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Rabbi Silver's Choices Not All-Inclusive, He Says: 'No A Monopoly on Genius.'

"Greatness is a co-operative achievement." Rabbi A. H. Silver said in discussing "The Ten Greatest Figures in History" at the Temple yesterday morning. "There is no great man without his precursors. Every great man is the apex of a

every great man is the apex of a pyramid.

"Even a hasty survey will convince one that greatness is not the monopoly of any one nation or race. Genius is international. Long heads and short heads, brown eyes and bine eyes have nothing to do with it. "A working definition of a great man may be the man who by his discovery of new truth has made a lasting contribution to mankind. And that newness may come through the

that newness may come through the medium of science or of art. There is revelation in poetry, music, painting and sculpture quite as much as there is in physics, chemistry or biology."

Cites Cumulative Labors.

In choosing the ten greatest figures of history, Dr. Silver pointed out:

"The truly great of the earth far exceed the number ten, or ten times ten. Our civilization is not the achievement of ten people. It is the result of the cumulative labors of countiess men and women, the great and the near great, who through the ages have added grain by grain to the storehouse of human knowledge."

Following are the ten figures listed by Dr. Silver:

"1—Homer—whose songs have carried their precious freight of beauty down through the ages. There was no European literature before Homer. He gave to posterity the 'grand style' in poetry and the technique for volcing man's deepmost passions, hopes and fears, in accents at once simple, noble and perennially tresi.

"2—Aristotle—a man who taught the race the technique of experimental science, of exact observation, record, classification and inductive

reasoning; the man whose colossal intellect dominated the world for twenty centuries. "3-Copernicus-the man who lib-

erated the mind of the race from

the Ptolemaic system in astronomy, whose system established the fact that the cartir was not the center of the universe but only one of its planets, and caused one of the major revolutions in human thought.

"4-Michelargelo-the incarnation of the spirit of the Renaissance, the man who was crowned, to use Emerson's phrase, with the four crowns of architecture, sculpture, painting and poetry; the man who, in stone and on canvas, reveals the amazing energy and wonderful strength which one finds in the literature of the Old Testament.

"5-Shakespeare—the greatest

"5-Shakespeare-the greatest name in all literature, whose mind name in all literature, whose mind and art were as vast, varied and unfathomable as nature herself. His genius created a race of imaginary men and women who will live immortally among us mortals.

"6—1seac Newton—who laid the foundations of all modern physics and engineering, who established the universal reign of law and brought order and harmony into our concept of the world.

Economic Reconstruction Should Be Sought, Says Silver

The world is still in the dark ages as far as advancement of social work is concerned, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, Ohio, said Monday at the monthly meeting of the Central Council of Social Agencies in the New Orleans Public Service Inc. auditorium.

"Social workers should begin an economic reconstruction of society." Rabbi Silver said. "My appeal goes out to you today not to be satisfied to remain within the confines of your profession, but to envision the problems of government and arouse the intelligence of the people."

The youth of the Old World is be-

ing forced into uniform to prevent the masses of the people from gaining access to things which they believe they are entitled, and because hey are determined to destroy everything to get them, Rabbi Silver

"Machinery has been a great boon to the laboring man; it has removed the curse of drudgery, giving him time for leisure," he continued, "The machine is good, provided it is not exploited for the sake of a privileged few.

"Palliative, remedial, preventive and adjustive measures have been the program of social workers. Let us now work for the economic order of greater fairness and justice and cency. The call of the day is for a holy crusade-justice and more jus-

66T AM opposed to the suggested changes in the structure of I the Supreme Court as set forth in the President's mes-ge. I cannot see how, from a practical standpoint, business will be expedited or more cases heard by the court with 15 members than with its present nine members, because every judge has to hear every case, and it probably will consume more time for a court of 15 judges to hear and decide cases

than for a court of his judges to for than for a court of nine judges to do so.

"If the law is changed in the manner suggested, it will place entirely too much power in the hands of the executive branch of the Government and will have a tendency to destroy the balance of power between its three branches at which our forefathers aimed and intended to preserve when the Constitution was adopted. present members of the Supreme Court have desided the important cases heard by them during the past several years n accordance with

was adopted.

"While it may be true that Congress has the power to enact the proposed changes into law, it is my belief that such a drastic reorganization of the judicial branch of the Government should be accomplished only by an amendment to the Constitution, and with an opportunity to the people of the various states to express their will upon a subject as important as this.

"I think most lawyers are instinctively opposed to any measure which seeks to lessen the power, authority and dignity of the judicial branch of our Government and to place any part of that power in the hands of the executive.



Sincerely hope that when this subject comes before Congress for consideration and debate, our Senators and Representatives will not hesitate to express their real views upon the important subject involved.

"The principle of retirement from active duty at or near 70 has received the widest acceptance in the business and the academic worlds, in the Army and Navy, in civil service and elsewhere. There is no conceivable reason why it should not be applied to the all-important and heavily burdened federal judiciary and particularly to the Supreme Court of the United States.

"Everyone will agree that the Supreme Court cannot but be greatly improved by "new blood." It does not follow, of course, that older men are necessarily more conservative than younger men. The oldest member of the present Supreme Court. Justice Brandels, has been outstandingly liberal, and so was the aged Justice Holmes. Nevertheices, the Pracident rounts out the present.

Rabbi Silver Scores Speech of Saturday; Discounts Accomplishments

"Hitler's four years' record is indeed a shabby one, and the price paid by the German people for his meager achievements has been truly appailing," Rabbi A. H. Silver said in an address entitled "Four Years of Hitler" at the Temple yesterday

"Fitter's speech of Saturday was as weird a performance, and as full of erasions, distortions and cant, as has ever come from the mouth of a leader of government," Dr. Silver and

has ever come from the mouth of a leader of government." Dr. Silver said.

"He brags that the Nazi revolution occurred practically without any bloodshed. Was there no one among the 141 yes-men in the Kroll Opera House to remind him of the thousands who were beaten to death in the prisons and concentration camps, shot in the back while 'excaping,' and driven to suicide by Nazi brutality Had every one forgotten the bloody purge of June 30, 1934?

"But the height of mendacity is reached when he taunts Spain with the 170,000 persons who have been killed in the Spanish civil war and lays the fevolution at the door of Sparish democrate. Does Hiller meas to persuade the world that the revolution in Spain was the work of the loyalist democratic government against itself? Or that thousands of these men, women and children who have been sain were not the victims of the guns, tanks, airplanes and soldiers has Hiller himself sent into Spain?

"In the political field he succeeded in acrapping the military clauses of the Versailles Treaty. That means that under the guise of restoring German prestige he has shackled a militarism upon the German people which is draining its life blood.

"In the economic field he reduced unemployment. But so have democracles since 1933, without resorting to terrorism and totalitarianism. Most of the reduction was achieved by putting the unemployed into munition manufacturing industries which produced no wealth and into an armament program which will drive Germany into war.

"There have been no achievements in the field of foreign affairs. "Gross-deuts:hland' is still an unrealized dreams. Austria has not been absorbed. Hitler has tried to get Memel and Dansig and has failed. He has tried to build up an affailed. He has tried to build up an anti-Soviet bloc and has failed. And he has intervened in Spain and has failed."

SILVER, BRICKNER TALK ON STRIKES

Rabbis in Sermon, Hold Legal Aspects of G. M. Situation Secondary

Both Rabbi Barnett R. Brickner and Rabbi A. H. Silver in sermons yesterday morning said that the purely legal aspects of the General Motors strike are secondary to the main issue. Rabbi Brickner spoke at Euclid Avenue Temple on "The Sit-Down Strike," and Rabbi Silver at the Temple, Ansel Road N. E. and E. 105th Street, on "Strikes!"

Strikes!"

In discussing the contention that sit-down strikes are a seizure of property and therefore illegal Rabbi Brickner said a strict and literal reading of the law made the strike illegal, but observed: "There is a social and a moral aspect to law, which must also be regarded."

Rabbi Silver said on the point: "A people's sens of justice frequently outdistances its laws. If the ends to be gained in a strike are just ends, so recognized by the people of the country, and if there is no other way of achieving them, except through the sit-down strike, you will find that the people of this country will come to tolerate it regardless of its illegality."

Cites Arbitration Experience

Cites Arbitration Experience

Speaking from his experience as arbiter of strikes in the Cleveland Street Railway and baking indus-tries, Dr. Brickner said:

"My experience leads me to believe that where both parties can be brought together before an impartial mediator or mediation board, and meet to talk with one another, common sense will get the better of

passion.

"Arbitration following strikes is always in bad blood. Frequently the real issues are lost sight of. Only in the case of a public utility do I believe in compulsory arbitration."

Discussing the question whether the present strike is simply one of union recognition and the closed shop, Rabbi Brickener pointed out that the union contention still is that, although the hourly wage in the although the hourly wage in the automobile industry is higher than in other mass production industries, nevertheless the annual wage of the worker is inadequate and far below the decent minimum standard of liv-

ing as computed by the government.

"The annual wage in 1936 was \$1,490, making the weekly wage average between \$22 and \$28, whereas the government's computations indi-cate that a family of five requires at least \$2,000 to maintain a decent minimum standard of living," the rabbi continued.

"If General Motors had brought the incomes of its 211,000 employes up to \$2,000 a year and paid it out of the net profits of \$176,000,000 earned in 1935, it still would have had \$72,000,000 left to distribute as

had \$72,000,000 left to distribute as dividends to its stockholders."

Rabbi Silver commented:

"The basic issue in the General Motors strike should not be overlooked in a mass of incidental and subsidiary issues. What is involved is the question of the total organization of its employes in an independent union and real collective bargaining.

"Whether the United Automobile Whether the United Automobile Workers of America is authorized to speak for the workers should be determined by polling the plants, and wherever a majority follows the leadership of this organization it should be authorized to represent them all. Only one phase of the present strike caused Rabbi Silver any alarm, that of the possible damage to the cause of labor.

"The present division in the ranks of American labor," In said, "is the issue of the vertical versus the trade Unless it is quickly composed, it will disrupt and defeat the entire labor movement and will open the way for all kinds of Fascist achievements."

Silver Says Many Evils Are of Our Own Making: Starts Lecture Series

Modern man sighs and groans and secretly wonders why he did not sit in when God planned and created His universe. He thinks his idea is novel. But sighs and groans, complains because he has to suffer, began with very primitive man and have rumbled through the ages.

Famed for his brilliant oratory, Rabbi Silver has been spiritual leader of The Temple in Cleveland, Ohio, since 1917. He is national co-chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, which is sponsoring the Milwaukee campaign in conjunction with the Joint Distribution Committee.

Silver Gives First Lecture of Series on Life Problems

"Whatever man has ever thought or felt about things basic or elemental in his destiny are to be found in that ancient and ever fresh testament of the human spirit, the Bible," said Rabbi A. H. Silver, in the first of a series of seven lectures on "Problems of Human Life Reflected in the Bible," at the Temple yesterday morning.

Rabbi Silver dealt with the theme, "Suffering and Its Harsh Ministry." He described the Bible as envisaging the problem of suffering under sev-eral heads, including the evils which are of man's own making, the evils

are of man's own making, the evils which we suffer because we belong to society and the evils inherent in the order of life itself.

"Faith in God leads us to the belief that evil is an essential part of God's design, which is unfathomable to us," he said. "God has ordained that we have many and and the said of the said." that man shall be born man and not God, finite and not infinite, and surrounded by evils, but capable of mastering most of these. "By his very finitude and through

his very handicaps man fulfills God's purpose nad realizes his own destiny. Suffering is thus not always punishment. It is a fact in human existence like joy, like the air we breathe and the food we eat.

The wise man and the man of faith accordingly uses this fact of human experience for self-improve-ment. Trials and tribulations are so used as to draw them to the heart

"Through our own broken hearts we learn to understand the tragedles of other hearts, and our own hot, scalding tears make us wish to spare the tears of other men. The wise men and the men of faith use the rigors of adversity for spiritual con-ditioning."

Display Jewish Solida by Through Aid to Campaign, Says Rabbi Silver

Noted American Jewish Leader Urges Constructive Unity As Best Means of Stopping Persecution; Describes European Situa-tion; Praises Work of Joint Distribution Committee and United Palestine Appeal

N A STIRRING address last Sunday evening delivered be-fore a large crowd that filled Temple Emanu-El B'ne Jesh-

urun, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, sounded a call for Jewish solidarity and appealed for contributions to the United Jewish Over-

seas campaign.

"The ancient Jewish principle that I Jews are responsible for their "The ancient Jewish principle that all Jews are responsible for their brethren is more applicable today than at any other time," he said. "The Jew has always felt a sense of group responsibility and it is this sense of solidarity with their fellows in other countries that has been and will be the rock on which persecution will be broken."

Likening the world Jewish situa-tion to a leaking ship, Rabbi Silver declared that it is impossible for any Jew to remain indifferent to the plight of their co-religionists in other coun-"Must Stand Together'

"Whatever we do, we must stand together because the greatest danger that besets us is our own disorganiza-tion," he declared. "In a sense, there-fore, this is not only a campaign for the Jews of Berlin or Warsaw, but also for you in Milwaukee."

The present political trend in Europe was described as a reversal of "the liberation doctrines of the French and American revolutions and a swing the darkness of the middle ages.

"A movement has set in against the rights of man, against the forces of democracy, against all those factors which have contributed toward the advancement of mankind during the past 150 years. In its place has come a progressive disenfranchisement of not only Jews but all those opposed to the totalitarian state."

"Since Jews are everywhere a ready scapegoat, it is easy to saddle upon them all the ills of mankind and in a world caught between the opposing forces of Fascism and Communism the Jews are trapped in the no-man's-land in between."

Factors of Reaction

Three factors are operating to bring about political and economic reaction about political and economic reaction in Europe, according to Rabbi Silver. The first is a tendency to re-enslave the human mind, which results in uni-form mass thinking imposed by the covernments in power.

"The mind of the western world is being dragooned into thinking only what the dictators wish their subjects to think," he said, "and if the dictatorship is opposed to Jews then there is a hatred set up that will take years to eradicate" to eradicate. The second factor is a stampede away from individual rights to colleca stampede

tive control in which minorities are made subservient to the will of the majority. Jews, who are always in the minority, are therefore left without recourse to "any higher court in which their Cod given and itself." which their God-given and inalienable rights can be reviewed."

Return to Middle Ages

"The result of these factors is that

the Jew is being pushed back into the position he occupied during the middle ages," declared Rabbi Silver, "and the favorite past time of that period — expulsion — is being invoked against him. "By a series of edicts the German

government has driven out 100,000 Jews and now the Polish government taking cue, has announced that it famass exodus of its 3,000,000 Jews.

"One thing that the statesmen of Europe should know is that we will not finance any such proposal to transfer our people out of the countries of their residence. We insist that the Jews residence. We insist that the Jew-who have lived in their countries for as long as a thousand years have very right to remain where they were n, and we in America will mo-

bilize to assist our brothers abroad in fighting for that right." Although he has been a Zionist for

almost 25 years and is national co-chairman of the United Palestine Ap-peal, Rabbi Silver declared that "Pal-estine is not the solution for all the Jews in the Diaspora."

Polish Plight Recounted

He pointed out, for instance, that is Poland the natural increase in the Jewish birthrate recently has been greater than the settlement of Polish Jews in Palestine.

Outlining the reasons for the present resurgence of anti-Semitism in Poland, Rabbi Silver declard that it is due to the general impoverishment of the country itself. Since the Soviet revolution Poland has lost Russia as its greatest marketplace and the Jew-

revolution Poland has lost Russia as its greatest marketplace and the Jewish middle class was left stranded.

The result has been that out of the three million Jews, one million are practically starving and another are on the brink of economic disaster. He described the position of Polish Jews as being one of "elemental misery" and declared that many of them work and declared that many of them work 14 to 18 hours a day for "coolie wages."

J.D.C. Work Praised

Characterizing the activities of the Joint Distribution Committee as a "marvelous, holy work," Rabbi Silver declared that it gives not only food, clothing and shelter to the needy—but more important—it gives them hope and the realization that they are not friendless."

"J.D.C. loans of a dollar often sustain the lives of whole Polish Jewish families for a week," he asserted, "and the loans are always repaid because

the loans are always repaid because the Jews know that they may have to apply again in the future."

According to Rabbi Silver half of the Jews of Berlin, "once the proudest and richest Jewry in the world," are now receiving relief and that the same general condition exists throughout the country. the country.

Urges Historical Perspective

"Hitler has not written the last chapter," he said. "Let us keep our historical perspective and remember that Hitler is only four years old while the history of the Jewish people can be traced back 4,000 years."

The persecution of Jews in Europe has driven many of the young people into the ranks of the revolutionaries, Rabbi Silver pointed out. The belief

Rabbi Silver pointed out. The belief has therefore spread that all Jews are communists and revolutionaries, and as a result many Jews in America are swinging over into the camp of reaction in the hope of escaping the

reaction in the hope of escaping the stigma of radicalism.

"That is the gravest mistake possible," he declared, "because once reaction sets in it will destroy even those Jews who finance its rise to power. Our only hope is aligning with those democratic and liberty-loving groups that also have much to lose with the coming of a totalitarian state."

Palestine Settlement Lauded

Intensified nationalism was cited as the third factor in the progressive break-down of liberty in Europe. When combined with policies of racial purity, as in Germany, it tends to create a hermetically sealed nation in which alienism and a distrust of all people predominates.

Turning to a discussion of the insportance of Palestine, Rabbi Silver asserted that "what has been done in that narrow strip of desert land is the greatest colonizing feat in modern times and marks an epoch in Jewish history."

HOLD LOVE FINDS COVENANT IN BIBLE

Silver Asserts Manifestations Are Dis-

cussed in Scriptures

Rabbi A. H. Silver, speaking on "Love-And Its Strange Ferment," at the Temple yesterday morning, asserted that the universal impulse of love in all its manifestations finds its complete testament in the Bible.

"The Bible treats the subject of love not naively but maturely, with profound insight and realism and with a wisdom which comes from having lived long and seen much," Rabbi Silver said.

"You will find no frothy romanticism about love in the Bible, no false gallantry, no spurious chivalry. Pose and affection are foreign to the type of mind of the authors of the books of the Bible. To them love is like sun and soil, like bread and wine, like life and death, overwhelmingly real, essential, mysterious."

Discusses Problems of Sex

Referring to the problems of sex as treated in the Bible, Dr. Silver said:

"Love is infinitely more than sex, but even the subject of sex is treated in the Bible with a reverent solemnity and a basic sanity. Sex-mating and generation are presented with a reverent naturalness that puts to shame the prude, the lewd person and the finicky pietist.

"They are the ordinances of God, necessary to his scheme of creation, and, as such, holy. Sex is exalted through love and degraded through lust. That is a frequent theme of the Bible, and story after story is

told to illustrate it.

"Generally speaking, the true love of which the Bible speaks is not a moments' ecstasy, but the conseerated food of every-day life of every-day folks. This love can go eagerly with youth and beauty, but it can also go gracefully and un-diminished with age. It seasons well. It mellows like a deep, rich

"In our youth, such a love walks with hope; in our old age, with memories. For aging men and women it is the ministering angel on

their homeward journey.

Rabbi Says Jews Will Fight To Live in Chosen Homes

live in whatever country they have chosen to make their homes despite persecution and antisemitism.

This was the challenge voiced by Rabbi Abba Hiller Silver, Cleveland, O., in an address at Temple Emanu-El-B'ne Jeshurun last night. Rabbi Silver spoke on behalf of the United Jewish Overseas campaign which locally is expected to raise \$65,000 to support needy Jews abroad.

"Such enduring love is built out of loyalty, tenderness and sacrifice. It is unbounded mutuality, It is a love which overlooks much and forgives even more. Love covereth all transgressions. It is steadied by a wisdom which does not expect a fool's paradise, or nectar and ambrosia for an every-day diet. "Of such a love, which is not ethereal nor beyond the reach of earthly men and women, the Sage of the Bible speaks: 'Enjoy life with the wife whom thou lovest, all the days of thy vanity which He hath given thee under the sun, for that is thy portion in life, and in thy labor wherein thou laborest under

he sun. "There is little else of value in fe. Within that love is the habitaon of our soul's true rest, pride nd courage, and in it the world's erts and misunderstandings are rgotten."

Jews will fight for the right to chapter in Jewish history," Rabbi Silver said. "Hitler is only 4 years old, the Jews have a history of 4,000 years. Jews share one common destiny. Jewish solidarity will prove the rock on which all persecution will be broken.

> Rabbi Silver recalled since the rise of Hitler 100,000 Jews had been expelled from Germany while thousands more had been deprived of a livelihood. Of 3,000,000 Jews living in Poland, he added, one-third are starving and a million or more forced to the border of poverty.

> "The Polish governent," Rabbi Silver asserted, "does not expel the Jew. It politely gives him to understand that he is an economie burden whose removal to another country is highly desirable.

> "We all know, and the Polish government should know, that Palestine is not the solution of the Jewish problem in Poland or elsewhere." Rabbi Silver declared. "We in America won't finance an exodus of Jews to some wilderness. The Jews in Poland have a right to a living in that country the same as Poles have in the United States. Jews the world over will mobilize to assist their brothers abroad in

> fighting for that right."

Representative spokesmen for the city, labor, the clergy and the congregation will honor Dr. Silver in a program after the dinner.

Mario Chamlee, Metropolitan opera enor, will sing. The dinner will be tenor, will sing. The dinner will be held in conjunction with the 87th annual meeting of the Temple. Eugene E. Wolf, president, will deliver his annual report and preside as toastmaster.

Dr. Silver's record as leader of the Temple, as a commanding personality in community and social service, as an author and scholar and as a guiding figure in the Jewish world has been a striking one.

In his ministry the new temple, ne of the finest religious buildings in the country, was built and opened in 1924. Since 1917, when he began his ministry, the congregation has grown from 725 members to nearly 1,600, and Rabbi Silver has con-firmed 2,074 boys and girls. Under his guidance the religious school has become one of the largest and most progressive in the United States. It is a pioneering institution in its field, offering courses in religious education from kindergarten through the college department.

Dr. Silver's Sunday morning lecture sermons, attended by large audiences of Jews and gentiles alike. have become a civic institution.

He has been called the father of the unemployment insurance movement in Ohio, having begun in 1928 to persuade the Consumers League of Ohio to undertake the study of unemployment and unemployment insurance. unemployment insurance.

was chairman of the first committee on unemployment in-surance and framed the initial legislation of this kind. He also wa mber of the commission appointed former Gov. George White to study problems in unemployment ine and was chairman of the executive committee of the State Committee on Unemployed Insur-

Rabbi Silver has long been active in movements for liberal legislation and has particularly distinguished himself as a friend of labor. He resigned from the Chamber of Com-merce in 1924 because of its open-shop policy. Arbitrator of many strikes and industrial disputes, he has had exceptional opportunity for study of labor and industrial prob-lems, and his experiences have been reflected in his sermons, books, and articles dealing with economic and social relations.



My Twenty Years in Cleveland

THE CITY WHEREIN I HAVE FOUND WORK GOOD

On Sunday, leaders of Cleve-land assembled to pay tribute to Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver at the conclusion of his twentieth year of active service in this city. Rabbi Silver has kindly contributed three articles based upon his observances and experiences of two dec-ades. Another follows soon.

CosmopolitaL

Cleveland has been a good city to work in The cosmopolitan character of its people has given it a commendable liberalism and spaciousness. Intolerance of any sort finds it difficult to take permanent root here. I found a strong liberal tradition in this community which reflected itself in the press, the pulpit, the academic circles, and in civic life generally. It was pleasant to meet so many spiritual disciples of Tom Johnson who were carrying on, each in his respective field, the work which he had initiated.

For one brief spell following the World War, during the notorious era of the Palmer red hysteria, Cleveland went hay-wire and the infamous May Day riot of 1919 took place. But the community soon sobered up and recovered its balance. Under the sponsorship of the City Club, which for years has been one of the finest influences in the social and intellectual life of our city, public forums were opened on the Public Square and in high schools throughout the city in an effort to end the reign of post-war patrioteering, terrorism and suppression. I recall with pleasure the meetings which Judge Bradley Hull and I addressed in various parts of the city in this campaign for civic sanity and basic American traditions.

Neither reaction nor radicalism has made much headway in Cleveland. The city is carried along by a sound, confident and steadygoing liberalism, and the newspapers of the community have helped to keep its life moving on an even keel.

The Clergy

I found the clergy of Cleveland during my twenty years of ministry a distinguished and broadminded group of men. One of the profound satisfactions of my ministry in this community has been the close and warm friendships and hearty cooperation which I have enjoyed at the hands of both Protestant and Catholic churchmen. The Cleveland ministry is outstanding for the quality of its quiet, dignified and courageous spiritual leadership. I found here a most gratifying absence of sensationalism, clerical hysteria, vice-crusading and acrobatic evangelism. Here and there one chanced upon a publicity-hunting cleric, but sooner or later he was discovered by his colleagues and rejected by them and by the community.

Good will and religious tolerance have made possible many interdenominational activities in our community and numerous communal, phiarathropic and social caterprises to which all creedal lines were obliterated.

The same strong sense of unity and solidarity I discovered in the Cleveland Community Chest. I atvery Fund campaign back in 1918 and I have been close to the Fund ever since. I have been privileged to open many of its annual campaign meetings. The Community Fund is a civic achievement of more than local significance. It was a pioneering effort, experimental in the extreme, but it succeeded, and it carved a highway for the community-ides in philanthropy throughout the nation. The success of the Fund was made possible through the labors of a remarkable group of lay-leaders witch Cleveland possessed. Some of them who were with the Fund nearly twenty years ago are still active in it today. Others are no longer here. But the inspiration of their leadership ab des and the memory of such

warm humanity, will ever remain with this community as a precious legacy.

Municipal government in Cleveland during the last twenty years has been spotty-nothing to brag about. We have had some good administrations but these sooner or later found themselves submerged. A brief effort was made in the '20s to establish here the city manager form of government. I was quite active in that movement. I believed in it then. I believe in it now. Ultimately, am persuaded, Cleveland will come to adopt it. It is the only logical form of government for a modern city. Party lines should have no place in local government.

Cleveland, in common with all other American cities, and to a degree, more than most other cities, received terrible punishment during the six years of the depression. One of the few heartening things was to see the manner in which our people bore the strain and deprivations of that unparalleled economic collapse. Here, again, our community was fortunate in producing men adequate to the emergency. The relief work which was done in our city under the leadership of A. V. Cannon and Marc Grossman, assisted by the splendid existing charitable organizations, has justly received national recognition and praise.

Wreckers

What was most depressing during that era of civic tribulation, was the fact that so many prominent citizens in exalted positions were found to have contributed through their own irresponsible financial juggling and piracy to the economic plight of the community. I felt called upon to denounce by name some of these financial wreckers whose very position should have imposed upon them | State Legislature.

their example of duty, devotion and a compelling sense of social responsibility, restraint and scrupulous

> It is perhaps not known to many people that Cleveland is the birthplace of the unemployment insurance movement in Ohio, and perhaps also, in the United States. It was in Cleveland, under the leadership of the Consumers' League, whose attention and interest I directed to this cause, back in 1928, that the movement was inaugurated. In 1930, the first study committee on wnemployment insurance was formed by the Consumers' League and thereafter regular meetings were held at my Temple over a period of many months, at which the whole subject was thoroughly canvassed. Here were framed the bills on unemployment insurance which were through the efforts of this committee presented to the Ohio State Legislature.

Leaders

Among those who were most active in the movement, who carried on educational and organizational work throughout the state and who appeared before the state Legislature, year after year, to champios the cause were citizens of Cleveland-Marvin C. Harrison who drafted the bills; Max S. Hayes, Prof. Busch, Prof. Carleton, Father Cyprian, former Senator James A. Reynolds, Alice Gannett, Grace Mayette, Marie Wing and many others.

The active management of the movement was at all times in the hands of Miss Elizabeth S. Mageethe best informed woman on unemployment insurance in the United States. Eight years of unflagging leadership in this movement on the part of Cleveland people were finally crowned with success in December, 1936, when an unemployment insurance bill was passed by the Ohio

WHAT DOES THE FUTURE HOLD IN STORE?

BY RABBI ABBA HILLEL SILVER

Ending twenty years service in this city, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver coas honored Sunday last by croic and religious leaders. This, the last of three articles, concludes his observations on his experi-ences and discusses those to come.

The Future

I have been writing in retrespect, I am much more interested in prospects.

Most men, watching this convilsive age, are fearful of the future. The last twenty years have seen Communism, Pascism and Nazism unleashed in the world. The deepest waters of our political and social life have been profoundly disturbed and rolled and much mud and slime have come to the surface. The last two decades have been almost continuously in a stage of crisis. Long cherished traditions of government and human liberties have been trampled under foot. Organized attempts have been made by governments to re-enslave the human mind, to undermine the integrity of thought by propaganda, to deprive the individual of all his rights heretofore regarded as inalienable, to fragmentize and provincialize peoples through na-tionalistic and racial chauvenisms and to restore the ancient worship of the heathen gods of war, blood and

Through all these years I have tried to keep my faith in man and in his power ultimately to master his most difficult problems intact. I see no reason for abandoning that faith now. Short of some unpredictable universal calamity, some cosmic derangement, or man's own mad impulse to destroy himself, I can conly halt man's onward progress.

Man has come into possession of a key which will in the future unlock for him all the doors which can be unlocked—the key of science. He has learned how to experiment de-liberately and toward definite objectives in his physical, chemical and medical laboratories. And his vic-tories in the past few generations have given man tremendous confidence both in his prowess and in his

ing what only the slower processes our political but our economic for-or education and self-government tunes as well. can permanently establish.

Mankind has just begun to emerge from its economic dark agus and has set about banishing from its life poverty and insecurity. The first steps have already been taken to provide men and women with protection against the economic disabilities of sickness, old age and unemployment even in our most prosperous years. This is a land of abundant natural wealth, and human intellect and the machines which it creates will, in the future, give men such comforts as have not yet been known in the whole history of the human race. But they cannot give them peace and happiness. These must come from the deep wells of the human spirit, heretofore largely untapped by man.

In the future, men will work fewer hours and wil enjoy more leisure time. They wil have more time for the loveliness of living. But they will have to learn the creative usages of leisure and rediscover their heritage of dreams and visions. We shall also learn how to reduce delinquency and crime by surrounding children with favorable environment, by granting them wholesome recrea-tional opportunities and by eradicating poverty from their homes.

We shall-learn how to govern our-selves better. We have neglected government because it did not impinge seriously upon our economic life. In the future government will play an increasurily vital role in our national economy and we shall, in self-defense, have to become more vigilant of it. As citizens we shall become more alert to government, and we shall d-mand higher qualifications of competence and character | what remains,

My faith is strong that the twentieth century will do for war what the nineteenth century did for slav-Wars cannot be tolerated in a world, so interrelated and interde-pendent, that they prove destructive to victors and vanquished alike. We have already begun to think differently about war. For countless ages and to shield children from industrial in the ancient days, men sacrificed exploitation. This process will con-tinue like the future. I active that all the idea of Moloch was destroyed the standard of living of our people and then men ceased to sacrifice will rise progressively and reach far above the icres heretofore attained generations the human species has generations the human species has been sacrificing its children to war. been sacrificing its thing. stroyed in the minds of men, and soon men will cease to sacrifice their children upon its ensanguined altars. Desperate attempts are being made today to rekindle the war spirit in some lands but the idea is definitely bankrupt. The huge armaments which nations are piling up today should not discourage us. The temples of the pagan world were never more numerous and resplendent than at the moment of the final collapse. of paganism. The nations of the earth, through the drive of indefeasible economic forces, will be comchinery for the peaceful regulation of their international traffic and for the pacification of the world.

Thus, in suffering and in blood, mankind is building today a new civilization-one from which international aparchy, economic chaos and religious and racial intolerance will be bunished. We are among the builders, even though our work is feeble, faulty and uncertain. But a famous rabbi, long ago, declared; "Thine is not the duty to complete the task but neither art thou free to desist from it." In this spirit I face the tasks of the oncoming years, gratoful for what has been and for

Where man has lagged has been in the field of the social sciences and in spiritual education, resulting in a dangerous want of balance which must be redressed. Those who have become apprehensive of man's technological progress and of the machines which his inventive genius has produced and are calling for a moratorium on scientific progress are timid romanticists. Man must learn not to destroy the labor-saving, wealth producing and lelaure-yield-ing machines which he has invented but to bring them into the service of his own ncreasing and advancing

And this work is well on its way. Man is turning to the fields of the social sciences and is bringing to them the same integrity, intelligence and courage that he brought to the physical sciences. The social straiggles of tocay, with all their bitterness and agony, are proof that man has set about seriously to do this necessary lob. From the chaos of our day new creation will emerge. Simple truths are slowly weaving themselves into the thought-pattern of our age. Thus, it is becoming in-creasingly dear that eighteenth century economics cannot function in a twentieth century world and that the unrestricted, competitive individualism of a phneering, non-mechanized capitalistic society spells anarchy in an age of mechanization and mass industrialization.

Men are harning to distinguish between the individualism of self-expression and the individualism of exploitation and they are groping hard for ways to correlate personal freedom with group responsibility. The dictatorships of the hour are at-

Rabbi Silver, Civic Leader

A man who in these trying times stands up for the fundamental rights of the individual, who carries on the fight for free inquiry and for the basic principles which point the way of human progress, deserves commendation by his fellows. Such a man is Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of the Temple who for twenty years has said the things that needed to be said and in causes of spiritual, civic and community welfare has been in the vanguard. An international leader of the Zionist cause, Rabbi Silver has in no way been a sectarian. Rabbi Silver came to Claveland from Wheeling, W. Va., where he had previously filled a pulpit. But a man of Dr. Silver's caliber would have made his voice heard no matter where the field of his labors. Not only is he a "great leader in the household of Isreal," as those who honered him put it, but a leader or the whole community. Speaker Suggests World Peace Plan

Rabbi Silver Heard Wednesday on Men's A Club Program

The deliberate attempt to reenslave the human mind and to
shackle truth with propaganda; the
submergence of the individual in
the state; the narrow intolerant
nationalism rampant in the modern
world, and the growing concept of
war as a national destiny—these,
said Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, of
Cleveland, in his talk at Anshe
Hesed Temple Wednesday night,
are "Some Aberrations of Our
Age," to which we cling and which
we worship.

These aberrations, Rabbi Silver continued, in the most brilliant and dramatic talk of the Temple Men's club 1937 lecture series, have appeared as a consequence of the tremendous changes this generation has been forced to undergo, changes unsettling and roiling the waters of our political, economic and social life, he claimed.

As a result, we have a jittery world a world of crisis, he said, a world of aberrations and unsettledness in the lives of whole nations and peoples. And mankind to rediscover its poise, its sanity and its equilibrium, he went on, must think its way out of the difficulties.

"The solution," he said, "lies in the efforts of those few individuals scattered throughout the world, who think with the minimum of bias, and feel with the maximum of truth."

The task of the 20th century he said, is to find the balance between the scope of the state and the right of individuals, else we shall go down to spiritual, intellectual and moral defeat.

Christianity and Judaism must rediscover its courage and its prophetic voice, he went on, and must preach in the modern world its ideal of human brotherhood, which, he said, "is an old platitude but dynamite, revolutionary and treason in half the world today."

There will be no peace in the world until nations are ready to sacrifice some of their sovereignty for the sake of peace, he said. Man has learned painfully

Man has learned painfully through the centuries that war is evil, he went on, and today he is taught in schools and kindergarten that war is the supreme achieve-ment of the human spirit.

HOLDS PROPHETS TRANSCENDED WAR

Rabbi Silver Says Bible
Was Pioneer in Movement
for Universal Peace

The epochal pioneering of the Bible on the problem of war is to be found in the fact that some of its books transcend war and reach out after the ideal of a warless society, Rabbi A. H. Silver said in an address on "War—and Its Ancient Madness" yesterday morning. The lecture was the fourth in Rabbi Silver's series on "Problems of Modern Life Reflected in the Bible," at the Temple.

"In certain books of the Bible war is recorded in all its ferocity, and even sanctioned," Rabbi Silver said. "The early Hebrews were no less warlike than their neighbors and their literature reflects it.

their literature reflects it.

"However, with the contemporaries of ancient Israel war remained an accredited and accepted institution, regarded as the ultimate destiny of nations. They did not transcend war, even theoretically, just as they failed to transcend idolatry.

Thought Beyond War

"But the teachers of Israel did transcend it. They were able to think beyond war. They projected the ideal of a federation of nations, under the sovereign rule of international law, beating their swords into plowshares.

"The prophets were not pacifists. The doctrine of non resistance is foreign to them. But they taught men to resist evil, to remove the causes which lead to strife, to forego hate and vengeance, and to seek peace and pursue it. They realized that before peace there must be justice. The work of righteousness shall be peace."

"The prophets, therefore, called

"The prophets, therefore, called for a high level of national and international morality. They were not

concerned merely with the salvation of the individual. They demanded of all nations subjection to the mandates of international law. "They came to realize that religion

"They came to realize that religion and the business of war have nothing in common. King David was denied the privilege of building the Temple of God because his hands had spilled much blood. No weapon of iron was to be used in the erection of the Altar of the Temple, because iron is the symbol of war, whereas the Altar is the symbol of peace.

Quotes the Psalmist

"The Psalmist asks, 'What are God's most marvelous achievements on earth?' and replies, 'He maketh wars to cease in the whole earth; He breaketh the bow and cutteth the spear in sunder; He burneth the charlots in the fire.'

chariots in the fire.'

"The supreme theophany will be vouchsafed to men when they will pile high all their armaments and set fire to them. Out of that flame will come the supreme vision of God to men."

Rabbi Silver outlined the program for world peace found in the writings of Isaiah and Micah.

"In that vision three mighty ideas are incorporated: First, that nations must learn to subject themselves voluntarily to the reign of law; second. that as a result of a compelling and implemented international law the nations of the earth will feel secure and will then begin to disarm; and, third, that the inspiration for it all must come for a return to spiritual values—a return to Zion—the spiritual reservoir of mankind," Rabbi Silver said.

"'For out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem."

Listening to Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, noted Cleveland rabbi, at the annual University of Cincinnati banquet at the Netherland Plaza, 350 alumni were given a glimpse of a peaceful world which he was confident would spring from the present chaos.

"I am convinced," Dr. Silver, university graduate of the class of 1915, said Monday night, "that the 20th century will do for war what the 19th century did for slavery. There is chaos in the world and out of this chaos there will emerge a new creation—new creations always emerge out of chaos. The temples of paganism were never more numerous and magnificent than when they went down to defeat."

The university is Hebrew University, on Mount Scomis, Jerusalem, with which Dr. Bergmann has been connected since its opening twelve years ago. The banquet was sponsored by the Cleveland committee of the university and the Cleveland Zionist Society.

Dr. Bergmann pointed out that, although universities of Jews had existed in a few scattered cities in zemote times, the Hebrew University at Jerusalem was the institution where "we have tried for the first time in our history, or at least since our exite, to build up in our own language, with our own hands and brains, a scientific civilization which would become a part of European civilization."

He said that after the opening of the khettoes in Europe the Jews "plunged into European culture," but failed to maintain at the same time their own particular cultural development.

Power House of Heritage

"We Jews owe it not only to ourselves but to humanity to keep our heritage," he said. "The Hebrew University is here as a kind of power house of that heritage, and to educate young men and women in what Judaism is and should be to ourselves and the world."

The faculty of science has done valuable work in eradication of disease in the country, he said. Speaking of the university's library, which has become the largest in the middle and near east, Dr. Bergmann par-enthetically expressed his gratitude to the Cleveland Public Library for contributions which he described as of inestimable value.

Rabbi Silver Says Revelation of Diety Is Through Self-Perfection

"Neither the philosopher nor the scientist can reveal God to man," said Rabbi A. H. Silver, in a sermon on "God-and His Endless Revelation," concluding his series on "Prob-Bible," at The Temple yesterday morning.

The form of life that Palestine Jewry will adopt must grow out of its soil, ideals and experiences. Certainly a movement which contributed nothing to the romance of Jewish rebirth should have more poise and self-respect than to fling its record in the face of our pioneers in Palestine. I hardly believe that Rabbi Silver will accept the appointment. Unlike his other colleagues on the committee, he surely knows that there is more important work to be done in

Rabbi Analyses Reason for Visit of German Students to Cleveland Schools

"The purpose of the German propaganta department in sending hese students here is not educaonal but political.

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Their purpose is to persuade the American people that all is sunshine and roses in Germany, that the German people-epday are just one big happy family and that all the criticism launched against the Reich is just the vindictive lies of Jews, Communists and Catholics whose presists and monks are guilty. whose priests and monks are guilty of unspeakable immoralities.

Welcome Is Naive

"The liberals in this city who get p on the high horse of broadcoming of these hand-picked emis-aries of Goebbels and the mentors and 'fuerers' who accompany them is an act of international good will of happy augury, are simply as neive as the Nazis would like them to be.

These youths will serve the p pose of nuclei round which will rally pro-Nazi sentiment. Cleveland will experience, in all probability, a six-week period of Nazi meetings, re-ceptions, etc. Schoolwork is the incident and the commonplace in all this business

one of the founders of the Joint Distribution Committee, formed twenty years ago to carry on Jew-ish welfare work abroad, described the plight of the Jews in Germany and Poland.

Rabbi A. H. Silver, general chairman of the campaign, recalled that 100 German children arrived in Cleveland last night to attend this city's schools. Then the rabbi read a letter from a thirteen-year-old Jewish girl in Germany. She had written to an aunt in Cleveland telling that she had just been ousted from the German schools because of her race. She pleaded that her aunt her race. She pleaded that her aunt find a way for her to come to this country to gain an education.

\$11,000 Gift Announced

The goal of the campaign is \$279,-200, a large portion of which is to be allocated to relief and rehabilitation work among the Jews in Germany, Poland and other European coun-tries. Part of the fund also will go tries. Part of the fund also will go to the resettlement of refugees and emigres in Palestine. The remainder will be used for tuberculosis hospitals and educational projects in the United States and for educational projects in Cleveland.

Only one gift was announced last night—\$11,000 from the charity trust created five years ago by Commodore Louis D. Beaumont, an officer of the May Co.

Rabbi Silver read a letter from Nathan L. Dauby, co-trustee of the fund with Morton J. May, announcing that the trust would repeat its \$6.000 subscription of last year. Another \$5,000 was added as a special contribution in honor of Commodore Beaumont's 80th birthday anniversary, which was April 26.

The campaign will continue through May 11. The first report meeting will be held tomorrow noon in Hotel Statler, with Lord Marley as the speaker.

Exhorted to Greater Efforts

Philip Frankel, chairman of the men's division of the campaign, said the personnel of this year's teams of solicitors was the finest ever gathered together. He exhorted the workers to greater efforts than ever before.

Asch said the Joint Distribution Committee was feeding hundreds of thousands of Jewish children and

"It is you who help to rebuild the Jewish structure by suporting trade schools or the Jewish youth. It is your money which extends credit to hundreds of the lands of poor artisans, enabling them to carry on their humble trades in face of an enemy world."

Asch said that Jews and Chris-ans "are all the children of tians 'Israel."

"God is our guide," he said, "and Abraham, Isaac and Jacob are our ancestors. No Christian can do wrong to the Jew of today, or in fact to any human being, and still consider himself a Christian."

In Germany only 400,000 Jews re-main, he added. This number is only four times the Jewish population in Cleveland, he pointed out.

In his final appeal, Mr. Asch said: "The helping hand which we ex-tend is a rebuke to the enemy. We proclaim through our help that we all belong to a united Jewry. 

HOLDS SETBACKS

Rabbi Silver Asserts Man Must Regain His "Lost Horizons"

All he can of the hard, witter realities of life, through suffering and sacrifice, by means of planning and organization, slowly and with many heart-breaking setbacks, that mankind must hew out a cleaner and lovelier order of life for all." Rabbi A. H. Silver said yesterday in a ser-

mon on "Regaining Lost Horizons" at The Temple.

"The theme of James Hilton's 'Lost Horizon' has been a recurrent one in the wish-life of mankind," Rabbi Silver said. "We all have a nostalgia for some far-off horizon on the rim of which lies the delectable valley of

our heart's desire. "There are periods of human his-tory when conditions become so bad and problems so involved, desperate and seemingly impossible of solution that whole generations are seized with a sense of impending doom and the desire to escape them. Then men yearn for some distant hermitage of tranquillity where life is again simplified and into which the urgencies and anxieties of a twisted world are not allowed to enter.
"These are the Utopias which, un-

der one name or another, men have dreamed of and have actually en-deavored to establish throughout his-

"Unfortunately such hopes have always been doomed to disappoint-ment. Here and there an individual from the coils and may free himself from the coils and involvements of his day and age and find sequestered peace in some isle of security where he can carry on a lotus existence.

Impossible for Millions

"For the millions of the struggling masses of this earth this is impos-sible. There is no running away.

masses of this earth this is impossible. There is no running away. There is no peaceful lamasery in the Valley of the Blue Moon to which the masses of mankind can retire, where amidst refinement, peace and pleasant labor they can live long, unhurried unharassed lives, savoring all the loveliness of living.

"In our private lives, too, when we are young, we glimpse distant horizons and later lose them. In the generosity of our youth we set high destinies for ourselves, beautiful and noble careers. We want to be the first the first however, we lose, almost knaw edly, those horizons. Our eyes turn downward. We become self-centered. Money, success, pride, position come between us and our selves. Mountains rise up and blot out the shimmering horizons.

A mass meeting of more than 3,000 to hear German education protested opened with tense calmness in Public Music Hall last night, as Marvin C. Harrison called all to stand in symbol of grief at the Hindenburg disaser, but ended in a storm of excited ipplause as fiery Rabbi A. H. Silver exclaimed that it would have been highly advisable if Clevelanders had given the German exchange pupils, the "100 picked emissaries of Hitler," a cool reception.

"I am amazed that so few Cleveland citizens, so few school teachers see behind this seemingly ininnocent student exchange," said the rabbi, "that they have not seized this opportunity to unmask this miserable dictatorship and drive home to honest citizens the meaning of the machinations of this regime.

"We should have done well to have laid a little less stress on sweet reasonableness and being charming hosts to welcome the emissaries of dictatorship.

Citadel for Naziism

"When liberals lose their sense of hot resentment, when they become squeamish, when liberal newspapers fall in with the Nazis' plan to sweeten up the public about the third reich and these papers spend pages portraying how pretty the affected, never using cosmeticsthen our city becomes a stamping ground for Maziism, a citadel of Nazi triumph.

"When Clevelanders are admiring these fine young people, I would be remiss in my duty if I did not call attention to what the Nazis did to similar fine young people in Germany, the vindictive hate with which they put the children of my people back on the Judenbank, then finally quarantined them in Ghetto schools as if they were loathsome.

"The Nazis send us lovely young people but there are military airships to kill levely young people in Their purpo create nuclei. These young people are being exploited for such demonstrations as a week ago Sunday when hundreds of Clevelanders raised their hands in Nazi salute and a Cleveland lawyer repeated doggerel which was an insult to every Jew.'

"Bos! Booocoooooo!" the audience began, then was quickly silenced by "Sahhhhhh!"

"I will not advise insulting these children. I would not play into Nazi hands that way. But when dealing with a desperate, relentless beast that mays, it is madness to use for weapons reasonableness and sweet moderation."

Before the meeting waxed hot. Harrison, former state senator, had suggested that American people learn to manufacture light without heat, and not meet emotion with counterirritating emotion.

We ought to welcome these fine children, try to teach them some of our democracy to take back to Ger-many," he said. "We should confess our sins and remember that it was partly our fault that poverty and employment drove them crazy.

Paul Douglas, professor of eco-nomics of the University of Chicago, said everyone in the audience was a friend of the German people.

Love Soul of People

"We love the soul of the German people," said Douglas. "We are fight-ing for their freedom. In the past I have helped in the exchange of stu-dents between democratic countries. But there is all the difference in the world between that and this ex-change. No child can leave the Fas-cist state without the consent of the minister of propaganda. No liberals come here. None can be sent back. No American may spread the idea of

democracy in Germany.

Silver Lashes Reception Here For Germans



Silver Cautions Jews to Avoid Martyr Roles

Persecution of Jews in Europe does not justify the Jews in America in driving themselves into a "self-made spiritual Ghetto," Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of The Temple said today at the district grand

said today at the district grand lodge meeting of B'nai B'rith here. More than 500 men and women from eight states attended the second-day sessions of the three-day convention in the Statler hotel. "I believe that fascism has reached and passed its zenith," declared Rabbi Silver, "Events in Spain prove that democracies have learned how to organize against the

Spain prove that democracies have learned how to organize against the forces of reaction, which were turned loose by the World war.

"Hitlerism is doomed, and therefore it behooves us Jews to increase to orient ourselves so as to return to the more orderly way of thinking and feeling. It is the duty of organizations like B'nai B'rith to take the lead in tranquilling Jewish life.

the lead in tranquitient deviation.

"There should be less emphasis on anti-Semiticism. We should talk about the positive, rich values of Jewish life. The non-Jewish world becomes tired of us if we continue to rich to irritate and to complain, and drespects us more if we devote an archer fuller, total ourselves to a richer, fuller, total American life.

You undermine the morale of the "You undermine the morale of the Jew in America, you give him a feeling of being a hounded individual, and you force him into a self-made spiritual Ghetto, if you talk about the dangers to the Jews and quit working positively for the preservation of basic American traditions."

Rabbi Stephen S. Wise of New York city will speak at the ban-quet of B'nai B'rith tonight. The states represented at the conven-tion are Ohio, Kentucky, Indiana, New Mexico, Colorado, Arizona, Missourl and Wyoming.

Condemns Partition Proposal and Calls Upon Jews to Be Prepared "for All That Goes with Task of Nation Building" (-28-37

Declaring that the Jews need a strengthening of self-confidence and a reaffirmation of faith, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, of Cleveland National Chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, told more than 300 Jewish leaders at a dinner last Tuesday night at the Brooklyo Jewish Center that Zionists cannot accept any compromise of partition or cantonization in the present situation in Palestine.

Rabbi Silver came here from Cleveland to be the principal speaker at a dinner of the Bedford Eastern Parkway Division of the United Palestine Appeal which marked the climax of the local community's effort.

In a vigorous plea for a positive sionist approach, Rabbi Silver Zionist approach, Silver warned against building Zionism on

"What we want in Palestine," he declared, "is to normalize our status as a nation," Referring to the at-

solini's paper, in which Italian Jews were assailed because of their effort for Palestine, Rabbi Silver said: "Frenchmen have a country of their own and retain their rights in foreign countries without quertion of loyalty. Englishmen and Italians have a country and are permitted to live in foreign countries in large numbers without molestation or limitation of rights. We demand for ourselves the same thing-no more and no less.

"My Zionism is not founded on panic or despair. As a Jew I fight for the full rights of Jews in the Diaspora. As a Zionist I fight for the rights of the Jews in Pales-

Denouncing proposals for the par-Denouncing proposals for the par-titioning of Palestine, Rabbi Silver said: "A Palestine without Jeru-talem, without Haifa, without the Hills of Judad is no Palestine at all. It is not our Palestine—it is not the Palestine of the Bible. If a 20vernment whom we trusted and government whom we trusted and whose pledge was enforced by inernational agreement intends to go back on its word, we have no armies or navies to send against it; we will not and shall not resort to Physical violence. We will say we cannot accept it. We shall wait for a new orientation for the recognition of our just claims for the whole of Palestine. We must not yield to any compromises. We ask for no concessions. We ask for the right to keep the doors of Palestine open to the tens of thousands who want to go there to escape persecution.

We do not have to complete the Job today," he added, "All we ask is the right to build the country which has been neglected for cen-

Nothing Can "Liquidate Zionism"

Appealing to the Jews of America to continue their work of rebuild-ing Palestine through the United Palestine Appeal, Rabbi Silver said that an adverse decision by the Royal Commission would not "liquidate Zionism."

'If you are Zionists you must be prepared for all that goes with the task of nation-building," he de-

Rubbi Silver pointed out that deapite past setbacks Zionists never ceased their effort, continuing to build and establishing a record of achievement in Palestine that "is the most amazing success of colonization in modern times,"

The Jews are not a race of weaklings, but a nation of strong men who have survived all threats of destruction in the past and will survive all the dangers of a diseased nationalism in the present and future, Rabbi Silver said, urging Jews to replace the prevailing mood of despair with a mood of hopeful optimism in their destiny.

THERE must have been numerous occasions in the 37 years of its history when the Ohio Consumers' League, looking back over its activities, could see little except setbacks, discouragements, rebuffs and bitter disappointments.

There were a number of occasions, to be sure, when the league could celebrate a thumping good victory. But nothing which would approach yesterday's annual meeting in celebration of a triple victory on Ohio's minimum wage law, the unemployment insurance law and the law regulating women's working hours.

It is hardly necessary to remind Clevelanders that the Consumers' League was a pioneer in each of these fields, or of the tenacity and devotion with which its members carried on in spite of opposition from groups that have since come to their support.

Some idea of the changed attitude toward social legislation may be gained from the fact that it took the league 24 years to win its minimum wage fight and only seven to get an unemployment insurance law on the statute books,

Rabbi A. H. Silver, one of the principal speakers at the meeting and himself extremely active in the Consumers' League, recalled that the first studies of unemployment insurance began in 1928. Even while the bull market was still at its height the league had noted the signs and begun the studies that were to result in model legislation for numerous states,

Perhaps the finest tribute of the day was also paid by Rabbi Silver when he said that he had no fear for democracy as long as such organizations as the Consumers' League continued to bring about necessary social changes by democratic processes.

The effort to bring social progress into better balance with scientific and economic development has recently achieved several dazzling victories, but must be pressed with unremitting vigor as a necessary protection to the principles of a mocracy. ce, is the message whit to be to hit to yesterday's victory meeting of This, in subs H. Since the last annual meeting of the league, of which Marvin C. Harrison is president, Ohio has enacted an unemployment insurance law and an 8-hour act for women workers. In the same period the Ohio minimum wage law has been validated through the decisions of the United States Supreme Court upholding similar state legislation.

It is significant that it was a quarter of a century ago that the Consumers League began the battle for some of these reforms, and almost a decade since the start of its effort for unemployment insurance, in which its pioneering became the pattern for many other states as well as the nation.

It is a tribute to the ability and tenacity of the League that it did not permit repeated rebuffs to dull its enthusiasm or deter it from continued effort. It has been a leader along a difficult road. Unexpected forces have aided its recent victories. One of them, noted by Dr. Silver, is the growing public realization that "eighteenth century principles of economics do not fit twertieth century problems." To which he adds the practical warning that these new measures of social legislation are "not perfection, but are perfectable."

The same important point was made by Miss Louise Stitt, another of yesterday's speakers. Miss Stitt is one of many able public servants who has the distinction of being ousted by the Davey administration. As director of the minimum wage division of the federal women's bureau, she now has a wider field of usefulness. Miss Stitt. noting that the principle of far-reaching social legislation has now been upheld by the highest courts, sees the problem of the future in the field of efficient administration of state and local laws

Liberal-minded Ohioans may well join in felicitating the Consumers League upon its achievements. It is fitting that yesterday's celebration also brought merited praise to Miss Elizabeth Magee, the League's executive secretary. Those who watch the progress of social legislation will indorse Dr. Silver's statement that "she knows more bout unemployment insurance than any other voman in America."

"WYNC operates for the instruc-tion, recreation, entertainment and welfare of the inhabitants of New York City," Mr. Kracke told the Aldermen. "It is the foremost ex-ample of governmental radio staample of governmental radio station operation in the United States. It has often been pointed out that abroad government broadcasting monopolies have one of two policies regarding controversial subjects. They either broadcast the government viewpoint or they do not broadcast any viewpoint at all.

"It is contrary to American ideals to advocate regulation of radio by

to advocate regulation of radio by a government agency whose authora government agency whose authority would extend to the point of exercising a complete censorship over programs. The use of the air as a public forum is important to the maintenance of a democratic form of government."

ments had been made for presenta-tion of the Jewish side of the question before the date on which the Arab side was discussed.

Calls Station a Town Hall

"We welcome your request to know whether or not New York's own station was correct in allowing a discussion of this vital problem over the air," he told the Alderover the air," he told the Aldermen. "To begin now to prohibit a frank and free expression of opinion on national and international affairs would be to take away the station's function as a symbolic Town Hall—common meeting ground for New York's citizens.

or individuals, regardless of race, creed or political leanings, to take the stand in the public squares and on corners of the city to say what will to whoever will stop to h. There is no censorship, and never has been, in such cases.
"After a study of this entire com-

Mr. Kracke attached letters from Jewish leaders defending WNYC from the charge of being anti-Jewish. Dr. Wise wrote that "ab-Jewish. He repudiated the charge that WNYC had been unfair to Jews, saying the charge might be sustained only if the station had denied to Jews the station had denied to Jews the

anti-Semitic spirit. He added that it would be a sad day in America when minorities were throttled and were unable to express their view-points. As an orthodox rabbi and as president of the Rabbinical Council of America, he said he would have given the Arab representatives as much fair play as Mr. Kracke gave them

Louis Fabricant of B'nai B'rith wrote that the incident had been eized upon unjustifiably as an in stance of anti-Semitic feeling, adding that no criticism could be made after both sides had been heard. Similar expressions came from Representative Dickstein, Sol M. Stroock of the American Jewish Committee, the National Council of Jewish Women and the New York Civil Liberties Committee.

After Mr. Kracke had been pep-pered with questions from various Aldermen, Tammany Floor Leader Murray W. Stand moved to file his report on the incident, with the exception of that part asking a retrac-tion from the Aldermen for having adopted the Inselbuch resolution.

Silver Warns Against Five My 'Aberrations' Dayly Lower

World 'Dancing In Mad Abandon,' Says Summer Lecturer 19

The whole generation of young people today is being prepared for the next war-this was declared by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver to be one of the great "aberrations" of the world today in the first university summer lecture before an audience of more than 2,000 persons on the west front of Old Capitol last night.

"The function of the state today is not to preserve law and order and to preserve justice among men, which is all that a state should do, but it is instead a conquest of war," he declared.

Referring to Germany, Italy and Soviet Russia, the 44-year-old rabbi from Cleveland, Ohio, pointed out that today "children of 12 are being made to march in uniform just for the fun of it." The whole thought of a whole generation is being concentrated on one thing, preparedness for war, he said. Concentration Camps

"Some of the saintliest spirits in western Europe today are languishing away in concentration camps because they dared to hold aloft the torch of peace and international cooperation," Rabbi Silver asserted.

"Civiliation today is a race between education and propaganda," he said. "We know how to stamp out illiteracy, but we haven't yet discovered how to get rid of a far more dangerous foe, propaganda."

"Propaganda today has elaborated a technique for befuddling the human mind, undermining human reason and making the masses of people do things which in their sober mind they would never dream of doing," he cried out.

Rabbi Silver outlined five "aberrations, golden calves around which we are dancing today in mad abandon:" the attempt to shackle the human mind and to distort the faculty of human thinking; the sanctification of brutality, ruthlessness and the elevation of violence; the threat to the independence of the individual, the submergence of the individual in the state totalitarian; narrow, intolerant ingrown nationalism, and glorification of war as national destiny.

Asserting that "truth is being shackled to the chariots of political and economic theories" and that "truth is being made to serve the interests of autocracy," he decried the growth of power of the totalitarian states.

"Vermin"

"Totalitarian states have actually begun the rewriting of the whole compendium of human knowledge to get it to conform to the dogmatics of the party in power," he said in citing recent developments in the world.

"A political opponent today is not for all people to "proclaim and an opponent, he is just vermin," he declared. "No tyrant of olden days ever indulged in such indecent bru-tality, such meanness as the leaders of political parties and states are doing today," he said.

Today's nationalism, "like all sms," he said, "has coined a sort of high church terminology of its wn." Citing an example, he rerred to the phrase of "white man's burden" merely as a "coverup for redatory expansionism,"

Rejects "Illusion of a State"

In an impassioned declaration of faith in an undivided Jewish National Home in Palestine, which brought the delegates to their feet in a sustained demonstration, Dr. Wise rejected "the illusion of a Jewish State for the reality of a Jewish National Home.'

The suggestion by Dr. Wise that the United States Government express concern regarding the fulfilment of the League of Nations mandate for Palestine before the British Government had formulated its future policy for that country was followed by the presentation of the resolution asking the State Department to intercede.

Referring to the treaty signed in 1924 between Great Britain and the United States governing the administration of Palestine, the resolu-

tion read:

'In view of the crisis in the a:fairs of the Jewish National Home, which threatens the right of the Jewish people as assured by the terms of the mandate, and in view of reports that the probable preposals that may be made by Hs Majesty's Government to the Pe :manent Mandates Commission of the League of Nations, involving modifications of the terms of the mandate which will prejudice Jewish rights in Palestine and adverse. affect the interest of the Jewish people as guaranteed to them by the convenants and agreements entered into with Great Britain,

"This fortieth annual convention of the Zionist Organization of America respectfully calls on the Govern-ment of the United States to use i's good offices for the purpose of saftguarding the rights of the Jewish people and the integrity of the Jewish National Home as provided for

in the mandate."

Emma Lazarus Honored

In the forenoon, prior to the opening of the convention, a delegation of Zionists, headed by Rabbi Bar-nett R. Brickner of Cleveland, visted Bedloe's Island and placed a wreath on the tablet at the base of the Statue of Liberty on which is inscribed the decication of Emma Lazarus, the American Jewish poet. She wrote "The New Colossus," in 1883. Miss Lazarus was one of the pioneers in the Zionist movement in this country for the rebuilding of Palestine.

Louis Lipsky, chairman of the Palestine Foundation Fund, presided at the afterneon session. Elihu D. Stone of Boston presented the resolution calling on the government here to prevent violation of the terms of the Palestine man-date. It was seconded by Rabbi

American Zionists Vote To Reject Palestine Partition Plan

Stephen S. Wise Reelected President by Acclamation; Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver Rouses Convention to High Pitch of Enthusiasm with Anti-Partition Address

New York (WNS)-Fully endorsed by a unanimous Zionist rank and file, a united American Zionist leadership unequivocally rejected the proposed partition of the Jewish Homeland at the 40th annual convention of the Zionist Organization of America. Although it is still problematic whether the Royal Commission will propose the division of Palestine into Jewish and Arab states, American Zionists went on record against any and all tampering with the present geographic boundaries of Eretz Israel. Dr. Stephen S. Wise, president of the Z.O.A., sounded the keynote of the anti-partition feeling in his presidential message when he declared that American Zionists would under no circumstances surrender their views regardless of what the World Zionist Organization may do in this matter.

The 40th Z.O.A. convention, climaxing 40 years of Zionist activity in America, was marked by a new high in attendance and enthusiasm. Close to 700 delegates and twice that many guests and visitors responded unanimously to the exhortations of Dr. Wise, Louis Lipsky and Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, all of whom proclaimed the sovereignty of the Zionist movement in Jewish life and pledged the Zionists of America to the continuance of the upbuilding of Palestine, come what may in its political destiny.

Dr. Wise's address was in many respects the most significant utterance on fundamental Zionist issue made by an another Zionist since the return of the many weight in Weight in the president of the Z.O.A. proclaimed the ma-

turity of the American Zionist organization, demanding for it full participation in all world Zionist affairs. Citing the United States as a factor of almost equal importance with Great Britain in the present Zionist political crisis, he deplored the fact that world Zionist leadership had apparently minimized the role of America. He also emphasided that American Zionists should have been heard at the Royal Commission hearings, that the World Zionist Congress should be held in New York or Washington in October after the publication of the Royal Commission's report and that the Z.O.A. should no longer be only a fund-raising instrument.

It must be noted, however, that at no time did Dr. Wise challenge or criticize the present leadership of the World Zionist Organization. His complaints were rather in the form of respectful regrets that these vital aspects of the contemporary Zionist situation were not sufficiently appreciated in London and Jerusalem. He employed a similar tone in scoringwithout naming anyone-those Zionists who are known to be flirting with the acceptance of the partition plan. In referring to the recent election of American delegates to the World Zionist Congress, Dr. Wise intimated that if the Congress did not change the present system of elections he would withdraw from fund-raising activities for Palestine and also from active leadership in the Zionist

That Dr. Wise expressed the policy of a united Zionist leadership in America was confirmed when Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland spoke with indignation about the proposed "microscopic" Jewish state and when Louis Lipsky re-echoed his sentiments in a brilliant speech.

In the course of his address Dr. Wise declared that the outcome of the Congress elections in America would have been different "had our comrades of the Poale Zion and the Mizrachi devoted their service to the United Palestine Appeal with the assiduity with which we of the Zionist Organization gave ourselves to its service" and emphasized that "the elections would not have taken place if party advantage had meant less. and unity and effectiveness in the interest of our imperiled cause had meant more." He insisted that at the Zurich Congress "we insist that the rules shall not again make possibleperhaps inevitable—the abortive results of the recent election. The Z.O.A. is not to be penalized because it's major devotion is not to the sale of shekolim."

Reviewing the political situation, he deplored the fact that American Zionists had yielded their better judgment and not insisted on appearing before the Royal Commission, and declared that "the time has come for us to consider whether in the light of present circumstances it is not for us at times to reach decisions which are not to be reversed or vetzed by London or Jerusalem." He stressed the need of common counsel and discussion in the present situation, outlined the important influence American Zionist leaders exercised last summer in London in averting the danger of a stoppage of Jewish immigration to Paiestine and suggested that with re-

ZIONIST DELEGATES LAY WREATH AT STATUE OF LIBERTY

Bedoe's Island, N.Y. (WNS)—The memory of Emma Lazarus, American Zionist pioneer and poetess, was honored by delegates to the convention of the Zionist Organization of America when 100 of them, headed by Rabbi Barnett B. Brickner of Cleveland, made a pilgrimage to this island in New York Harbor to lay a wreath on the tablet containing Miss Lazarus' dedication to the Statue of Liberty, which stands on this island. Rabbi Brickner characterized Miss Lazarus as one who perceived in Palestine, as she did in the Statue of Liberty, the symbol of freedom for the oppressed and the homeless.

Zionists Vote Against Partition Plan

National Convention Demands "Justice" of Great Britain; Emma Lazarus' Pioneering Contribution in "The American Hebrew" Recalled at Statue of Liberty Ceremony

THE fortieth anniversary convention of the Zionist Organization of America — which held sessions in New York from last Sunday to Tueswound up in a blaze of fervor and affirmation in behalf of Palestine. Hundreds of delegates attended the meetings at the Hotel Roosevelt and several thousand onlookers were present at Carnegie Hall Tuesday evening to cheer in sympathy for the Holy Land. Mayor Fiorello H. LaGuardia and Senator Wagner were the main speakers at the mass meeting. They voiced the hope that Great Britain would not countenance any program of partition or cantonization in the Holy Land.

Dr. Stephen S. Wise was re-elected president of the Zionist Organization, 24 delegates were elected to represent America at the forthcoming World Zionist Congress in Switzer-

Preceding any of the public sessions on Sunday, a delegation of Zionists, headed by Rabbi Barnett R. Brickner of Cleveland, made a pilgrimage to Bedloe's Island and there placed a wreath upon the Statue of Liberty, which bears the inscription of a stir-ring poem by Emma Lazarus, Ameri-can poetess of another era. She wrote "The New Colossus" in 1883 and her services to the cause of Palestine were extolled by Rabbi Brickner as well as by Oswald Camp, superintendent of the statue.

Mr. Camp paid particular tribute to Emma Lazarus and reminded his hearers that she first wielded her gifted pen in behalf of her people through her writings in "The American Hebrew," contributing a series of articles entitled "Epistle to the Hebrews," which was later reprinted in brochure form by the Federation of American Zionists in 1900.

A PALL of anxiety and uncertainty hung over the atmosphere of this convention - due to the impending report of the Royal Commission of Inquiry. Therefore, it seems strange to many veteran Zionists that a resolution in opposition to the so-called Partition Plan was jammed through on Sunday without giving the delegates an opportunity to voice their views upon it. This lack of discussion prevailed at most of the sessions—except perhaps on the question of a variable dues. It almost seems as if the more preachment there is about democracy, in affairs guided by Dr. Wise, the less it is evident in practice. Jacob Fishman and other level-headed devoted Zionists openly decried the increasing violations of the democratic spirit. Louis Lipsky presided adroitly throughout.

There was resentment felt likewise against Dr. Wise's veiled attack upon Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the World Zionist Organization. Apparently the former ascribes to the latter his frustration to appear before the Royal Commission. One also could not help wondering why some of the speakers derided and kicked at the League of Nations, on the

hand, and appealed thereto on the other, for justice.

Another painful sidelight of the

proceedings was the manner in which Abe Goldberg's Yiddish speech was abruptly choked off the radio (by whose order we know not), in consequence of which a magnificent ad-dress by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, which followed, was lost to radio audi-

But on the whole, the fortieth anniversary convention was not much different from any others. The same speakers, more or less, the same inarticulateness of delegates who travel hundreds and thousands of miles to attend, the same precision in predict-ing the names of those to be elected. A slight slip in plans was discernible in the election of delegates. Word had gone forth in the corridors that Dr. Wise wanted the present official personnel to receive precedence. But sonnel to receive precedence. But the balloting revealed an outpouring of sentiment in favor of Rabbi Silver, whose votes follow right behind those cast for Dr. Wise.

INVOKING a treaty signed by the United States with Great Britain in 1924, which made America a party to the terms of the League of Nations Mandate for Palestine, the convention adopted a resolution calling upon the government at Washington to intercede with Great Britain to prevent any violation of the Mandate arising from the recommendations of the Royal Commission as a violation of the American-British pact.

The convention unanimously went on record in opposition to any policy of crystallizing the Jewish National Home or curtailing its territory, whether through partition or cantonization, or any other restriction upon the pace of the upbuilding of the

This action was taken following the keynote address by Dr. Wise. Dr. Wise reviewed the political situation that has developed since June, 1936, when he was first elected head of the Zionist Organization of America, declaring that he could not imagine any year could have been "unhappier from the Zionist point of view.

Tracing the problems that have arisen as a result of the Arab disturbances in Palestine and the subsequent appointment of the Royal Commission which has just completed its investi-gation, Dr. Wise stressed the fact that partition of Palestine should never have become a Zionist issue. He declared that the Royal Commission was not named to consider the problem of partition or division but to inquire into the causes of the Arab disorders and to offer recommendations designed to prevent their recur-

Discussing the reported plan for partition, Dr. Wise pointed out that it had nothing whatever to do with the disorders, asserting that far from ending them, partition will bring graver and deeper evils in its wake.

"A partitioned, divided, truncated Palestine would no more be Palestine

than England would be England without Scotland and Wales, without Yorkshire and Northumberland," Dr. Wise said.

Addressing himself to the leaders of the world Zionist movement, Dr. Wise stressed the need of common counsel and discussion in the present situation, and pointed out that American Zionism was not content merely with the role of being a major fund-raising source of world Zionism. As the representatives of the largest Jewish community in the world, American Zionists should have been consulted from the very beginning regarding the threat of partition and should have had the opportunity to offer united resistance against such a plan, Dr. Wise said.

Considering the position which the Zionists in the United States must take with regard to the political situation, Dr. Wise suggested that American Zionism had reached a maturity justifying independent action without arousing any feeling of disloyalty to the World Zionist Congress or the Executive of the Jerusalem Agency, whatever their position might be.

In discussing the attitude of the Jewish people towards partition, Dr. Wise assailed the "histrionic hotheads" who are more avid for the name "Jewish State" than the reality of a Jewish national home.

N Monday in a cable message from London to the convention world Zionist leaders urged Dr. Wise and other leading American Zionists to come to London in order to aid them in avoiding any decisions by the British Government that might jeopardize the future of the Jewish development of Palestine.

The message was signed by Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the World Zionist Organization and the Jewish Agency for Palestine, recognized by the League of Nations as the subreme Jewish authority in the rebuilding of the country, and David Ben Gurion, chairman of the Executive of the Lewish Asserting tive of the Jewish Agency.

The message from London arrived only some hours after Dr. Stephen S. Wise had publicly expressed regret that the Zionist leaders in London and Jerusalem had failed to call upon the leaders of American Jewry to assist them in London in warding off any threats of violation of the League of Nations' Mandate or the Balfour Declaration, as a result of the recommendations expected to be made by the Royal Commission for the partition or division of Palestine between Jews and

The message declared that "in a world restricted by hatred and violence, we are facing a period that will call forth all our reserves, all our fortitude, determination and statesmanship." The world Zionist leaders pointed out in their message that the voice and support of the Jewish population in the American democracy may have a de-cisive effect in the policies that are about to be framed by the British Gov-

"Great Britain undertook, under the terms of the Mandate, to place the country (Palestine) under such political, administrative and economic conditions as will secure the establishment of the Jewish National Home. It failed to do that.

"It undertook to 'facilitate Jewish immigration under suitable conditions. It has failed to do that. Far from opening the docrs of Palestine wide to Jewish mass immigration, it has continually wrangled and bickered and bargained for minimum schedules for immigrants. The depth of the farcical and the outrageous was reached in the

latest schedule which allows 220 labor certificates for a period of four months at a time when hundreds of thousands of Jews are turning to Palestine as their last ray of hope and desperate-ly reaching out for these visas for a new life. Quite properly the Jewish Agency rejected them."

The new executive committee, in addition to the officers, remains virtually unchanged. The convention paid a special tribute to Louis Lipsky by according him unanimous re-election to the executive. The following were elected honorary vice presidents of the Z. O. A.: Prof. Gustave Klausner of St. Louis, Dr. Alex S. Wolf of St. Louis, Rabbi Solomon Goldman of Chicago, Max Shulman of Chicago, Joe Weingarten of Houston, Tex., and Rabbi Barnett R. Brickner of Cleveland.

In answer to a plea by Rabbi Wise the convention voted to launch a \$40,000 fund, in honor of the 40th anniversary of the American Zionist movement, in order to deal with the present critical political situation.

The convention also voted to abolish the national council, and acted on the report of M. Maldwin Fertig, chairman of a special committee to revise the Z. O. A. constitution, by authorizing more autonomy for the Zionist regions and changing the method of electing delegates to the Zionist Congress in anticipation of similar change by the Congress.

The object, however, is not so much to tie Dr. Weizmann's hands as to get more votes for the resolution so as to give the world the impression of greater Jewish unity.

Dr. Weizmann, contrary to reports, did not go to Geneva, but conversed here today with various delegates, including the leaders of the Shomer Hatzaic faction of the Labor party, which will bolt the caucus and vote against the resolu-This group favors a bi-nation. tional Arab-Jewish State in Palestine, and it is reported that about twenty-five of the Zionist party will oppose the resolution for the same

It is understood that Dr. Weizmann sought to bring the leaders around with the argument that the Jews first must have a Jewish State or the prospect of one in order to have the status necessary to advance bi-nationalism with the Arabs. Although there is little expression of the bi-nationalist view in Congress debate some of the supporters in the corridors appear confident-though not at this Congreas session-that it will come to the fore again.

Tonight's session was devoted mainly to a strong plea favoring the Weizmann policy by the Labor party leader David Ben Gurion.

ZURICH, Switzerland, Aug. 10.-(AP)-Two resolutions came before the World Zionist Congress tonight one urging fresh negotiations with Britain on Palestine problems, the other strongly opposing any dealings whatever with Britain on partition of the Holy Land.

Both resolutions condemned the British Royal Commission plan to partition Palestine into three states Jewis, Arab and a British-mandated area.

The majority resolution, however, stood for new negotiations on the problem of establishing a Jewish national home in Palestine, now administered by Britain under League of Nations mandate.

Recesses Late

The minority report expressed firm opposition to any discussion that might consider partition, holding that "the inalienable right of the Jewish people to their historic homeland cannot be signed away."

The Congress recessed late to-night when leaders found debate would be so extensive no vote could be reached for many hours. Delegates were summoned for a sion tomorrow morning at which officials announced roll call votes would be taken on the majority and minority resolutions.

The congress earlier in the day had split wide open into two factions over the partitioning scheme and it was only after hours of negotiation that opposition delegates were induced to meet with the others tonight. Rabbi Stephen Wise

of New York acted as chairman.

Louis Lipsky of New York criticized Rabbi Wise and Rabbi Abba

H. Silver of Cleveland for abandoning the majority of the United States delegation and refusing to

States delegation and consider the partition plan.

"The whole Zionist movement is dismemberment of opposed to dismemberment of Palestine but the issue facing the congress is a choice of two alterna-tives that were placed before us as practical matter through proals by diagonal rule of the mandatory government," Lipsky declared.

Nearly half of the voting dele-gates had ignored the day's regular congress session and attended separate meeting under Rabbi Stephen Wise of New York to for-mulate counter proposal to Zionist President Chaim Weizmann's plan, which would permit consideration of the British partition scheme.

When Congress first assembled, feeling was pretty ofrong against Partition. Then, suddenly, there was an amazing switch over to it; and now, in the closing stages of the debate, there appears to me to be a slight reaction on the part of some of the rank and-file whose consciences, perhaps, are pricking them and who are asking themselves whether, quite apart from the intrinsic merits of the issue involved, it was not perhaps a political blunder to let it be known that the Jewish people are prepared to bargain on this issue.

An excellent statement opposing Partition came from Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, who spoke in the course of last night's secret session. When I showed Rabbi Silver the official communiqué of his address he thought it was a very poor reproduction of what he had said. He then

dictated to me the text of his speech.

The Report of the Royal Commission, he said, set the fashion for illogical conclusions, and this method had been adopted by Congress. The Report vindicated all their claims, stated that the position of the Arabs had improved greatly, that the Arab landowners and fellaheen had profited, that the health of the population had improved, and that all this had been made possible through the growth of the Jewish population in Palestine. The conclusion should then have been a recommendation for a vigorous prosecution of the Mandate. Instead, there was an unwarranted and radical proposal to dismember the country. Similarly, Dr. Weizmann failed to draw the logical conclusions of his own declarations. He criticised the Palestine Administration, declared that the Mandate could be carried out, that the riots in Palestine could have been prevented, and that the fault was the weakness, blundering, and, in part, definite sabotage on the part of members of the Palestine Administration.
What, asked Rabbi Silver, should have been his conclusions?

Illogical Conclusions

On all three scores they were likely to be disappointed. Partition did not offer the promise of a lasting settlement with the Arabs. The Arabs had said that they would resist it. Should trouble arise, went on Rabbi Silver, and the English Government be called in as the protector of the Arab minority, it would arrive possibly at the same conclusions as those at which the Commission had arrived, namely, a further partition or perhaps even a complete liquidation of the Jewish homeland. The immigration of 2,000,000 Jews in twenty years, an idea which had tantalised the members of Congress, would depend upon a large number of and conditions the realisation of which nobody could guarantee.

He then enumerated these "ifs," and said that on their basis they

'BE CALM,' SILVER URGES ZIONISTS

Palestine Problems Being Studied, He Says

Rabbi A. H. The Jewish people there did not seem to be greatly discouraged, he said, but told him that they were there to stay, that there was no other place for them to go and that they were prepared to meet what-ever difficulties might come with the assurance that they could not be much greater than others already surmounted.

The rabbi took his family to Paris for a week to attend the exposition, which he said was distinguished and artistic. He noted that just op-posite the tall Nazi building was the Soviet building, on top of which were huge figures of a man and a woman armed with mallet and sickle held aloft toward the facing edifice.

"I was struck with the symbolism." said he. "It represented perfectly the status of Europe."

Partition, which would give only one-fifth of Palestine to the Jews, would have to include in the Jewish area a quarter of a million Arabs, Rabbi Silver told the society at a meeting in the Temple last

This will prove to be "an intract-able irredentist minority," he said Rabbi Silver, who opposed the ma-jority opinion at the recent World's Zionist Congress at Zurich, said that the proposals would solve none of the present problems.

would be Arabs and a source of continual trouble, he said.

"There is not a scintilla of cvidence that partitioning will bring about peace in Palestine." Rabbi Silver declared. "When the question was put up to the Arabs, they said 'No" And when the Arabs say 'no' they mean 'no,'

Sights Trouble With Arabs

"Our trouble is that we under estimate the position of the Arabs. There are 300,000 Arabs in the proposed Jywish state. They are a bitter ir edentist group. They are backed by all the rest of the Arabs.

He said once the new Jewish state is set ap as designated by the British Royal commission in its partitioning plan there would cer-tainly be trouble with the Arabs.

"There would be incidents," ne ontinue. "England would step in three, four or five times, and finally ask 'How long have we got to keep this up?' They would be-come tired of going into the coun-try to keep order."

Claude L. Kulp, superintendent of Ithaca schools and president of the State Teachers Association, told the delegates from eleven countles that delegates from eleven counties that the public school system of the state would be destroyed if an attempt were made at the constitutional convention to tamper with the section regarding the public school set-up. At the same time, he sounded a warning against Federal aid to schools, declaring he was "scared of the possibility of Federal control of public schools in the event of Federal aid being given."

In an address at a morning session of the two-day meeting, Bishop G. Bromley Oxnam, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, voiced his opposition to "those who will destroy political liberty in the quest for economic security," and urged the teachers to do their part to preserve democracy in a changing world.

In the last month Rabbi A. H. The American community is no longer bounded by regional geographical lines, but has become national in scope, Dr. George S. Counts, Professor of Education at Teachers College, declared in his asdress on "The Teacher and the Community."

"We ought to take a more active part in community life." Dr. Counts said. "I know that some people think this is dangerous advice, and it undoubtedly is. We know that if teachers take an active part in community life they will be sub-

incted to criticism. Other groups have been criticized for taking an interest in seciety. However, teachers must accept more responsibility than they have hitherto done for the improvement of educational conditions."

Five qualities of a good teacher were outlined by Dr. Samuel Grafflin, editor of The American Aristocrat, in a session on intermediate grades, held at the Central Commercial High School Auditorism. A good teacher, Dr. Grafflin said, needs imagination, a sense of values, a motivating power, a plan of life and a "great spiritual power to hold her steady." To a good teacher her profession is an adventure and not just a job, he suggested.

The importance of knowing people, or appreciating their merits and being tolerant toward others was atressed by Dr. Robert Russell Wicks, dean of University Chapel, Princeton, in an address on "Our Youth in a Secular Ward," at the high school section held in the Hotel Commodor: He decried the lendency of secular civilization to rely on force. The greatest hope for democracy in the world today, he commented, was the multiplication of trusting people who have dealism and a sense of sacredness. A threefold plan whereby high school teachers could help in the entatilment of crime was offered by J. A. Smith Jr., assistant special agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation here. Citing specific cases in the apprehension of criminals, Mr. Smith said that 50 percent of those arrested for major rimes were less than 21 years old. It was within the teachers' powers to assist in setting high school youths on the right path, he held.

The proposal urged that State normal schools be four year institutions and grant bachelor of science or arts degrees. At present most of the normal schools have only the three-year curricustry.

MILITANT DEMOCRACY

DEMCCRACY is too generous with its enemies, Rabbi A. H. Silver of The Temple contended in als address at the annual Armistice Day luncheon yesterday.

He raised a point which has troubled most persons of liberal thought, i. e., How far should we go in giving subversive elements the liberty to destroy the institutions of free speech and free assemblythe very freedom that makes possible the existence of these groups?

Rabbi Silver urges a faith in the rightness of our democratic ideals and a militant effort to protect and defend them. He would, for example, deny to organizations opposed to democracy the right to parade and publicize their cause by uniformed display.

In his plan for the conduct of the democracy, he gives great weight to a plea that the masses be given a just share of the fruits of production.

Rabbi Silver is a scholar and a humanitarian. Perhaps he could be trusted to single out unerringly those enemies whom democracy should suppress. But there are those, for example, who raise the cry of Communism as a counter-attack against any effort toward the equitable distribution that Rabbi Silver proposes.

Therein lies the danger. Civil liberty must be protected against those who would use "defense of democracy" as a cloak for bigotry and economic oppression. Hence we must proceed slowly and carefully, lest we fall into the evil which we condemn in others.

Rabbi Silver, of course, is well aware of this, as he indicates, on unshakable ground, when he advocates a sharply questioning attitude loward propaganda from whatever source. If we can discriminate between the true and the false, between justice and selfishness, the destructive agencies which he deploces will collapse of their own

Chicago Expans There is developing a search for an antitoxin against propaganda, both within the United States and Great Britain, Recently Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland called up on the New York State Teachers' Association which he addressed to offer courses in the diagnosis of propaganda. He told the teachers:

"Propaganda has perfected the art of befuddling the minds of the people with half-truths, slogans and catchwords. It is an elaborate technique for stampeding the masses into doing what in sober judgment they would never do. Education under nazism, fascism and communism is avowedly and shamelessly propagandistic and dogmutic. Our children should be trained to detect propaganda."

Rabbi Silver is known foremost as a preacher and a rabbi, but a glance at his long and distinguished record in the field of community and social service shows him to be a man of action, whose tnfluence has pervaded the whole life around him, and even extended, especially among the Jewish people in every corner of the land, to countries overseas.

This week's celebration of Armistice Day brought no more forceful warning for the adherents of popular government than that ecutained in Rabbi Silver's address to the Cuyahoga County organization of the American Legion.

Choosing a timely theme in Brazil's sudden flop from democracy to Fascism, this Cleveland liberal and civic leader impressed on his audience the menacing situation in which free government finds itself on this continent. Caught in a squeeze play between Communists and Fascists, hemmed about by foes of the democratic tradition, Americans find themselves unwittingly on the defensive against political creeds hostile to every principle they hold dear.

It is not enough for Americans to realize that their form of government vouchsafes for them priceless privileges denied to men who live under a dictator. They must militantly defend these privileges. They must resist the encroachments of Communist and Fascist, firm in the creed on which the American state was founded and has prospered all these years.

With Brazil, almost a next-door neighbor, surrendering to Mussolinian philosophy, the peril comes figuratively close to the boundaries of the United States. It is no longer a distant menace. No American can dismiss it as no concern of his.

The democratic creed is tolerant, but it cannot afford to be indifferent. It endures and invites differences of opinion, but must not surrender. It thrives by free speech and free assembly, but it cannot permit plotting to overthrow by force the temple of political justice and freedom.

To men of rare eloquence like Rabbi Silver, to the leaders in civil and religious life, to the millions of average Americans, most of them voiceless but all of them inaplired by love of country, democracy must lock for safety in these stormy days. A heritage Zeyo'nd price is at stake.

Fascism, Communism Are in Conflict

Of the three major political religions now in power over a grea part of the world, the ideals of democracy are closest to the ideals o prophetic religion as practiced by Jews and Protestants, said Dr. Reinhold Niebuhr today. Dr. Niebuhr is professor of applied religion in Union Theological Seminary, New

He was one of the speakers at the opening session of the three-day symposium on "Religion Speaks," being held under the auspices of the Temple. Today's subject was "Communism. Fascism and Democracy.

The session, meeting in the ballroom of Hotel Cleveland, was attended by 600 of all creeds and

Political Religions

Least in accord with prophetic religion, Dr. Niebuhr listed Fascism although he limited the appeal of Communism to the industrial work-The three forms of government he characterized as "political religions.

While having the least regard for Fascism, he expressed the belief that Fascism would be accepted here in preference to Communism if the country rejected demorracy.

Rabbi A. H. Silver presided at the meeting. He stated the symposium was called because religion had lost its voice in recent months and other forces, more strident, urgent and commanding, had drowned it out. To make religion heard again, he had decided on the symposium for universal religion, he said.

Fascism Offer Negative

Dr. Stephen S. Wise, founder and president of the Jewish Institute of Religion and president of the Zionist Organization of America, was the second speaker.

"Fascism offers all that religion negates," he said. "It means not 'each for all and all for each' but all for the state and the government of the state. Fascism is regimentation and therefore enslavement, whereas religion means liberation. There can never be a truce between religion and Fascism'

Democracy Stands Alone

THE Temple Men's club deserves praise for the three-day symposium, opened yesterday by eminent speakers discussing the relationship of the fascist and communist menaces to religion, and the consequent path of the religious forces. Following the speeches yesterday of Dr. Niebuhr and Rabbi Wise, the symposium continues at The Temple tonight and tomorrow night.

To listen to Drs. Niebuhr and Wise was to sit at a great feast. Their words were electric to more than 1,000 hearers, though hardly more so than were Rabbi Silver's in his Armistice day oration. If in any heart there was a wavering essential faith in democracy's present, and its ultimate spiritual conquest of the mockery now going on in totalitarian lands, it should have been banished by Rabbi Wise's stirring appeal to his people to become "fanatics"-a term used and decried by Dr. Niebuhr-for democracy.

Coming at the very close of the double speech, it satisfied many who were waiting for just that emotional appeal on behalf of the society of mankind which is palpably the highest and most nearly

"Democracy," Dr. Niebuhr had said. "has after all a sense of the dignity of man;" while naziism and fascism are a form of frightened retreat to primitive tribalism, the glorifying of tyranny in terms of the conquest of right by power, while communism is an evangelist effort at razing economic power by building up comparable political power, he said.

Perhaps too deep or fascinated a study of the differences of communism and fascism may lead some to wonder whether a choice of two vast evils is sometime to be precipitated for the Anglo-Saxon republics. We do not think there will be a choice. There will not be when there is a militant public opinion aroused for

Some of these labor leaders are jailbirds who use the union as a vehicle for the sort of racketeering that other criminals carry on in other fields. They make money out

"Frequently such men, while nominally representatives of unions, are themselves in business and use their offices to force their product upon those who have to employ members of their union and to

ness. Men will sometimes be calle out on a strike for no other reaso than that such representative than that such representative might shake down the employer.

"It is quite hopeless in some of these unions to attempt to our these racketeer leaders. No elec-tions are held, or, if held, voting is in the open and it takes high cour-age indeed to oppose in the open these strong muscle men.

Strength of Unions

"That such parasites disgrace the movement of organized labor goes without saying. That enemies of or-ganized labor seize upon these facts and magnify them and declare them to be typical of the entire labor movement is quite clear. The strength of the trade union movement has always been its moral strength, its just appeal to the reason and conscience of men.

"The shameless explcitation of the movement by a few unscrupulous racketeers is a menace which trade uniquicity.

which trade unionists should be the first to expose. To shield such crooks in the thought that by so doing one is defending trade unionism is a tragic delusion. These rata should be exterminated. Every support should be given by organized labor to the legally constituted agencies of government to ferret out these fees of labor, convict and purple these. punish them.

"Lawlessness, generally, has not helped the labor movement. When peaceful picketing becomes mass coercion and intimidation, when violence is resorted to, when a small minority in a plant seeks to impose its will upon an unwilling majority of workers through what amounts to sabotage, when jurisdictional disputes between unions interrupt production, when coninterrupt production, when con-tracts with employers are willfully broken, or when strikes are called on the slightest provocation and frequently without authorization from the parent body, labor defeats itself. THE preservation of democracy in the United States will come from labor and not from capital, asserted Rabbi A. H. Silver in a timely and erlightening discourse on the subject of labor relations."

He cited the willingness of capital to go Fascist when threatened, as demonstrated in Europe and America. His point was that labor must take care to do nothing that will bring the cemocratic processes into disrepute.

The strength of the trade union has always been in its appeal to reason and justice, Rabbi Silver recognizes. Thus he suggests that unionists should be the first to condemn exploitation of their movement by a handfil of racketeers.

That uniwnists tend to temper this condemnation is probably due to the fact that the charges are taken up and magnified by groups whose hatred of labor is apparent, and whose own methods are often lawless and unconscionable.

Calls for Stronger Friendship of Faiths

The Interdenominational Home Missions Council, represerting the home missions boards and societies of all the major Protestant denominations of the United States and Canada, issued last week a state-ment with regard to Jewish and

ment with regard to Jewish and Christian relations which deserves the highest commendation.

Rabbi A. H. Silver, in the concluding address of the symposium "Religion Speaks," said: "Christians ought to fight anti-Semitism as they would fight anti-Christ." Thoughtful Christians are coming more and more to see the truth in such a pronouncement. It is interesting. therefore, that in the wake of Dr. Silver's words there comes this document urging, in the strongest language possible, all Christians to unite in the removal of racial prejudice and the development of measures making for friendly and sym-

Ever since the Kellogg-Briand pact, nations no longer wage war. They just fight! Brazen duplicity, official lying, intrigue and cynicism characterized international relations during the last year. There was no repentance among statesmen, no vision, no brave new voice raised for a new international order. The political leaders of the earth seemed to be bogged down in a frightful Serbonian bog of their own duplicity and blundering. They churn and splatter and mess about. But they get nowhere.

"President Roosevelt's fresh and cheering appeal, made in Chicago, calling for concerted action for peace was a voice in the wilderness. England was not ready to back up such a program with acence-and words without action in the present international setup are ridiculously ineffective.

Hits Britain's Policy

"There is ro prospect for any ef-ective cheek upon Japan, Italy or Germany except through concerted action. And England seems to be incapable of such forthright and single-minded co-operation. In fact, the whole European chaos since 1932 may be laid at the door of 10 Down-ing Street. From 1932, when Eng-land wrecked the League of Nations by obstructing international action against Japan, through her separate naval treaty with General which naval treaty with Germany which served notice that the allied front is broken, through the sanctions flasco against Italy which she in-augurated and sabotaged, through the teet acceptance of the remilitariza ion of the Rhineland, up to the present double dealing in Spain, Great Britain has been a dangerous ly blundering and confusing factor in the international situation.

"Apologists and propagandists call this uncertain, inept and improvised this uncertain, inept and improvised diplomacy 'muddling through.' That rationalizes it into a cardinal virtue. But his 'muddling through' is damnably hard on the rest of the world and ultimately also on Great Britaia. This unwillingness on the part of the British government to speak the clear unambiguous word at the cirtical moment and to match action with words brought on the action with words brought on the World War. This same technique— if it is a technique and not just repetitious ineptitude—has made a madhouse out of Europe.

madhouse out of Europe.

"This is true of the British policy also in Palestine. Palestine is an armed camp today because of the weakness and indecision of the mandatory government.

"It is said that when England will have completed her rearmament she then will be able to act decisively. She will again lay down the law to the world. It is too late for that, Other nations are rearming also. England must decide to co-operate whole-heartedly with the remaining free nations of with the remaining free nations of the earth, and until her decision is made the fate of democracy in Eu-rope will hang in the balance. Fascism will remain aggressive, even though internally poor and domestically a failure.

"The bloody purges which have been going on in the Soviet Union in 1937, twenty years after the revolution, are again driving home the fact that Utopia cannot be ushered in at the point of the barronet. bayonet.
