RAPS 'WEAK' BRITISH Cedar RA

Town Hall Speaker Says Cooperation England, France, U. S. Needed.

Condemning Great Britain for the weak stand of its foreign office in matters affecting world peace during the last four or five

years, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland Sinai temple sounded a warning for the United States in the Japanese situation in his talk

on "This Changing World" given before an enthusiastic Town Hall audience Thursday night at St. Paul's Methodist church.

"There is no prospect for pacification of the world today, or of curbing belligerent nations without the wholehearted cooperation of France, England and the Unit-

ed States—the world's three great democracies," brought out the speaker. "England seems unwilling to carry through a consistent, deliberate and wholehearted program. Its foreign office for the last four or five years has not lived up to tradition, and in my opinion most of the trouble in the international scene today can be put squarely on the threshold of

No. 10 Downing street." British Policy "Confusing."

Ever since 1932 when Great Britain kept the league of nations from following through sanctions against Japan when that nation was found by an investi-gating committee to be the aggressor against China, England's foreign policy has been confusing and introduced an element of chaos into the international situation, Rabbi Silver maintained. He cited naval agreements made with Germany while France was ignored, a refusal to enforce sanctions against Italy in the Ethiopian crisis, and said that the British had forced the popular-front government of France to adopt a non-intervention policy in Spain that practically closed the frontier against the loyalist government

although it was known that the fascist nations of Europe would support that party in Spain.

"Great Britain must make up her mind as to whether she will cooperate consistently, faithfully and wholeheartedly," said the speaker. "Until she makes this decision the fascists will continue to gain headway, they will capitalize on the lack of firmness on

the part of democracies." Following out this statement. Rabbi Silver cited the recent fascist gains in Roumania and South America, and the fascist attempt to undermine the French

republic. "America has been ready to cooperate wholeheartedly," said the speaker of the proposed world movement to maintain peace, adding that the present situation would have been different if the

European nations had not grabbed their selfish aims. "America is ready to cooperate today," he con-

Blockade Could End War.

A united blockade of Japan would in six weeks end its war in China, Rabbi Silver said. But, he warned, if the United States alone boycotts that nation it means that all of the trade will go to Great Britain and France and no headway will be made toward peace.

Rabbi Silver Urges International Peace Action

The proposed Ludlow amend-ment, although well-intentioned and nobly motivated, is not practical and will not achieve the desired goal of peace, asserted Rabbi A. H. Silver, speaking on "Shall We Have Referendum on War?" at the Temple yesterday morning.
"It is a democratic delusion that

the masses are more peace-minded and less likely to be propagandized into war than their chosen representatives," said Dr. Silver. "It is naive to assume that the rank and file is better informed, better intentioned and more idealistic than the men to whom they have delegated the authority to make laws for them and vital decisions.

"Our government is not a primitive absolute democracy. It is a representative government. If we cannot trust our chosen representatives to make grave decisions, then our whole philosophy of govern-ment is brankrupt. To ask for a meeting system of governin 1938, and for a nation of 130,000,000 is to invite chaos and

Adequate Opinion Channels

"If we are dissatisfied with the intellectual competence and the moral integrity of our chosen representatives we can send others to take their places. The electorate also has adequate channels to make its opinion heard-the press, the public forum and the radio, as well as direct communication with the lawmakers in Congress, who are not at all deaf to the opinions of

their constituents. Beyond this, we must trust the wisdom and the patriotism of our representatives.

"The long delay which would be involved in a popular referendum on war would simply give the prospective enemy not only the opportunity to build up his military forces but to lay down a barrage of forces but to lay down a barrage of propaganda in our own country, dividing our people, inciting one nationality group against another and invoking old world loyalties. So that even if war is finally declared, our people would be found hopelessly divided and enmeshed in bitter partisanship.

Urges International Action

There is no short cut to peace. Neither pacifism nor peace propaganda nor the outlawry of war nor disarmament proposals nor neutrality legislation nor a popular referendum will bring about peace Peace is an international probler and calls for international actio Only collective action for collective security would meet the situation

"Only an international organiz tion implemented to enforce international law. capable of the instantaneous application of both economic and military sanctions, will give the nations of the earth a sense of security and will make the piling of life-draining armaments unnecessary

OF POLITICAL TRAPS

He Cites Those Abroad Who Were Self-Deceived Into Supporting Foes of Democracy

ROOSEVELT BACKS CAUSE

His Greeting Given to Capital
Palestine Parley by Secretary
—\$4,500,000 Sought

WASHINGTON, Jan. 23. A plea to American Jewry to align itself with the friends of democracy and not with those elements of "special economic interest" which in other lands fostered the rise to power of non-democratic and anti-Semitic groups was delivered today by Harold L. Ickes, Secretary of the Interior, before the National Conference of the United Palestine Appeal.

In the address, sent out over WOL of the Mutual Broadcasting System, the Secretary urged "cooperation" of the Jewish people "in a democratic solution of the grave problems confronting democracy in a modern world."

Other speakers on the second and closing day of the conference appealed for the help of American Jewry in financing immigration to Palestine of Jews suffering persecution in Germany, Rumania and Poland and in financing the economic development of Palestine. The drive aims at a total contribution of \$4,500,000 by American Jewry to the colonization movement.

Other Speakers of Day

The speakers included Stephen S. Wise, president of the Zionist Organization of America and of the American Jewish Congress Dr. Alba Hillel Silver, pewly inducted national challman of the United Palestine Appeal; Dr. Philip S. Bernstein of Rochester, Dr. Maurice J. Karpf of the Jewish Agency in Palestine, Dr. Bernard Joseph, legal adviser of the Jewish Agency for Palestine; Senator Robert J. Bulkley of Ohio, and Representative Herman P. Kopplemann of Connecticut.

In opening his address Mr. Ickes said that President Roosevelt had instructed him "to convey deep and continuing sympathy" for the conference efforts "to rebuild a national home for the Jewish people in Palestine."

Mr. Ickes cited the need for "a viable Jewish homeland in Palestine," since "cruel pressures" against the Jewish people in Europe had not relaxed and access to Palestine had not become carried

Urging "cooperation of J ws in preservation of a tradition of civilized living the ugues critical perice of economic change," the Secretary asserted:

"Never forget that the foes of demouracy in other lands were financed by economic groups that professedly were only attempting to protect their property from political incompetency.

Warns of "Self-Deception"

"Never forget that among those now suffering in other lands are many who foolishly believed that they could protect themselves by supporting democracy's foes and who yielded to the self-deception that the intolerance avowed by tyrannical power was really not aimed, and certainly would not be directed, against them, but only against so-called enemies of law and order.

"Just as men and women in despair of a solution of their economic ills yield to dictators, so desperate dictators seek escape from internal resentments in foreign wars. If only a way could be found to relieve these internal resentments, we might look forward to a new, more generous and more enlightened spirit in international relations."

Dr. Wise warned the conference that "there is danger lest England forget" that Jews "have invested our hopes, our loyalties, our dreams" in the rebuilding of Palestine, and that the Jewish State that ought to come" without partition of Palestine by Great Britain may not come with partition.

Points to Hemisphere Moves

Presiding at tonight's banquet, Representative Kopplemann, citing the recent edict against Jews in Ecuador and the "menace" of anti-Semitism in Brazil, warned that the Western Hemisphere was not exempt from "the sweep of Jewish persecutions."

During today's sessions opportunity was given to Dr. Karpf to present the position of the "non-Zionist" on the question of the settlement of Palestine.

He asserted that he believed partition of Palestine was "socially unwise, economically unsound, politically unsafe." He expressed the belief that Arabs and Jews could "live side by side," their harmony "vouchsafed by a democratic form of government." He urged a "round table" of Jews and Arabs to reach understanding of and respect for each other's problems.

A resident of Palestine, who was a member of the conference, charged that Italy and Germany were fumenting Arab hostility toward Great Britain and that in this procedure "the Jews were being sacrificed."

Fascism and Irreligion Will Die, 150 Told at Arlington Dinner

OFFICERS INSTALLED

10,000,000 War Ghosts Stir up Persecution, Says Ohioan

The fight for the preservation of religion, in spite of Fascism and other disrupting influences, will be won, predicted Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, O., to about 150 members of Binghamton Jewry at the Community Center installation dinner held last night in the Arlington hotel.

"Jewry and her daughter, Christianity are not on the abyss of doom, although for the past two decades since the World War. 10.-000,000 ghosts from 10,000,000 graves have stirred up the people, and have caused persecution in all countries of the world. We have outlived this oppression as we always have in former times of trouble, and although religion as we know it now has retrogressed a bit for the past few years, what are a few years compared to the triumphs in the past, and the triumphs that will always be won by those who seek peace and religious tolerance?" he asked. The occasion was the induction into office of Rabbi David Sherman, new head of the Center, and other officers for the coming year. With a vivid vocabulary and forceful personality Rabbi Silver, continued:

"The Jewish people have never accepted the pronouncement of doom on our race, and in spite of Fascism and other ideas contrary to human ideals, we will win our fight for the preservation of religion in the whole of the civilized western world. The wars being waged in other countries are not between men, but between the idea of religion as we now know it, and irreligion.

"That is why those who dare acknowledge this inner-war are so heavily tyrannized under those regimes which deal with little or no truth, and the submersion of the individual mind. Every man has the right to say "The world was created for my sake," and that is impossible unless the bitter war of sympathy, kindness, justice and peace versus terror, oppression, purges and mock trials is won by the unique feature of Christianity, Universality."

In outlining the duties of a present-day Rabbi. Rabbi Silver cumerated them as 'Be a light it Israel; Be a strong iron pillar, have ideals in mind and stick to them; and Be a strong hammer, learning to fight for these ideals. He lauded the work of Rabbi Sherman when associated with him in Cleveland, and warned that

He lauded the work of Rabbi Sherman when associated with him in Cleveland, and warned that there are three institutions which are to be considered for a successful life in the ministry: the synagogue, the school, and the home. These three are the sources of inspiration for a modern rabbi, he said.

Rabbi Sherman was installed by David Levene, a past president of the center, and urged that the adults be cooperative in the center's program for the Jewish youth of the community, because parents should set an example for their children.

Enemies of Democracy

Clear white light, a brief quotation from Rabbi Silver's speech in Cleveland will bear repeating. If every American man and woman could have heard him, or could read his words, believe in them and abide by them, our democratic national security would face no hazards.

Rabbi Silver says to those in love America:

"These forces which believe democracy is a lie, the state is everything and the individual nothing, are today concocting a poison of lies and half-truths, hatred and devilish appeals to class and race prejudice; and they afflict this subtle poison on the masses of people until the masses are half crazed by the propagarda; and when these masses come to their senses they are faced by machine guns, and there is nothing to save them. . . .

"When you meet a person who is fighting fascism, and that person does not in the same breath

denounce communism, you will know he is an enemy of democracy; and when you meet a person who is fighting communism, and that person does not in the same breath denounce fascism, you will know him for an enemy of democracy."

Dr. Chaim Weizmann Hails Silver's Election

In his message to Dr. Silver, Dr. Weizmann said: "I deeply appreciate your assumption of the national chairmanship of the United Palestine Appeal which has been launched at a moment when success is equally vital both from a political as well as financial standpoint. I trust you will succeed in uniting America."

DR. SILVER LAUNCHES R. I. PALESTINE DRIVE

\$15,000 Pledge as First 1938 U.P.A. Campaign Gets Under Way

PROVIDENCE, R. I. — The first address of Dr. Abba Hillel Silver as National Chairman of the United Palestine Appeal was delivered at the Central High School here on Wednesday evening, January 28, before a crowd of 1,500 people who gathered from all parts of Ehode Island to launch the fund-raising effort for Palestine and to hail Dr. Silver as the newly elected leader of the Palestine rebuilding forces in America.

The sum of \$5,000 was presented to Dr. Silver at the meeting and pledges for \$15,000 were voiced by leaders from the various communities in Rhode Island.

"Partition or no partition—we shall go on building" Dr. Silver told the cheering crowd. "Our progress may be temporarily retarded, but we will not be defeated."

Dr. Silver blamed the Palestine government for the slackening of its efforts. He expressed hope that American Jewry would continue "with ever greater zeal to strengthen the economic positions already established and to build new ones." He called upon American Jewry for increased sums to purchase the land that can be bought today in Palestine, and to settle Jews already on the land in Jewish possession,

The morning after the meeting hundreds of workers entered into every section and community in Rhode Island on a state-wide canvass that will make possible the raising of the quota. Individual pledges indicated that success would be attained,

I lay down my office as Chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, resigning to the care of younger and stronger hands than my own. I will not lay down my office after two years of incumbency thereof without saying to my gifted and brilliant successor that I am at his command. As Chairman of the United Palestine Appeal Executive Committee I pledge him the fullest measure of my cooperation, looking for a fruitful, blessedly triumphant year under his extraordinarily gifted leadership. In this year of doubt and indecision there must be at least one great affirmation—the affirmation of American Jewry's generous, ceaseless and unequivocal united support. As far as it may lie in my power to evoke such support for the United Palestine Appeal it shall be done, and I am only one of Dr. Silver's co-Chairmen of the 1938 campaign, in addition to Louis Lipsky, Morris Rothenberg, Israel Goldstein, Harold Jacobi and Solomon Goldman, upon whose zealous cooperation and unfaltering loyalty he may confidently rely.

Lead us, then, Dr. Silver, throughout a year of unwearied endeavor and of unparalleled achievement for our people and the Land of Brael.

Dr. Silver Succeeds Dr. Wise As Head of 1938 Campaign

Few conferences have met at so dramatic an hour in Jewish life; no conference has been so broadly representative of the determination of American Jewry to bring a constructive solution to the troubled situation in Palestine as the National Conference for Palestine of the United Palestine Appeal which met in Washington, D. C., last weekend, five years after the advent of Hitler, eighteen days after the issuance of the British White Paper.

Solemnly, hundreds of delegates streamed into the Mayflower Hotel not to brood and grieve over the sorrows that have overwhelmed so many Jews in Rumania, Poland and Germany, but to take counsel and plan a maximum program of American Jewish cooperation in the upbuilding of Palestine through the United Palestine Appeal, to open wider the doors of Palestine to the rapidly increasing ranks of the homeless and the oppressed.

Although Rumanian Jewry had not been free of anti-Semitic pressure up to the beginning of the Goga regime, the coming into power of an avowed anti-Jewish party was reflected in the Washington Conference. Not since the Nazis took control of Germany had Jewish leaders in America felt so keenly the dangers to Jewish existence. It was quite evident that all the delegates felt that the Jewish community in America was the last stronghold of freedom of action and expression for a large section of world Jewry—that responsibility could no longer be shifted elsewhere—and that all of American Jewry's resources must be mobilized for a constructive program to make possible mass Jewish immigration into Palestine.

SEC. ICKES SEES GREATER NEED FOR PALESTINE UPBUILDING

A man high in the nation's government struck the keynote of the National Conference of the United Palestine Appeal. When Secretary of the Interior Harold L. Ickes declared that new restrictions and cruel pressures against Jews in European lands have made the need for a viable Jewish National Home greater than ever before, he sounded the call to united action of all Jewish elements in America to support the 1938 campaign of the United Palestine Appeal.

Perhaps the most significant phenomenon at the Washington Conference was that at a moment of deepest sorrow for the Jewish people in so many parts of the world, the delegates and leaders in Washington did not yield to the counsel of despair but in the words of Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, the newly-elected National Chairman to succeed Dr. Stephen S. Wise, banished the dirge of doom and in its place sounded the clarion call for positive action inspired by the imperishable spirit of the Jewish people in the face of darkest suffering.

This same emphasis upon constructive action rather than static self-analysis marked the consideration of the problems facing Palestine as a result of the Royal Commission report and the British White Paper.

Speaking not only as the great Jewish community of America, but as an important section of the American nation which is directly concerned with the future of the Mandate as a result of the American-British Convention of 1924, the National Conterence urged Great Britain to carry out her pledges in the Balfour Declaration and the Mandate and to restore the prinple of absorptive capacity as the measure of Jewish immigration into Palestine. It called upon the British Government to end the period of political uncertainty in Palestine which has caused considerable setbacks to the economic development of the country.

The Conference marked the installation of Dr. Silver as National Chairman of the United Palestine Appeal. To Dr. Wise, retiring from two years of leadership of the United Palestine Appeal campaign, the delegates expressed their tribute in a long and stirring ovation.

Rabbi A. H. Silver Lists Qualifications at Temple

He is not a doctrinaire, a dogmatist or a bigot. He does not sacrifice means to ends. He avoids the vices of excessive virtues. He does not play safe, only fair. He has strong convictions but also broad tolerance.

"The superior man respects honest craftsmanship of hand and mind.
"The superior man tries to master both his good fortune and his mis-fortune. He does not succumb to grief and sorrow. His spirit is not

dulled by prosperity and success.

"And finally, the superior man is not tight-minded but open-minded. He is a seeker. The adventure of the human intellect in the undiscovered continents intrigues him. He hails every new vista which opens up before man. He does not scoff at the old because it is old, nor does he resist the new just because it is new."

Personally, I have long since done penance for the sins which I committed during the first (and most notable) year of its publication. Are you sufficiently repentant? And the long line of editors, from Silver to Silver, who, each in his day, labored and brought forth-a Monthly? Should we not rather "bow down our heads as a bull-rush" (what an appropriate term for an editor) "and spread sackcloth and ashes under us" (what a splendid suggestion for an editor's chair)?

Go through the files and see the rich treasures of golden emerods and golden mice with which the undergraduates, who suffered from great discomfiture by reason of their Weltschmerz, filled the columns of The Monthly. Is there any contributor who ever offered his literary first fruits to this magazine who did not, ten years later, bite his knuckles and lament the fact that he had not carried out the Biblical law concerning the offering of first fruits: "Thou shalt put it into a basket?" . . .

And speaking of undergraduates, what about the Faculty? Did they not drop into the helpless and desolate hopper of The Monthly whatever was not grist for the mill of a real publication? And the Alumni-how often did they slip over a nefel tamun sermon on us in the guise of an essay. And the moles and the bats of the editorials which we wrote! And the poems and the songs which we published-what a tinkling they made with their flat feet! And all the other literary fillets and crescents and pendants of the sons of the daughter of Zion in their Monthlies. And the portraits which were published each year of the graduates! "For Compassion Surpasseth All Misunderstanding"

The United Jewish Appeal for Jersey City has been launched last Monday evening amidst a representative group of Jersey City Jewry. The several hundred persons assembled will long remember the scholarly and soul-rending oration delivered by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, national chair-

man of the United Palestine Appeal.

The assemblage responded generously to the appeal for funds, so that nearly one-third of the alloted quota of \$25,-000 for Jersey City had been reached that evening. It is to the added credit of those present that not only did they lend their presence to grace the evening and pay homage to Rabbi Silver, but they came with the full intention and knowledge that they were to contribute to and encourage the opening of the United Appeal; and every one present who contributed, did so, freely and generously.

A sad commentary of Jewish life, is that all too frequently, whenever an affair or gathering is called, the invitation announces that there will be no solicitation of funds. This is an insult to the character of cur people. The Jew knows his role. For two millenia a pagan world has visited insufferable woes upon them; and he knows by nature and instinct that his first obligation is to care for all his breth-ren and his institutions-Kal Yisroel Chaverim. Let no future invitation of a Jewish group or institution carry this insulting and degrading epithet of 'no funds will be solicited'. For the Jew whose soul is attuned to the spirit of his people will not be deterred from attending the occasion, for such reason. The ignoble Jew; the Jew lost to the rich fulfillments and spiritual destiny of his people, cannot be revitalized with the allurement of 'no funds will be solicited'. But, yet, another commentary; and the text and instruc-

tion we chose from that guest who sublimated the souls of his listeners and honored the city with his presence. The text of Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver we find in his address of acceptance of the chairmanship of the United Palestine

Appeal. He said,

"I do not approve, I deprecate the constant chastising of our people. I deprecate the constan: beating of our breasts-we have sinned, we have not done enough. I think something should be said for our people, for what it did do, for the sacrifices which it has made in the last twenty years, colossal sacrifices, astounding sacrifices. In nearly twenty years the American Jews have had to send over \$120,000,000 to succor their people in Eastern Europe.

Rabbi Silver then describes that this came not only from the pockets of the few, but from the masses of our people, and that many more millions were sent abroad to

relatives. Continuing, the Rabbi said, "When I come to a community and ask for

funds for Palestine or for Poland or for Germany, I do not go with a scorpion whip, with words of bitterness and denunciation. I go to that community with words of consolation, comfort and hope, praising them for what they have done and urging upon them that as long as that great need exists to make even more and greater sacrifices.'

From this text would it be well to pattern the methods or the present United Jewish Appeal of Jersey City. We reslize that the need is indescribable and hence the emotions and feelings of those who not only give of their substance but of their energies, strength and time, run high. Yet it is wisest, as Rabbi Silver teaches, that the method of appeal should not be with 'a scorpion whip, with words of bit-terness and denunciation", but with a dignified appeal to the reason and finer sensibilities of the people.

In almost every appeal where the deep emotions of men are stirred it is but human that criticisms for certain methods of proceure and details of a campaign arise. Yet whether justified or unjustified, it must be remembered that an appeal for a cause does not concern any group of individuals and personalities; it concerns the life and death of suffering brethren and the threat to Jewish life and institutions everywhere. Let Jews ever be mindful of this. The man or woman that would nurse a grievance or criticism commits a mortal sin. In the light of this deeper realization let all devs remember that they are each a committee of one to do their stare for the alleviation of suffering and the maintenance of the dignity and the heritage of their peopl:

Rabbi Silver set out to present briefly "a realistic statement about the status of Palestine today, an accounting of what was done with the funds that were given to the United Palestine Appeal during the past year and an explanation of the budgetary requirements of the coming year."

Silver Reports Palestine Progress

6 Events of the past two years have had a serious effect upon the economic life of the country. There has been a marked decline in the volume of capital investments and in the flow of immigration, causing a rise in unemployment, which has been aggravated by a bad citrus crop. In spite of these adverse conditions, fifteen new Jewish settlements have been established in the past year while building construction and land acquisition have been progressing. There has also been a considerable increase in the volume of exports.

Further progress might have been possible were it not for the uncertainty of the political situation resulting from the failure of Great Britain to carry out the letter and spirit of the Mandate. The situation today, dominated as it is by the unsettled question of partition, is politically again in suspense. For all practical purposes, however, partition, according to Rabbi Silver, is not now imminent. In fact we may draw the conclusion from the white paper recently issued by the Colonial office, that partition is definitely postponed. The important thing for American communities to bear in mind, Rabbi Silver added, is that "the unsolved question of partition should not affect the contribution of American Jewry in Palestine."

Urges Faith in Jewish Future

The deeds accomplished in Palestine by Jewish loyalty and Jewish sacrifice are, Rabbi Silversaid, noncontroversial. The Palestine issue, he concluded, "will surmount all the difficulties which confront it today." The immediate need, he said, "both for those who are devoting themselves to the JDC or to the UPA is to have faith in the future of Jewish life even in those countries where it seems doomed today. We must continue to believe in human progress, in the coming of a new day of reconciliation, of emancipation, and when that day comes our position in the whole world will be normalized again."

SILVER DISCUSSES

Children Are Owed Home, Not Opportunity

"Sinclair Lewis suggests that the time has now come for a revolt of parents against the recent well-publicized revolt of youth," said Rabbi A. H. Silver, speaking be-fore 2,000 persons on "The Rights of Parents and the Rights of Children," with special reference to Sinclair Lewis' book, "The Prodi-gal Parents," yesterday morning at the Temple.

"This is an age when revolts are the order of the day," Dr. Silver observed. "A day without its revolt is just a dead loss. To think of anything carrying on its old accustomed way is itself a revolutionary thought. And, of course, the more things change, the more they remain the same. In morals and customs, just as in space, if you can go far enough in one direction, you will come back to your starting

"The revolt of women gave them equality with men but hardly improved their real status. They are now free to join the ranks of the unemployed equally with men.

"The revolt of youth which was to remake the world which had been so frightfully messed up by the older generation, has now given us a world of blood and thunder dictatorships, war and prepara-tions for war, and millions of youth

"It is pointless to approach the problem of the home from the point of view of rights. It is far more helpful to see the subject not as a matter of debate but as a matter of conference, not as a competi-

tion but as a co-operation. "Parents do not owe their children either money or opportunity. They owe them a home which is more than a house, not rich, but built out of honor and integrity, where speech is kindly, faith strong and judgments charitable. TWO CLASSIC ANSWERS At the third annual Institute of

Judaism sponsored by the Brotherhood of Temple Israel, on Monday of this week, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, Ohio addressed more than two hundred and fifty clergymen of many denominations, on "The Democratic Theme in Judaism" and "The Concept of Messiah in Judaism." Following his addresses, there was a discussion period in which the assembled ministers plied Rabbi Silver with questions. Two questions brought forth classic answers which are worth chronicling. A retired minister asked: "If the Hebrew word Almah (in the seventh chapter of the Prophet Isaiah) is correctly translated as young woman and not virgin, then for me all of Christianity collapses." This word in Isaiah is usually translated as virgin by Christian theologians and thus forms the basis for the theory of the virgin birth of Jesus which has become a dogma in some Christian denominations. Rabbi Silver's answer: "I would hate to think that such a great civilizing force as Christianity which has done so much for mankind in the past, which is inspiring hundreds of millions of men and women to nobler living in the present, and which I feel certain has an equally significant role to play in the future depends on the translation of one word. Irrespective of how Almah is translated, Christianity remains a noble strand in the fabric of society."

Question two:- "Is there a growing undercurrent of anti-semitism in the United States?" Rabbi Silver's reply: "Whether there is or not, I do not know. If there is, it would not surprise me as periodically there have been movements against minorities. There was a movement against Irish and German immigrants, a movement against Catholics, there was the Klu Flux Klan, which was against Catholics, Jews and negroes. These movements came and went. As a Jew, I am not especially concerned about anti-semitism. I know that the Jew will survive. We are old-hards at the game of beating anti-semitism. We have met it in all forms and we shall survive the twentieth century brand. But what I am concerned about is this noble and beautiful thing we call America. Whether that will be dragged through the mud and mire." Following this answer, there was prolonged applause on the part of the assembled clergy. Rabbi Silver impressed them not merely with his scholarship and brilliance, but with his sympathetic appreciation of Christianity, his gracious spirit, and his natural manner. Silver Says Dictators Plot Own Doom, For Trampled Minorities Will Revolt

DEMOCRACY-HATING dictatorships are plunging to their own doom as they trample on minorities, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of The Temple declared today.

Peoples persecuted by twentieth-century tyrant-rulers will sconer or later rise up and destroy their oppressors, Dr. Silver

His address, "The Rights of Minorities and the Next War," riveted the attention of a capacity crowd at the City club luncheon

Rabbi Silver again called upon libertyfoving citizens to resist what he termed "lying propaganda" of "subsidized alien Nazi agents" in America.

He named Adolf Hitler, German reichshrer, whom he branded a dull, obtuse and callous," as the "leader of a desperate international game which used minority groups as pawns in the bloody march to empire."

In the question period after his address,

Rabbi Silver declared:
"The dawdling British foreign office is responsible for present world chaos for failing to take a firm stand against Japan, Italy

For the same reason "it was England that killed the league of nations,

"War is seemingly inevitable in Europe."
"America must take no step to deprive alien minorities of direct and work relief."

"Any government which in the twentieth century sets about singling out men, on account of their race or religion, for political disfranchisement, or economic discriminations, or social regradation, is underwriting its own doom," he said in his address.

"It is doing its best to raise, train, and equip the malcontents and revolutionaries of tomorrow who will destroy it root and branch. You can hold such persecuted people down for a time with bayonets, or what is more effective than bayonets, with lying

"But propaganda, sooner or later, must succumb to truth, and as far as bayonets are concerned, it was Napoleon who declared that there is one thing you cannot do with

them—you cannot sit on them . . ."
"The shot which will usher in the next world war will probably be fired," as it was at Sarajevo in 1914, "by some individual in the name of an oppressed minority," the rabbi prophesied. "Europe today is rushing headlong back to 1914."

RABBI SILVER said "the genius of America," except when it permitted the persecution of the Negro in the nineteenth century, "has evidenced itself in re-sisting the hard concentration and concretion

of minority groups."

He called upon Americans again to "avert the Balkanization of this country."

For example, he singled out the Ku Klux Klan movement and pointed to Abraham Lincoln who, he said, "denounced as a threat to America," all attempts to disfran-chise newly-arrived Irish and German immigrants and Catholics.

Democracy in America, Rabbi Silver declared, is again endangered by efforts to oppress Jewish minorities and organized labor.

"Persecution is cropping up again today— as a result of the lying propaganda of sub-sidized Nazi agents representing a govern-ment which is the sworn enemy of all de-

mocracy but is proposing in the United States to save our democratic form of government for us by preaching hate against Jews, or labor organizations, whom Fascists do not like."

"America must resist oppression againnot for the sake of the Jews who are the targets at this particular moment-but for the sake of the spirit, the unity and the peace of America!"

ABBI SILVER declared radical groups n only thrive under the heel of discrimination.

"Communists are not born," he said. "They

are made—made by oppression, by unjust discrimination, by a sense of wrong, by intolerable to the said sense of wrong. The best was a Said Congress, aut of any people in the Canary is to single them out as a group for discrimination in employment, by restricting their opportunities in the quest of an education or a career, and

by unwarranted abuse and attack.

"Men of spirit, of courage and of character do not truckle long under such abuse."

RABBI SILVER compared modern America and Europe on the test of their attitude toward minorities.

"Europe is concerned with the rights of minorities," he said. "America is concerned with the rights of men. The allegiance of an American citizen is direct and immediate. not through a group.

"Whatever other supplementary loyalties American citizens may have to their religions, or to the memories or cultures of their former homelands—and few men are without such subsidiary loyalties—their transcendent and basic loyalty is to America."

SILVER CITES ENGLAND FOR A EUROPE WOES

Rabbi Tells City Club Britain Killed League, Aided Dictators Program

Most European troubles of the past five years were placed at England's door by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, speaking today at the City

"The strength of dictators," he said, answering a question in the forum at the close of his address, "started in 1932 when England refused to permit imposition of sanctions on Japan to curb her aggression against China.

"Japan's action, in the face of British indifference, served notice on Italy and Hitler that they could get away with it. England killed the League of Nations. She used it when it served her purposes and destroyedlf it when it no longer served her."

Rabbi Silver said war is inevitable unless the League is rebuilt, with the United States in it, to guarantee collective security.

Warns on Minorities

America will remain free of the minority race problem which is threatening the peace of Europe, as long as she adheres to her fundamental principle confirming the individual's right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, Rabbi Sil-

In one of the most largely attended speeches before the City Club this year, Rabbi A. H. Silver of the Temple yesterday scored as enemies of the American people those who would teach their fellow men to judge American citizens, not on the basis of individual worth, character or achievement, but on the basis of the race to which they belong or the religiou to which they subscribe."

Holds Treaties Were Broken

Rabbi Silver charged Poland and Roumnia with disregarding, as soon as the League of Nations was shown to be impotent, provisions of the minority treaties they signed at the end of the World War.

"In 1934, Poland, through the mouth of its foreign minister, Col. Beck, announced at Geneva that she no longer considers herself bound by the treaty of 1919 which gave the League supervision over the rights of minorities in Poland. Col. Beck hastened to add, however, that the minorities of Poland need have nd fear. Their rights were amply protected by law.

"How amply protected these minorities are in Poland has been fully demonstrated by the persecution of the Jewish group in recent years, the riots, the boycotts and the shameless harrassment in the fields of economics and education.

The prominence given in the press to the oppression of Jewish minorities must not overshadow the fact that other minorities are also suffering. Rabbi Silver warned, notably the Magyars of Transyl-vania, "who complain of being driven from the public service, of being forced out of employment to make room for Roumanians, of agrarian reforms carried out at their expense."

Main Blast at Hitler

Robbi Silver reserved his greatest blast for Germany's Adolf Hitler, whom he accused of leading in the game to use minorities in the quest for empire.

"Hitler announced himself as the protector of all the German minorities in Europe, even as the czar had announced himself as the protector of all the Slavs. Tis is the same old adroit dodge. It works-

"Dull Mentally"

"This man talks of the rights of minorities! He is so dull mentally and spiritually that he cannot even sense the shocking incongruity between his protest against unnecessary tormenting of German national minorities and his own cold, persistent, sadistic tormenting of a helpless minority in his own country.

"The same spiritual callousness accounts for his verbal volcanic eruption against what he calls the intolerable press campaign against Germany," Rabbi Silver continued.

"This from a man in whose country and under whose patronage such lying, vulgar and indecent sheets as Julius Streicher's Der Stuermer are allowed to appear-papers whose sole aim is to incite to intolerance and cruelty and whose contents are so filthy and pornographic in their unbridled attacks upon the Jewish people that even Hitler is ashamed to have them seen outside of Germany and has prohibited their being sent abroad."

Poland and Roumania have invented the slogan of surplus populations to camouflage their intolerance of minorities, Rabbi Silver asserted. He laid the blame on "jobless intellectuals" who have "whipped up national chauvinism as an excuse for driving minorities from their jobs in the hope of en-sconcing themselves in their places."

Economic problems of a country are not solved by taking away opportunities to earn a living from one group and giving them to another, he went on, and said:

"Even if there existed the opportunity for moving 50,000 Jews annually out of Poland, after a generation of such enforced emigration, Poland would still have 3,000,-000 Jews."

To those who wonder at the number of Jewish Communists in Russia, Rabbi Silver explained: "The overwhelming number of Jews in Russia were democratic, constitutionalist or Social Democrats. But all of them wanted the Czarist regime destroyed.

"Is there any wonder?" he asked. Think of the life of degradation and infamy and disabilities under which they were compelled to live. Would you act differently?

"Any government which, in the twentieth century, sets about singling out men, on account of their race or religion, for political disfranchisement, or crimination, or social degradation, is prescribing its own doom. It is doing its best to raise, train and

equip the malcontents and revolu-tionaries of tomorrow who will de-stroy it root and branch."

Turning to a consideration of America, Rabbi Silver said that in only one instance "did the genius of America falter and fail"—in its treatment of the Negro.

"This one failure embittered our national life from its very inception, snarled and tangled up our political processes for three-quarters of a century and finally led to a tragic Civil War in which 500,000 white men laid down their lives on the bloody altar of minority perse-

Quoting Abraham Lincoln's stand against the Know-Nothing party. Rabbi Silver said that this political threat to the American ideal of equality for all men was wiped out,

as was the Ku Klux Klan movement later.

The threat "is cropping up again today-as a result largely of the propaganda of subsidized alien Nazi agents, representing a government which is the sworn enemy of all democracy, but proposing in the United States to save our democratic form of government for us by preaching hate against Jews, or labor organizations they do not

THE MUTILATION OF THE STRONG. The tragedy of this present age, said Dr. Abba Hislel Silver, in speaking to 100 St. Louis Protestant minister is that freedom is being trampled under foot in two-thirds of the world. No one can deny the grim factual correctness of this estimate, and no American who is conscious of his particular heritage will be inclined to deny its tragic significance. It is, in fact, the very essence of classic tragedy, in thatfor the moment at least-it presents the spectacle of the mutilation of the strong.

It would be an over-simplification to say that the so-called democratic nations are the sole repositories of freedom. But they, at least, are the only ones in a position to give it effective expression. And they, by every count, are the strong nations of the earth. They have the possessions, the money and the moral prepossessions which should enable them to offer an irresistible spiritual leadership to those parts of the world where the principles of the free man and the free choice are not so well crystallized.

Yet it is those principles to which the strong nations presumably are committed which are being brutally disdained and tormented, while the Mussolinis, big and little, carry on their relentless campaign to make the "rotting corpse of liberty" a wideworld reality.

Can it be that freedom is a mere philosophical abstraction and that it must inevitably give way before the necessity for strong organization and discipline which modern life requires? If so, the world may as well prepare, not only for a sweeping change in its social and economic forms, but for a complete abandonment of any recognizable ethics, religion or political morality.

The "consent of the governed" is nonsense if it is not based on the supposition that the incividual and the society to which he contributes are capable, actually or potentially, of making a free choice. That such freedom is limited by practical necessities goes without saying. But the difference between reasoned and voluntary acceptance of limitations and the limitation imposed by one who is conscious of no will but his own is the difference between life and death for anything resembling spiritual values.

FINDS JEREMIAH'S FAITH STILL HOLDS

Rabbi Silver Reviews Book, 'Hearken Unto the Voice'

"Within the last few weeks, two world renowned writers, Thomas Mann and Franz Werfel, have gone to the Bible for their inspiration and source of material for their monumental works," said Rabbi A. H. Silver in a lecture at the Temple yesterday morning.

His address was based on the recent book by Franz Werfel, "Hearken Unto the Voice."

"The Bible has been a perennial source of inspiration to creative artists and writers of all times,"
Rabbi Silver said. "Almost anywhere you dig in the Bible, you strike the living waters of inspira-

"Werfel found in the Book of Jeremiah a universal and eternal essage as pertinent and applicable o our day as it was to the men of eremiah's own generation.

No Violence to Main Outlines

"Though liberally embellished and adorned by a poetic license which is permitted to a great artist, Werfel's story does no violence to the main outlines of the career of Jeremiah as we know it from the Bible or to his essential teachings. The approach to the biblical source is reverent—the way of the ancient Midrash, or Agada.

"Jeremiah sought to escape his crushing mission which made him man of contention and strife to he whole world—'a laughing stock all the day'. But he could not. No great man can escape the compulsion of the mission which destiny assigns to him. A great truth is like a raging fire shut up in one's bones. Jeremiah, like all prophetic spirits, wearied himself to hold it in, but could not.

he tore down only to build anew-on surer and nobler foundations.

Hurt by Those He Loved

"Like all great prophets, he was hurt by those whom he most loved. They scourged him. They threw

him into dungeons and loathsome pits to perish. They charged him with treason and with undermining the morale of the besieged city. He counseled peace, but they chose

"Jeremiah saw the destruction of the temple and the desolation of the country which he had prophesied. The vision of the return from exile and the rebuilding of the country which he had also prophesied, he did not live to see come true. But here too, his words were

"Jeremiah taught a religion not of ritual and cult but of the heart, a religion of piety, of justice and of peace. He had no faith in the "His mission was to attack, to security of wealth or power or tear down and to sweep away. Yet arms. The ultimate security of men and nations, he proclaimed, lay in righteousness, in love and in faith. 'Let not the wise man glory in his wisdom nor the strong man in his strength nor the rich man in his riches, but let him glory in un-derstanding and knowing Me, the orc, Who executeth kindness and astice and righteousness in the

ONE of the essential contributions of ethical religion to human progress is the concept of method. Religion offered a new method by which men might attain morally desirable endsmethod worthy of the ends. Ethical religion outlawed the notion that moral ends justify immoral means.

Each step on the way toward the realization of a noble objective must be a noble objective in itself. Means have way of integrating themselves into the ends and of determining their quality and pattern.

Therefore, to establish justice, men must employ the

ways of justice, and to establish peace, the ways of peace. The more exalted human goals are, the less likelihood is there of their complete attainment. When impatient and desperate measures of ruthlessness and brutality was employed, they not only make the attainment of the goals impossible but they turn man's long, weary way toward them into a misery and a horror.

Obedience to Supreme Moral Law

Ethical religion has been careful to define the character of this method, of the "good way." It is the way of obedience to a supreme moral law which is binding upon groups and governments as well as upon individuals. It is the way of allegiance to a sovereignty which is higher than that of any state, party or majority.

It is the way of acceptance of a law which overarches

all human groupings and their temporary and shifting political or economic interests.

The just way calls for a curbing and control of all concentrated power. It demands the safeguarding of the spiritual integrity and freedom of the individual.

It is the way which uses good will and tolerance be-tween peoples, classes and races for the establishment of justice and peace in the world.

D Laughter was acclaimed as an emotional release for the "overcharged and over-burdened soul" by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver yesterday at The Temple.

His theme was "Laugh, If You Are Wise." It was in connection with the 24-hour Jewish festival of Purim, which begins at sundown Wednesday and during which Jewish people are especially merry.

Rabbi Silver pointed out that lauger could be a retaliation for misfortune and oppression. Stating there were all sorts of laughter, including laughter of ridicule and scorn, he emphasized the laughter of confidence.

"Frequently such laughter is not far removed from tears because it is not unmindful of the sorrows. hurts, pains and the defeats of life,"

"Nevertheless," he continued, "itknows how to smile through tears for the confidence which gives rise to it looks forward to a better day."

Never Been Fully Tried in the World

This classic way of religion has never been fully tried in the world. Today it is being rejected more thoroughly than at any time in human history. Insolen and cynical state and class autocracies have proclaimed at there is no law superior to theirs and that their way infallible because their vast punitive force makes it uncontradictable. The individual is being terrorized into spiritual and intellectual subjection, and every precinct of his life is being invaded and possessed.

The economic life of mankind is fast resolving itself into a bitter class war. Each class is resorting without much computation or hesitancy to methods of violence, suppression and civil war.

Each class justifies its tactics in the name of some great ideal. The shame of our age is that men are committing the most shameless acts of immorality in the name of the highest morality. Methods which are ab-horred and denounced in one's opponents are rationalized into moral imperatives when employed by one's self.

By their way shall ye know men, not by their objectives. Men seem to have forgotten that democracy, too, is unique because of a characteristic method. In the philosophy of democracy, the process is as important as the objective.

Method, too, is what distinguishes propaganda from education. The way of propaganda is the way of bias, deceit, distortion of facts, appeals to prejudice and hys-

Too Much Propagands, Little Education

se way of equeation is the key of truth, reason, fairness and calm deliberation. Therefore, propaganda serves dictatorship and education serves democracy. Our age has too much of propaganda and toc little of education. The war of Shaddai upon Diabolus today is the war of education upon propaganda.

Our generation has not only forgotten the sanctity of method, it has also lost the sense of a universally recognized and accredited code of moral conduct. All our moral ideas have again been thrown into the crucible.

There is hardly a single moral concept in private or in public life which may be said to receive the universal sanctum and indorsement of our generation.

Marriage, industry, patriotism, tolerance, liberty, peace, democracy-these moral principles which a previous generation accepted almost axiomatically, as fixed rules of life and guiding principles, have in our day become the subject of the most bitter controversy and negation.

Cesspools of Moral Iniquity

It is not that everybody does not observe them in practice. It is that they are being deried in essence and rejected in principle by so many-and by organized groups, classes and governments even more than by indi-

and authority-governments-are today polluted cess-pools of moral iniquity. Organized governments are today, through their moral license, their opportunism, cynicism, terrorism, broken pledges and piracy, con-founding the moral lives of their citizens and undermining whatever authority the moral law may still possess among them.

The challenge to the hard-pressed spiritual forces of our day is to hold aloff in a confused and darkened world the banners of spiritual law and the good way. Else mankind's struggle today for economic justice will lead to greater injustice; and for universal peace, to greater and more terrible war.

And one of the high points in this genius was reached in Hasidism and in certain phases of Cabbalism. The names of Baal Shem Tov and Moses de Leon are but little known outside the circle of Jewish scholars, yet their attainments in religious thought are of the profoundest interest.

"I'm Proud Of Jew's Record," Cries Rabbi Abba H. Silver

He has a broad-shouldered build like Paul Muni. He uses his hands like Stokowski. And the rounded phrases of his baritone-voiced oratory would do credit to a Shakespearean actor.

He is Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, head of one of America's largest congregations-1,800 families belong to his Cleveland synagogue-and chairman of the \$4,500,000 United Palestine Appeal, who was a Seattle visitor last week.

One of America's highest paid rabbis-he is reputed to get \$600 a week-Rabbi Silver is a champion of labor's rights and has won tome as an arbiter in Cleveland labor troubles. He's a Litvack who is a director of Hebrew Union College, the world's largest Reform rabbinical seminary.

And though he's spoken boldly from his pulpit on such issues as Tom Mooney case and the greed of entrenched wealth in America, he has held his post for 21 years-without

anything more than a verbal agree ment with his board that they can ask him to leave at any time.

This scholarly, brilliant rabbi who reads anywhere from five to a dozen books a week and who likes to travel by plane is a staunch champion of Zionism, foe of partition of Palestine. advocate of organized boycott of German goods by Christians and Jews, and firm believer in a silver lining for the Jewish people.

Through the Joint Distribution Committee and the United Palestine Appeal, the funds raised will provide relief for destitute Jews who have been deprived of the opportunity to earn a livelihood and have been barred from public relief agencies, will retrain them for new occupations and will enable many to emigrate and resettle in Falestine and other lands.

More than 60 organizations will share in the fund. They do not come within the scope of the Cleveland Community Fund. Included are Jewish educational institutions and national Jewish health agencies. The solicitation, Berne said, will be confined to Jewish persons.

Rabbi Silver Says Libels Must Be Answered

If today Jews spend much time in defending themselves it is because they are subjected to so many attacks from their enemies, Rabbi A. H. Silver said in a sermon yesterday morning at the Temple on "Some of Our Faults and Some of Our Virtues."

"We are called upon to expose the falsehood and wickedness of these libelous attacks," he said.

"Moral complacency was never allowed in ancient Israel, and there has never been a time in our history when the people were not summoned by their spiritual leaders to repent and reform. The Jew is always ready to justify the ways of God to men by accepting responsibility for his own sin, but we ought never to say we are worse than any others. The truth is, we are like other peoples, with good, bad and not to judge ourselves morally and ethically as a unit.

We have had great men and women far beyond our quota for the nummen; we must also accept the strong." others. We owe it to ourselves to reduce the number of these antisocial persons in our midst, for we are the heirs of the oldest moral and ethical traditions of mankind.

Gave Mankind the Bible "We were ploneers in the field of moral values. We gave to mankind the Ten Commandments, the Bible and the holiness code. It was the Jewish people who challenged the moral callousness of the ancient world, its indifference to the poor and oppressed.

"However, it is not by appeal to the past but by our own lives that we must judge ourselves. And we

Restless and vehement ambition often expresses itself in social aggressiveness, in ostentatious display, in the foolish desire to impress and in too great eagerness for advertisement. "Also I find an element of extremism, which is no doubt due to our uprooted past. Many have not enough balance, poise or spiritual equilibrium. They must learn greater moderation and to be content with slower progress in the quest of place and power. A debouching of our surplus energy into the spiritual, the intellectual and artistic areas of life would help correct these faults.

Two Many Lawbreakers

"Again, there are too many lawbreakers among us. Although we have a much smaller proportion, as compared with other peoples, there are altogether too many for us. Proportion, after all, is no moral standard and, as far as the Jew is concerned. it has no meaning.

"Finally, we are a little too individualistic. We have too many would-be leaders and too few followers, with the consequence that our life is too much fragmentized.

"On the side of our virtues, it was rightly said among the rabbis indifferent in our midst. We ought of old that by three qualities you can distinguish the people of Israel. They are merciful and com-"As a people we have had men of passionate, hating war, human opgenius whose names have been beacons and torches to mankind. We have had great men and women modesty and chastity. And, lastly, they are a people of charity, willing ber of our people, but we have to assist the downtrodden and also had our shoddy folks of all anxious to be co-workers with God classes. UNTERMYER QUITS

Reaffirms His Faith in the Boycott Drive but Cites Age, Health and Duties 5 %

HE WAS A FOUNDER IN 1933

Feels Confident Non-Sectarian League Will Go Cn Under 'Rightful Guidance'

Reaffirming his faith in the organization and its work, Samuel Untermyer, lawyer and philanthro-Untermyer announced his resignation yesterday as president and chairman of the board of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League to Champion Human Rights, Inc., of which he was a founder.

For more than five years the leading spirit of the league, which now claims 100,000 members, Mr. Untermyer, who soon will be 80 years old, said he resigned because of advancing age, poor health and pressing public obligations, including his duties as a delegate to the State Constitutional Convention.

"While I regret the necessity for this step," Mr. Untermyer said in his letter of resignation, "I am con-soled by the reflection that, after more than five years of arduous and continuous service, the objects of the league have become so well known that under rightful guidance it should from now on go forward

on its own momentum.

"By 'rightful a idance' I have in mind guidance based on American ideals of tolerance, restraint and fair dealing, that always recognized the interest and ways recognized the i nizes the interests and unity of the American people as a whole as par-amount to the interests of any particular group or class and that scrupulously excludes all radical and un-American principles and methods. In my mind it would also emphasize the non-sectarian character and attitude of the league—in a world in which Nazi persecution has also bitterly assailed Christian-ity and is seeking to overthrow all

ity and is seeking to overthrow all existing religions."

Mr. Untermyer said he would recommend as his successor Dr. Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland except for the fact that he recently had become head of the United Palestine Appeal, a position with extensive responsibilities. Dr. Silver, who is first vice president of the who is first vice president of the league, automatically becomes its president un il the league chooses new officers at its convention here

The executive committee of the league, which has been expecting Mr. Untermer's letter because of his failing health, accounts his failing health, accepted the resignation with regret yesterday at its regular session.



Dr. Chaim Weizman To Address Opening Meeting Sunday; Congressman Hamilton Fish Guest Speaker, 1,900 In Record Campaign Army Will Seek \$328,000 Minimun Quota

SEEK FUNDS TO ASSIST STARVING, PERSECUTED JEWS

The most intensive eampaign in the history of Cleveland Jewry will be launched Sunday evening, May 8, when the Jewish Welfare Fund drive will open with a community dinner meeting at the Statler Hotel. Stirred as never before by the tragedy of Germany, and other lands, the campaign will open with an army of workers far greater than in any previous year, dedicated to the salvation of their fellow Jews overseas.

Guest speaker at the meeting Sunday will be Congressman Hamilton Fish of New York, outspoken cham-pion of Jewish rights and co-author of the Lodge-Fish resolution by which the United States officially endorsed the establishment of the Jewish homeland in Palestine. Representa-tive Fish has taken the floor of the House repeatedly to voice America's condemnation of the atrocities in Germany, Poland, Austria, and other lands where Jews have been subjected to ruthless persecution.

An extraordinary feature of the meeting will be a message from Dr. Chaim Weizman, head of the Jewish agency for Palestine broadcasted from London. Special arrangements have been made with Dr. Weizman for a communication to the Cleveland Cam-

paign organization by direct wire.
Final instructions will be given the
workers by Rabbi A. H. Silver, chair-man, and Rabbi B. R. Brickner. They will be told why this year more than ever before every Jew who is not himself receiving aid must give—why every dollar is desperately needed— why every effort must be expended is completely thorough canvass of Cleveland's Jewish community to help meet the gravest Jewish crisis in centuries.

The minimum quota for the drive is \$328,000. It is almost \$40,000 more than was raised last year. The additional amount will go entirely for European relief and resettlement. Since the 1937 drive the Nazis have struck a shattering blow upon 200,000 Jews in austria. They have boycotted their stores, confiscated their property, thrown their leaders into concentration camps, driven hundreds to suicide.



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He described the sufferings of Jewish refugees and pointed out that the Jewish community here could show its interest in democracy by helping them with funds.

The Joint Distribution Committee, the United Palestine Appeal and the National Co-ordinating Committee will be chief beneficiaries.

Leaders of the local drive include Rabbi Barnett Brickner, co-chairman; Philip Frankel, head of the men's business and trade divisions, and Mrs. Siegmund Herzog, chairman of the women's division.

PICTURES EUROPE RETURNING TO '14

Rabbi Silver Hits at Tory and Fascist Diplomacy

Through the "new realism" of European statesmanship, Europe is returning to the same bloody cockpit as in 1914, asserted Rabbi A. H. Silver yesterday morning at the Temple in a lecture-sermon devoted to the theme of the bankruptcy of contemporary international diplo-

The text of Dr. Silver's address

follows, in part:
"In Rome last week a former Socialist who is now duce of 58,000, 000 people and a former signpainter who is now fuehrer of 72,-000,000 people met. Twenty million dollars was spent to make the occasion a truly Roman holiday.

"What will follow Hitler's return visit to Mussolini? All indications seem to point to the dismemberment of Czecholslovakia or, as a first step, its reduction to vassalage to the Third Reich. Provided Hitler will pay the price. The price is German acquiescence in some new Italian scheme of aggression, either at the expense of Spain or some French colonial possession,

"The stage is set for a new act of aggression on the part of Nazi Neither the Anglo-Italian pact, recently concluded, nor the much heralded Anglo-French military pact will deter them.

"The military pact between France and England does not commit Great Britain to any international obligations which she had not heretofore assumed. France is left in the same condition of helples dependency on 10 Downing Street as heretofore. And 10 Downing Street is in the hands of a Tory government which has consistently through the last seven years aided and abetted the Fascist powers on the continent of Europe.

"In place of collective security the old system of loose alliances based on a shaky balance of power is being restored. In this system the smaller states again will become the pawns of imperial rivalries and the minorities within these states will be pitted and incited one against the other at the behest of Imperial interests. This will make of Europe the same bloody cockpit which it turned out to be in 1914.

"Not until the present Tory gov-ernment of Great Britain is swept away will a new ray of hope come

"The failure to act decisively in 1914 brought the British Empire years later to the brink of uin. It was only the intervention of the United States which saved the empire. In the next war, which British diplomacy is quite uninentionally hastening today, the United States may not again be willing to make the world safe for the British Empire." S WE write these lines, events in Europe are moving with start-

ling rapidity.
Steel-helmeted soldiers are across their borders into neighboring countries. Bewildered Jews, young and old, are feeling the lash of the oppressor. A churchman, daring to shout out against the pagan practices now being adopted, has b shunted off to a lonely concentration

Where is it- all leading? Where does religion stand in the midst of the

What would Christ say if He were to return to earth in the flesh today, and move in and out among the passing throng?

Because Jews have suffered the most in the present chaos in central Europe, we invited an outstanding American Jew with a wide social and international vision to

come to the WAR CRY'S forum and answer some pointed questions. He is Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland.

Rabbi Silver may be described as the "voice of Judah" in America. For twenty years and more he has been ooked upon as a spiritual leader "in

the household of Israel."

A member of the administrative committee of the World Zionist Agency, he also is vice-president of the Zionist Organization of America and national co-chairman of the United Palestine Appeal. With Samuel Untermyer of New York, he organized the first movement in the United States to fight the enemies of the Jews in Europe and to champion American ideals against insidious propaganda. As he takes his place on the plat-

form, we see that he is still a comparatively young man-only 45 years of age-with dark hair combed straight back from a high forehead. There are flecks of gray about the temples.

His face is angular and his most distinguishing feature is, perhaps, his eyes. Dark and set wide apart, they carry something of his own deeply emotional nature to his hearers on the other side of the pulpit.

HIS voice is resonant and his choice of expressions—like the simple phrases in Pearl Buck's books—have a quality of prose poetry that is found all too seldom outside the Bible. Listen for a moment as he outlines his philosophy on the rights of the minorities.

"Any government," he says, "which, in the twentieth century, sets about

in the twentieth century, sets about singling out men on account of their race or religion for political disfranchisement or economic discriminations or social degradation, is underwriting

its own doom.

"It is doing its best to raise, train and equip the malcontents and revolu-tionaries of tomorrow who will destroy it, root and branch. You can hold persecuted people down for a time with bayonets or, what is more effec-

tive than bayonets, with lying propa-

"But propaganda, sooner or later, must succumb to truth, and as far as bayonets are concerned, it was Napoleon who declared there is one thing you cannot do with them-you cannot sit on them.

"The shot which will usher in the next World War will probably be fired, as it was at Sarajevo in 1914, by some individual in the name of an oppressed

minority. Europe today is rushing headlong back to 1914."

Now for the ques-tions—and Rabbi Silver informs us he is most happy to answer them. "If Christ were

to return to Jerusalem, Rabbi, what message do you think he would bring to His oppressed people, the Jews, in Europe and else-where?"

"The message would be: Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely . . . " (Matthew 5:11)

"Would Christ, in your opinion, look upon the return of the Jews to the Holy land as a fulfillment of Bible

prophecy?"

"Yes. Bound up with the messianic faith of Israel at all times was the restoration of the people to Palestine and the rehabilitation of its national

"In the light of the present rearmament race, what would be the text of your sermon if you were preaching to the rulers of the world?"

"My text would be: 'For not by their own sword did they got the

own sword did they get the land in possession, Neither did their own arm save them. But Thy right hand, and Thine arm, and the light of Thy coun-

tenance, Because Thou wast favorable unto them . . . " (Psa. 44:4 R.V.)

"What are the main points you would seek to bring out in your ser-

mon to the rulers?" "I would stress the old but forever ignored truth which mankind should have learned by now after having passed through so many seas of blood that no victory is -that no victory is ever achieved through arms, and that no permanent security is ever established through physical power. It is only in 'the light of God's countenance,' in the building of a social order based on justice, truth and the supremacy of a moral law that a nation can find its enduring salvation."

Rabbi Silver Draws Parallel

With Slavery Issue

There can be no compromise between democracy and dictatorship, and democracy must put on armor for the coming irrepressible conflict with dictatorship, Rabbi A. H. Silver said in a Memorial Sunday address yesterday at the Temple.

Dr. Silver said in part:

"In the Civil War men fought to preserve the Union. Why was the Union threatened? Because of slavery. Men tried to keep the top

slavery. Men tried to keep the two issues, the preservation of the Union and the abolition of slavery, apart. All the ingenuity of statesmanship was employed to that end. But to no avail.

"They tried compression in the

concessions and compromises they can preserve the peace of Europe. But inherent in dictatorship is also the metive of expansion.

"Those who, like Under-Secretary of State Sumner Welles, admonish our people to refrain from even criticizing the dictatorships abroad because what they are doing are the internal affairs of those countries and none of our business, are naive and intrealistic and are rendering a distinct disservice to our country and to humanity.

"Seemingly, dictators are to be free to denounce democracies and their institutions at will, to interfere in the internal affairs of other nations as Germany and Italy are doing today in Spain, to set themselves up as the champions of minorities in other nations and loment disloyalty and treason among their citizens, to send proparaminists to other countries as the Nazis have done in the United States, which propagandists also act as spies, and to incite their followers in other countries to parade in foreign uniforms, to salute a foreign flag and to hell a foreign ruler; but democracies must not even breathe a word of disapprobation.

The conflict, as the wiser heads foresaw, was irrepressible. The country could not remain half free and half slave. As the Mexican War and the annexation of Texas offered to the planters new prospects for expansion, the issue reached its inevitable denouement on the blood-drenched battlefields of the Civil War.

Draws Modern Parallel

"There is a lesson in all this for the world today. The western world today is also half free and half slave. The so-called realists of our day—the Chamberlains and the Halifaxes—also imagine they can keep the two issues of the preservation of peace and the existence of dictatorships apart, and that by

"There is no way to sidetrack moral issues of dictatorship in the western world just as the issue of davery could not be sidetracked. If peace is to be preserved, there must be collective action on the part of the remaining free peoples of the carth against aggressors, riolators of international law, and appressors of minorities. Democacy, to use a splendid phrase attered recently in Cleveland by Thomas Mann, must put on armor it must pick up the gauntlet, accept the challenge, call the bluff. At home it must aggressively expose all anti-democratic propaganda and prohibit enemies of our free institutions from organizing into unofficial armies, parading our streets in military uniforms and generally playing democracy for a sucker."

SILVER SEES BRIGHT FUTURE FOR

Noted speaker F dicts Smoother Path For Jewry in Ultimate Downfall of Nazis; Exhorts For owers to Fight With Action, Not Words, For Rights.

PTIMISS, over the future of Jewry, with the assurance that democracy will eventually triumph over dictatorship, was voiced by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver in a speech before 1,200 persons assembled at a banquet in the Lincoln Room of the Shirley-Savoy Hotel, June 22nd, marking the close of the district grand lodge B'nai B'rith convention in Denver.

Holding the audience in the mighty grip of his remarkable eloquence, Rabbi Silver declared, "Our task is to expose those who attack us, to reveal to the American people the truth about the Jew and his faith. This problem is concerned not only with Jews but with all American people.

"We must fight-not only with words but primarily with action. Any Jew who trades with Germany at this time is a traitor to his people. We must learn to fight. We Jews must not permit ourselves to be put on the defensive. Apologies for our existence in America as well as in other countries are not necessary.

"Jewish people must unite and cooperate in fundamental ways. I recommend the defense and support of American institutions, the defense of democratic institutions-not only because we love America, but because we Jews gave birth to those high American ideals of freedom, liberty and equality. The Bible pages are filled with our gift to mankind. We must defend those ideals-save them, not by lip service, but by action. We must work with might and main to establish economic justice to which every human being is entitled."

In painting an encouraging picture of the future, the speaker pointed out that "dictatorship will collapse because it has no new philosophy, no hope, no vision. Dietatorship is plain gangsterism and brutality. It will destroy itself-but until then, the Jews must endure hardship."

A dictatorship, in order to exist, must expand at the expense of weaker minorities, explained the speaker, and that accounts for the persecution of the weaker Jews. Thus, Italy invaded Ethiopia, Japan invaded China, Germany invaded Austria and all the dictators have a hand in invading Spain. It is because of this that the League of Nations was founded-to give minority groups the advantage of international protection.

Jewish people must learn to cultivate stoicism in their lives, declared Rabbi Silver, in order that the world at large may not become disgusted by its wailings. "The Spanish situation is more tragic than the Jewish, and the Chinese suffer more than

the principles of Judaism because they knew nay be well-prepared for life's battles.

DENVER HONORED BY PRES-ENCE OF OUTSTANDING SPIRITUAL LEADER

As a Rabbi, Silver appeared as a prophet of old, with a message of Judaism spoken deep from his heart. He has not only studied and has a clear insight into the ideals and principles of his religion, but he has put those ideals into practice. He is primarily interested in teaching Judaism, not in the superficial things of life. In short, Rabbi Silver is a shining example of the American Rabbi in the world today.

As a scholar, he is a master in the field. From his early youth he has devoted his life to study and improvement—directing his researches not only to Judaism, but to every field of knowledge and learning.

As an orator, Rabbi Silver is almost beyond mere description. Only his actual listeners know the power of his personality as reflected in his words. Many orators inspire and uplift an audience by their innate ability to speak. But his supremacy lies not in oratory alone, but in the expression of his own being. His neatness comes not from the power of his voice, but from the expression and feeling of words directly from his heart. Denver was indeed honored by the presence of such a man.

"What are we to do? Are we to stand still? When a ship is in a storm, the security of the ship lies in the fact that it is moving, not standing still. Jewish life "is not liquidating anywhere in the world," Rabbi A. H. Silver last night told more than 200 members and guests of Masada, the young men's Zionist organization of America, at a fifth anniversary convention banquet in Hotel Statler.

'The Zionist movement is the expression of an immemorial hope as well as of a desperate emergency," Rabbi Silver said. "We ask only for the chance to regain and to reclaim by our labors and our own sacrifices that which by right of history and by divine promise is ours—the land of Israel."

ASKS GREATER AID TO PALESTINE FUND

Zionist Convention Says Jews of Nation Face Vital Test of Self-Sacrifice

CHAMBERLAIN CRITICIZED

Dr. Silver, at Detroit Session, Predicts Failure in Effort to Appease Dictators

DETROIT, July 2 Deploying the failure of many community to open their doors to Jews in Austria oppressor by the Nazi regime, failure vention of the Zionist Orization of America today called uson Jews throughout the United States to support with all their power the United Palestine Appeal in order to create opportunities in Palestine for the absorption of tens of thousands of Jews of Germany, Austria Poland and other lands.

Taking the lead in sounding the call was Dr. Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, national chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, the central agency for settlement and immigration in Palestine.

Reporting on the results of the appeal for the first half of this year, he announced that \$1,811,780 had been raised by campaigns in more than 500 communities. The quota for the year is \$4,500,000.

He declared that democracy could

survive alongside of undemoeratic countries, that the world could not remain half free and half slave, and that Prime Minister Chamberlain of Great Britain would fail in his effort to appease dictatorships because no compromise is possible with totalitarian coun-

Stresses Theme of Session

He stressed the theme of the day's convention session-the responsibility of American Jewry as the largest free Jewish community in the world in the task of rescuing Jews in Europe crushed by economic, po-

litical and religious persecution.
"Throughout the United States
there is a sharp awareness of the
central position which Palestine has come to hold in any program for the resettlement of the hundreds of thousands of Jews who are being uprooted from their homes in one of the greatest tragedies of Jewish history," he said.

"The plunging into homelessness of almost 200,000 Austrian Jews has directed more dramatic attention to the necessity of enlarging immigration opportunities in Palestine, particularly in view of the failure of many governments to lift immigration restrictions and of the action by other countries in closing even tighter the gates for the entry of refugees."

He warned that the fate of the Jews of Germany and Austria hung over Jewish communities in other parts of Europe.

The convention, stressing that a program of refugee emigration and settlement adopted by the interna-tional conference called by Presi-dent Roosevelt must rely upon the resources of private organizations, adopted a resolution declaring that American Jewry stands on the threshhold of its greatest test of loyalty and self-sacrifice, not only fore the Jews in distress but before the entire world.

Exercises celebrating Indepen-dence Day were held this morning, with Dr. Barnett R. Brickner of Cleveland, national vice chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, and Elihu D. Stone of Boston, vice president of the Zionist Organization of merica, as the principal speakers.

RABBIS SILVER AND BRICKNER PLEAD FOR JEWS

Appeal for Creation of New Opportunities in Palestine AND

Special to The Press

DETROIT, Mich., July 5-The 41st annual convention of the Zionist organization in conference here, yesterday called in United States Jews to aid in creating opportunities in Palestine for Jewish refugees of Germany, Austria and Poland.

The appeal was voiced by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland.

Dr. Solomon Goldman of Chicago, formerly of Cleveland, national cochairman of the United Palestine Appeal, was elected president of the nists. He succeeds Rabbi Stephen S. Wise. Other officers will be chosen today.

Reporting on the United Palestine Appeal campaign since Jan. 1, 1938, Rabbi Silver said that up to June 30, \$1,811,780.19 had been raised for the upbuilding of Palestine. The United Palestine Appeal which com-bines the Palestine Foundation Fund and the Jewish National Fund, received contributions aggregating \$1,511,602.32 in this period.

Hadassah Aids Drive

An additional sum of \$200,187.87 was raised by Hadassah, the women's Zionist organization of America, for the settlement of German Jewish children in Palestine. The quota for the year for the United Palestine Appeal is \$4,530,000.

Rabbi Silver warned that the fate of the Jews of Germany and Austria hangs over Jewish communities in other parts of Europe.

He said the upbuilding of Pales-tire is a cause on which all American Jewry can unite, regardless of local communal differences.

Rabbi Silver expressed the hope the inter-governmental conference will succeed in persuading Great Britain to open the doors of Palestire wide to homeless Jews. He said the action of the nations 20 years ago in pledging their cooperation for the rebuilding of the Jewish national home must in the present crisis be paralleled by an equally generous and humanitarian action for the solution of the Jewish

Great Britain to appease the dictators, Rabbi Silver said, recalling that the American Civil War demonstrated the unworkability of such a plan:

"The world today is facing an identical situation where mankind cannot remain half-free and halfslave, half-democrat and halfdictatorial. There are some who maintain that the proper form of appeasement can be discovered whereby absolutistic dictatorships can remain side by side with free democratic nations."

Sees Two Choices

Referring to the problem of minorities and the fight for the survival of democracy, Rabbi Silver said "the hour of decision is approaching."

The world cannot remain permanently half free and half slave, because "inherent in dictatorship and inherent in Fascism is the same motive of expansion. Witness Ethiopia, witness Austria, witness Spain, witness China. Witness the threat hanging over Czechoslovakia.

When the time of decision comes, minority rights will be re-established in Europe because there is no solution of the minority problem in Europe except in the granting minorities, religious and nationalist, full freedom and equality under the protection of an organized Europe under the protection of the League of Nations. When that time comes there will be an easement of the tension in Jewish life, but until that time we shall be in for a great deal of hammering," Rabbi Silver said.

Praises Democracy

"Only under democracy can mankind find economic security, liberty, peace and happiness," Rabbi Brickner said. "They malign democracy who say it is in the twilight zone and passing from history," he said, adding that long after "Fascism and Communism have passed from the face of the earth as political and social aberrations, democracy will continue to live."

Asserting that the Jewish race is fighting to free itself from the forces of destruction which also seek the extermination of democracy, Rabbi Brickner declared that the Jewish race is today building concretely for democracy and independence in

Palestine. Rabbi Brickner said, the Jews are building a thoroughly "good society" in a social order based upon the "highest principles of social justice, democracy, good will and peace."

History reveals that your people have played a great and commendable part in the defense of Americanism during the World War and prior wars, and have contributed much in time of peace toward the development and preservation of the glory and romance of our country and our democratic form of government.

government. "On behalf of the American people I commemorate your loyal and commendable service and wish for happy and successful en-

ampment."

2,500 Hear Dr. Silver Talk to Veterans

A new social creed for the Jews of America, designed to counterbalance the spread of anti-Semitism in this country, was outlined by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, of Cleveland, in an address Sunday night before delegates to the convention of the Jewish War Veterans of the United States at Masonic Temple.

Dr. Silver's address, delivered be

fore an audience of 2,500, was broad-cast over a nationwide hookup, as were those of Rep. Harold Mosier, of Ohio, member of the Dies commit-tee investigating un-American ac-tivities, and Gen. Frank T. Hines, director of the United States Veter-ans Administration.

Dr. Silver, who has achieved international prominence through his chairmanship of the United Pales-tine Appeal, advised Jewish citizens in America to "work quietly, pa-tiently and confidently in all spheres of life for the America which we all love and for the economic well-being and security of the American people." Intelligent co-operation with other citizens, he said, will help to preserve the foundations of human rights and liberties which "the founding fathers laid so many years ago." years ago."

OWE NO EXPLANATION

In counseling the Jews of this country to devote their energies to the perpetuation of democratic institutions, Dr. Silver urged them to abandon defensive and apologetic attitudes because "we owe no one an explanation."

"We are citizens of this country and are performing our duties as faithfully as any other religious or racial group here," he said. "We are not interlopers on the American scere, nor late arrivals who helped ourselves to what others had built. with others, the Jews of

Across the dark curtain of hate, persecution, and exile, spread across the face of twothirds of Europe to-day, there is written large in letters of fire and blood this legend which our people must read and, on reading, must resolutely act: The Jewish people need a home.

Rabbis Silver and Brickner View 'Collapse' of Ideals

Urging the Jewish people to increase devotion to the ideals of the Jewish religion in a world threatened with war, oppression and hatred, Rabbi A. H. Siver last night told a congregation which packed the large auditorium and balcony of the Temple to overflowing that Jews always had been faced by superior forces and always had triumphed over them.

Dr. Silver's address marked the beginning of Rosh Hashana, or New Year, observance, which is to continue today in reform synagogs and today and tomorrow in conservative and orthodox synagogs of Cleveland.

Dr. Silver said:

"Fundamentally, it is the repudiation of great ethical principles which has been responsible for the mounting political catastrophes of the last twenty years. You cannot violence to the spirit-truth, justice and decency-any more than you can do violence to the body, vithout a breakdown sooner or The breakdown in the mocratic life of Europe has now set in.

Blames Peace Treaties

"The first affront to the spirit of mankind came with the peace treaties themselves. Dictated not by wisdom and compassion but by greed and vengenance, they were the dragons' teeth sown across the continent of Europe. The moral and salutary provisions in the treaties collective security and the protection of minorities—might have pacified Europe if they had been faithfully lived up to. But y were disregarded almost from their very inception."

"Minorities are again becoming pawns of imperial ambitions, the pawns of imperial and Rabbi Silver continued. nations on the continent seeking ex-pansion are disrupting those states hich lie a ross their paths by for-

menting disloyalty among the minorities within their borders.

"Hitler is leading in this game. Hitler is not interested in the protection of German minorities as such. He has recently handed over to Italy the most oppressed and exploited minority in Europe-the Gemans in southern Tyrol. He has most brutally destroyed a racial and religious minority in his own country. Hitler is interested solely in using German minorities in other lands to expand the boundaries of the Reich and to realize the old Germanic dream-of an empire ever expanding toward the east.

New Kind of Defeat

"It is sad to contemplate how blind and stupid diplomacy and predatory economic interests have shattered the dream of a nev Europe, a new world organization based upon security and peace and a new system of justice for great and small alike. These ideals lie in ruins today not because the nations which championed them at first have been defeated in war. These ideals have been betrayed by these former friends who, though undefeated in any war, have suffered one major political defeat after another because of the betrayal of these ideals.

"Chamberlain at Berchtesgaden, Chamberlain at Godesburg, is the tragic symbol of this betrayal and spiritual collapse! So is Daladier! So is the impotent rage and indignation of the American people!

"Chamberlain's talk about the need of appeasement in Europe should not mislead anyone. Ever since he launched his program for purchasing peace by sacrificing, not British interests, of course, but the interests of other peoples, to dictators, Europe has known nothing sut periods of gravest crisis and the threat of imminent war. One wonders why Chamberlain did not offer a foot of British territory to appease Herr Hitler or the return of a single colony taken by Great Britain from Germany! Likewise, in their sudden enthusiasm for plebiscite and self-determination, Mr. Chamberlain and his Tory friends seem to have forgotten India!

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RABBI SILVER INVOKES JESUS' HELP



By Rav. Fred Haberer, a Gentile Christian Who Loves the Jews

In the June issue of the Religious Digest on page sixty-eight there appears an interview conducted by a reporter, Mr. William Dinwoodie, with "Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, world-famous Jewish leader of Cleveland."

Mr. D nwoodie asked, "If Christ were to return to Jerusalem, Rabbi, what message do you think He would bring to His oppressed people, the Jews in Europe and elsewhere?'

To which the rabbi replied, "The message would be: 'Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely. ' '' (Matthew 5:11).

There are two things about this answer of Rabbi Silver which strike us forcibly. First, he admits that the words of the Lord Jesus Christ have weight, because he quotes Him, and thus indicates that He has a message which is of importance for the Jews who are being oppressed in so many quarters of the world today. Not so long ago pious Jews considered it a sinful thing to read the New Testament. No rabbi would have dared to quote the words of the Lord Jesus Christ for fear of being considered an apostate, a "meshumed." The Lord Jesus Christ was considered a false prophet who was to be despised above all other false prophets. If any Jew did confess that he believed that Jesus was the Christ, that is, the Messiah, that Jew was considered an outcast from his people.

ONLY HALF A TRUTH

Now we come to the second thing which

strikes us so forcibly in the rabbi's reply, namely, that he did not quote the whole statement made by Jesus and recorded for us in the Gospel of Matthew. The full statement is:

"Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil agairst you falsely, for my sake. Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you." (Matthew 5:

Rabbi Silver omitted three vital words: "for my sake." When we read the full statement, we get an entirely different impression of the message than that conveyed by the partial quotation given. Persecution is "blessed" if it is "for my sake." Those who are persecuted for Christ's sake are in the same class as the prophets of Israel who were also persecuted by the Jews of their day because they were God's appointed messengers to His people. These holy men of old denounced their people's sin, showed them what the will of the Lord was, and pled with them to repent and thereby secure deliverance from the certain judgment which was coming upon them because of their disobedience.

PERSECUTED AS PUNISHMENT

The Lord Jesus Christ never said that mere "persecution" as such was a blessing, but rather that false persecution for His sake would be blessed. Rabbi Silver would have a hard time convincing the Jews of Germany, Austria, Poland, and Rumania that the sufferings through which they are passing are a "blessing!" Yet are not many Jews suffering false charges and being persecuted falsely in many places today? Who would run away from a blessing? Yet the daily papers state that vast numbers of Jews are beseeching British and American Consulates to grant them passports to leave the place of persecution. No, those Jews who are being persecuted in Europe and elsewhere today are not being persecuted for Christ's sake, although they are indeed being persecuted falsely in many instances. The daily confession of the pious orthodox

"Because of our sins we have been driven from our land."

God says that it is their iniquity which is the cause of the sufferings of Israel in the lands of their enemies. See Leviticus 26:39. Modern Jewish leaders say that it is because of jealousy and anti-Semitism that Israel is suffering. God's Torah indicates the way out of the predicament:

"If they shall confess their iniquity, and the iniquity of their fathers, with their trespass which they trespassed against me, and that also they have walked contrary unto me;

And that I also walked contrary unto them. and have brought them into the land of their enemies; if then their uncircumcised hearts be humbled,....then will I remember my covenant. . . . " (Leviticus 26:40-42).

Why not meet these conditions? Why not confess the iniquity of heart and soul which has led so many Jews to reject their own Messiah and seek help in their distress from earthly governments, Zionism, money and influence !

PERSECUTED FOR MESSIAH'S SAKE

If Rabbi Silver will call upon his people to join with him in doing just that very thing which God demands every Jew shall do, he will experience what the Lord Jesus Christ was talking about when He said: "men shall revile you and persecute you and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely for my sake." Ask any Jew who has publicly confessed his faith in Jesus as the Messiah of Israel whether or not he has experienced it. Or, better still, if you who read this are not a follower of the Messiah, ask yourself these ques-

"Have I ever falsely accused a Jew of accepting Christ for gain? Have I ever reviled any dew as being a traitor, an apostate, because he said that he believed in Jesus ?

That is the sort of persecution which Jesus said was "blessed" to those who endured it, because it is "for my sake." It is blessed because there is a great reward in heaven awaiting the one who is so persecuted.

PERSECUTED BY SATAN

In all fairness, we must include still another persecution; this time it comes from one who has ever been back of every diabolical scheme to inflict suffering and anguish upon the Jew. He is the one behind the scenes, the greatest Jew baiter of them all-SATAN!

Down through the pages of human history we have seen him at work with increased zeal as every one of the ages drew to a close. As each cycle of God's purpose completed itself, Satan released his venom, stirring the nations of the world into a frenzy of hate for the Jew, and uniting them in a determined effort to wipe him out. History has shown us what happened in Egypt, in Babylon, in Medo-Persia, in Greece, and who does not know the story of the unparalleled persecutions under the iron hand of Rome? Not only has he sought to destroy God's chosen people, but he has tried repeatedly to thwart God's plan for man's salvation through the Messiah, who was born a Jew.

"Appeasement is not peace! You cannot have enduring peace by pay-ing ransom to blackmailers. You simply encourage greater and greater

"It is hard to maintain morale and faith in these hard times. Par-ticularly for the Jewish people which has been subjected to such cruel hammering in so many parts of the world in recent years. What is world in recent years. What is clearly indicated in these desperate times is increasing devotion to the great ideals of our religion, the dis-regard of which has plunged the world into chaos. Courage, Faith and Work!'

a criminal and condemned without a hearing." Benes asserted. Hits British Policy PD 10-312

D"The immediate future of Palestine is all one and uncertainty," said Rabbi A.H. Silver of the Temple in an address on "Palestine at the Crossroads," delivered at the opening of the Sunday morning lecture services yesterday.

"Uncertainty has attended British policy in Palestine from the begin-Rabbi Silver asserted. is the same uncertainty, vacillation and lack of decision which have characterized British foreign policy generally, and which have led that great empire from one diplomatic defeat to another, dragging the whole world into that chaos in which it finds itself today.

"Is is this uncertainty which has retarded and frequently interrupted the upbuilding of the Jewish homeland in Palestine. Had the mandatory government loyally lived up to the letter and spirit of the Balfour declaration and the mandate, had it facilitated, as it undertook to, altogether voluntarily, Jewish immigration into the country and the close settlement of Jews upon the land, the Jewish homeland would by now be an accomplished fact.

"But such loyal fulfillment of an international obligation was missing the very beginning. What

was the clear and unmistakable purpose of the Balfour declaration and the mandate was progressively whittled down by a series of unilateral interpretations so that what is practically being proposed now is not the establishment of a Jewish homeland in Palestine, but an Arab homeland.

"There would be no rioting in Palestine today if the government had vigorously suppressed the terrorists in the early days and if it had not constantly yielded to pressure and rewarded rioters by concessions at the expense of the lawabiding element of the community.

"What will happen to Palestine? Anything can happen in this anarchistic world. The present Tory government, hell-bent for peace at any price, provided someone else is paying the price, may abrogate the Balfour declaration and the mandate and sacrifice the Jewish homeland to what it thinks are British imperial interests. We hope, however, that the moral sense, sportsmanship and traditional friendship of the English people will assert itself again, as it has done in the past, and will prevent such a cruel and dishonorable thing from hap-

Lists Other Ways to Settle

"The Jewish people cannot accept a minority status in Palestine. The whole purpose of the reat historic effort was to give the wish people national status in the world by establishing in Palestine a national homeland-a privilege possessed by ewery other people.

"A way can be found to a peace-ful settlement of the Palestine problem which would be just both to the Jews and to the Arabs. The partitioning of the country is not necessary. I was opposed to it from the beginning. Cantonization is preferable. A federated state is preferable. A binational state is preferable. But in order to be just and acceptable, any ultimate solution must take into account the national status of the Jewish people in Palestine and the right of free immigration into the country."

DEMAND BRITAIN

Rabbis Silver, Brickner Warn Against Sellout; Urge National Rights

Rabbis Barnett R. Brickner and Abba Hillel Silver in their first Sun-day lectures of the season called upon Great Britain not to "sell out" the Jews in Palestine.

Said Rabbi Brickner of Euclid Avenue Temple: "If the Chamberlain government goes back on her promise to the Jews in conformity with the policy of appeasement, which led to the desertion of Czechoslovakia and makes of Palestine another Czechoslovakia, Great Britain will not only lose whatever prestige and reputation she has left, but she will endanger her own position as an empire.

Brickner Denies Revolt

"I have every confidence that the British Parliament, speaking the heart and mind of the British people, will not permit Chamberlain to yield, and in that way sell out not only the Jews, but Great Britain

"It is a misrepresentation to say that the Arabs in Palestine are in revolt against the Jews, when the facts are that the so-called revolt s conducted by from four to six thousand terrorists, many of whom have been brought into the country and are paid for by Hitler and Mussolini who want Palestine as a part of the Rome-Berlin axis.

"Now that the Arabs have been liberated from the Turkish yoke and they have been established in four independent nations, it is only fair that justice should be done to the Jews, especially now when the plight of the Jewish people is so desperate. The Jewish people have waited longer than any other for its rights to be re-established as a nation.

Great Britain today was called on to maintain Jewish rights in Palestine in a series of resolutions adopted by 3000 Cleveland Jews who gathered in Public Hall last night to celebrate the 21st anniversary of the Balfour Declaration.

"Jewish development of Palestine was based entirely on Lord Balfour's promises," Dr. Robert B. Whyte, president of the Cleveland Church Federation, told the audience, "and Great Britain would be guilty of infamous betrayal should she close Palestine to further immigration.

Another resolution passed at the conclusion of a three-hour program of speeches commended President Roosevelt for the "hope and confidence" he inspired by "urging fulfillment of the international promise made to the Jewish people.

Principal speaker was Joseph B. Keenan, Cleveland attorney now assistant U. S. attorney general. He described Balfour Day as "symbolic of a revivified Jewry.

redicting the "dawn of a better day" for the Jewish race, Mr. Keenan said 5000 years of suffering had made the people great. He spoke of the Jewish contributions to this country which, he said, "extended its arms to the hated, to the oppressed and to the persecuted of all lands."

Other addresses were made by Welfare Director Fred W. Ramsey, representing the city; by Senator Robert J. Bulkley, who called Jews the "bulwark of democracy." and prominent Jewish leaders. Edward M. Baker presided.

3,000 Gather to Honor Balfour, Hear Keenan

Gathering at Public Music Hall to mark the 21st anniversary of the Balfour Declaration with a series of addresses by religious and political leaders, nearly 3,000 Cleveland Jews last night turned their eyes toward the east and called on Great Britain to keep open the doors of

Palestine.

A roar of approval greeted three resolutions presented by Rabbi Armond E. Cohen. The first two were addressed to Great Britain and expressed "confident hope that the government of Britain will be faithful to its tradition of integrity and honor and will fulfill its pledge to the Jewish people by faithfully discharging its obligation as the mandatory power."

The third expressed "gratitude for the hope and confidence inspired by President Roosevelt in urging fulfillment of the international promise made to the Jewish peo-ple" and thankfulness to members of the cabinet, the Senate and the House for their "leadership in pleading for justice, tolerance and decency for those oppressed by po-litical tyranny."

Program Lasts Three Hours

Calling persecution through the ages the greatest force in the unification of the Jewish race, Keenan said present troubles in Palestine were only a modern manifestation of a hitter struggle which had characterized the Jewish people.

He pointed out that America had "extended its arms to the hated, to the oppressed and to the persecuted of all lands" and paid tribute to the contribution of the Jews to the development of the United States.

"I am happy to say that in President Franklin D. Roosevelt you have a leader whose sympathy and human understanding reach out be-yond politics, creeds and religions,"

"I am sure that if he were here tonight he would say his heart beat in unison with yours. You may be sure that at the proper time you will find him marching with you, with his shoulder to the wheel."

Welfare Director Ramsey, repre-senting Mayor Harold H. Burton, recalled four visits to Palestine and praised the organizing and colonizing influence of Zionism.

"I am already identified with you in feeling and understanding," he said. "The moral precepts and teachings that have come from Palestine have made it a Holy Land for all of us.

Senator Bulkley called Jews in America "the bulwark of democracy" and said the United States had a responsibility to accept those who have been tyrannized in other lands.

"Let us hope that the Balfour Declaration will be maintained," he Declaration will be maintained," he said, "and that our government may at all times use its friendly influence with Great Britain to see that the Jewish people are given justice." Rabbi Silver said: "Our claims to Palestine rest on a mightier voice than that of Lord Balfour. They are based on the voice of Him who



Over Century of History

Munich will be known as the twentieth century replica of the Congress of Vienna, out of which will come a new unholy alliance and domination by new masters who represent everything antithetical to the ideas which stemmed from the French Revolution and were symbolized by 1789, 1830 and 1848, Rabbi A. H. Silver said in his address yesterday morning at the

Reviewing the history of Europe since 1814 and 1815, Rabbi Silver drew a close parallel between the triumph of reaction after the defeat of Napoleon and the return of a "new Caesarism" and "new im-peralism" at Munich. The denunciation of the "disease of liberalism" Metternich has its counterpart in the speeches of Hitler and Mussolini, the rabbi said.

Rabbi Silver devoted a large part of his lecture to a vehement excoriation of the dictatorships, particularly that of Hitler.

"The kind of state absolutism represented by the new arbiters of Europe means the ultimate conver-sion of the individual into a robot," Dr. Silver asserted. "They represent the return of all the heresy hunting psychology which religion has been trying to eradicate, and a moral and intellectual depravity Europe has not known for 2,000

"They are thieves, stealing people's property and then covering up with a shyster pretense at su-perior culture. The inconceivable degradation of the German 'kultur' was reached when intellectuals and men of refinement of Vienna were compelled to clean up the latrines and sewers of the city with bare

"They represent a deliberate at-

tempt to destroy all the ideas which have contributed to build civilization. The same barbarism which characterized the barbarians who flowed out of the marshes of the north of Europe in the fifth century to overrun and crush the civilization of the world is being repeated.

"But democracy has not had its last say. Munich is not the last word in the history of the nations. The trouble has been that people have not realized that democracy is not easily kept; it must be recaptured time and again, and paid for, if need be, with blood. Man-kind will have to begin again to throw up barricades against the invasion of imperialism.

"Democracy must become mili-tant again and recapture that crusading zeal which swept away the rubbish of the despotism of the three empires at the close of the World War. It must drive out the insidious forces which seek to destroy it. In our own country we must keep out of office men who refuse to stand by the Constitution and the Declaration of Indepen-

"Liberty is an end in itself. As an old Roman said, 'Liberty can remain unconquered only so long as she knows nothing more valuable than herself.' If we wish to keep our democracy we must work for it. You cannot keep talking about the beauties of democracy to an empty stomach. Our national economy is ailing, but it is not hopeless. It can be restored by statesmanship, vision and good will."



Meet at Oak Temple; Rabbis Silver, Brickner in Sermons

on Persecutions

A mass meeting to protest persecution of Jews in Germany is to be held tonight in Oak Pythian Temple, 706 E. 105th street, under auspices of the Jewish People's Committee Against Fascism and Anti-Semitism.

This gathering follows meetings in temples and synagogs in the city yesterday at which prayers were offered for Jews in Germany and other countries.

Crowds that filled to overflowing the Temple and Euclid Avenue Temple heard Rabbis A. H. Silver and Barnett R. Brickner speak on

the Jewish situation in Europe.
Talking on the subject, "The Nazi
Fury and What Can Be Done About
It," Rabbi Brickner said in part:

Shooting a Pretext

"The shooting of the German secretary at Paris was only a pre-text for the expropriation of Jewish capital and wealth. The whole matter had been carefully planned and plotted months ago when Jews were ordered to register their possessions with the government.

"It is an indication of how badly off the German government is financially. The point the world must understand is that this is only a prelude to the expropriation of the ands and wealth of the Catholic

Rabbi Brickner expressed his thanks and that of the congregation to all Cleveland Christian leaders and indicated that in reality the Nazi challenge was a challenge to everything for which Christendom stood as well as to the things that Jews and Judaism stand for.

Pray for Persecuted

At the Temple, Rabbi Silver de-

clared in part:

"We pray today for our persecuted people in Nazi Germany. We think of them today as we have every day

for the last five years.
"When innocent men and women are despoiled and their houses of worship bombed and burned to the ground in a systematically organized program by a government insensate to all the decencies of civilized life, and then, stripped and pauperized, driven into exile to be cared for by others, the human species would be utterly degraded and deserving of the fate of Sodom and Gomorrah if it stood by, witnessed it all, and remained silent and unmoved."

CITY'S JEWS PRAY FOR NAZI VICTIN

Leaders Discuss Means of

Aiding Sufferers

Throughout temples and synagogs of Cleveland yesterday the voices of Jewish congregations were lifted in fervent appeals for divine help in behalf of their persecuted brethren in Germany, as Jewish leaders probed the situation and sought practical ways of alleviating the suffering of the German Jews.

Both the Temple and Euclid Ave-

nue Temple were crowded to overflowing, with many hundreds turned away, at morning services yesterday. At the Temple hundreds stood around the walls in the main auditorium and in the balcony. A special service of prayer with responsive readings and verses, prepared by Rabbi A. H. Silver, was used at the Temple.

Following are excerpts from the sermons preached by the rabbis: RABBI SILVER—"We pray today

for our persecuted people in Nazi Germany. We think of them today as we have every day for the last five years. We think of their tired hearts, their eyes weary with long-ing for escape, their silent tears, their broken and scattered families, their lives drained of hope, and their pride lowered into the dust.

No Domestic Affair

"We pray that our brethren will find strength and comfort in the thought that they are not alone, that around them is the ring of a great compassion forged by the hands not only of Jews, but of non-Jews as well, by the hands of millions of men and women of good will throughout the world.

"Men will speak up! Inhumanity in any land is not a domestic affair. When innocent men and women are despoiled and their house of worship bombed and burned to the ground in a systematically organized program by a government insensate to all the decencies of civilized life, and then driven, stripped and pauperized, into exile to be cared for by others, the hu-man species would be uttterly degraded and deserving of the fate of Sodom and Gomorrah if it stood by, witnessed it all, and remained silent and unmoved.

"I would pray today for the Ger-man people. I find it in my heart to pity them. I would pray for any people ruled by a gang which began its career by descrating cemeteries, celebrated its advent to power by burning books, and climaxed its career by the burning and the desecration of houses of worship. I would pray for any people whose ruler deprived it not only of freedom, but of honor, who besmirched its fair name and placed the brand

of shame, "pogrom," upon its brow.
"We pray that that great people
may be finally cleansed of this pollution and that the great spirit of Germany, the spirit alive in its poets and singers and scientists, the spirit which we always loved and which many of us defended when it was attacked, may gain perma-nent ascendency in German life.

SCOUT REFUGEES WILL FIND AID HERE E NYT

Dr. J. E. West, Chief Executive, Appeals to Colleagues to Provide Homes or Jobs

HE SCORES REICH POLICY

Scouting Abolished Wherever Dictators Are in Control. Leader Declares

High up in the skyscraper at 2 Park Avenue thousands of miles removed from the scene in his thoughts, a genial, silver-haired man who is the chief executive for more than 1,000,000 American woys and men engaged in scouting spoke a few quiet words occuprday that will mean salvation for a number of refugee Box Scouts from across the sea.

Dr. James E. West, whose memories of his own handicapped boyhood as a crippled orphan have caused him to devote nearly threescore years to guiding the lives of youngsters in the scouting movement, was explaining in an interview a scep he had taken in accordance with the Boy Scout motto: "Do a Good Turn Daily."

In response to many appeals for ald from former members of the now-extinct Scout Associations of Germany and Austria, Dr. West has mailed requests to all those in scouting here to try to find either homes or jobs for their persecuted colleagues in other lands.

Assails German Policy

Coincident with his announcement of the attempt being made by American Scouts to help others, Dr. West, speaking for the entire Scout organization, assailed the policy of the German Government and expressed fear for the future of scouting in the countries coming under the domination of Germany.

"There is still scouting in Hungary, Poland and Czechoslovakia, but we don't know how long it will last," he said. "Where there are dictator countries, there is no scouting-it has been abolished in Austria and vill be in countries absorbed by Germany."
"To all of us here," he continued,
"it is shocking and unbelievable

that the German people themselves,

"We find it in our heart to pray even for the Nazis—for their repentance and regeneration. I should like to remind them of the motto which was on the first flag of the American Revolution raised by Paul Jenes' ship in 1776: 'Don't Tread Cn Me!' Others have tried to tread on the Jewish people—the ezars of Russia, for example.

"I should also like to advise them of what I suspect they already know—that they will not succeed in terrerizing the rest of world Jewry into silence by putting the thumbscrews upon their Jewish

It is unreal for the people as a whole to condone or permit such glaring injustice as the German Government policy has apparently promoted.'

He admitted that Russia, Italy and Germany were doing a "magnificent job" in the training of youth, but added that these countries were training youths only physically, "not morally or educationally." He termed pro-

that has caused the Boy Scouts of

America to condemn their policies.

This reads:
"A Scout is reverent. He is reverent toward God, he is faithful in his religious duties, and respects the convictions of others in matters of custom and religion."

The suggestion that American assist former Scouts Austrian Scouts in rehabilitating themselves was one of the last acts of Hubert Martin, director of the Boy Scouts International Bureau, London, Eng-land, who died on Nov. 17. "In one instance that came to our attention," he said in his letters, "one of our World Jamborce Scouts met an Austrian boy at the World Jamboree in Holland and they have corresponded since then. This

would have expired on Oct. 31. "Unless an affidavit of support were provided by a United States citizen, they would have been compellec to leave with no safe destina-tion in sight," he added, "but in this case a member of our national executive board provided the affi-

davit."

In his sermon Dr. Silver will deal with the problem of the protection of fundamental human liberties, and the part which religion plays in preserving these liberties. He also will speak of the validities which must be protected in the

With the rise of the totalitarian states of Europe and the oppression of the Jewish people in Germany and Italy, Dr. Silver has helped American Jewry to assist refugees overseas.

"I call your attention to the menace of propaganda via the radio.

Misuse of the radio is the easiest way to establish Fascism in any democracy.

"Basically, the problem of anti-Bemitism is the exposed minority problem.

"Agitators capitalize on dislike of the unlike. The Jewish minority group is not different from any other minority group being persecuted everywhere.

"Anti-Semitism is frequently used as a propaganda weapon. A minority is frequently used as a scapegoat because it is easier to say 'they are.' Anti-Semitism is used as political Ministers who took part in last

Dr. Silver censured Jews who "had taken their cue from lobbyists, corporation lawyers and representatives of special interests, and joined in the chorus of defamation of the President."

The rabbi said: "I am not an apologist for the President nor the advocate of partisan politics. My interest is not so much in people as in principles. President Roosevelt has made mistakes but these have been of judgment, not of motive.

"President Roosevelt has kept honest, courageous leadership. He stands shoulder high above any other leader in the world."

Inter-Faith Ratly Hears Attack on E Father Coughlin

Before a crowd composed of Christians and Jews from four large East Side churches and the Temple, which taxed the seating capacity of Epworth-Euclid Methodist Church, Rabbi A. H. Silver last night warned that anti-Semitism is the first and readiest weapon to be used by the protagonists of Fascism when they set out to overthrow a democracy.

Rabbi Silver, speaking on the theme, "What Is Behind Anti-Semitism?" asserted that when a privileged class is frightened by a threatened change in the economic order they will move to protect their special interests not by a frontal attack against liberalism but by identifying the liberals with an unsavory label.

"There is a menace of propaganda confronting education in our day. The race of civilization is between propaganda and education, and if the radio falls into the hands of certain people who want to incite revolution they are in command of the best weapon. The easiest way to establish Fascism in a democracy is through the radio.

"Father Coughlin is a Fascist through and through. He has dedicated himself to remodeling our political structure and bringing it into line with the bankrupt terrorist state of Italy. He employs the old arguments and lies, but a Fascist adventurer will use a lie if it helps his cause.

"The genius of our religion has always been against any form of vilolation of man's inalienable rights. In this the Judeo-Christian tradition is definite. We must stand together in the defense of all those fundamental rights and values which have made life worth liv-

CLEVELAND (JTA) -- Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, made the following statement to the J.T.A. ? "I have not yet seen the full text of the Woodhead report and the Government policy. I am pleased that partition has been abandoned. I have opposed it from the very beginning. I am satisfied with the proposal to convoke a round table conference of representatives of Arabs and the Jewish Agency. If the chosen spokesmen will be men of statesmanship, vision and good will, a satisfactory solution may be worked out. It is clear, however, that the Jewish people cannot accept the status of a permanent minority group in Palestine or the restriction of Jowish immigration on grounds other than the absorptive capacity of the country. I am persuaded that our leaders will not enter such a conference in any spirit of instransigeance or unyielding dogmatism, but this attitude, in order to be helpful, must be matched by a similar attitude on the part of the Arabs. The British Government especially must place its full weight of authority behind a solution which would realize the primary purpose of the Balfour Declaration and the mandate. It must not permit other considerations to induce it to attempt to force intolerable concessions from the Jewish people."

He said the answer was not in stressing horror of war nor in cultivation of religious and secular pacifism. "It is a beautiful ideapacifism-but in the grasp of a few spiritually elite in the world," Rabbi Silver said.

He declared preparedness was not the answer to the question. "There never was a nation so adequately prepared that it wasn't beaten in war," he asserted.

Rabbi Silver lashed regional agreements and said the temporary pacts now being made between European countries would only bring more problems with serious consequences.

Isolation is not the answer, he "We cannot become ecoaverred. nomically involved in all parts of the world and remain isolated," he told the audience,

"The people have no confidence in neutrality laws. They tie our hands as aids to agressor nations while crippling the victims of agressor natiosn."

Men's hearts, in times like these, are not sectarian.

PREDICTS RISE IN

Dr. Jones Tells Symposium 'Romance' Is on Wane

With war and rumors of war steadily rising throughout the world and the clouds of ever-accelerating rearmament hanging over the nations, approximately 1,000 leading representatives of religious and civic life here yesterday noon heard what religion had day noon heard what religion had

What was heard was in sub-stance a call to face reality, to abandon false hopes and undue optimism, and to unite forces in lifting American influence alongside that of other nations in a co-operative effort to rid the world of the curse of war.

Ball Room Crowded

From Dr. Edgar DeWitt Jones of Detroit, president of the Federal Council of Churches, and from Rabbi A. H. Silver of the Temple came words bringing the interpretive insights of religion to bear on the problem. Outbursts of appleause was from the crowd which plause rose from the crowd which occupied every inch of available space in the Hotel Cleveland ball room as the speakers drove home

To mas the speakers drove home point after point.

Dr. Jones, in opening the symposium, sponsored by the Tempie under the title "Religion Speaks," said the romance of war, with its human element of glory and fame, had disappeared and that in its place remained only the brutality, stark reality and filth of war. Even soldiers of modern war have no enthusiant for it, for down in their hearts they realize its complete brutality, he asserted.

With reference to the church's position in time of war, Dr. Jones predicted that any future war would see a larger number of conscientious objectors than ever before in American history. He re-ferred to the conclusions of Dr. Charles Clayton Morrison that the church, in the event of war, must declare its independence of the state, must excommunicate from its altars the whole war system, and must have room at its altars for both the loyal pacifist and the loyal

Talk Not Enough

Rabbi Silver said that to talk about the horrors and tragedles of war was not sufficient, because men and nations knew the horrors of war and refused to be frightened away from its adventure and ex

away from its adventure and excitement by fear of death or injury.

He discounted pacifism as a means of getting rid of war, pointing out that in 2,000 years the Christian ideal of pacifism had as yet only been apprehended by a mere handful of the spiritually alife.

Preparedness was likewise dis-counted by Dr. Silver, on the ground that preparedness was al-ways relative, depending on what the enemy was doing pari passu with your own country.

The only way America can help in bringing peace is through active co-operation and intervention with other nations in the preservation of international law and order, he said. The only road to peace is col-lective action for collective security.

Germany Probable Instigator, He Tells Town Hall Forum

That war among western powers, with Germany the probable instigator, is inevitable within six months to a year's time, and that ultimate world peace can be achieved only by a rebuilt League of Nations enforcing impartial international law were convictions expressed before the Town Hall Forum at the Grand Avenue Congregational chirch Thursday night by Rabhi Abba Hillel Silver, worldfamed Jewish sociologist from Cleveland.

Discussing the topic, "Some Aber-rations of Our Day," Dr. Silver rations of Our Day. Dr. Silver painted a gloomy picture of a demo-cratic western civilization sliding steadily backward through the past 20 years into the morasses of hu-man degeneration. The aberrations he listed as departing from the great upward trends of humanity were:

1. Attempts by governments to shackle and enslave the human

ENGINEERING PROBLEM

Dr. Silver said:

"Peace is a problem in en-gineering for which we have to train coming generations. That peace will come only through international action, through set-ting up of machinery for col-lective action for collective se-

The League of Nations faled because it was betrayed. The United States, after giving birth to the idea, refused to nurse it to maturity. England dealt another blow. Unless the United States is willing to contribute its share to the machinery for neares it will the machinery for peace, it will do nothing loward solution of the

The rabbi put his finger on Germany as the likely boil from which war may crupt. He declared the race toward armament in dictator-ship countries can mount only to a certain point, when financial and physical increases no longer are possible. At that point, he said, mili-tary experts must choose between going to war or losing their dom-inant positions.

"There never has been such an

"There never has been such an attempt on the autonomy of the human mind as in the past 20 years. The Middle Ages were a time of human emancipation compared to the present, when two-thirds of the Western world has outlawed and punished truth-seeking, has regimented thinking, is training children, not how to evaluate, but just to obey." evaluate, but just to obey."
He added:

"The race for civilization seems to be a race between education and propaganda, with the latter, now a pseudo-science, in ascendency."

dency."

The principles of the bill of rights, guaranteeing freedom of the unalienable rights to life, liberty and happiness have been revoked in two-thirds of the western civilization, Dr. Silver charged. He decried the "rise of shameful, irreverent nationalistic exhibitionisms, and mourned trampling of civilizations." and mourned trampling of civilized ideals under boots of racial hatreds.

DUG UP OLD IDOLS!

Dr. Silver asserted:

Dr. Silver asserted:

"We have gone back to old superstitions, dug up old idols, and placed them on pedestals around which we now dance in an orgy of abandon. These idols are the aberrations I mention. But, fortunately, I believe they are just that—aberrations, only momentary deviations from the ascendant trends of mankind."

The patient labor of those in the world today who still can think with a minimum of bias and a maximum of self restraint will determine the fate of the world, the rabbi said.

Dr. Silver has studied foreign trends at first hand, interviewing such notables as Mussolini and for-mer President Masaryk of Hun-gary. He was one of the framers of the unemployment insurance bill in Ohio, is on the National Child Labor commission, and the commission on Militarism in Education.

Rabbi Silver Asserts Tradi-5 tions Are Threatened

A revived paganism, proclaiming the absolute supremacy of the state is again threatening the classic tracitions of both Judaism and Christianity in the modern world, sald Eabli A. H. Silver yesterday morning at the Temple.

cay festival of lights instituted by Judas Maccabeus and his brothers at the time of the dedication of the new sacrificial altar at the temple of Jerusalem in 165 B. C.

"Paganism in the second century before the Common Era represented many of the ideas and attitudes which are again raising their heads in the paganism of our own day. Its gods possessed no moral character. They represented blind forces ter. They represented blind forces of nature which had to be propiliated. Long before the time of the Maccabees, the gods of the Greeks had become mirth-provoking characters in the plays of the comic playwrights of Greece. They were represented as drunkards, deceivers, licentious and lacking in all moral dignity. Judaism recoiled from such an attitude to divinity. It envisaged God in terms of holiness, perfection, the object of supreme love and reverence.

"Paganism proclaimed the supremacy of the state. The symbol of the state, the bust of the emperor, was in every temple of the ancient world and was worshipped. Judaism insisted on the supremacy of law and the will of God, to which state and emperor alike were abovedingte. The appaired world.

The ancient world mew little of sympathy and compassion for the weak, the poor, the iged and the slave. Judaism proclaimed the ideal of 'Nation shall not lift up sword against nation, nor learn war any more.
