 2 per cent transaction tax would produce the vast sums needed to pay the 8,000,000 pensioners over 60—at least

\$20,000,000,000 yearly.
"I understand that the figure \$1, 200,000,000,000, representing the volof business transactions in 1929, is being used as a basis by the Townsend advocates," he said. "But it is evident that this figure must include all bank transactions.

"Does the Townsend Plan suggest that every check issued shall cost 2 per cent in addition to the tax on the sale itself? Imagine what efdeposits and on the whole bankin structure of the country.

Like Paying an Army

"A sound economist has estimated that the total business transactions, usive of bank tran ctions, in 1933-an average depression yearwould amount to some \$250,000,000,-000. If this figure were doubled for a normal year, the 2 per cent tax would yield \$10,000,000,000. Pensions would then be not \$200 per month but \$100.

By 1948 this plan will call for a 6 per cent, tax on the pay roll of the nation, to be paid in equal shares by employe and employer. It is not yet clear how even this plan, which contemplates only minimum benefits, will operate, and what strain it will not upon our economic structure.

will operate, and what strain it will put upon our economic structure.

"All the dictatorships in the world today are due to the fact that people have sought short-cuts to prosperity and to Kingdom Come. The Federal Social Security Act should be given a chance. It should not be tampered with by agitation for extreme measures such as the erd Plan contemplates."

Rabbi Asserts **Youth Pension** Is Wiser One

Pensions for young married couples would be an improvement on old age pensions under the Townsend plan, assuming it would work, Rabbi A. H. Silver declared yesterday in his sermon at the Temple.

In criticizing the Townsend plan, he described it as "a Messianic stampede," inflationary, unjust and dangerous. He urged support of the old age pension provisions in the social security act.

"Assuming for the moment that the best way to bring back prosperity is to tax one part of the pcpulation to give money to another part to spend, one could make a better case for young married people than for old people. At least it would go to workers who have homes to build and children to rear and educate," he asserted.

"The Townsend plan is so simple it fairly takes your breath awayand your reason. What makes it hard to discuss objectively is that it is linked emotionally with the car of the aged.

"But to give a non-producing class of eight to ten millions money to spend out of the pockets of those who work and need it themselves is like maintaining a standing army of eight to ten-million soldiers in the midst of the land, and hoping the money spent on them will make the nation prosperous. Huge armies and their upkeep have always tended to impoverish a nation.

Rabbi Silver characterized as fantastic and unjust any plan which proposes to give 3,000,000 people each \$2400 yearly to spend while 90 per cent of the actual producers of the nation, many with large families to support, receive hardly half that amount in wages.

"If, in normal or prosperous times, anyone had suggested that these workers struggling to make ends meet should be taxed an amount equal to from 20 to 50 per cent of the total national income o support a class of non-product on a scale at least twice as high as their own, he would have been laughed out of court.

The idea has been widely popu-

only put a large amount of money into circulation the wheels of industry would begin to move again and prosperity would return. This notion is capitalized by the Townsend Plan, and this, plus its natural at-tractiveness to old folks, is what gives it such wide currency and ap-

peal.
"The plan, if put in operation, can only lead to a terrific monetary inflation even though the advocates of the measure are not themselves inflationists. When that sets in the \$200 promised the old people prob-ably will not be worth 200 cents."

Rabbi Silver expressed confidence in the social security act recently passed by Congress, and said 2 should be given a chance to be put into operation.

While the sums it gives to the aged are not as large as promised by the Townsend Plan, it is based on revenues that are possible to raise. Tampering with it by agitation for extreme measures, such as the Townsend Plan advocates, can had only to harm, he said.

RABBI SILVER'S SPEECH

RABBI ABBA HILLEL SILVER IS nationally known as one of the most sincere liberals of our generation.

This gifted leader at the Temple, who has frequently fought for unemployment insurance, old-age pensions and other enlightened social legislation, spoke yesterday on the Townsend Plan and social security.

We believe his analysis of the plan's operation deserves the thoughtful consideration of the plan's supporters no less than of its opponents. We believe to be particularly timely his warning that the Federal Government's new social security act may be endangered by the agitation for extreme measures.

After years of struggle, for example, Ohio has finally gotten an old-age pension system in operation. It has not operated as satisfactorily as we believe it should. But under its provisions the dependent aged are actually getting something, with a maximum of \$25 a month possible. When the Government puts up its money, the combined maximum possible will be \$30. There are prospects of more liberal pensions in the future.

These are benefits which, although not large by comparison with the Townsend Plan, are definitely realizable. They ought not to be lost sight of by even the most ardent and sincere supporters of other plans.

The federal security act, Rabbi Silver reminds us, also sets up an old-age annuities plan, or retirement wage, under which any worker may retire at 65 and receive an annuity for the rest of his life. The maximum possible under it would be \$85 a

In this connection, Rabbi Silver makes the following significant comment:

"This law is a sound combination of a retirement plan for the superannuated with old-age insurance, based on sound actuarial principles.

"The plan will involve heavy outlays and taxation. By 1948 it will call for a 6 per cent tax on the payroll of the nation to be paid in equal share by employee and employer. It is not yet clear how even this plan which contemplates only minimum benefits will operate and what strain it will put upon our economic structure. It doesn't meet with all of our heart's desires, of course, but if found workable and feasible in the future, the benefits may be increased as experience warrants. It is part of economic sanity as well as of political wisdom to move carefully in these fields."

And with such a temperate warning we must all agree. This newspaper believes that too little has been done for the dependent aged of Ohio. We hope that the state soon will be in position to treat its citizens more generously in the field of unemployment insurance as well as oldage pensions.

Sympathetic Warning.

for many years Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver has been a fighter for good causes in social advancement. Obviously he needs no introduction as an understanding liberal.

This gives added significance to his discussion of the Townsend plan. He appraises it, not from the standpoint of a reactionary, but as a sympathetic friend, mindful of the burdens which a hard social order has too often placed upon the shoulders of the aged.

He appraises the Townsend plan and finds it wanting. At a time when it is assuming the proportions of an emotional stampede, he warns that it is dangerous, impractical, and illusory. His statement is courageous, as well as being well backed by reason. With a mind trained to analysis, he points to this outstanding fallacy of the Townsend formula:

A plan which proposes to give 8,000,000 people, not themselves producers, \$2,400 a year each, while 90 per cent, of the producers, many of whom have families to support, receive hardly half that amount in wages, is not only fan-tastic but unjust.

The rabbi points out that the 2 per cent. tax, many times multiplied, would grow to a 15 to 20 per cent. levy, "a sales tax on every stage in the production and distribution of goods." Treese objections to the Townsend plan are fundamental, however much they may be denied by those who allow emotion to outstrip reason in their zeal to achieve a worthy objective.

Dr. Silver is no less eager than they to achieve that objective. But he wisely insists upon considering it in terms of the attainable. "Rabbi Silver offends common decency and ordinary intelligence when he, the recipient of a large salary from a wealthy congregation, expresses confidence in the social security act," Dr. Fagan as-serts. "That legislation offers to the aged, 65 and over (provided they will sign a gauper's oath and assign to the state any equity in fome or insurance), a sum up to \$15 per month, if the state contributes a like amount.

"Will the rabbi, accustomed as he is to a reported \$18,000 wearly salary, write a budget showing how an old person can live on \$15 or \$50 a month?"

Charges Misstatement

Dr. Fagan pointed out that "states lke Pennsylvania Kentucky and Michigan, with old age pension laws, are paying nothing, because the states have no funds."

He added that the Townsend plan, as expressed in the McGroarty bill, "loes not contemplate the taking of one dollar from the U. S. treasury or the sale of one bond to put the plan in operation. Rabbi Silver, probably misinformed, says that the flast \$2,000,000,000 would be contributed by the government. This is a misstatement." He added that the Townsend plan,

SURPLUS PAY

Speaker Says Proposed Tax Would Provide 4 Billions Over Pension Needs

The Townsend Plan will not only amply support America's 8,000,000 men and women over 60, but will pay the national debt within eightyears with the surplus from the proposed 2 per cent transaction tax.

This new estimate of the power of the pension plan devised by Dr. Francis Townsend of California was given by C. R. Baker, assistant area manager of northeastern Oho, at the Community Temple, meeting in Coventry School, Cleveland Heights, yesterday. His talk was in answer to a Townsend attack by Rabbi A H Silver, The Temple, last Sunday.

Mr. Baker said he had come to give facts and figures about the Townsend Plan and answer charges that it would not work and was based on false estimates.

To support his claim that sufficient money was exchanged in trans-actions in the United States within one year to produce \$24,000,000,000 yearly by a 2 per cent transaction levy, he quoted Carl Snyder's "Bustless Cycles and Business Measures" of 1927. He said r. Snyder gave the transaction figures as \$800,000,000,000 per year in a normal year.

Quotes Authorities

Other authorities he quoted were: E. A. Goldweiser who, before the Congressional Ways and Means Committee in 1932, placed the total transactions at 1200 billion dolars; Dow-Jones Co. Inc. New York, gives 1120 billions as their estimate for 1929; Hearst for the same year places the transactions at 130C billion dollars.

The Townsend Plan executives use The Townsend Pian executives use 1200 billion dollars in their estimates because £ is an easy figure to remember, said Mr. Baker, who advised writing this number on cuffs and backs of calling cards. At 2 per cent this would yield \$24,000.000,000 yeary, while the 8,000,000 pensioners' needs would be supplied with \$16,000.000,000 at \$200, per month each. 000,000,000 at \$200 per month each, he said.

Mr. Baker said he preferred to split the surplus of receipts over expenditures and use the conserva-tive estimate of \$4,000,000,000 yearly savings with which to pay off the national debt, which even if ncw as high as \$32,000,000,000, could be viped out in eight years, he said.

Whether all bank transactions were included in the estimated transactions in the figures used and whether all bank transactions were to be subject to tax, Mr. Baker said "yes and no."

Faster Turnover

"Make up your mind; we want to know," said a man talking in a broad Scotch accent.

"Obviously banks would have to be taxed on their earnings and not their transactions where they simply act as a credit clearing house," Mr Baker said. "The same adjustment would have to be made on call money paid back after only two or three days' use.

"The Townsend Plan will use real money as we are using now. There will be a faster turnover, that is all. Inflation is not necessary; the present \$5,000,000,000 issue is sufficient. And prices will not increase on the average of over 8 per cent. A cup of coffee will cost one-sixth of a cent more A set of automobile tires will be taxed 65 to 70 cents.

"Most of this will be absorbed by the manufacturers. There will be keen competition and they will have to absorb the tax to get the business. And the machine age will continue

And the machine age will continue to require fewer producers so the age limit of the pensioners will eventually be reduced to 58—55—50—yes, and even to 45 years.

"If the Government can support 23,000,000 people now on the dole in one form or another, but only so that they can barely keep body and soul together, certainly with a newer and saner plan they can support er and saner plan they can support as 200,000 decently. And the Plan will put 11,000,000 now unemployed back to work, so they may live not on necessities alone but be able to afford luxuries. Luxuries are as necessary and right as rain."

"So Russia is prepared with the largest standing army in the world. It is a tragic pity that this people, whose philosophy is one of peace, so far as aggression is concerned, is compelled to do what every capitalist country is forced to do-militarize itself to the hilt.

"Russia seems to be on the way to solving the problem of production for use and not for profit. It has not solved the cost of production; it has sacrificed much of human freedom. Whether dictatorship can iquidate itself, whether the people will be happier than those of capitalistic countries, only the future can tell."

Dr. Silver sald a chief improvement was an about-face in treatment of the intelligentaia and explained that "the man of expert training again is being jushed into the position of true 'eadership and importa ce in Russia, as he must be in av. sy civilized country."

SAYS SCIENTIST UPHOLDS BASE OF RELIGION

Rabbi Silver Preaches on Dr. Carrel's New Book, "Man. the Unknown" 12.9.3

The basic contentions of religion are completely upheld by a scientist "whose credentials are completely in order," Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver fold his congregation at the Temple yesterday.

He preached on the current sen-sational best-seller, "Man, the Un-known," by Dr. Alexis Carrel, fa-mous scientist and member of the Rockefeller Institute.

It is sensational that the book should be a best-seller because it was not so designed to be.

Rather here is a medical research scientist who has thought much about life at large, and especially the world as it is today, and who tries in his book to convey a studied serious picture of man as he might be, a rounded individual, through the medium, first, of the physical approach and, indirectly, through the psychological.

Makes Abstruse Reading

Into this picture he has woven his own philosophy of the ideal concept and in doing so he rises into mys ticism, pure metaphysics, no less than 14 times. This makes abstruse if not heavy reading, not keyed for

a popular audience.

In all Cleveland there is no man so well equipped to appreciate Dr. Carrel's book as is Rabbi Silver, because "Man, the Unknown," is in effect a scientist's supporting appendix to a book which Rabbi Silver published in 1929; "Religion in a Changing World," a selection of the Religious Book-of-the-Month Club which also was for months, despite its mystic heights and metaphysical

profundities, a best-seller.

"One gasps," Rabbi Silver said,
"to find this member of the very
elite of scientific pioneers of our
day brush aside as so many fads
and illusions many of the ideas in the field of medicine, psychology pedagogy and human relations generally, which we have been admon-ished to regard as the very last words on the subject.

"Over and over again one finds the great themes of religion echo and re-echo in Dr. Carrel's bold and thoughtful critique of our civiliza-tion, and in its demand for a new orientation of human life, and its different concept of human progress and destiny.

Cites Banal Amusements

Our present social order is not safeguarding the individual. It has reduced him to an economic unit of production and consumption and it has given him insecure comfort and banal amusements instead of the opportunity for a vigorous physical, moral and spiritual life."
On that ground, Dr. Carrell, after

presenting a horrendous picture of life as most of us live it nowadays, declares that science must abandon the Cartesian doctrine of dualism of mind (or soul) and body, and learn to see the individual concrete man as a physical, psychological, spiritual

But it is as fatal to follow the cult of mind as it is the cult of matter.

Man must be apprehended in the

"full acceptance of all the data of observation" including the religious phenomena which has made his book seem sensational rather than what it actually is, provocative and

Catlining his proposal for a new "scence of man," Dr. Carrel devotes chapters to discussion of body and physiological activities, inward time (the progressive changes of anatomy and physiology), adaptive functions, automatic regulation, and accommo-dation to changed environmental

Er. Carrel is willing to give up democracy as a false creed, "now breaking down under the blows of the experience of nations."

Though he admits that in the abthough he admits that in the abstract all men are equal, actually, he says, they are not, and "the feeble-minded and the genius should not be equal before the law. The stupid, the unintelligent, particularly the hidebound, "have no right to higher education, and it is absurd to give them the same electoral power as the fully developed indi-viduals."

Says Sexes Unequal

Neither are the sexes equal; men and women should be given differ-ent-educations. Women's prime function is bearer and trainer of children.

The proletariat, Dr. Carrel sees as the dragon of a degenerate world. He thinks cities, nudism, feminism, communism, vegetarianism, Freud, advertised medicines, and atheism all enemies of progress.

But his ideal world would be far from a Fascist as from a Commu-nist dictatorship.

"Our civilization must be reconstructed by the synthetic organiza-tion of the laws governing the physiological nature of man with those of its intellectual and spiritual nature," Rabbi Silver summarized Dr. Camel's argument yesterday.

HOLDS DR. CARREL VINDICATES FAITH

"This scientist philosopher is so thorthodox in his views that he finds himself frequently in the camp of the very orthodox moralists and religionists whose day, so many knowing folks told us frequently, was long since past," Rabbi Silver said.

He characterized the book as at once a scientific treatise and a "magnificent sermon written along the classic lines of all "he great preachments of aistoric religiona."

"The major theme of his book is that our modern industrial civilization is causing the rapid degeneration of man," the rabbi went on. "Dr. Carrel takes stock of man and saciety which our scientific age has produced and finds them both wanting.

Not Developing Strong.

"Our society is protecting the weak, but it is not developing the strong. Nor is our race propagating its best elements. What high interests of man did we intend to serve by erecting huge factories, by herding men into crowded cities, by surrounding life with din, noise, excitement, speed, artificiality, by substituting conveniences for effort, comfort for struggle?

"Our civilization must be reconstructed by a super-science which will organize synthetically the laws governing the physiological nature of man with those of his intellectual and spiritual nature.

Dr. Carrel calls attention to some phases of man's consciousness which the other varion—intuition, clairvoyance, telepathy, the moral and mystical sense in man, the power of spiritual forces, such as prayer, to affect our tissues and organs—miracles,

"He calls for the fullest exploration of all the realms of consciousness and of all the capacities of man.

"Every human being is as unique

(Every human being is as unique as his ingerprints, and the best way to guide and educate him is to treat him as an individual, not to subject him to standardization and wholesale education, but to develop a scientific technique which will make possible the discovery and orientation of his physical and psychic peculiarities.

"The conclusions of this great scients are completely opposed to the regmentation of the masses and the submergence of the individual which has been going on at a great pach, particularly under dictator-ships."



RABBI SILVER TAKES STOCK OF YEAR 1935

Says League Must Force Italy Out of Ethiopia or Admit Its Helplessness PARA 12-36

The League of Nations either must force Mussolini out of Ethiopia during the coming year or acknowledge its own helplessness.

There will be war in the Far East sooner or later.

The naval conference in London will fail and it will be fortunate if out of it does not come a mutual agreement to increase armaments.

With partisanship running riot, the coming political campaign will be bitter.

These were the high spots in an iddress by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver resterday at the Ansel Road Temple. He spoke on "Taking Stock of the Year 1935."

"Public opinion served notice on the chancellories of the world that there are limits even to the shame-lessness and chicanery of international diplomacy." Rabbi Silver remarked in mentioning the repudiation of the Hoare-Laval plan as one of the international bright spots of the year.

"No nation has the right to announce that it intends to be beyond the pale of international law." Rabli Silver said, "any more than an incividual can claim immunity by prociaiming himself to be beyond the pale of the criminal and civil laws of his state."

Though the year brought marked business improvement, there are still 10,000,000 unemployed and many more millions on relief, with no assurance that business improvement is permanent, he said.

He prophesied a bitter presidential emmaign with both parties overlooking causes and cures of depression. He said that slogans of "a halanced budget," "save the Constitution" and "relief wastes" were already gaining currency, and that the myrmidons of big business, having again found their courage and their veices, were already closing in on the president.

"The League of Nations in 1936 must force Mussolini out of Ethiopia or must acknowledge its own helpleisness and uselessness," Rabbi Sever said. "Without the power to impose forceful sanctions on a receleitrant nation, the League is valueless. The life and death struggle of the League will center around this issue of sanctions.

"While the European nations were ergrossed in the Ethiopian affair, Japan, encouraged by its success in 1983, prosecuted her plan further for the diamemberment of China, Sooner or later there will be war in the Far East.

"These contributed toward making the trial a carnival, a cheap and lurid publicity organ," he said. "The press of the country exercised neither restraint, tact nor propriety in treating the case. Newspapers should of course, reflect life faithfully, but they should not distort the perspective of people by focusing their attention too closely or too long upon one criminal case. A paper not merely reflects life, but directs it."

The most inspiring message of all the sessions came from the lips of Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, who stirred the delegates to a veritable frenzy of determination. He wisely cautioned against the delusion that Zionism can liquidate the Galuth. He stressed that Zionism is "more than an escape from persecution; a movement toward auto-emancipation." He further emphasized the need of all lovers of Zion not to permit Zionism to be utilized "as an excuse for disfranchising the Jew in any part of the world. Sokolow called the act of Kareski in Berlin a covenant with the devil. Zionists have never maintained that the Jew in the Diaspora shall live in a Ghetto. He must always ask for the Jew the right to walk as a free man, unairaid upon the face of the whole earth."

Rabbl Abba Hillel Silver of The Temple, Cleveland, said to be the largest liberal synagogue in America, in discussing "The Radicalism of the Jews," last evening, in Ford Hall Forum, declared that his race is often charged with radicalism simply be-

charged with radicalism simply because "Jews welcome new ideas and there are so many non-Jews who denounce every new idea as radical."

The fact that the word radical means "going to the root of things," he said, but it has come to be associated with both pacifism and violence. He admitted that many Jews are pacifists. Hitler, he added, puts pacifists into concentration camps along with the type of radicals who would overthrow government.

He told of a recent report of a small committee of patriots in Cleveland, to the entire body of the Cham-

own," Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland declared last night at the weekly
meeting of the Ford Hall Forum.

He pointed out, however, that of 100
communists who were elected to the
German Reichstag before the advent of
Hiller to power, not one was a Jew. Of
the 26,000 registered communists in the
United Straes, he said, less than three
per cent, are known to be Jews, a smaller nationality percentage than any other
group.

There are certain inherent Jewiah traits, he said, that give many people the impression that Jews are radicals. The Jew, he explained, is almost always exceedingly vocal and voluble; he it is was takes the stump and "when the Jewish communist gets going he talks like 10 non-Jews."

"The Jew is inatinctively sympathetic to the dispossessed and the downtrodden, and is a champlon of human rights." the speaker added. "He is a cosmopolitan and an internationalist with an analytical mind that makes him ask why, wherefore and whither. These questions make him are advocate of international peace.

"The Jew dares to stand alone and this characteristic gives some people the idea that the Jewish people are a stiff-necked, stubborn people. They dared to stand alone in the world, maintaining their monothelstic ideals, when all about them was idolatry and polythelsm. If the Jew had not remained faithful to monothelstic ideals there would be no Christianity and no Mohammedanism in the world today."

Teachers' Convention Shown How Controversial Subjects May Be Considered in the Classroom

New Jersey Educator Conducts Illustrative Discussion on Stage—Superintendents Balloting Today on New Officers.

With the principal speech-making over, the convention of the Department of Superintendence of the National Education Association settled down for a breathing spell today, the fourth day of the convention, and confined itself to such hings as election of officers, a class demonstration on the convention hall stage, and various service club nd college luncheons.

It was a holiday for the St. Louis public schools and for some schools elsewhere in Missouri. Many of the teachers were downtown to reinforce the convention delegates. Tonight the college clubs within the department will hold their annual dinners, following which there will be a program on "The Arts in Edu-cation," with songs by Elda Vettori, St. Louis member of the Metropolian Opera.

It was an easy day for the 8000 nen and women following the businight. The convention will close tomorrow with morning and afternoon sessions.

Classroom Teaching Demonstration A demonstration that, with fair nd intelligent teaching, controverand intelligent teaching, contemporary questions can be discussed from all angles in the classroom without prejudicing or the students was propagandizing the students, was given today on the stage of the Municipal Auditorium Convention Hall at a general session of the convention attended by about 5000

A classroom was set up on the ge, with 24 boys and girls of Cleveland High School senior public speaking class as the stu-dents, and Dr. Roy W. Hatch, head of the social studies department of the New Jersey State Teachers' as the instructor.

Dr. Hatch had talked over some of the subjects with the class on several occasions last week, but he assured reporters that the questions and answers were not rehearsed and the discussion was spontaneous on the part of the students.

Supreme Court Discussed. They started off with Supreme Court decisions on New Deal proj-Dr. Hatch kept the discussion going with leading questions and succinct comment. Why, he asked them, should the nine Justices of the Supreme Court answer thought the power of the court is a good thing, because the Justices don't have to run for office and are not influenced by political con-siderations. A boy reminded her that election of representatives by the people is the basis of our democratic government. When one stu dent told of the system of checks and balances of our governmental system, another demanded, "Bu who checks the Supreme Court?"

There was intelligent debate of the court's decision on the AAA, showing the students had read the newspapers closely. One quoted from the minority decision. Most of them said they would have voted the way the minority of the court did.

Dr. Hatch asked if the teacher should give his opinion on such matters. The students agreed that he should, but as a point of view, and not try to drill it into his lis-teners. He reminded them his opinion might influence them in their views, but several students asserted there was no danger of that, that they arrived at their own decision. Opinion of Rabbi.

In an evaluation of the demon stration, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland declared it the "best testimonial possible for soundness of freedom of discussion in our

"The spirit of free thinking," he said, "is being throttled in many parts of the world. Thought is beparts of the world. Thought is being regimented. The Germans boast they have nationalized truth. They are teaching their children to think with their blood, not their minds. Teachers are fast becoming drill sergesnts."

A striking figure with a shock of black hair, keen dark eyes and a powerful voice, he warned: "Ignorance is not the greatest menace to civilization or deterrent to prog-ress. Propaganda is. It is far more cunning, shrewd and organ-ized, a complete technique for undermining the human mind with half truths and catch words. Its purpose is to substitute hysteria for education.'

Freedom of speech, he declared, means "significant speech in sig-nificant places." And freedom of nificant places." And freedom of speech in the classroom is significant, he asserted, "not something granted to you by the board of education or the people who pay school taxes, but an unalienable

The Teachers' Job.

The teachers' job, he said, is not to make party converts or incite into political action, but "to open doors, lift curtains, inform fairly, frankly, without passion or bias, but also without subterfuge."

If it is the purpose behind the

teachers' loyalty oath movement to stop discussions in the classroom and "turn the students over to propagandists outside the class-room," then the policy is danger-ously short-sighted, he asserted.

EDUCATORS HEAR 'FREE SPEECH' CLASS

St. Louis Pupils Discuss in 'Model Session' the Effects of New Deal.

DISPLAY IS COMMENDED

Taussig and Rabbi Silver Back Classroom Discussion-Threlked Is Elected.

ST. LOUIS, Feb. 26.—Only one public school class in S. Louis went to school today, but that class showed 5,000 school administrators from all parts of the country how freedom of speech really works in the class room.

Meanwhile, at another session, Charles W. Taussig, chairmar of the advisory committee of the National Youth Administration, was urging high school courses to reveal "the whole sordid story of ward heelers, spoils system, lobbies and corruption" and the nature of propaganda.

In a regular class session on the stage of the convention hall twestynine high school seniors held a frank discussion of the New Deal before the Department of Superintendence of the National Education Association. They gave their opinions of the Supreme Court and the Constitution and by a vote of almost 3 to 1 they disagreed with their teacher and with the majority decision of the court on the AAA

Every point of "academic free-dom" the school men have debated for four days was brought out in

the demonstration class.

"Why should mine men decide for 128,000,000 people?" one girl asked.

"We have to have somebody to hold back Congress," ventured another.

other.

"Congress can impeach members of the court," offered a boy.

"But you can't impeach a man because he doesn't agree with you," countered a girl.

Opinion Differs on New Deal.

Opinion seemed to follow much the same range as in an acult group. While one boy condemned the New Deal as a three-year experiment in socialism at a cost of \$24,000,000,000,000," another hotly contended that "if the New Deal could have a redeal with the cards unstacked—with power to carry out the NRA and the AAA—it would be a great success."

NEW YORK LAUNCHES DRIVE FOR U. P. A.

AS WOMEN OPEN U.P.A. DRIVE

NEW YORK, March 4, (JTA) -- A two-point program calling for alliance with the forces combatting Nazism and the speedy rebuilding of a Jewish homeland in Palestine was urged upon the Jews today by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, of Cleveland, co-chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, addressing 1,000 women at the opening of the women's campaign of the Appeal at the Astor.

Another speaker was Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, women's leader, who bitterly denounced the Nazi regime and offered her own two-point program for aiding refugees: receiving as many as possible of them here with hospitality and pressing the movement for providing a home for them in Palestine.

The meeting accepted a \$200,000 quota in the \$1,500,000 New York campaign. Other speakers were Mrs. William D. Sporborg, chairman of the women's division and Nathan Straus, chairman of the New York Appeal.

"We will not go back to the ghetto," Rabbi Silver asserted. "We may be dragged back there, but we will ally ourselves with all the liberal forces of the world to undermine and destroy the reactionary forces."

He asserted that "history has not said its last word. The Nazi regime is three years old and the Jews are 3,000 years old.

He urged as a measure of "national self-defense" that the Jews unite "with all the groups in the world who see in this violent reaction a menace to the whole of modern civilization."

He declared that "the Jew who does not throw himself into the battle which is raging today is underwriting his own suicide."

Lauding the Jews' achievements in Palestine, Rabbi Silver appealed for "building as rapidly as we can of our own Jewish homeland."

Rabbi Silver spoke in the evening at a reunion of delegates to the hual Zionist convention in the Bronx.

Mrs. Catt asserted, in speaking of the Hitlerite regime, that "never before has an ordered society deliberately and with intent so porsecute a minority of its own citizons."

She added that the Third Reich has taken away from the Jews "their citizenship and the right to hold administrative positions. has denied educational fecilities to their children and economic freedom to the adults.

"This is what Germany has done to the Jews. She has taken away their citizenship and the right to hold adthe adults."

BAKER SAYS LEAG PREVENTED BIGW

"This thing is clear-the existence of the League has for a year required the greatest military powers of the world to discuss and debate in the open their plans and their controversies, and, accordingly, no nation is now bold enough to believe that it can surse a plan which it cannot explain persuasively enough to secure the sympathy of the disinterested part of the

"The League has represented not merely the great powers which used to dominate European policy and were at the head of the respective power systems which maintained the balance, but it also represents the small powers which once trailed along in the wake of European national overlords.

"For years the League, like any other new institution, was hesitant about its powers. It achieved some successes and some disheartening failures. It has not yet acquired authority enough over the imaginations of men to lead the great powers to rely upon it rather than upon the strength and readiness of their own military preparation." Mentioning the Ethiopian dis-pute, Mr. Baker went on:

"It seems quite certain that, but for the existence of the League of Nations, Europe would long since have been plunged into the disaster of the second world war. The League at leas; has given the world a year of debate instead of a year of battle and it may yet save us from catastrophe.

Mr. Baker urged that the American Government do nothing to obstruct the League's workings.

"Those who are interested in peace and who realize that American interests are involved in world peace even though America be not involved in world conflict can take heart when they realize what the League of Nations has come to mean in the world and what it is now doing for the preservation of world peace," he said.

Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver in Symposium at University Deplores Arms Race.

CHRISTIANITY ASSAILED

Dr. John H. Race Declares Education and Religion Must Face Challenge.

Religious education is the only defense against governmental systems such as communism and fascism that deny the liberty and the dignity of the individual, three distinguished men representing the Protestant, the Jewish and the Catholic religions declared at the University of Chattanooga yesterday.

Dr. John H. Race, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver and the Rev. Father John F. O'Hara said, in a symposium on "Religion in Education," that man possesses rights as an individual that are separate from his rights as part of the society of a state.

Religion Curbs Absolutism.

Father O'Hara, president of Notre Dame university, said at the university semicentennial session yesterday afternoon that "against the encroachments of absolutism only religion, with its affirmation of the rights of the individual soul, stands the test of history as the one universally effective barrier."

Rabbi Silver, of The Temple, at Cleveland, O., who addressed yesterday morning's audience, as did Dr. Race, saw in propaganda, nationalism and the totalitarian state the greatt menaces of the present day, at a time when he declared all nations, including the United States, are in the greatest armament race in history, internationalism has become an object of contempt, international cynicism prevalls and treaties are "casually broken."

Challenge to Christianity Seen.

Dr. Race, publishing agent of the Methodist Episcopal church and a former president of the University of Chattanooga, declared both the systems of communism and the totalitarian state are "militantly alive," are "unquestionably able to show certain benefits" and their claims to being superior to Christianity represent a challenge that "places every one on a moral battlefield."

Father O'Hara said belief in the immortal destiny of the human soul is the only principle upon which academic freedom and free speech can be upheld.

Rabbi Silver said that in opposition to the totalitarian state, which would crush the human spirit, religion is the one influence that can effectively uphold the "simple truths of human co-operative living."

Appearing before the university auience despite illness with sinus trouble and against the advice of a physician who was summoned to his ho-tel room earlier yesterday morning. abbi Silver said "religion has an reduity in our day to teach-and it may frequently run counter to the ngs of the state—that there are inalienable rights that belong to a man because he is a man and no because he is a part of society."

"Propaganda," he asserted, "is the greatest enemy of progress today; it is organized and skillfully directed; it appeals to the primitive in people, and drives them to an action they would not lend themselves to if they were not stirred up."

ent day as practiced in the cause of dictatorship, has appealed to the young people, "who could be inflamed as the more mature could not," Rabbi Silver said, and continued: "Education that stops at efficiency is a menace to society. The most dangerous epochs in history are those in which the human mind has run too far ahead of the human spirit, in which invention has not been harnessed by equally high ethical purpose."

"What religion gives to education is a way of life," he declared. "A way of life based on tremendous convictions derived from the distilled experiences of the human race over countless generations, and equally tremendous hopes that are the mandates of the human heart. " " What are you to teach? You are to teach guidance."

"Religion throughout history has been the alma mater, the nourishing mother, of education. Religion has nothing to fear from science; its institutionalism and superstition masquerading as religion and vested hierarchy alone have been afraid of science."

"Some of the ideals, the axiomatic truths of religion are being threatened. Religion has a greater opportunity today to save the world than it has ever had before in history." Telling of an audience he had with Mussolini, shortly after the fall of the German republic, Rabbi Silver said he asked the duce where a line of division occurred between the rights of the state and the rights of the individual. He said Mussolini replied, "Beyond the state, nothing," and declared plainly that in Italy the collective lile was being deliberately stressed at the expense of individual life.

Suppression Breeds Evils.

Both Christianity and Judaism may agree with subordination of the in-dividual to the collective life, but "the trouble comes when the individual is suppressed, when education become

trouble comes when the individual is suppressed, when education becomes indoctrination, when the church is made a chattel of propaganda for a political party," the rabbi said.

"Religion has an opportunity in our day to teach—and it may frequently run counter to the teachings of the state—and there are inalienable rights that belong to a man because he is a man and not because he is a part of society," the speaker asserted.

"To save the integrity of human personality is one of the supreme opportunities of religion."

Citing that "the only groups that dared raise their voices against the totalitarian state of Germany were the organized religious bodies," Rabbi Silver said, "There has not been any age in Central Europe when nationalism and racialism were so infamous, so inflamed and chauvinistic. I have never known Europe to be so disintegrated."

Internationalism in Disrepute.

Internationalism in Disrepute.

"Internationalism has become a word of contempt, fear and hate, like pacifism," he said. "It is a madness which is sweeping over the world today and in this discord and fury your religion and mine have a great opportunity to stress the simple truths of human co-operative living.

"Only a few years after the terrible experience of the World war, the nations now are engaged in an armament race the like of which the world has never seen—our own country included. International cynicism prevails; treaties are casually broken.

They do not want the Boyd-Hunter bill which was passed by the House and demanded by organized labor. It is the only bill yet introduced which meets the requirements of the federal social security

Senate leaders blocked the bill in another Senate committee. When they thought it might pass the Sen-ate if gotten out of committee they formed the Research Committee to give further study to a question which has had legislative study in

Ohio for six years.
What Senate leaders and som representatives of retailers really want is to see no unemployment insurance bill passed.

The McIntyre-Lipscher bill which is called a state-wide pool plan with automatic merit rating, permitting employers who have accumulated certain specified reserves to stop paying the state tax as long as their reserves are maintained or to guar-antee a certain amount of employment each year.

"I feel no restraint of convention in saying that when a nation persits in such a cruel course we should sever all diplomatic relations," the senator added.

In what he termed a "cool dispassionate" estimate of the Roosevelt administration in a time of partisan bitterness, Rabbi A. H. Silver yesterday balanced the good against the bad for his congregation at the temple, giving Roosevelt a decided edge.

"It is idle to maintain," he said, "that the economic chaos which Roosevelt inherited would have reshaped itself into recovery and prosperity if only it had been given time

Mussolini's dominion over Italy will end in "blood, tragedy, horror and shame," Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of the Temple, Cleveland, O., declared yesterday in an address at the Covenant Club.

"One serious mistake by Mussolini," said Rabbi Silver, "and the same mob that now acclaims him as a hero and the savior of his country will turn and rend him. Fascism and Bolshevism have the same technique. Yet the methods of the Russians are branded as tyrannous and inhuman, while the harshest word applied to Mussolini's is 'unique.' The difference is that Fascism is the lackey of capitalism.

"It is said in favor of Mussolina and in criticism of democracy that he has made Italy prosperous. Yet children work there twelve hours a day for the equivalent of 25 cents. Prosperity is not the sole function

of government."

A Story of Jews Who Need Aid Told to Jews Who Can Give It

RABBI SILVER ADDRESSES J. W. F. LEADERS

At Federation Dinner Wednesday, Dr. Abba Hillel Silver Gives Stirring Talk; Ernest Peiser, Geo. Oppenheimer and Louis H. Ehrlich Speak, Also

250 members of Special Gifts Committee No. 1 and the division chairmen and generals of 1936 Federation campaign, a stirring address by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland was heard. This session, held Wednesday evening at the Hotel Muchlebach, was presided over by George Oppenheimer, Chairman of Special Gifts Committee No. 1. Final instructions were given to the members of his committee and the other drive leaders.

Mr. Oppenheimer characterized the 1936 campaign as "a voluntary and spontaneous demonstration of the greatest of human virtues—giving." He instructed his own division in their particular responsibility in making the campaign a successful one. He explained the urgent necessity of raising approximately \$40,000 more than in the previous drives. Ninety per cent of this increase, he said, will go abroad for European relief and for establishing a home in Palestine and other lands for German and Polish

"In previous years the Federation raised about \$103,000, of which about \$30,000 came from non-Jewish sources, Mr. Oppenheimer stated. non - Jewish This latter amount cannot be increased and will probably be decreased. This leaves \$75,000 actually raised from Jewish sources. Out of this \$75,000, the amount of \$50,000 has been raised annually from Special Gifts Committee No. 1, so you can plainly see that you must secure an average increase of fifty-five per cent from your prospect. This also means that in every case where it is financially possible, you must obtain double last year's subscription, in order to off-set those individuals who may be unable to increase at all.

Information for Prospects

"Now what are you going to tell your prospects? You are going to tell him that this money must be raised, even if he has to sacrifice some personal pleasure. We all know that it will not necessitate the sacrifice of

At a meeting attended by nearly essentials, particularly for members of this group. You are going to meet with some prospects who will state, individually, that 'he feels that is giving out of proportion at this time, and that he might be willing to give more if Mr. 'So-and-So' and Mr. 'Somebody-Else' would give more."

"There are two outstanding aspects to this statement. One is the very

definite sincerity of your prospect's opinion. The other is the very certainty that the same statements will be made by Mr. 'So-and-So' and Mr. 'Somebody-Else' and so, we establish a vicious circle. Somebody must break this chain. You will tell the prospect that the man to break it is he.

"As you listen to the reasons why we must raise this quota, I can well imagine that some of them may fill your hearts with sorrow and your eyes with tears. But I want you to tell your prospect that, while his tears do him credit, they heal no wounds, and that he should save his tears and give his dollars."

Emest E. Peiser, general campaign chairman, expressed confidence that

the larger as well as the smaller donors would keep faith with the Federation and answer the demands of the 1936 campaign. He praised the work of each of his aides, and declared that everything was in complete readiness for the beginning of the drive.

Louis H. Ehrlich, who has been the president of the Federation since its inception in 1933, presented the principal speaker of the evening, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver. He briefly recounted the history of the Federation and its work in creating communal harmony, with a Board of Governors composed of 41 individual representatives of all segments of the community.

Rabbi Silver Reviews History

In one of the most stimulating and challenging addresses ever heard here, Rabbi Silver revealed why he has become recognized as one of the foremost American Jewish leaders and a principal figure in the American rabbinate. He began by declaring:

"As a rule if Jews have, they give. Jews have a sacred tradition of giving. For centuries we have known the indispensable nature of giving, as no Jewish community in the Old World knew when or to whom the necessity of giving might come next. The pres ent era abroad is comparable to no period since the Crusades in the Middle Ages."

Youth Marches in Brigades

Chauvinism and racialism are now rampant, Rabbi Silver declared. Where boys and girls once sang with the fervor of youth, now they march in brigades, preparing for the next war. We are living in an insane world, in many sections of which the future of the Jewish minority has become most untenable. A wave of the need of a Jewish Homeland forty anti-Semitism has poisoned the minds years ago," he said. of youth and even the intellectuals in the universities. Narrow nationalism and the scarcity of jobs-not nearly enough to go around-have created a bitterness which has wreaked havoc amongst Jews throughout Europe.

Liberal ideas have been made distasteful by attributing them to Jewish origins. This situation does exist not in Germany alone. It is merely dramatized there. Three million Jews in Poland, and Jews throughout Rumania, Austria, Hungary and the Near East, totaling five million of our people, are affected. Since you met a year ago for a similar purpose, the threatened Nuremburg Laws have become a fact, and Jews have been outlawed as citizens of Germany, without guarantees or rights.

School Doors Closed

Since you last met. Dr. Silver pointed out. Jewish boys and girls have been thrown out of the public schools in Germany. Today the Jews of Germany are making frantic efforts to open schools, to spare their children from ignorance and illiteracy, and are training teachers. A medieval barbarism has crashed down upon the Jews of Europe, and they are being proscribed in their professional and business relations.

The boycott against Jewish business men is continuing a little less noisily in Nazi Germany because of the coming Olympic Games, which is expected to bring great sums into its depleted foreign exchange. But the Jews of that country are writing a magnificent chapter in history of courage and unbroken morale. Once giving help to other Jews, the wheel of fortune has turned so that they are now in a desperate plight.

Now they raise their heads and say, "Do not let us sink-save us from the mire. We want to keep our schools open for our children; to maintain our cultural centers for our people who can find no other putlet today for their interests; to keep open our homes for the aged and the orphans." And the number of those poverty stricken is growing apace. At Passover time over 15,000 families were given matzos.

Hailed As A Leader
"Amid a veritable whirl of engagements, Rabbi Silver has found time, somehow to study, to write and to think out the problem of life and arrive at a solution. I begin, said he, by recognizing the simple fact that I am a Jew. This means certain disadvantages -the disadvantages of finding oneself inevitably in a minority and subject to the prejudices to which minorities are liable. On the other hand, it means advantages which only a Jew enjoys. No cummunity in the world has ever produced such a literature, and I am one who considers that this literature, is supreme over the more ephemeral writings that are produced toal writings that are produced to-day. Also, as Jews, we have tradi-tions and bonds of union which are our own and priceless. In deal-ing with our young people, there-fore, I do not try to suggest the abolition of what is called discrimi-nation. I prefer to arouse in our boys and girls that sense of the value of their own heritage which will render them immune to these will render them immune to these stings and arrows of social animosity.

"I know that we are passing through a period of materialism. So be it. But the church is organized for the express purpose of steadying society during these spiritual depressions. It is our business in these days simply to have going and in due course. keep going-and, in due course, we shall pass out of the trough of the wave and mount again to the crest of its successor. Once more, we shall see visions and dream dreams of the unseen that lies beyond these voices.' "Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver im-

With approximately \$230,000 raised towards the \$323,550 Allied Jewish Campaign quota as forms for this issue of The Detroit Jewish Chronicle were prepared for the press late on Thursday, leaders in the community joined in issuing an urgent appeal to Detroit Jewry pleading for immediate liberal contributions to assure the complete success of the present drive.

Leaders in the general division, under the chairmanship of Abe Srere, are redoubling their efforts during the week-end to raise the quotas assigned to them. In the meantime, the pre-campaign division, under the leadership of Henry Wineman, is approaching its goal of \$240,000.

An inspired gathering of campaign workers officially launched the drive on Tuesday evening, at the opening dinner at Hotel Statler, when Dr. Abba Hillel Silver of the Temple of Cleveland delivered the principal address.

Hebrew Union College Honors World-Figure, Ordains 13 Rabbis And Confers D. D. On Banker-Brother Of Commencement Speaker

Baccalaureate Address Of Abba Hillel Silver At Hebrew Union College Inspires Listeners

ABACCALAUREATE address A which will long be remembered by all who were fortunate enough to be present was delivered last Saturday afternoon at the 52nd Graduation Exercises of the Hebrew Union College in the college chapel by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, Ohio. Rabbi Silver did not stress the usual points contained in baccalaureate addresses to new Rabbis, such as qualities of character which are requisite for successful ministers, he did not admonish the graduates to be strong and courageous, nor did he dwell upon the pastoral element in the ministry. Robbi Silver in his address dwelt largely upon the question as to how the abbi can best fulfil his mission in such turbulent times as ours.

"No government is quite secure today," Said Rabbi Silver, "No people is quite certain of its tomorrow. Nations have simply despaired of planning their future. They live as it were, from hand to mouth. Each day is a day which brings them nearer to war or revolution. And in the midst of this universal insecurity and instability, the lot of our people is the most insecure of all. The times are desperately critical for all mankind-but most of all for that most sensitive seismograph of all mankind's earthquakes and disturbances-Israel.

"In such a time of tribulation," continued Rabbi Silver, "a rabbi entering upon his career will best fulfil his mission if he will set about to discover just what the predominant need of his age is, in the realm which he has made his own, and, upon such findings, determine what the predominant occupation of his leadership shall be. What does the world stand most in need of today? What does his people stand most in need of today? How can he, with that power of heart and mind, with which he has been endowed, and with that equipment, knowledge and insight which he has secured in this academy of learning, most directly, most relevantly, and most helpfully respond to those needs? What will be the burden of his message, the cry of his lips, the plea of his heart to his fellowmen in these darkening days?

"Uppermost in my mind today is the temper of the world into which you are entering as ministers, the desperate spiritual crisis in our civilization, the life-anddeath struggle which is raging today between the classic religious and moral tradition of mankind as represented by Judaism and the

new paganism of power, dictatorship, state totalitarianism, militarism, and racialism which is sweeping the world. I cannot help but be apprehensive concerning the quality of crisis and emergency which has entered Jewish life today. And I ask myself at this moment, watching the ordination of new rabbis in Israel, what shall a rabbi preach in these times? What shall be the center of gravity in his message and mission? Out of the treasure-trove of historic Jewish ideas, which shall he select to raise on high for ensign and banner to his troubled

Message of Comfort

Touching upon some of the specific duties of the rabbi today, Rabbi Silver concluded, "The rabbi would do well to bring today a message of comfort and confidence. There is a time to chide and a time to soothe. The harrassed soul of Israel today needs the healing, comforting word. It needs morale. It needs the reassurance of resplendent destiny, of ultimate victory, of the sheltering wings of God. In the hour of Israel's prosperity and power, our ancient prophets castigated their people, but in its dark hour of sorrow, defeat and exile, they spoke with a compassionate tenderness. They spoke of resurrection, of vindication, of restoration. Their banner over their people was The Synagogue should, in these days, be a place of spiritual refuge and heartening. From the pulpit should come to our people not querrulousness and cenesoriousness and part sanship and spluttering polemics and the bitterness of an impatient or disappointed spirit-"We walk no

better for abusing our crutches"but the strong, confident faith, the gladdening word of hope and the wise, practical guidance and instruction. In such times as these, I suspect that our people stand in greater need of sages than of prophets.

"The rabbi today should strive

not for unity in Israel-a task quite impossible of achievement among our people or among any other people-but for a maximum measure of cooperation on the basis of common needs and obligations. He should foster among his people the larger loyalty to the whole House of Israel-here and abroad-and the sense of a common destiny. Provincialism and protective isolationism are no longer possible for any Jewish community in the world today. The rabbi should encourage the cooperation of his people in the up-building of the Jewish Homeland in Palestine-not because that is the solution of the Jewish problem-there is no solution, for there is no one Jewish problemnor because he is enamoured of nationalism, which has more or less run riot in the modern world-nor yet because he feels that the Galut is liquidating and that there is no longer any hope for Jewish communities in the Diasporathat is a too-hasty reading both of past and of contemporaneous Jewish history as well as of the history of mankind, but because a Jewish Homeland will help to normalize the status of our people in the world, because it will remove the element of desperation-of fighting with our backs to the wall - from our renewed struggle for equality and emancipation, which the world has again forced upon us, because it will serve as a haven for hosts of our people who must now seek new homes in a world where doors are everywhere closing, and because this Jewish Homeland may become in the days to come a vast dynamo of creative Jewish cultural and spiritual energies."

The Honorary degree, Doctor of Hebrew Law, was conferred upon James G. McDonald of New York, former League of Nations High Commissioner for Refugees from Germany, who is now on the editorial staff of the New York Times, at the graduation exercises.

Maxwell Silver of New York, a graduate of the Hebrew Union College in the Class of 1916, and a brother of the Baccalaureate speaker, was awarded the degree of Doctor of Divinity.

Dr. Bernard J. Bamberger of Albany, N. Y., a graduate of the College of 1926, was awarded the first Kaufmann Kohler Memorial Prize of \$500.00 for his essay on "The Rabbinic Attitude Towards Proselytization and the Social Position of Proselytes within Jewry in the so-called Talmudic Period."

Rabbis George Lieberman and Abraham D. Shaw were awarded the Rabbi Morris H. Youngerman Memorial Prize for the best student sermon preached during the year in the College Chapel.

Rabbi Lieberman was also the recipient of the Social Research Prize of 100 dollars established by Simon Lazarus of Columbus, Ohio, for his essay on "Sectarian Factors in Contentions over Communism, Pacifism and Similar Controversial Issues"; Rabbi Shaw too, was awarded with a second honor-the Simon Lazarus Prize of 100 dollars for the graduating student who has completed the entire Collegiate Department in residence, has attained the highest academic standing, and has shown himself by character and diligence worthy of this honor.

Other students of the graduat ing class who were given awards in various fields are: Rabbi Sidney Berkowitz, who was awarded the Edward L. Heinsheimer Memorial Fellowship for Graduate study at the College, as well as the Adolph and Marilla Guttman Prize of 100 dollars for his essay on "The idea of the Perfection of Man in Maimonides." Rabbi Adolph Feinterg, who was awarded the Selma Straus Prize of 50 dollars for his essay on "The Universalistic Imrlications of the Concept of the "Day of Yahweh" and Rabbi Roland B. Gittelsohn, who was awarded the I. Fleischer Memorial Prize of 100 dollars for his essay on "The Synagog as Center of Social, Religious, Cultural and Fhilanthropic Activities of the Jewish Community: An Analysis and a Program."

Members of the student body who received awards on various essays include Sidney Ballon, Alexander Goode, Paul Gorin, Leonand Mervis, Arthur J. Lelyveld, Herschel Levin, Ely E. Pilchik, and Sam Sandmel.

Rabbi Samuel Chomsky and Rabbi Allan S. Green, both of the Class of 1934 were re-awarded fellowships they have held since their graduation.

Speaker's Advice

"My advice to you, going forth today to serve congregations, is to bring them messages of comfort and confidence - reassurance of a resplendent destiny," Dr. Abba Hillel Silver of The Temple, Cleveland, told 13 new rabbis in his commencement address at the Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati Saturday alternoon, May 23rd.

"Speak the truth, in love," he continued. "Be kind. Persuade through reason, and, through love, win men over.

"The times are critical for all men-but especially critical for the world's most sensitive seismograph-the Jew.

"You now go forth to serve in a world of ferment—a world, as Vergil described it, full of 'thundering by the deep Euphrates.' But your task is to rise above that thundering by teaching those truths which are timeless, indispensable.

Stresses Moral Law

"The first of these values is the supremacy of moral law. In the old days, others taught that 'there is no king but Caesar;' but the Jews taught that 'there is no King but Thee.' Today, others teach that the nation is supreme; we must cling to our age-old teaching that God and man are sacred

"Not Judaism but ourselves need a change. Let us not worry about being in transition; people always are. As Dean Inge observed: 'When Adam and Eve entered the Garden of Eden, Adam. said to Eve: "My dear, we now are entering upon an era of transition". '"

In addition to teaching the supremacy of moral law and bringing messages of comfort and confidence, the rabbi also should seek co-operation, large loyalty to all Israel, Dr. Silver said.

"Provincialism and protective isolation are no longer possible," he explained.

As to Palestine

"Thus we should aid the development of Palestine because, as Jewish homeland, it will help to normalize Jewish life-and not because, as some incorrectly believe, the Diaspora is a failure."

Dr. Silver warned of the doub :ful meaning of the phrase, "successful rabbi."

"I don't know what 'success' in the ministry means," "One of the most 'successful' ever broken heart.

"But this I know: your congregants may admire you for your scholastic achievements, but they will love you for bringing light into their daily lives. The pastoral element is very important. Serve them in love.'

\$20,075 RAISED ON FIRST NIGHT OF RELIEF DRIVE

Campaign to raise \$50,000 for suffering Jews in other nations gets under way

Responding to a nationwide appeal for money to relieve the suffer-ings of persecuted Jews in many nations, 500 leaders of the Jewish com-munity of Buffalo met at the initial dinner of the local campaign in Hotel Statler last evening. They contribated \$20,075, toward the \$50,000 fund which is the goal of the local drive of the United Palestine Ap-peal and the Joint Distribution Committee.

The first subscriptions were from Mrs. Eugene Warner for \$750, Mr. and Mrs. Louis Maisel for \$600, Mrs. Arthur Victor for \$500, and Mrs. Alice J. Steigerwald for \$350.

The local campaign will continue for eight days with committee luncheons on Thursday and Friday this week and Monday and Wednesday next week.

The chairman of the drive is Alfred M. Saperston; chairman of main committees are Harry J. Lehman, Mrs. Arthur Victor, Mrs. Sieg-fried Levi, Mrs. Maurice Lion and Eugene M. Warner. Head of the men's division is Charles Dautch; women's division, Mrs. Isador Setel; co-chairmen of the junior division, Hannah N. Schiff and Betty Warner, The appeal to the Jews of Buffalo

was led by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, rabbi of The Temple, Cleveland, O., who explained the plight of Jews in countries which are under domination of anti-Semitic governments, especially Germany Jews in Poland, Austria, Lithuania, Rumania and other European and Asiatic countries also are in need of elp from the Western World, the speaker declared; they suffer not so much from persecution as from

economic pressure.

"You may be surprised to learn,"
he declared, "that of the 3,000,000
Jews in Poland, more than 1,000,000
are starving. And the proportion of
sufferers holds true in many other countries. The Nazi virus has spread

countries. The Nazi virus has spread from Germany all over Europe.

"You may as well realize the truth that the Nazi regime has, through its propaganda, menaced the entire framework of Jewry throughout the earth. The poison distilled by Hitler, Goering, Goebbels and their cohorts has been ingeniously disseminated all over the globe.

"It is not only the 600,000 Jews in Germany who are menaced. It is every Jew in every nation. It is your obligation to all of them that I am bringing home to you.

The speaker pointed out that the refuge for stricken Jews throughout the world is Palestine, to which 65,000 Jews emigrated last year and which expects 75,000 more this year.

THE UNITED JEWISH CAMPAIGN OPENING DINNER MEETING

The great gathering of over Tuesday night to open the appeal in Buffalo of the United Jewish Campaign was truly inspiring to behold. This unified spirit in Buffalo Jewry is a revealing demonstration of the aroused interest and concern of local Jews in the unprecedented plight of their fellow Jews thruoghout the world in general, and of the cause of Palestine as a potent means of easing that situation.

The inspiring, and in many instances harrowing, tale told by Dr. Abba Hillel Si dyleeovm lb-Dr. Abba Hillel Silver moved the large audience, but it is strongly feared that few gave more than they could well afford. The amount raised at the opening dinner meeting was forty per cent of the quota sought to be raised in Buffalo, but it must be remembered that most of the generous givers are listed among the subscriptions reported last Tuesday night.

This raises a problem which Buffalo Jewry must face squarely. We cannot afford to fail in this effort. The stakes are too high. Much too high for the health of Jewry and Judaism, itself. Our brethren in Europe have reached the very nadir of despair, and unless we Jews of America come to their rescue, we can look forward to nothing but losing them from the great brotherhood of Israel. You have all heard about the political, social and economic destructive legislation which has all but destroyed the 600,000 Jews of Germany. among the very flower of Israel. Then too, today, we are hearing constantly of the actual physical pogroms the Jews of Poland have to face. Thousands of our brothers there have reached a depth in human existence, never even reached by the Jew in the middle ages in the vile ghettos of Europe. There are other countries, too, in Europe, where the political and racial theories of the Nazis are being employed gainst the Jews in those lands, and in many instances the Polish policy of pogroms is but the next step.

Despite the upset conditions, at the moment, the one bright spot

in Jewry is Palestine, where thou sands of our brothers are rebuilding the ancient homeland, not only as a haven of refuge for

the destitute and exiled of Europe, but where Jews can become five hundred people in the Grand self-respecting, constructive citi-Ballroom of the Hotel Statler zens of a land, the seat of their ancient greatness and culture. The work our Jewish brothers have accomplished has today produced a picture that is bright with hope and promise. Thousands of refugees from Europe have already rehabilitated themselves in Palestine, and have joined whole-heartedly in the effort of upbuilding a Jewish national home and seat of culture, where an Israelite may walk with head upright without the need to truckle to his "superior" neighbor, either socially or economically. To carry on this great work, at least to care for the most recent newcomers, money is still needed and the Jews of America should jump at the chance of doing their share in this noble effort, which in the last analysis, looks very much like the only hope left for the Jew.

We sincerely hope the enthusiasm expressed by the large attendance at the Opening Dinner meeting will inspire all other Jews in Buffalo who were not present and will be translated in terms of dollars for the local campaign. The work of Chairman Alfred M. Saperston and his associates in organizing so extensive a campaign merits the full support of the entire community to the extent of raising the minimum of the \$50,000 quota, every dollar of it, and more. Not merely in appreciation of their splendid efforts do we ask this; we ask it for those thousands of our fellow Jews whose very lives depend upon the money we are asked to raise in Buffalo, and for the firmer establishment of a place in the world where Jews may work and live as Jews without fear, and without apology for being Jews.

The workers who are now canvassing all the residences and business houses of our Jews of Buffalo are volunteers, serving without pay, and who are devoting their time, as well as their money to the success of this effort. When they approach you, receive them courteously and remember the cause they appeal for. Be generous. Make your subscription substantial. You will feel better, and you will have the added satisfaction of knowing you are really contributing to something that will redound to your personal benefit through the added security given your own position with the knowledge of a strong, healthy Jewry throughout the world.



Rabbi Silver Says He is Not A Z.O.A. Candidate

In Exclusive Statement to Jewish Advocate He Backs Rothenberg for Re-election -Rabbi Wise Being Boomed

(Exclusive to Jewish Advocate)

In a letter written specially to the Jewish Advocate, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland yesterday definitely announced that he was not a candidate for the presidency of the Zionist Organization of America and at the same time endorsed the candidacy of Morris Rothenberg.

Replying to a recent editorial in the Advocate which proclaimed him the outstanding man for the position, Rabbi Silver states that he "cannot accept" if offered the presidency.

The text of his letter follows:

"I thank you for all the nice things which you say about me in the editorial, but as for being a leading contender for the position of Zionist head' at the forthcoming Convention, I must say that you are under a false impression. I am not a contender for the office and I can not accept it if offered.

"The present incumbent of the office, Mr. Morris Rothenberg, has made an excellent president. He has brought to his position fine qualities of devoted and quiet leadership, integrity and a spirit of conciliation. His administration this year was particularly successful. His tour through the Middle West and the West in behalf of the Zionist cause was eminently successful and made a host of friends for Palestine.

"I trust that the Zionists of America will have the wisdom to re-elect him at the forthcoming

WISE PLEADS FOR UNITY

He and Rothenberg Are Rivals for Presidency - Spread of Clashes With Arabs Feared.

PROVIDENCE, R. I., July 4 .-Fifteen years after the most sensational convention in its history, the Zionist Organization of America met here today under circumstances threatening to produce a stances threatening to produce a split as dramatic as that at the Cleveland meeting from which Louis D. Brandeis, Julian W. Mack and Stephen S. Wise bolted with a defeated minority.

Lipsky at its helm.

Mr. Rothenberg, whose followers include Louis P. Rocker, finance committee chairman, has insisted he will not withdraw. Before the caucus this evening, however, it was said that an "effort was being made to find a formula making."

Late this evening caucuses were being held in a last-minute attempt to keep the factions from clashing in the formal sessions beginning tomorrow. But whether or not a settlement is reached, an issue will have been sharply drawn.

It is an issue of exceptional importance to Jews of almost all hades of belief because of the tension in Palestine. Zionists differ ECRISIS widely as to approach and proedure, but all agree on the re-esablishment of a Jewish national home and they know that the acute problem of Arab relations currently menaces all progress toward that

Specifically, the question is who shall be the next president of the organization. The candidates are the incumbent, Morris Rothenberg, New York attorney, chosen four years ago in a conciliatory move by the groups which grew out of the 1921 division, and Rabbi Wise.

Wise Urges "Unity Above All"

Dr. Wise is in London conferring with Dr. Chaim Weizmann, world Zionist chief, and representative of the British Government. Hi supporters, however, have received a letter declaring his willingness to accept the office. A pre-convention campaign got under way in New York weeks ago with Louis Lipsky at its helm.

Warburg, and their associates.

VISTS' DISPUTE CONTINUES SHARP

Fight Over Presidency Seems Likely to Ge to the Floor of Convention in Providence.

ROTHENBERGCONCILIATORY

A Compromise With Wise Looms -British Policy in Palestine Is Hit in President's Report.

PROVIDENCE, July 5. - Delegates to the thirty-ninth annual convention of the Zionist Organization of America here today upset the scheduled program to provide for a final settlement of the Wise-Rothenberg presidential issue tomorrow afternoon.

While a committee on nominations was deliberating tonight, with authority to select a candidate virtually certain of election, the probability that the fight would go to the floor remained strong.

The committee was generally expected to present, in a majority reort, the name of Rabbi Stephen S. Vise, for whom Louis Lipsky has irected an energetic campaign.

directed an energetic campaign.

But the minority was also entitled to submit a plea, whose effect would be to give to about 500 Zionists from all over the country an opportunity to re-elect Morris Rothenberg for a fifth term.

The sentiment for moving up the nominations report from Tuesday to tomorrow was made plain following a resolution by Jacob St. Louis, who asserted that too often in the past the report had been submitted after many delegates had left for home.

mitted after many delegates had left for home.

Abraham Spicehandler, an ardent supporter of Mr. Rothenberg, opposed it, but the president facilitated the vote and it was carried with a rumble of ayes.

From 3 A. M., when the extraordinary arbitration board set up last night agreed on a regular committee on committees, headed by Dr. A. J. Rongy of New York, until the close of the formal program this evening, leaders of the two factions kept reiterating that the situation had changed little.

Readiness to Compromise Seen

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Mr. Rothenberg's willingness to ompromise, along lines of the pro-osal submitted by Dr. Israel Gold-tein last night, seemed clear. In his administrative report to the convention, he made a vigorous plea for a broadened and united Zionist stand on a world-wide basis, stressing the emergency in the Near East.

The message, outlining Z. O. A. activities for the year, insisted that the membership join "in solidarity with Jews the world over in giving aid and comfort to our brothers in Palestine."

At the same time, Mr. Rothen-berg showed no desire to withdraw until the agreement, embodying certain administrative reforms recommended by himself, was formalized in detail by the conven-

His supporters, notably a Cleveland group associated with Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, were even less

Small Rothenberg caucuses persisted in the Biltmore corridors even after the committee on committees retired.

The general outlook, based on a canvass of representatives of both sides, Z. O. A. staff members and journalists who for years have been close to the movement to rebuild a Jewish national home, indicates

Jewish national home, indicates acceptance of the compromise with or without a floor vote.

Under its terms Dr. Wise would become president and Mr. Rothenberg administrative chairman. Complete accord on basic policies, which in the long run mean more than personalities to even the most stubborn extremists, seems certain. American Zionism sees its enemies as without rather than within.

As for the United States, Rabbi Silver said the best thing this country can do at the present time is to mind its own business and not attempt to play another messianic

"For Uncle Sam to call togther the ruling heads of Europe to a general love feast will result in nothing more than in having his pockets picked and finding himself on the way home without an important item in his customary accoutrement," he said.

He considers the present struggle in Spain of vast importance to the future of government in Europe.

"No one can foretell the outcome of the struggle," he said, "but if the Fascist adventurers in Spain are defeated, it seems likely that their defeat will mark the beginning of a definite recession of Fascism in Europe."

While discussing European observation, Rabbi Silver was anxious to learn what has been happening in Cleveland during the past eight weeks. He said this city has been very much in the news abroad what with its conventions, presi-

dential visit and Jesse Owens.
"By the way," he asked, "how much time do I have left to take in the Great Lakes Exposition?"

Rabbi Silver Calls Pre-Vote

Battle Here Child's Play Compared With Abroad.

Returning from Europe to find America in a sort of pre-election war mood with charges, incriminations, denunciations and rabble-rousing filling the air, Rabbi A. H. Silver said in his first Sunday lecture at the Temple yesterday morning that this was as child's play in comparison with the life and death struggles he had witnessed abroad.

We know that after Nov. 3 the we know that after Nov. 3 the smoke will clear away and men will go about their business regardless of which party is elected," he asserted. "Always before a national election American people view with alarm. After election they forget both the view and the election both the view and the alarm.

"In Europe this business is in deadly earnest. When they talk about revolution, overthrow of government, dictatorship and civil war over there they are not using scare-head campaign stuff. Nations either live in the very midst of them or are next door to them.

"I found abroad a sharpening of the lines of class cleavage and wid-

ening of the gasps between right and left. The sense of nation was yielding to the sense of class. Civil war is a far greater threat to many nations in Europe today than foreign war.

"Democratic Decision Impossible."

"The disheartening fact in the situation is the growing conviction that the conservative elements will not abide by a democratic decision at the polls if that decision runs counter to their vital interests. They

A MESSAGE FOR THESE TIMES

Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland was the baccalaureate orator at the commencement exercises of the Hebrew Union College last spring. His address on that occasion was a masterly utterance of profound significance which deserves wide circulation among Jews and Christians. Speaking of the function of Judaism in these troublous days Rabbi Silver said: "The fearful heresy of our day proclaims not the supremacy of the moral law but the supremacy of the state or nation. The state or nation can do no wrong. The party in control of the state can do no wrong. The party boss, the Duce, the Fuehrer, the Commissar can do no wrong. The eternal cry of the Jew through the ages has been not 'There is no king but Caesar' but 'There is no King but Thee!' The new paganism recognizes only one moral sin for which a nation should do penance—the sin of having been defeated in battle, and only one impartial judge above the nations (as one of the military experts of the Nazis declared)-success! The state is itself the right. It is the origin as well as the goal of all morality, and conformity with state ends, is conformity with the moral law. State absolutism is steadily degrading morality to political strategy, and robbing man of his freedom and dignity. There is here, as in other fields, an irreconcilable antithesis between the classic Jewish tradition and the new paganism. antithesis between the classic Jewish tradition and the new paganism.

The perspicacious among the new pagans knows it. That is why the Nazis, for example, have centered their bitterest attacks upon the Jew and Judaism and upon the Old Testament." The meeting was one of the mani-festations of turmoil within the Republican organization, turmoil which is based partly on a belief in the hopelessness of trying to carry Cuyahoga County for Landon, and partly on dissension between the regular ward leaders, who supported former Mayor Harry L. Davis at the mayoralty primary a year ago, and the Burton ward leaders, who supported Mayor Harold H. Burton.

Some Republican workers have been suggesting that the organiza-tion abandon efforts to get votes for Landon and concentrate on saving the county for Bricker and the other dates. Naturally this suggestion has not met with official approval of the

Burtonits Excluded.

The regular ward leaders, who won their control fights at the primary last May, have moved into Republican headquarters, with the result that the Burton ward leaders are practically excluded.

Alex Bernstein, who was put in charge of headquarters by County Chairman Daniel E. Morgan, issued orders that all applications for speakers, literature and campaign buttons should come through the regular ward leaders. This means that in some wards where the Buron and former Davis leaders are infriendly the independent ward oflubs can get neither speakers to address their meetings nor literature to distribute.

The dissension is not helped by the fact that there are many complaints over patronage. Many of the Burtonites are complaining that they have not got the jobs they thought they were entitled to.

It goes without saying, too, that the campaign funds will be distributed through the regular ward organizations. The colored wards are demanding \$50,000, three times as much as they ever had before, to counteract the Roosevelt sentiment produced there by plentiful WPA jobs.

Fear Landon Cause Lost.

This is about half the total campaign fund available to the Repub-lican organization in Cuyahoga lican organization in Cuyahoga County and many of the leaders do not believe the expenditure of any amount of money in the colored wards would do more than produce an even break between Roosevelt

Private information received by Republican leaders is that 60 per cent. of the colored vote will be cast for Rocsevelt this year unless some thing drastic is done to stop it. This would change a normal 25,000 Republican majority in these wards to a Roosevelt majority of about 5,000 votes, a net loss of 30,000 to the Republicans.

Those Republicans who advocate concentrating on saving the county for Bricker and the other candidates say that it is impossible to take votes and from Roosevelt in Cieveland and that unless the normal Republican voters who are sup-porting Roosevelt this year are edu-cated to mark a split ballot there is danger that an avalanche of straight Democratic tickets will re-elect Davey and sweep all Democrats into office. They argue that it is better to save as many Republican candi-dates as possible and forget about

"Civilization has become a race between propaganda and education," said Rabbi Silver, "We used to think ignorance was the greatest menace to human progress. Today the greatest menace is propaganda, for it has evolved a technique for befudding the mind by slogans, catch-words and half-truths. Its purpose is to appeal to the emotions and to stampede people into doing what in calmer and soberer moments they would not dream of doing."

He quoted a statement by Dictator Hitler, "The generating power of great change is not so much in insight as hysteria." The rabbi added, "And he used it to gain his ends."

"The greatest need for education today is to protect the mind of the student against the aberrations of our day, the apostasies against the basic ideals of civilization.

"There is a tendency to re-enslave the human mind, regiment thought and punish expression of dissonant opinion in totalitarian and absolutal states. Occasionally such manifestations even take place in our own country. There is too little education and too much propagands. It is not education but hysteria."

Out of Balance, Full of Aberrations, Says Rabbi in Address

A world "jittery, out of balance and full of aberrations" was pic-tured to school teachers of 15 eastern Nebraska counties by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, Cleveland, O., at the opening general session of District 2, Nebraska State Teach-irs' association, in the Orpheum heater this morning.

A registration of about 3,300 eachers is expected for the three-

leachers is expected for the three-lay convention running concur-rently with five other district-eachers' conventions in Nebraska. Rabbi Silver, after describing how totalitarian states "of the right and left" are systematically forcing the thinking of youth into line with four principal "aberra-tions," he declared: "It is the business of educa-tion in a democracy to resist these tendencies which we regard as fatal to civilization and human progress."

In and of the dictators Rabbi Silver told how "intellect is being made subservient to political sogmas of the autocracy in pow-ar" and how "deviation is heresy and leads to the concentration samp." "In our country, too," he added, "attempts are frequently made to muzzle education, to insimidate educators and to punish the expression of impossible or insimilate. The expression of unpopular or un-conventional views."

Rabbi Silver, to re-enslave the human mind, to control people in hysteria induced by propaganda. "Education," he asserted, "no

longer is given to teach the child to think, but to prepare, his mind for the state. In our country, attempts are being made to intimidate teachers.

"Our age has too little real education and too much propaganda. Propaganda has advanced to the point where it is pseudo-science.

'Glorification of war as national justice is the greatest madness in the world today. Battle is the business of every German. In Italy, children are bearing arms."

The rabbi urged the teachers

to "rally 'round" to resist any attempts to intimidate teachers.

He proposed the organization of course in high schools which would teach students to identify propaganda, and to "debunk state idolatry.

FREE DISCUSSI

Tells Teachers They Must Guard Youth from European Aberrations.

Attacking what he termed the four great aberrations of the present day-the effort to re-enslave the human mind, propaganda, nationalism and pseudo-patriotism glorifying war—Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, Thursday night at the university coliseum asked Nebraska teachers to guard American youth against such trends by encouraging individual thinking and allowing free classroom discussion.

"The ideal education in a democracy is to broaden the horizons of men so that they come to embrace the whole world," he said. contrasting this to the ingrown provincialism of fascist and communistic nations. He said, how-ever, that many Americans fail to recognize the real danger signs in this nation. "Many who rant against communism in the United States, particularly certain great newspaper chains, are not fighting communism but attempting to discredit every advanced piece of social legislation. Branding something 'red' obviates the need of a logical argument," Rabbi Silver

Telling how the teachers of Europe are regimented by their states, he warned against the encroachment of government on the rights of the individual. "The state exists for the citizen, not the citizen for the state," he de-clared. "I am not recommending the old brand of 'rugged individualism' but we must work out the proper balance between private and collective management of human life."

International League.

He spoke of the new European philosophy which makes the su-preme goal of the state conquest thru war, then declared that the only way permanent peace could be achieved was thru an organized international league, backed by an adequate police force, which would protect the weak nations from the strong. "The major contribution which the United States can make is not thru neutrality but by aid-ing international machinery to insure peace," he said.

Free discussion does not promote radicalism but on the contrary is the greatest conservative force that exists."

Of the problem in the schools, Prof. Roy W. Hatch of Montclair, N. J., said, "The teacher must remember he is to unshackle the minds of the students and give them a chance to think and say something worthwhile. The greatst danger confronting democratic institutions lies in those organizations that would stifle free discus-

Pupils Must be Taught.

"We need more intelligent leadership," Mrs. Grace Hyatt of Lin-coln said. "The teacher must be qualified to tell the pupil what is

right and what is wrong."
"What can .you do if you are branded 'red' for allowing free discussion or disagree with someone, Belle Ryan of Omaha asked. Dr. Horn answered that fairness was usually sufficient protection and Dr. Hatch recommended "common

PULPITS BARR AS RECRUITING POSTS FOR WAR

Cleveland Preachers Use Armistice Day Approach as Occasion to Warn for Peace

By PAUL MILLER

Armistice Day themes in Cleveland pulpits yesterday were declarations for the most part that mever again would churches be used as recruiting stations.

Some ministers outlined plans for maintaining peace by conferences, others suggested the church attend to church affairs solely and show by Christian example the purposelessness of war.

Speaking on the current question as to whether the church and synagog should fight Communism, Rabbi A. H. Silver at The Temple said, "No."

Warns of Hitler's Game

"As I see it, neither the church me synagog can indorse Com-m, holding as it does a philosof materialism, the right of control by dictatorship and an antireligious program," Rabbi Silver

"Failure to indorse Communism does not mean that the church should institute a crusade, under the guise of a holy war, against Communism.

"Should the church fight Communism, she would find herself allied with other forces whose motives may not be as honorable and as altruistic, with forces opposed to justice for the underprivileged who are exploiting the Red menace in order to establish Fascism," he said.

"The chief crusader against Communism today is Hitler. At Nuremberg. Hitler called for a holy war on Soviet Russia.

"He wants Russian territory and Russian raw materials for Reich. His present strategy is to isolate the Soviet Union in anticipation of this war. The church and the synagog by inciting people throughout the world against Com-munism, by making it odious and untouchable, will be playing directly into der fuehrer's hands. Rabbi Silver said there might be

reason to question the wisdom but not the motives of such an aggression if the fight on Communism was coupled with a similarly vigorous fight on Fascism and Nazism. He pointed out that there has been no call for a church crusade on the latter two.

"This situation," he said, "the call to fight Communism and not Fascism, or Nazism gives the impression that it is not liberty of the people the church is concerned with, but liberty of the church; not so much dictatorship which it abhors as the dictatorship which interferes with the church's privileges and preroga-

"The danger involved in such a crusade on Communism is that it leads directly to the destruction of democracy and the establishment

of Fascism.

"That is the present lesson in Spain. That has been the lesson of the last 20 years throughout Europe. Not a single Communistic state has been established in Europe since 1920, but dezens of Fascist and semi-Fascist dictatorships have been semi-Fascist dictatorships have been established, and in nearly every instance, through the Red scare.

"The role of the church and synagog in the world which has gone mad, cynical and murderous is not to lend fuel to the flames, to in-

"There is already plenty of this in the world and there will be plenty more as the inevitable struggle between the right and left develops and gains in bitterness, brutality and ruthlessness. ruthlessness.

"Church and synagog can best serve mankind in the desperate years ahead as the great pacifiers, preaching reconciliation, moderation toleration and the protection of the elementary decencies of human life."

"They cannot make a frontal attack upon constitutional government, democracy, the rights of labor and advanced social legislation, the things that now embarrass the privileged classes. So they set about discrediting them by branding them as Jewish and alien. In every interpret it is not so much anti-Semas Jewish and alien. In every in-stance it is not so much anti-Semcharges against Jews but the knowledge that such charges will help them overthrow democratic government. They have succeeded in many

"Church and synagog can best serve mankind in the desperate years ahead as the great pacifiers, preach-ing reconciliation, moderation, toleraand the protection of the ele-Church and synagog should remain above state, class or party. But to all and at all times, it should seek

"The task of the church is far more positive, patient and permanent than to join a panicky crusade against a movement which, in the Unted States at least, as revealed in the last election, is so minute as to require a powerful microscope to find it.

"Church and synagog ought not to worry so much about Godlessness and materialism in Russia. There is plenty of it in Cleveland and in the United States. Here we have something worse than anti-religion. Here we have irreligious, lazy-going in-difference to it. Our churches and synagogs are open, to be sure, but how many come?

Urges Methods of Love.

"Anti-religion and materialism cannot be destroyed by destroying Communism. They existed long be-fore and will exist long after. The only methods which can yield the

St Paul Princepes Seeing the Community Chest and other welfare agencies as a means toward preserving democracy, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland urged 800 St. Paul Chest workers "to go forth in service of the com-munity" in a talk Friday night at the organization's opening dinner meeting.

The affair, which attracted the largest crowd ever attending such an event here, was in the Masonic temple, Sixth street and Smith avenue. Held just before the cam-paign's official start Monday, the meeting brought optimistic reports from divisional commanders on preliminary showings and promises of success for the drive, which will continue until November 24.

"There are class wars, revolutions and ultimately dictatorships when a people's basic wants are not cared for," Rabbi Silver sald. "Democracy and democratic institutions will survive in this country and elsewhere only when the more fortunate citizens become socially aware and spiritually sensitive to the wants of the less privileged.

"This social awareness is best ex-emplified in the work of voluntary units to help the destitute. This is the foundation of democratic gov-

ernment."

While citing improved economic conditions following a seven-year slump, Rabbi Silver, a nationally known public speaker and authority on welfare activities, sounded a note of warning with "the advent of the spirit of buoyancy".

"There has been untold human wreckage," he said, "during the past seven years and this damage, particularly on the spiritual side, must be rectified. Men and women, out of work, have had their souls scarred by bitterness. The load of responsibility for bringing about a spiritual as well as a material revival must fall on the private welfare agencies. It was through their work, aided of course by public organizations and government relief. that disaster was averted during the past depression."

Ralston Jerrard, head of the industrial division of the Chest, stated that 46 St. Paul firms had stated that 46 St. Paul firms had already reported 100 per cent contributions from their employes. F. R. Bigelow, special gifts divisional leader, revealed a 20 per cent increase in preliminary pledges in his division over those a year ago.

E. A. Roberts, campaign chairman esided at the meeting. In addipresided at the meeting. In addition to brief reports and pledges of success from division heads, short talks also were given by Mayor Gehan and H. S. Sommers, president of the Chest board.

The campaign is for a fund of \$735,000, a \$5,000 increase over last year's total. The first report luncheon will be held at 12:15 P. M. Monday in the Athletic club.

A third of a century of the political life of Cleveland passed in review before the body of Maurice Maschke, veteran Republican leader, at the Tenple, Ansel Road N. E. and E. 102h Street, yesterday afternoon.

There were judges whom Mr. Maschke put on the bench, policemen whom he promoted, men whom he seated in the City Council, in the Legislature and in Congress, two mea whom he had helped elect mayor of Cleveland, one whom he hac made city manager, Democrats who had fought him since the days of Tom L. Johnson but who nevertheless respected him and knew the power that he wielded, the rich and the poor, the proud and the humble,

white and colored, Catholic, Protestant and Jew.

There were many in the audience of 3,500 who filled the Temple to capacity whose names are or have been Page One news. Among them were Walter F. Brown, former Mayor Herman C. Baehr, Mayor Harold H. Burton, former City Manager Daniel E. Morgan, Attorney General John W. Bricker, Congressman Chester C. Bolton, Rev. Dan F. Bradley, Edwin D. Barry, Harry J. Crawford, William H. Boyd, Paul Lamb, Rees H. Davis, A. J. Hirstius-just to mention a few.

But the most striking thing about the audience was the fact that the werwhelming majority consisted of common people whose names never get in the newspapers but whom Mr. Maschke at one time or another in his long political career had befriended.

The front and side of the Temple were banked with more than 300 floral pieces sent by Mr. Maschke's friends. Roses, chrysanth lilies predominated.

The funeral services were conducted by Rabbi A. H. Silver.

In his funeral oration Rabbi Silver

"This great outpouring of men and women is in itself a remarkable tribto the man whose earthly re mains we are about to consign mains we are about to consign to their last resting place. Here are gathered men of all creeds, of all races, of all parties, young and old, rich and poor. Here, round his bier, are assembled political friends and foes. 'Everybody is a friend to one who can give gifts,' says the

Biblical proverb. But this man is dead. His hands, folded in death, can bestow no gifts. And yet throngs of people from all ranks of society have come to this sanctuary today to evidence their sense of loss and to pay their respects to him.

"Surely something in the life and

character of the departed one, must have made an appeal to the heart and imagination of our community strong enough to have evoked such a tribute-something so strong as to overcome the disparagement which inevitably surrounds the career of any man who for a generation or more serves as the political leader

more serves as the political leader of a party.

"It is not difficult to point to that something. It was Maurice Maschke's essential kindliness and humanity. In the many expressions of sympathy which men have uttered in the last few days and during the days of his illness, none failed to stress this salient quality in the man—his rare capacity for friendship. He enjoyed befriending people. His friendliness of spirit was not based on calculation or on self-interest. It was with him an affection of generosity, of open-heartedness, of largeness of spirit. Some men are gifted with a temperament and disposition for friendship. Maurice Maschke was so gifted. His bitterest political foes could not resist the open-hearted kindliness of the man. kindliness of the man.

kindliness of the man.

"Such men are frequently imposed upon, victimized by those who make merchandise out of friendship. Maurice Maschke owed much to his friends and he was always grateful. He never ignored the obligations of friendship, often to his own hurt, and at times at the cost of the integrity of his judgment and the freedom of his action.

Friend to Unfortunate.

"The needy and the unfortunate found a friend in him. His door was always open to receive them. He was never too busy to listen to them. He was always approachable and always attentive to a man in need. He gave liberally to the support of the organized philanthrcpic agencies in our community. He was an active worker in our Community Chest and an inspiring division leader in the campaigns of the Jewish Welfare

Fund. "In the bitterest of political controversy he never forget the man-dates of tolerance and humanity. He dates of tolerance and humanity. He was never so desperate in purpose, so relentless in the pursuit of his objectives as to inflict pain. There was no hate in his heart. He had no desire to hurt, to crush an opponent, to add any new burdens to the already heavily burdened shoulders of men. He seldom had to guard himself against expressing harsh judgments and sharp denunciations. His native sense of geniality, fairness and good humor and his capacity to see also from the other man's point of view gave temperance and poise to his judgments, speech and action.

"Men trusted him. He kept his word. He was square. He inspired

"Men trusted him. He kept his word. He was square. He inspired confidence. Whether politics is a game, or should be played as a game—many of us will seriously question. But playing that game—Maurice Maschke never violated any of

rice Maschke never violated any of its rules. He was without gulle, hypocrisy, deception or dishonor. "Some of us differed sharply with him. Occasionally we attacked publicly his political policies, measures and methods. Some of us rejected both the laws and standards of his school of politics, although we recognized it as a characteristic feature of an spoch in American political life. But we knew that he always played fair and fought fair.

Their cpinion was aptly summed up by an editorial writer who commented on the morning of his death: 'He was a gentleman in politics and a politician who remembered to be a gentleman.'

"He was a gentleman throughout —courteous, cultured, of gracious manners and quiet dignity and utterly without affectation. His mind was keen, splendidly trained and well stocked. He loved the good things in literature. Hs was at home in the world of thought.





Rabbi Silver Says Hearers' Praise of God Shows Power in Pulpit.

"When a religion has something vital to say to mankind," he said, "it will find eloquent voices to say it and men to listen. When it becomes set, wearied and somewhat irrelevant to contemporary life, it will shelter itself in peaceful ritual. will shelter itself in peaceful ritual and poetically reminiscent cerepoetically and

monialism. "Preachers are sometimes thought of as weak and inconsequential. But there have been great episodes in so-ciety which were dominated by great preachers. Think of Luther, Zwin-gris Calvin and Knox during the thought preachers. Think of Luther, Zwin-gie, Calvin and Knox during the period of the Reformation. Think of the influence wielded by Channing, Parker, Brooks and Beecher in our own country. Think of Geiger, Jel-linek, Elchhorn and Holdheim and the impact of their word upon their generation.

Alds Worship.

"There are today in the Christian and Jewish pulpits of America men who are forces for civic righteousness in their communities, moiders of public opinion and trusted guides of myriads of men and women. Their communities would be the poorer but for their light and leadership."

Discussing the relation between preaching and worship, Rabbi Silver asserted that good preaching, instead of eclipsing worship, led to more devout worship.

"The test of good preaching is not whether men will praise the preacher but whether men will praise God," he said.

"In our day and in our temples worship is in danger of being eclipsed. Most people come to hear the preacher, not to pray. That is bad. Worship is a supreme religious exercise which, if neglected, atrophies the religious life of the individual.

"Preaching once or twice a week, at fixed intervals, without waiting for the urgency of something really worth while crying to be said, must make inevitably for a certain amount of meagerness in the sermon. Perhaps if preachers preached less they would preach better. But then the laity must cultivate the habit of attending divine worship even when there is no sermon.

"The layman can help the preacher to remain true to the classic traditions of his calling by not expecting the sensational in the pulpit. The pulpit should not be called upon to cater to the over-stimulated specities of our age for the novel and the sensational."

Two Trends of History.

"His ory is divided into two parts," he comtinued. "The east has given the world culture, and the west has given 2 civilization. Our destiny may be to bring the civilization of west to the culture of the east and give back, as a present to the world, a new culture from the east."

Referring to progress the Jews have reade in transforming Palestine into a fertile land, Dr. Mossinsohn

asserted that, through new implements and methods of irrigation, the Jews had made the country five times as productive as it was before.

"The event which overshadowed all else in Europe in 1936 was the revolution in Spain," said Rabbi A. H. Silver, in a sermon entitled "The Four Most Significant Events of 1936," at the Temple yes erday morning.

The event next in importance derived from the Spanish revolution, Dr. Silver said, and was the widespread gathering of the forces of democracy to resist the onrush of Fascism. The third was the inter-American conference for the making of peace, and the fourth outstanding event, especially for people in the United States, was the return of prosperity.

Of the greatest importance to Jew-ish life, is the present situation in Palestine, where Great Britain must make a decision for or against the Jewish cause. Dr. Silver said... In reviewing 1936 Rabbi Silver said:

OIDS RELIGI IS NOT FAILUR AS RABBI FEA

By PAUL MILLER W. Wofford T. Duncan, pastor of Lakewood Methodist Church, took exception in a sermon yesterday to the views expressed last Sun-day by Rabbi A. H. Silver, the Tem-ple, that both Christianity and Juda-ism were more or less failures as religion judging from present world

conditions. Rabbi Silver pointed to conditions in Germany, Spain, the Or ent, and referred to the rather chrotic conditions elsewhere that religion should have prevented.

"With the prophetic call of Rabbi

Silver last Sunday to religionists, both Jewish and Christian to renewed, sacrificial devotion," said Dr. Duncan, "We, of course, most heart-

ily agree. "We hardly feel, however, that the case against religion is quite so desperate as he describes.

"Of course the actual always suffers when compared with the perfect ideal. To describe the desperate wickedness of the world and then say that both the Old Testament and the New contemplated a world of righteousness, might easily construed as evidence of the failure of both.

"However, by such process could call science, education and culture of every kind colossal failure. The dream of medical science is a healthy world, yet millions are sick and death still takes its toll of the young and middle aged.

"The ideal of education is the banishment of illiteracy yet millions cannot read or write, and even where educational systems have been adopted it is easy to find low levels of intelligence and vast ignorance.

"In spite of all these contradic-tions, we do not write science, or medicine or education down as failures. None of them operates 100 per cent yet none of them has failed. The prophetic vision always outruns the actual accomplishment.
