American Jewish organizations engaged in the task of aiding 6,000,000 Jewish rigidmi for Centin and Eastern Etimpe of political persecution and economic distress was announced yetterday.

The unification was made known in a statement igned by Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, national chairman of he American Jewish Joint Distribution. Campaign, and Rabbi tribution Campaign, and Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, national chairman of the United Palestine Appeal. The third organization participating is the National Coordinating Committee Fund, Inc., of which William Rosenwald is president. The three organizations will furction for the purposes of the drive as the United Jewish Appeal for Refugees and Overseas Needs.

Rabbi Wise and Rabbi Silver pointed out in their statement that the minimum requirement for the success this year of a well defined program of relief, re-training and emigration of German Jews and of aid to Jews in other lands of distress and of furthering the upbuild-ing of Palestine was at least three to four times the sum raised by all agencies last year.

"Tragic Setbacks" of 1938 Noted

"The year that is now closing," the statement declared, "has been marked by a greater series of tragic setbacks for civilization and therefore for Jews in Jermany and other parts of Central and Eastern

Europe than any year since 1933.

"American Jews have for the past five years been in the forefront of the efforts to aid the Jews of Germany and other countries of Eastern and Central Europe and to upbuild Palestine. Jewish communities in other parts of the world are carrying on campaigns on a far broader scope than ever before. To these efforts we plan to lend during 1939 greater support than ever."

Under the program, the Joint Distribution Committee will provide immediate assistance and emergency aid to Jews within Germany and Austria and to the German refugees in European and other lands, enabling many thousands of individuals, whenever possible, to many and other countries of East-

individuals, whenever possible, to find new homes. The Joint Committee will also continue its extensive program of reconstructive aid and emergency assistance to the Jews of Poland, Eumania and other countries of Eastern and Central Europe.

Function of Palestine Appeal

The United Palestine Appeal will promote the immigration and settle-ment in Palestine of many thousands who must leave Germany and other countries, in addition to maintaining existing institutions for the benefit of Jews in Palestine and continuing the task of advancing the upbuilding of the country through promotion of immigration, colonization, land purchase and other activities for enlarging the absorptive capacity of the country. Rabbi Silver Assails Proposal for Settlements in Africa

MASHINGTON, Jan 14.—Jan Maseryk, former Czech Minister to London, came back topsy to Washington, where be easered diplomacy twenty years and, and broadcast that he came "to speak for the Jews and to work for them," especially as regards Palestine.

He spoke under the auspices of the National Conference for Paiestine, which opened a two-day session tonight at the Mayflower with 1,500 Jewish delegates from fortyfour States assembled to study the plight of Jews in Germany and to plen how American Jews could best help these and other oppressed Jews o settle in Palestine. Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver

the United Palestine Appeal, dismissed as a "cruel deception" the proposals for settling Jews in Africa and South America. He was supported by other speakers in holding that Palestine alone is prepared to receive large numbers of refugees. Palestine could take 100, 000 in a year if the British would only let them in, Rabbi Silver said. He and Rabbi Stephen S. Wise of

New York, chairman of the executive committee of the appeal, who joined him in a symposium that was also broadcast over the Columbia system, both denounced the German plan for permitting Jews to leave as a "ransom" scheme, and said American Jewry would have nothing to do with it.
To Rabbi Silver this was "a blan-

ket invitation to other countries with anti-Semitic leanings to mulct the Jews," and to Rabbi Wise it was a plan to send Jews from Germany as "pauperized salesmen of German-made goods," which the civilized world should prevent.

Mr. Masaryk, the chief speaker, said that to compare "the treatment allotted to our Germans by my father with the treatment which Henlein and Company are dishing out to the Jews and anti-totalitarian citizens of Sudetenland-it is as heaven compared to hell."

He emphasized he had come to champion the Jewish cause, and

gave this explanation:
"There are nearly 10,000,000 of
my people—together—facing suffering and depredation, but they, being united together, can endure and survive it and come out victorious in the end. But the Jews, scattered all over the world—what chance have they to fight off the hatred and oppression which has driven them from their homes and dumped them on the highways of the world? The Jews are a small minority everywhere. And without tolerance and decent treatment of minorities, democracy cannot survive it and come out victorious of minorities, democracy cannot

United Palestine Appeal Calls on Britain to Admit That Many From Reich in 1939

JACKSON SUPPORTS MOVE

Sees Room for More Refugees Than Anywhere Else—Record Overseas Aid Fund Planned

WASHINGTON, Jan. The United Palestine Appeal closed its conference here today by pressing for the admission to Palestine this year of twice as many Jews as the 50,000 admitted in the past two and a half years.

The 1,500 delegates from all over the country adopted a memorial to Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain urging, as of right under the mandate and even more because of "desperate" need, that the immigration restrictions "temporarily" imposed by the British Government after the Arab outbreaks began should be

"No serious program contemplating the solution of the refugee problem," the resolution said, "can hope for success without giving a primary place to Palestine, which has the physical resources, the social environment and the economic opportunities for the integration of 100,000 German Jewish refugees in Palestine in 1939."

Only by opening wide the doors to Palestine can a policy developing so rapidly as the "ruthless" Nazi one be met, the resolution

Timing of Move Nated

Largest Fund Planned

The conference ratified plans for a unified campaign this year to raise the largest fund ever contributed by American Jewry for overseas needs. This will be called the United Jewish Appeal for Refugees and Overseas Needs and will represent not only the United Palestine Appeal but the Joint Distribution Committee and the National Coordinating Committee

It aims to provide for distressed Jews and refugees through Palestine settlement, European relief and rehabilitation and refugee adjustment in the United States.

Mr. Jackson's speech to the afternoon session was an inspirational, comforting address, in which he declared that "there will yet be help" if the Jews will but keep their courage and "spiritual integrity."
He told of the indebtedness of the United States to the Jews. The "predominant contribution of the Jews of Jew to American life is intellec-tual," he said, adding:

he said, adding: "In the law it is doubtful if the contributions of any man of our

times may be measured against those of Mr. Justice Brandeis or the late Mr. Justice Cardozo. The what spirit will America make answer to the plight of the refugee Jew which is today's out-standing challenge to the Christian conscience?" Mr. Jackson asked. 'I cannot deny that racial ill-will and intolerance exist in America, but I do deny that they are American."

"Any man who, in America, ad-vocates oppression or disregard of the rights of any minority is en-titled to the same intelligence rating as one who saws off the limb on

which he is sitting," he added.
Quoting the Prophets, Mr. Jackson brought back to his hearers the vision of the day when the Jews "shall be safe in their land," and "shall be safe in their land," and held that meanwhile "a terrible debt" is being written against the non-Jewish world and "it is the Gentile rather than the Jew who should seek deliverance."

Rabbi Jonah B. Wise of New York, national chairman of the Joint Distribution Committee, urging all Jews to unite their forces, said:

"We cannot and we will not permit the misrepresentation of Jews by anti-Semites to go unanswered; persecution of our brethren by States driven to desperation through economic failure to go unchal-lenged; exile of our brethren by heartless and ruthless dictators to go unaided. We will not abate one iota of our faith in the religion and in the just cause of the men and women of Israel."

In the closing speech of the con-ference tonight David Ben Gurion, chairman of the executive commit-tee of the Jewish agency in Pales-tine and one of the principal leaders, who will represent the Jevs in the coming talks in London, caused

"When we go to London next month to meet the Arab and British representatives, we will not only meet them, but the shadow of Hitler, for the British know that behind the Arab Fuehrer is the big Mufti who sits in Berlin. ficulties which will confront us in London, but just as we were not frightened by the agents of Hitler in Palestine, so we will not be frightened by his influence in Lon-

Asks Jews to Get Jobs for Refugees

CINCINNATI, Jan. 17. (AP)-American Jewry was urged today to help find homes and jobs for 12,000 Jewish refugees from Europe now concentrated in New York.

"We should be profoundly grateful that we are privileged to be their hosts rather than their guests," Harry B. Berk, president of the Brotherhood of the Reformed Congregation of Keneseth Israel of Philadelphia, told the biennial council of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations.

He urged synagogs and temple organizations to make every effort to help distribute the refugees over the country and help them get adjusted religiously, economically and socially to their new homes in America.

Berk emphasized that the newcomers should not be allowed to

take the jobs of others.

Cleveland said tonight that "thoughtful men search earnestly for the road away from disaster" because "great peoples have de-stroyed their liberties and enslaved hemselves!

Signs Of Religious Rebirth Appearing, Both Christian And Jewish Leaders Say

The rebirth of a more vital and transforming Christian religious life—realized despite a possible decline of organized religion to a "minority interest—" was envisioned last night by Dr. Charles W. Gilkey.

The widely known Baptist dear of Rockefeller Memorial Chapell University of Chicago, told the Union of American Hebrew Congregations and its affiliated groups at Emery Auditorium that "Gos may yet quicken among us a religious faith * * * smaller in bulk, but stronger in carrying power."

Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, Cleveland rabbi, sensed a similar "incoming tide of faith" in the future of religion in the Jewish world as well as in the larger Christian world.

At Cincinnati's Emery Session

"I am going to let you in on a secret tonight, we propose to inspire you," Frederick F. Greenman of New York, Chairman of a discussion on "Religion in Present Day Life," thus cautioned the audience which filled Cincinnati's Emery Auditorium, Tuesday evening, Jan. 17th. The meeting was one of the joint sessions of th 36th Biennial Council of the Union, the 13th Biennial Assembly of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods and the 8th Biennial Convention of the National Federation of Temple Brotherhoods.

Dean Charles W. Gilkey of the Rockefeller Memorial Chapel of Chicago University spoke on "Religion in the Larger Christian World." Dr. Abba Hillel Silver of The Temple, Cleveland, presented the position of "Religion in Present Day Jewish Life."

The meeting was called to order by the Honorable Alfred M. Cohen of Cincinnati, President of the 36th Council.

"It is my privilege as President of the Council to present to you the Chairman of the evening," the Honorable Mr. Cohen declared. "He is a lawyer of renown, a member of the Executive Board of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, a Trustee of the Jewish Institute of Religion, and besides occupies very many important positions in the religious, social and philanthropic aspects of Judaism."

After his word of warning, Chairman Greenman, in few words, presented his idea of religion's place in this modern world.

"The day has long since passed when established religions could get along by the use of the rack to torture disbelievers, or the inquisition to plague backsliders," Mr. Greenman declared. "No longer can established religion hold its adherents through threats of excommunication or the denunciation of heretics and heathen. Established religion cannot seek today to establish truth by denying the Copernican theory or by forcing recantations from the Galileos of modern science.

"The forces which wrote religious freedom and liberty into our Constitution made disbelief a right, but it also liberated the energies of church men for the greater work of making religion a constructive part of modern life. The guarantee of religious liberty gave us such liberal churchmen as Dean Gilkey, who will address us tonight."





Dean Gilkey pointed out that Christianity and Judaism "are alike heirs of that great spiritual heritage which the prophets and psalmists of centuries ago have passed down."

He went on to say that, though heirs of a common heritage do not always agree, his presence at the Biennial was a sign of "a new sense of spiritual kinship" between Judaism and Christian-

In the half century since the Brooklyn bridge was completed, Dean Gilkey declared, two great advances have made possible building of bridges more than

2½ times longer. "One of these," Dean Gilkey listed the advances in science, "is the greater exactness and confidence of the engineering that plans the bridge, and the other is the improvement in the qual-ity of the materials available for its construction."

"Religion is always building bridges over the gaps that in every generation tend to isolate it and shut it off from that fruitful commerce with the other interests and experiences of life through which it makes its contribution to these other interests and in return is enriched by them," the Dean said in comparing the resources of religion to those of science.

"The generation before our own, and our own earlier generation labored hard, led by the scholars of your faith and mine, at building a bridge that is happily firmer today than ever perhaps before in human history, between the religion of your faith and mine, and the best knowledge, science and history, of the modern world."

The Dean said that fruitful commerce passes over that bridge.

"But, our generation is facing some bewildering facts in this post-war world," he added.

"The gaps between the races of men, the nations of men, and what within our own America we begin ominously now to call the different classes of men, these gaps are widening and deepening into gulfs, on the edge of which we catch our visitors catch as their breath on the edge of the Grand

Canyon, looking down and aeross. "Can our democracy these bridges? Can our civiliza-tion hope to construct them? That has become to thoughtful people of whatever race and faith, the critical issue of our generation. What has religion to contribute to this building?

"My thesis tonight is briefly nis," Dean Gilkey said, "that this," the status of religion in the modern world is the chance to do for these more urgent bridges over these deeper and wider gaps, what our engineers and our steel makers have done for the Hudson and the Golden Gate, but that to do that will require newer religious faith and experience, and mind, a religion lighter in weight, smaller in bulk, but stronger in carrying power-

He then showed that in addition to the organized religion which is analagous to the completed bridge, there is a personal religion comparable to the materials that go to making a physical bridge.

"In the first place we once had a great newspaper editor in New York who told the young men of that city to go west and grow up with the land, and it has cost us very many promising young Then in the early part of the 20th century a young man by the name of Abba Hillel Silver left from New York, crossed the Alleghenies, looked down upon the land beyond, and thought it was good land. We have never been able to get him back home.

"You may recall that when Beethoven reached the climax of his 9th Symphony, he called for the sound of the human voice as his means of highest expression. Our next speaker might well have served Beethoven's purpose, but Dr. Silver has used his great gifts to bring help to Israel, comfort to the bereaved and hope to the persecuted. I present to you,

Dr. Silver began his address by pointing out that scientific, political and economical considerations turned Jews along with other religionists away from their faith during the 19th and early 20th centuries.

"Enlightenment and Emancipation were the pied-piper whose music beguiled many Jews away from their ancient loyalties and spiritual securities," Dr. Silver

declared.

"Fortunately," he went on, not all Jews were of the same "Fortunately," he mind. Many refused to exchange spiritual treasures for material advantages. They saw neither the need nor the wisdom of it. They were of the opinion that if freedom and equality are to come to all men, they should come also to the Jews as a matter of right. as a restoration of that which belongs to them and to all men

as a natural endowment, and not in payment for unwarranted sacrifices of religious convictions, a distinctive culture and an historic way of life."

"What has been tragically missing in our civilization had been that compelling and coordinating belief in the great haman goals which religion, and religion alone, has set for mankind, and towards the attainment of which science, education and democracy must contribute if they are to fulfill their sole func-

"Mankind's way of salvation is the way which leads back or forward to God," he said.

"Thoughtful Jews are turning to the sure and classic highways manity has sickened of its Godless civilization," stated.

"Where there is no longer the Law of God, there ensues the law of the Duce, the Fuehrer, or the Commissar before which all men must tremble. Now that lights are going out everywhere in the world, men are turning to the light of God. Jews can do no less. Jews will do no less."

WARNS OF DANGER IN ARMS PROGRAM

Rabbi Silver Holds World

Organization Is Need -

"The real solution of war and peace in the world is not armament or neutrality legislation, or regional alliances, but a world organization Such as was tried following the World War and destroyed because of lack of vision on the part of leaders of the major powers of Europe and because of the machinations of munition dealers and arm-ament merchants," said Rabbi A. H. Silver, in an address on "What is Behind the New Arms Program of President Roosevelt," at the Temple

"Back of an intelligent armament program must be an intelligent and program must be an intelligent and consistent foreign policy." Rabbi Silver said. "What shall we prepare for? We want an open door in China. Are we ready to go to war for it? We want the territorial integrity of China respected. Are we ready to go to war for that? Are we willing to back up, by force, any arrangement which we prefer on the Asiatic continent? Do we want to fight for the Philippines? Do we wish to control both sides of the Pacific? If so, then it pines? Do we wish to control both sides of the Pacific? If so, then it is quite logical to embark upon a vast program of naval expansion, to build many new naval bases and to fortify an island like Guam, 5,000 miles west of San Francisco.

"Dut if we are not willing to defend the above positions, then it is alwaste of money and needless provocation to engage in such expansionism

Cites Experience of 1917

"Do we wish to join with the re maining democracies of Europe in collective action against aggressors? Do we wish to unite with England and France to check the dynamic expansion of Germany and Italy? expansion of Germany and Italy?
This might involve us in another
overseas expedition, as in 1917, and
we must, therefore prepare for
such an eventuality by not only expanding our navy but by building
a vast army as well.
"President Roosevelt has been
toying with this latter idea. Great

democrat that he is, and outraged by the indecent aggressiveness and brutal imperialism of the dictators, and fearing that they are a men-ace to all free countries, he would like to 'quarantine' them, to unite the forces of democracy against them and, by pitting force against force, to stop them.

"This is a courageous program.
But President Roosevelt, I am afraid, is not reckoning with the true nature of his democratic part-They are not as excited about saving democracy as he is. The Tory Chamberlain and even Daladier are not seriously disturbed by the spread of Fascism. They are disturbed by the threat of Fascist countries to their own imperial inPressure at Munich

"There are powerful elements in the population of France and Great Britain who are more concerned with checking industrial control, social progress and the growing power of organized labor on the continent than with preserving democracy, and these elements are now controlling their governments.

"Act Munich it was not only four."

"Aat Munich it was not only fear but the pressure of these powerful elements which forced France and England to capitulate to dictator-ship and to betray a democracy which France, at least, had pledged to defend. These democracies also helped to strangle a legally-elected democratic government in Spain by making it impossible for that gov ernment to procure munitions to defend itself against Hitler and defend itself against Hitler and Mussolini, who used Franco as their

"France and Great Britain wan American military co-operation, not to defend democracy in the world, but to defend themselves—their imperial interests, perhaps Tunisia and Corsica or British colonial interests in Africa. President Roosevelt simply does not talk the same language as the heads of the governments in France and in Great Brit-ain, although they may use the same terminology.

"In the name of defending democracy, the American people ought not to be stampeded into building a still more powerful war machine to bolster up French and British imperialism, thereby repeating the tragic mistake which we made in 1917.

No Right to Take Sides

"We should consent to no re-gional alliances, however informal and tacit they may be. As a nation, we have no right to take sides in

imperial rivalries.

"We should have done our share in the last twenty years to effect a strong world organization for peace. That was the program which America presented to the nations of the world following the World War-collective action for collective se-curity. We falled to do it. We were unwilling to assume any responsi-bility or make any sacrifice for a world organization for peace. We even refused to enter a World Court which American statesmen had helped to project and American presidents indersed. Such joint action with all other nations of the world for peace would have in-volved us in fir less risk than the ideas with which some of our leaders are tsying today—joining up with one group of nations against another group of nations and dividing the world into two hostile camps

"The world being what it is to-day, and mad dictators being on the rampage, it is of course neces-sary for a nation like ours to be adequately protected against at-tack. Because of our fortunate geographical position, such adequate defense need not be excessive and need not involve us in colossal armament programs. No nation will likely make war upon us, our wealth being what it is, our resources, our raw material, our man power, our injustrial machine and our staying power. We should fore-go all thought of adventuring in the far Pacific or again saving the world for democracy on the battle

fields of Europe.
"And we should never lose sight that the real solution of war and peace in the world is not armament, or neutrality legislation, or regional alliances, but a world organization, such as was tried following the World War and destroyed because of lack of vision on the part of leaders of the major powers of Europe and because of the machinations of munition dealers and armament merchants. The experi-ment will have to be made again — perhaps after the next world

Geneva to Munich

B Two Cleveland men, church leaders and civic minded, spoke out Sunday on a topic to which every believer in democracy should in these days be giving serious thought. Both emphasized the fact that if the democracies are to survive the attack of hostile forces they must organize on a world basis for defense.

Rabbi Silver of the Temple, always the eloquent defender of liberal principles, regrets-as an increasing number of Americans must-that the United States has not in the last twenty years done more to carry out the program it proposed at the close of the late war; namely, to "effect a strong world organization for peace."

Instead, we refused to go into the League of Nations. We even turned our backs on the World Court. We declined to endure whatever small risks such membership would have entailed, and as a result now find ourselves, two decades later, face to face with risks more serious.

The other local churchman to speak on the same subject the same day is Charles L. Zorbaugh, a leader in the Presbyterian Church, who used the letter columns of the Plain Dealer to express his views.

For the moment, he points out, the League of Nations is "in eclipse. The pendulum has awung to Munich. But it will swing back again to Geneva." When it does, the "gathered nations of the world will take back into their own hands the ordering of their destinies."

Had the democracies not abandoned Geneva,

they might not have found themselves at Munich. And it may be true that to get away from Munich a return to Geneva is the surest course.

Silver Urges Y. W. Leaders to Proclaim Faith

The war mood of most of the world and the regimentation of intellect do not represent a new movement but "an apostacy, a backsliding, an aberration, a temporary disturbance of vast effect in man's struggle for freedom," Rabbi A. H.

SILVER CALLS PIUS

Says Pope Faced Evils of His Time Squarely

Pope Pius XI was a man of God ho preferred to face the evils of his time directly rather than evade issues by astute diplomacy, Rabbi A. H. Silver said in an address paying memorial tribute to the late pope at the Temple yesterday morning.

A man is tested by his hour in history," the rabbi said. "Pope Pius XI lived through one of the most XI lived through one of the most crucial periods in history. For seventeen years he was the acknowledged spiritual leader of more than 350,000,000 followers who lived in all countries of the earth, under every form of government, and who belonged to all walks of life. The issues which raged over the world during his pontificate sharply divided men and drove many to the most bitter struggles and conflicts. "Wherever he say evil, falsehood

most bitter struggles and conflicts. "Wherever he say evil, falsehood and cruelty, he spoke up against it with a startling and shattering directness. He was not beguiled by the sham political shibboleth of 'appeasement' He called not for surface appeasement but for repentance, reform and regeneration. He attacked the lies of bloated nationalism, arrogant racialism and state absolutism as few lay heads of democratic states have had the democratic states have had the courage to do.

Aware of Diseased Ideas

"He understood the nature of the diseased ideas which spread through the spiritually exhausted European world just as the physi-European world just as the physicians understood the nature of the physical epidemics which ravaged the post-war world as a result of the lowered physical vitality, the malnutrition and the filth brought about by the war. He saw in the revived ind violent anti-Semitism of our day but another evidence of the general spiritual breakdown of the world. the world.

"And from the eminence of his exalted office, he spoke out against this mad less and danger.

"One does not need to agree with this great man in all things. On some issues men of good will have sharply ciffered with him. But no one can doubt that, in a world of nigh universal strife, this man stood out for peace; in a world of in-tolerance he preached tolerance; in a world of hate and suspicion, he taught men the healing of charity and compassion, and in a world where classes were reaching out for mastery through force, he ad-monished them to seek the common good through co-operation and justice."

In viewing the spiritual, as well as the physical, breakdown of mankind which has continued since the World War and the loss of condence in the past few years in our own invincibility. Rabbi Silver declared that certain facts have become clear — that no democratic country can be immune from anti-democratic activity and prepaganda; that any democracy, including our own, can collapse and that we have certain advantages to help us retain our democracy.

Nothing has been discovered so far to counteract the spread of propagands, he stated, but there will be. Democracy must be militant and positive and for every rally held by enemies of the United States, there ought to be a dozen railies held to champion liberty, tolerance and our other ideals, he suggested. Mere propaganda is not enough to succeed in vertinowing democracy, if it has not conditions to feed upon, misery and unhappiness. We must reconstruct our economic life, keep the relationships between capital and labor on a sane basis—then there will be no reason why our democracy cannot be Rept.

Rabbi Silver cited a number of advantages, or strengths, which help us retain our democracy in the more set of the earth we can live our own lives peacefully and displiy of life. Here the help is a statistical tiem.

SILVER WARNS OF CHEAP DEMOCRACY

Tells Deans to Avoid 'Un-

bridled Emotionalism

The school and the instructor have important jobs ahead in fostering democratic beliefs in the younger generation, but democracy ought not be cheapened in the eyes of the youth with unbridled emotionalism, 500 banqueting members of the National Association of Deans of Women and the National Association of Principals of Schools for Girls were told by Rabbi A. H. Silver of the Temple last night.

Democracy has every chance to succeed in the United States, the rabbi said, if sensible precautions are taken and if school and college students are given an appreciation of its purpose, technique, privileges and responsibilities.

Rabbi Silver was the principal speaker at the annual banquet of the two associations in Hotel Statler. The affair is one of the events of the convention being held here this week by affiliates of the Amer-ican Council of Guidance and Personnel Associations.

Points to Dangers

The dangers of authoritarian ropaganda were stressed.

"Our country is not immune from anti-democratic propaganda. Democracies cannot, by their nature, curb or prohibit that propaganda," he asserted.

Poisonous propaganda has taken the place of illiteracy as the greatest foe of the educator, the rabbi asserted. Commenting on the Madison Square bund rally, he remarked: "We must stand by and see what we saw last Monday—20,000 aliens, alien in spirit or actually so, as-semble and form a miniature Third Reich, ridiculing our public offi-

He urged that courses of instruction in the detection of spurious propaganda be introduced in all high schools and colleges.

Suggests Attitudes

"By example in the class room by proper attitudes on the part of the teacher, definite democratic attitudes can be suggested to our young people," Rabbi Silver said.

"These include respect for the in-dividual as an individual, freedom from all forms of religious and ra-cial bigotry, tolerance for diversity, the right of decent and independent judgment, and a sense of proportion, generosity and sportsmanship, which are at the heart of the demo-eratic tradition."

"A wild and violent romanticism" for democracy, however, ought to be avoided, the group was told.

Warns Apparatus of Educat tion Is Not Enough

Knowledge does not necessarily

spell happiness or goodness, Rabbi A. H. Silver of the Temple said last night in Hotel Statler at the annual banquet of the Department of Elementary School Principals, which is allied with the National Education Association.

Pointing out that Germay did not lack colleges, universities, schools teachers or professors, the rabbi said that in the Nazi academic world "you have a whole complex of superstitions and dogmas taught and underwritten by those very institutions ostensibly created to emancipate the human mind."

Rabbi Silver, who asserted that the individual in the modern world has become "a statistical item," appealed to the educators for a return to the classic humanistic tradition of education," which set as its highest goal the integration of the individual around the great harmonies of human life."

Crisis Is Spiritual

Observing that the present crisis in world affairs was not economic or political, but spiritual, Rabbi Silver said the much-needed goals of human life included a sense of aspiration, exaltation or sanctification of the worth of the individual, and "an overarching moral law which is binding upon all classes."

"The trouble with our day is that these goals have been lost sight of," he added. "Because we no longer have a goal of human aspiration we have a world which knows little of compassion, pity and sympathy. Because of the lack of a sense of human exaltation, we have a world in which the worth of the individual is steadily dwindling."

FAITH IN GOD HELD VITAL TO VICTORY

Rabbi Silver, in Purim Talk,

Recalls Haman's Fate

Victory in the crisis of our times will rest with the side which keeps faith in God and loyalty to the things of God, said Rabbi A. H. Silver of the Temple, who spoke on "The Triumph of the Wicked Is Short" at the Temple's observance of the festival of Purim yesterday morning.

"Purim underscores the ancient wisdom contained in the verse, The triumph of the wicked is but short, and the mirth of the ungodly is but for a moment'," said Dr. Silver. "The defeat of the enemy of Israel in ancient Persia brings a message of hope to our pe Jewish communities today. Haman decreed doom for Israel, and even fixed a day for their total destruction. But it was Haman- who was destroyed and not Israel.

"The early Christians in the Roman Empire were branded as disloyal enemies of the state, and atheists. They were charged with incendiarism, with cannibalism and incest. The church fathers had to defend Christians against the oftrepeated charges that all the dis-asters which overtook the Roman Empire were due to Christians, and, in later times, because the Romans had ceased to worship their own gods and had turned to the worship of the oriental god of the Christians. A Letter To The Editor

In a recent address Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, Cleveland, said in

"Across the face of the earth hundreds of thousands of people are wandering tonight in quest of new homes. They wander by land and by sea, along the highways and the lonely byways of the world. They wander either in groups, whole communities uprooted and driven before the storm or alone, single human beings torn from home and dear onesthe sad flotsam of scattered hum an families. They wander to known and to unknown destinations. Few doors are open to them. Few lands will welcome them. Sometimes they find themselves bogged down in misery and desolation in some no-man's land, or adrift mid-stream between two hostile river-banks-doomed human derelicts. At times their tragic Odyssey tosses them about for long weeks and months from one forbidding shore to another, before they are allowed anchorage in some quiet harbor. Some of these wanderers carry with them the meager possessions left to them after the plunder and spoliation of thieving governments. Others are utterly impoverished, emptyhanded, with nothing to show for a life-time of honest work and industry. Some of them bear the marks of physical torture, of months and years spent in concentration camps, the victims of an inordinate brutality and vindictiveness. Others show the ravages of mental anguish, the sorrows of broken lives, of ruined careers, the deep, unutterable pain of humiliation. Many of them had held proud and honored positions in their former homes. Some had even achieved rare distinction in their chosen fields. All honest worth. They had served their countries well in peace and in war. None had been guilty of any crime. Yet they are wandering tonight along the hard roads of exile. They are knocking at the gates of an alien world. They are young and old. They are Jews

and Christians. They are Catho-

lics and Protestants. They are the

casualties of our world's great

political and economic sins. They

are the symbol of our age's degra-

dation. They are the Refugees of

1939.

"In a normal world, such innocent and helpless refugees would have been the first charge upon the solicitude and generosity of men and nations. There would have been a quick and ready response to their elementary human needs for refuge, shelter and help. In the past such needs and their answering response have occurred more than once in our Western world. Whenever political or religious persecution forced a minority group into exile, somewhere in the world there was a welcoming land to give them haven and the chance to begin life anew. Our own country was built and made great by refugees, exiles, pilgrims and immigrants from all parts of the earth who were harddriven by economic want or political oppression or religious intolerance and found sanctuary here.

"But ours is not a normal world, It is a tragically abnormal world. All the primal sanities, all the elementary decencies of civilized life seem to have been lost. A quarter of a century of mass killings, of wars, revolutions, invasions, civil strife and bitter class struggle, has brutalized our world and rendered it callous and inwhich followed it, there have arisen the dread ghosts of hatred, of national and racial passions, of arrogance and vindictiveness, and of dread stampede towards force, violence and terror as the sole technique of human life and progress. A paganism far more crass and cruel than that of antiquity has engulfed our world."

In concluding his half hour speech Rabbi Silver said:

"These refugees are now the wards of all those who still believe in God and in God's law of justice and love, who still know, compassion and pity, who see in the suffering and privations of these wanderers the common tragedy of the whole of mankind today. There is no security or peace

for any one of us, or for any group, or any nation today, ex-

cept in the passionate communion of all free peoples, in the pooled good will of all men, in the aroused moral conscience and the awakened sense of responsibility of all.

"We who are at peace must know no peace until all these exiles 'of the wandering foot and weary breast, shall have found peace."

Everytime we react normally to a cry of distress we by so much preserve our own mental and spiritual integrity and help to preserve what sanity is left in this distracted world. Failure to make some gesture of relief to the anguish of the persecuted and exiled is cause for concern, lest one grow callous and endanger one's own spiritual health.

Listening to the Message of Israel every Sunday evening at 7 o'clock (WCKY, 1490) one hears the same prayers, the same readings from the Old Testament, singing of the same psalms one hears in our churches. The services always close with the familiar benediction pronounced by sentences first in Hebrew then in English. The Lord bless thee, and keep thee, the Lord make his face to shine upon thee, and be gracious unto thee. The Lord lift up his countenance upon thee and give thee peace." Read Numbers VI . 22-27.

Do we pause to reflect that there lies on the pulpit of every church in Christendom a book which is read as an act of worship and for spiritual guidance and consolation, every word of which was written by a Jew? Do we reflect that from the Jews came concepts of the Divine mind. the will of God, that have never been equalled by any other race ancient or modern? With his genius for religion, do we wish to exterminate the Jew or to stand passively by while cruel, vindictive governments seek to exterminate him because of his race? "Do not go into this great drive as if it were only just another campaign," Warburg, speaking at a dinner meeting at Hotel Statler, said. "If we can only channelize the emotions stirred in us by the sufferings of refugees and transform them into the one way we can help-by gifts and sacrifice-we will win."

Cleveland's Jewish community, Warburg continued, enjoyed a national reputation as "an extraordi-nary organization" in helping to solve the problems created by central European persecutions.

"From the standpoint of citizens in a democracy, we have the duty of knowing where we stand," he said. "In this drive you have the opportunity at last, after months of frustration, to do something active for that spirit of democracy.'

Emigration or Cremation

For the Jewish community In Germany, Warburg said, there is the alternative of "emigration or cremation."

"There is no longer a question of passports, relatives, or the possibility of getting jobs in another country," he said. "The first step is out."

In Switzerland, in a Jewish community of 18,000, of whom 2,500 are enrolled taxpayers, according to Warburg, thousands of German refugees are being cared for and \$300,000 has been raised for their

support.
"Four hundred refugees a week illegally cross the borders into Belgium, where the Jewish community supports them until they can go-elsewhere, and \$40,000 a month is needed to supplement that support." he continued. "We have been asked simply if we in America can supply that amount. If we cannot, the leaders of Belgium's Jewish com-munity will have to go to the government and ask that government to stop the entry of any more of these desparate people.

"Toward the close of the eight-eenth century Edmund Burke, one of the greatest political thinkers of his day and one who best understood the temper of the American colonists and the promise of life in the New World, declared:

"'Young man, there is Americawhich at this day serves for little more than to amuse you with stories of savage men and uncouth manners; yet shall, before you taste of death, show itself equal to the whole of that commerce which now attracts the envy of the world.'

Prophecy Comes True

"Edmund Burke's prophecy came true. Not even his rich imagination could have foreseen the miraculous development of the Ameri-

can continent from his day to this. "What the American people need at this time is another Edmund Burke who will arouse their confidence in themselves again and assure them that their future will be even greater than their past. If we have not assured prosperity today, it is not due to the capacity of our re-sources, the niggardliness of our soil, the lack of technological skill or the instruments of production, but to our own colossal blundering and mistakes as well as to the economic upheaval in other parts of the world. A more intelligent organization of our economic life which will insure an equitable distribution of the wealth which is or can be produced in this countrywhich is more than a country but a continent—is not beyond the capac-ity of the American people to bring about.

"American democracy is not something static, something finished. It is not enough to fight subversive, alien, anti-democratic influences in the world by defending the status quo in our democracy. Democracy, to succeed in a challenging world, must be more dynamic, more aggressive, more confident than the dictatorships of the Old World. Democracy without economic prog-Economic progress can be achieved
—and this is the peculiar contribution which America can make to

Silver Urges Jews Counter-Attack

WASHINGTON, June 14—(AP)-American rabbis heard one of their number call upon the Jew today to defend himself by an audacious counter-attack."

Dr. A. H. Silver of Cleveland, addressing the Central Conference of American Rabbis, said: "The Jews have been singled out for destruc-

"It is not enough to defend the status quo against reaction," he said. Reaction must be defeated by destroying those evils in our present system which made it possible."

He proposed an attack upon "poverty upon the economic inse-curity of the masses, upon corrup-tion and special privilege, upon the excessive concentration of wealth; upon chauvinism, national exhibitionism and patrioteering, upon race arrogance and race domination-in a word, upon all that our religion and all the great religions of man-kind have branded and outlawed."

Hail Successful

Successful completion of the Jewish Welfare Fund Campaign, with \$785,000 pledged, was reported today by Rabbis A. H. Silver and Barnett R Brickner, co-chairmen.

"It is a staggering sum of money for a community the size of ours which hasn't excessive amounts of money at the top," Rabbi Silver said. "The money has been raised by 20,000 givers."

The campaign lasted 10 days. Approximately \$50,000 was raised from among 1,200 persons attending the campaign windup banquet at Hotel Statler last night. The total amount was nearly \$500,000 more than was pledged last year.

The money will be used for social

services supported by the Jewish Welfare Fund and for the assistance Jewish refugees.

1,200 Attend Victory Dinner

The ten-day emergency campaign of the Jewish Welfare Fund of Cleveland ended successfully last night with a dinner in Hotel Statler ball room attended by a capacity crowd of 1,200.

Rabbi A. H. Silver, co-chairman, with Rabbi Barnett R. Brickner, of the campaign, announced that the approximately \$50,000 pledged by those attending the dinner had brought the total realized in the campaign to \$785,000.

"What you have done these last few days is greatly to the credit of the Cleveland Jewish community," Rabbi Silver said. "It's a staggering sum of money for a community the size of ours which hasn't excessive amounts of money at the top. The money had to be raised from 20,000

"Historic Moment"

"It is nearly half a million dollars more than was raised last year, which was a top year in our community. We have registered an historic moment in our community."

"The success of the campaign is further evidence that the Jewish people will not accept defeat," Rabbi Brickner said.

"This community has given sacri-ficially," he added. "It has given in a way that is unprecedented. If there is no jubilation that we have raised such a sum of money it is because it has to be raised for such a purpose."

The campaign combined with the usual annual pledges for social services supported by the Jewish Welfare Fund a special request for funds to aid Jewish refugees in European countries.

ZIONIST CONGRESS OF ENING TONIGHT TO PONDER TACTICS IN FIGHT AGAINST BRITISH POLICY

GENEVA, Aug 15 (JTA) More than 550 delegates from all parts of the world meet in the Municipal Theater tomorrow evening in the first session of the 21st biennial World Zionist Congress, which will formulate a program of action against Britain's new Palestine policy

The Congress opens three weeks before the sessions of the League of Nations Council and Assembly at which final action will be taken on the Mandatory Power's plan to establish an independent Palestine state with the Jews relegated to the position of a one third minority, their immigration halted after entry of 75,000 within five years

Condemning the new policy as a breach of faith, a violation of the mandate and the Balfour Declaration, and a surrender to Arab terrorism, the Congress will give its chief attention to discussing tactics to be used in a campaign to seek rejection of the White Paper by the League at its September session and a further program of resistance in the event the League approves the British policy

The preliminary conferences of the various Zionist factions represented at the Congress produced a division of opinion on the methods to be used in the fight against the White Paper. Some of the Zionists, especially the M. zrachi, are determined to introduce in Falestine, a policy of passive resistance similar to that employed by Gandhi in India Many Zionists believe that this program which carefully excludes everything that could lead to terrorism, would bring Jewish resistance to a point where it would not only render the White Paper ineffective but may even force Colonial Secre tary Malcolm MacDonald to resign

Opposing this program, however, are other groups in the Zionist movement which believe in a more moderate form of resistance. They argue that the international situa tion is such that Britain could hardly maintain an "anti Jewish" policy for any length of time in Palestine, which is an important strategic point on the Mediterranean. Hence, it is argued it will not take long for the British Cabinet to realize that it must rectify the mistake represented by the White Paper and regain the friendship of the lews

as trusted elements able faithfully to guard the Palestine coastline from sabotage. It is held that Britain could not depend on the Arabs in the event of international complications.

This moderate viewpoint, which is based on the idea of marking time, is compared by its advocates to that of the Czechs in the German "protectorate." Just as the situation which has been forced upon the Czechs is not accepted by the Czech people, so the situation which Britain is forcing upon the Jews would remain "unaccepted" by the Jewish people until the opportunity arose to change it.

Leading members of the American delegation to the Congress served notice that they were opposed to non cooperation or passive resistance as a method of combating Britain's policy although they were prepared to fight it by other means. Spokesmen for the delegation were Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland and Abraham Coldberg of New York.

Addressing a session of the General Zionist Confederation last night, Dr. Silver advised the Zionist world to wait for a more favorable turn in the international situation to aid the fight on the British policy, which, he said, was the result of the general international situation. "We cannot accept the White Paper," Dr. Silver said, "but nevertheless we must continue to cooperate with the Mandatory Government in order to avert chaos in Palestine and demoralization of our work with the Palestine Jewish Community. Passive resistance will hurt none so much as ourselves. We must work in Palestine both with the British Government and the Arabs, or with one or the other. Alone we face disaster."

American Zionist Leaders Condemn Extremist Action: Speeches At Conference Of General Zionists, JTA News Bulletin

The American delegation to the Zionist Congress made it known through Rabbi Abba Hillel Balver and Mr. Abe Goldberg that, while condemning the White Paper and ready to fight it in every way possible, the delegation is against the policy of non-co-operation, or passive resistance, as advocated by the Mizrachi and other groups. The two American Zionist leaders announced their policy of moderation at the conference of General Zionists Group A, held here under the chairmanship of the Rev. J.K. Goldbloom, of London.

Professor Selig Brodetsky, head of the Political Department of the Jewish Agency Executive in London, who was

one of the principal speakers at the meeting last night, declared that the White Paper must be fought first by increased Zionist propaganda in England; secondly, by increased Zionist activities at Geneva; thirdly, by contacting Governments interested in the cancellation of the White Paper policy restricting Jewish immigration into Palestine.

Mr, Isaac Gruenbaum, member of the Jewish Agency Executive, also demanded more vigorous political steps against the

White Paper.

Rabbi Silver made it clear that he was very much against illegal immigration, which, he asserted, brought into Palestine only aged people, and women and children and other elements who were not an asset to the Yishub. The Zionist Movement, he suggested, should wait for a better international opportunity for fighting the White Paper policy, because the recommendations of the White Paper were the result of the general international situation. "It is clear," he said, "that we cannot accept the White Paper. Its proposals are contrary to law and unjustifiable on moral grounds. We must, nevertheless, continue our co-operation with the Mandatory Government in order to avert chaos in Palestine. We cannot fight the British Government with violence, even if we wished to. And we do not wish to, unless driven to desperation.

"The English people," he went on, "are not with their Government in this blind act of betrayal. Passive resistance will hurt no one as much as ourselves. We cannot afford it in these early stages of our economic development in the country, We must work in Palestine both with the British Government and with the Arabs, or with one or the other. Alone we face dis-

For the present, he urged, they must continue their work under the brutal regime imposed upon them by a Government which would not continue in office indefinitely. Denouncing the British Government's comments on the report of the League of Nations Mandate Commission as "a confession of intellectual dishonesty," Dr. Silver asserted that the report itself was a complete vindication of the Jewish case before the world. He predicted that when the report comes before the League Council next month the British Government will not dare ask endorsement of its White Paper proposal.

Expects British to Act

"I make bold to say," Dr. Silver declared, "that the British will not long tolerate that their government shall remain branded with the brand of betraval."

He added that he was persuaded that new proposals regarding Palestine were certain to emerge before

"That being so," Dr. Silver said, "I am constrained to propose to the delegates to this congress that they do nothing which might bring the Jewish people into conflict with the mandatory government. We are not yet confronted with finality."

Dr. Silver said he drew one valid conclusion from the White Paper— it was a temporary document, far more temporary than many other

White Papers now gathering dus in the files of the British Colonial Office. And he insisted that the Jews of Palestine must not sully themselves with violence or semirebellion.

Ignoring cries of disapproval and shouts of "What do you propose?" that came from various parts of the congress hall, he continued:

"One act leads to another; an act of violence leads to an act of reprisal."

Calls for a War Chest

Dr. Silver told the conference that he was not a pacifist and that he was not obsessed with any "ap-peasement" idea, but held that some day the Jews might have to pass to an attitude of resistance. He said it was a task of wise leadership to prepare for that day and store up a war chest.

"I am not unmindful of the plight of our poor refugees who are trying to get into Palestine," he went on, "but I am worried about the possibility of our making a colossal blunder at a time when circum-

There were more interruptions from the floor at this stage, and after a rapid-fire exchange of questions and answers, Dr. Silver finally announced that at the proper time in the political committee's sessions he would expose the situation of illegal immigration into Palestine.

CONGRESS URGED TO AID 93 000 REICH JEWS GAIN PALESTINE ENTRY; SILVER HITS NON-COOPERATION

GENEVA. Aug. 20 (JTA) German Jewry addressed an appeal to the World Zionist Congress today to make possible entry of 93 000 specially trained Reich Jews to Palestine. The appeal read by the leader of the German delegation to the Congress was apparently prepared in Berlin with the knowledge of the Nazi authorities. It emphasized that German Jewry in its distress did not want philanthropy but expected "national assistance" so that the doors of Palestine might be opened to them.

"We address this appeal to the Congress" the German Zionist said "in the hope that its voice will reach the ears of that power in whose hands rest not only the fate of Palestine but also our fate"

A dynamic address was delivered during the general debate last night by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland who inveighed against illegal immigration to Palestine and non cooperation with the British Government. The speech made a tremendous impression and is considered the most powerful yet delivered at the Congress. It was noted however that the Laborite faction which constitutes 45 per cent of the Congress, conspicuously abstained from applauding

Dr. Silver prophesied that new proposals on Palestine would be forthcoming before the September session of the League of Nations Council. With the Mandates Commission's report in the possession of the entire world be said "it is inconceivable that Britain will go to the League and ask for final approval of the White Paper."

Declaring that Dr Chaim Weizmann Zionist president may have erred in the past in being too yielding and trusting toward Britain Rabbi Silver asserted that the White Paper was unrelated to these shortcomings and to any past interpretations of the mandate by the League and by the British Government.

"It is not Weizmann standing today as a discredited leader but MacDonald(Malcolm MacDonald British Colonial Secretary) who stands branded by the Mandates Commission as a destroyer of covenants, a violator of pledges, accused of acting wilfully and illegally in a matter of life or death to an entire nation," Dr. Silver said.

Describing the British Government's comments on the Mandates Commission report as "culpably disingenuous contorting truth and logic" Dr. Silver declared it was inconceivable that Britain would cling indefinitely to a policy which was not endorsed heartily by the Government party rejected by important sections of British public opinion and almost unanimously by the rest of the world.

Differences of opinion noticeable in this delegation until today especially over Rabbi Silver's address opposing illegal immigration had been practically straightened out so that the 63 delegates of the Zionist Organization of America and Hadassah were functioning as a solid unit.

He warned against any desperate action which would bring the Palestine Jewish community in conflict with the Government. "The hour has not yet come for a final decision " he said. "We are not yet confronted with that finality which might justify unindicated forms of defiance."

Laborites Seen Veering to Extremist View

The Laborite attitude toward Dr. Silver's address is taken to indicate that the extremist views of David Ben Gurion. Palestine labor leader and Zionist Executive chairman with regard to fighting the new British policy are gaining more adherents among the Laborites, many of whom during the first days of the Congress backed the views of Moshe Shertok political secretary of the Jewish Agency who is advocating milder tactics.

Another speaker to come out against the Ben Gurion viewpoint was Prof. Selig Brodetsky. British member of the Zionist Executive, who urged moderation and warned against "harmful slogans." He praised American Jewry for its assistance in fighting the new British policy on Palestine and predicted that America would in the near future play an even more important role in the mobilization of forces for the fight against the White Paper.

On the question of non cooperation Prof. Brodetsky advised the Congress to set up a committee to study the advantages and disadvantages of such a policy toward the British Government. He agreed however that in the matters of immigration and of introducing constitutional reform in Palestine, the Jews had no other course but non-cooperation.

Declaring he believed the White Paper docmed to failure because it could never be carried out in a country where the Jews constituted 99 per cent of the economic forces Prof. Brodetsky advised that instead of extreme measures the White Paper should be combated by economic strengthening of the Palestine Jewish Community. He also advocated a concentrated campaign to widen the ranks of Britons who are opposed to the White Paper as a breach of faith

The American Laborite delegation announced it would support the Ben Gurion plan for resistance to the White Paper

3 Tendencies Revealed at Laborite Parley

While religious delegates attended Sabbath services in the Old Synagogue. laborites conferred all day yesterday debating Friday's address by Ben Gurion which urged what may be considered as extreme action to combat the British policy. The debate revealed three tendencies among the laborites: (1) those sharing Ben Gurion's views. (2) a group led by Shertok which favored a milder course and (3) those led by Eliezer Kaplan who supported the moderate views expressed by Ur. Weizmann.

Dr. Solomon Goldman president of the Zionist Organization of America, speaking at the Friday plenary session, denounced violence in Palestine as contrary to Jewish religion and ethics. He made a strong plea for abandonment of party strife in Palestine and urged broadening of the Zionist Executive to make it more representative of all elements in the Zionist movement. U. S. Group Favors Illegal Entry

GENEVA Aug. 20. (JTA) — An overwhelming majority of the American delegation to the Zionist Congress is in sympathy with leaders advocating illegal immigration to Palestine as a method of fighting the White Paper it became clear today during a four-hour discussion at a meeting of the group. The discussion was the result of Pabbi Abba Hillel Silver's address during the general debate last night in which he passionately condemned illegal immigration as a menace to the Palestine Jewish Community.

Dr. Silver's talk today drew a bitter attack from Berl Katznelson editor of the Palestine Laborite newspaper Davar in which he charged the Americans were praching defeatism and warned the delegation to dissociate itself from Dr. Silver's statement.

Katznelson called upon Zionists to combat the White Paper with all methods short of terror. Condemning terrorism he declared that those Jewish elements in Falestine who were advocating it were actually "following in the footsteps of the Mufti." The editor declared he was satisfied with the Mandate Commission report on the White Paper but warned against optimism on the League Council's decision which is scheduled to be made early next month. He attacked the British Government for substituting for the Balfour Delaration the "anti-Balfour White Paper" and cautioned the Congress against underestimating the danger of the situation. He was given a great evation when he concluded.

The Congress reaction to Katznelson's speech made it clear for the first time today that whatever the decision on the question of general non cooperation with the British Government may be the majority will favor illegal immigration even if the Congress should not adopt any resolution to that effect

Like the Congress itself the American delegation will hardly go openly on record as favoring illegal immigration. A committee has been appointed however to convey to the Congress the fact that not everybody in the delegation agreed with Dr Silver's condemnation of illegal entry.

Keren Hayesod directors meanwhile received a check for L 133 000 sterling from the British Czech Refugees Fund to be distributed among Jewish refugees from Czechoslovakia already in Palestine. Trustees of the fund informed the Hayesod directorate that an additional L 290 000 will be transmitted as soon as more refugees from Czechosl vakia leave for Palestine within the next three weeks. They stated that the Gestapo at Prague has agreed to permit Jews to leave the country without difficulties as soon as they obtain Palestine certificates.

Voiding of 10,000 Palestine Ballots and Cancellation of Mandates Bar Debate

GENEVA SESSION STORMY

Labor Leader Strikes Out at Americans' Counsel Not to Resort to Violent Action

GENEVA, Aug. 20.—General de-bate in the twenty-first World Zionist Congress had to be suspended today after an announcement at the morning's meeting of a deution by the court of the congress to reduce the number of mandates allotted to the Palestine delegations from 133 to 127.

to 127.

According to Zionist rules, any purchaser of a "shekel," or token, which sells for about 25 cents, has the right to tope for delegates to the congress, provided the purchaser has been properly registered. But

the central election committee of the congress is said to have discovered that in the recent elections large blocks of shekels were pur-chased in Palestine and votes cast without regard to registration requirements.

For this reason the court decided to cancel 10,000 votes of the 167,000 cast in Palestine and the annual four mandates previously allotted to the labor wing of the Mizrachi, the Orthodox party; two mandates alletted to to the labor wing of Group B of the General Zionists and one mandate allotted to Group B of the General Zionists proper.

But at the same time the court decreed that, regretful and inadmissible as had been the Mizrachi party's action in proclaiming non-participation in the recent elections, it had nevertheless played an important role in preparing for them and in disposing of shekels; consequently the court awarded two additional mandates to the Mizrachi.

For other reasons the court deducted two mandates from the total previously allotted the Palestine Workers party and added one to the total allotted Group A of the General Zionists.

Announcement of these changes aroused a storm of protest in the congress and for more than an hour held up the general debate. Rabbi Meyer Berlin of Jerusalem, head of the Mizrachi organization, which has been opposing Dr. Chaim Weizmann and other present Zionist leaders, declared the Mizrachi did not want the addi-tional mandates allotted it and

charged that the cancellation of he four others had been a result of political manoeuvring.

Makes Reply to Americans

After heated exchanges between delegates of the rival factions it was finally agreed that the next speaker on the list, Berl Katznelson of the Palestine Labor party, should be heard, after which the delegates would proceed to exchange views on the subject of the mandates. mandates.

Mr Katznelson's speech largely a reply to those of Dr. Solo-mon Goldman of Chicago and Dr. Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, both of whom continued, at earlier sessions, against resort to force in Palestine. Silver, Back From Abroad, Declares Fate Of European Jew Rests With War Allies

BY W. W. CUNNINGHAM

Fate of the Jews in Central Europe depends on the success of allied arms against Hitler, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver asserted today on his return from Europe.

"Hitler's persecution of the Jews has continued uninterrupted even though other events in Europe leading to the present war have distracted attention from it," Rabbi Silver said.

"Now that war has cut them off from the Jews of other nations, the Jews of Germany, Austria and Czecho-Slovakia will suffer more than ever. Their lot will be more tragic than it has been for the last six years under Hitler.

Hopes for Hitler Defeat

"There is only the hope that this war will mean the smashing of that madman's regime with a better period of peace and freedom following it."

Rabbi Silver returned to his home at the foot of E. 105th Street in Bratenahl today after a summer abroad with his wife and two sons, Daniel, 11, and Raphael, 9.

They made the passage from Europe on the crowded United States liner President Roosevelt and heard the declarations of war by France and Great Britain while in mid-

Liner Crowded

"Passengers slept in corridors, on stairways and on the decks and the ship carried twice its ordinary passenger list," Rabbi Silver ex-plained. "Most of the passengers

will continue regardless of the will of governments or Congress ses, it is far better that it should be properly conducted and controlled than it should spill over in disorder and chaos, causing further trouble for Britain and more confusion for the Jewish National Home.

"The sentiment of those aboard was highly anti-Hitler, everybody hoping that he would be beaten, but equally fervent in the hope that the United States would be able to stay out of the war."

Resigned to Inevitable

In both France and England, Rabbi Silver said, the attitude toward the war was that it was inevitable long before actual hostilities began.

"There was stolid resignation to doing something they did not want to do, but with the feeling that Hitler must be eliminated if their own security was to be preserved," he

There was no martial spirit, no parading. It was a streamlined, mechanized preparation for war that we witnessed. Paris was deserted. You came down to dinner in your hotel one day and learned that half the waiters had been called to arms. The next day you went out on the streets and found half the taxicabs had been com-

mandeered by the army."

While in Europe Rabbi Silver, as national chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, addressed the World Zionist Congress in Genevaand appealed for peace in Palestine and lessening of friction between Jews there and the British government during the European war.

Prayers for Peace

Jewish rabbis of Greater Cleveland preached on the European war and its relationship to the Jewish people before capacity congregations in temples and synagogs last night, as Rosh Hashana, the new year, was greeted by thousands of worshipers

The aching tragedies brought by the last year to Jewish communities all over the world was the burden of the new year's messages of the rabbis to their people, but with the tragic story was intermingled a note of hope that the era of darkness was coming to an end and an era of light was dawning.

Following are excerpts from ser-

RABBI A. H. SILVER, the Temple-"For our people, the past year was a frightful one, the area of persecution widening as the Nazi orbit was extended. The number of our helpless refugees, broken and impoverished, scattered to the four corners of the earth seeking new homes, mounted tragically.

"Too Much of a Madhouse"

"That year, and the brutal years which preceded it, now shrivel up in a world conflagration. It could not have been otherwise. The world had become too much of a madhouse. So much evil and madness could not endure any longer. The sins of our generation cried to heaven.

"No one knows what will come out of this war. No one dares to prophesy. We can only hope and pray that the suffering which awaits the nations of Europe will teach them, and us, repentance, that they will return again, after their dread chastisement, to that vision which they repudiated after the first World War-the vision of an international order based upon law and morality.

"We can only hope that this war will mark the end of Naziism and of that whole complex of aberations-force, militarism, aggression, intolerance, racism—for which it stands. The second World War will also prove vain and futile unless as a result of it the rights of peoples and minorities are firmly established and freedom and de-mocracy fully vindicated." Nations Urged

Kol Nidre services, opening the observance of Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, last night drew thousands of Cleveland's Jews to their temples and synagogs, where they met for prayer meditation, penitence and confess

RABBI A. H. SILVER, The Temple-"Our religion has throughout the ages sought to teach mankind in all things pleasure, sanity and proportion. The great tragedy of our age is that it has lost its bal-

"If there is anything that can save our world it is a return to religion, because only religion can restore to men the perspective which they have lost. Religion alone seeks to guide men by the persuasive force of charity and good will to better things. And religion alone can give mankind the moral sanity which is necesary to progress.

Says All Must Confess

"Mankind perhaps will have to to along the broken path of blooddrenched battle fields and over the bodies of millions slain for a long time before it returns, but return it must, humbly and penitently, to the threshold of God, confessing we have sinned, we have transgressed and we have done perversely." Oproep van Dr. A. Hillel Silver.

A grim picture of events that might follow failure of Britain and France in the war was painted by Rabbi A. H. Silver of Cleveland. He warned against the invasion of the country's shores, not by armed forces, but by the totalitarian doctrines if the European democracies

Cries of "bravo" were sounded as he called for guardia ship of the American "government which considers the individual more im-portant than the state."

Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver (General Zionists A.) said that, although Dr. Weizmann was criticised, he was not NEW blamed entirely by the delegates for the present impasse. Not only the Jews, but all humanity was suffering JUDAGA though the Jews had to drink the cup of bitterness to the very dregs. Dr. Weizmann might have been too yielding and trusting, but that was not the cause of the 1934 White Paper. Dr. Weizmann did not stand before them as a discredited leader, but was nearer to them to-day in the seeming hour of defeat than at any time in the past. Mr. MacDonald stood branded by the Mandates W.2.
Commission as a breaker of covenants. The judgment of the Mandates Commission was a vindication of the position maintained by their leaders. They had not yet come to a final hour of decision, and therefore nothing should be done to bring them into conflict with the Mandatory Power. They should not yield to emotion or passion. The White Paper was a temporary document only; while they should oppose it with all energy, there were good prospects of its being nullified, and therefore no extremist measures should be adopted. Whatever anti-Government acts were undertaken would be counteracted by the Government. It was dangerous to act as though they were the State, when they were not: they would be exposed to disaster. But in their desperation they should not put weapons into the hands of their enemies. They should not make a strategic blunder. They could not give their youth any greater vision than that which they had always had in the past. He approved of the programme announced by Dr. Weizmann-resistance to the White Paper, and until the White Paper was overthrown they should work to secure as much immigration as possible. He concluded by appealing for greater unity in the Yishuv, for that would be a stimulus to the Galuth.

Rabbi Silver Tellsg-27 F Legion: Be on Guard

CHICAGO, Sept. 27—The United States need have no fear of the armies of dictators but must be on guard against the doctrines they represent, Rabbi A. H. Silver, Cleve-lind, told delegates to the 21st anrual American Legion convention

"We must and will keep out of the present war," he said.

He urged legionnaires to "help keep America clean, free, just, tol-erant and united." pointed out that there can be an honest difference of opinion on the manner of keeping out of war.

"America is in no danger of at-tack or invasion," he concluded. "But we must be constantly on guard against aliens in our midst interested in undermining our American ideals and institutions."

Warns of Possible Defeat. In delivering greetings to the con-

vention Rabbi A. H. Silver of Cleveland declared that though America is determined to stay out of war, she should consider that a defeat of England and France would have a grave effect upon this country.

"If political barbarism triumps in this war and France and England fall prey to dictatorships, it will be not its armies but its doctrines that will invade this country," said Rabbi Silver. "Those subversive groups in this country that have troubled us not a little i nyears past will multiply a thousand fold and will become a real threat to neutrality.

"It is doubtful that in a world where the last beacons of freedom will have been extinguished that our own torch of freedom can remain burning."

HRabbi Pleads Cause of Allies.

Rabbi A. H. Stiver, of Cleveland, spoke of France and England as "last outposts of democracies." assailed the belief that America stands to lose nothing should the "forces of barbarism" win.

"It is not the armies of this po-litical barbarism that America has to fear," said Rabbi Stiver. "Their vicious doctrines may invade our shores. In the event of victory of the dictators in Europe, the subversive influences which the American Legion combats may increase a thousandfold. We will keep our torch of fredom aloft. The American people will not accept a ready-made millennium delivered on the spear point of dictatorship."

Hi, Ho, Silver! **Once Again**

(From a Staff Correspondent)

CLEVELAND-There's been a lot of talk in these parts of late to the effect that the present international war is, in fact, not a struggle between Democracy and Fascism so much as it is a war undertaken by the socalled Allies to save the Jews of Central Europe from persecution.

Many outstanding Americans, both Jew and Gentile, have undertaken to disprove this theory. It seemed strange, therefore, that a prominent Jewish leader, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, should support it last week in sermon in the Cleveland Temple.

Commenting on Adolf Hitler's vague proposals for a European conference to bring about peace, Rabbi Silver said: "If there is to be such a conference it should be stipulated in advance that . . . the rights of the

Jewish minorities shall be given first consideration."

In other words, Rabbi Silver believes that, unless the Jewish question can be solved, the war must go on-even though this might mean the slaughter of thousands and millions of Christians.

It is amazing that in this case Rabbi Silver should have adopted exactly the same viewpoint as Adolf Hitler -namely, that the Jewish problem is the mainspring of the entire war. Hitler claims World Jewry is blocking all his efforts for peace. Silver says peace cannot be achieved without recognizing the rights of World

That a man like Rabbi Silver, who wants the Jews to win the war, should come out flagrantly for repeal of the arms embargo and for aid to Britain and France was a foregone conclusion:

"The present (embargo) law unjustly deprives Great Britain of an advantage which she has built up over decades and generations," he declared, to the great delectation of his Jewish flock.

Rabbi Silver then concluded his interventionist appeal with the stockin-trade tirade against Father Coughlin, whom he described as the "Holy Ghost Fascist," and with attacks on Col. Lindbergh and Henry Ford. He contended these men "are not truly interested in peace, but in keeping the embargo law, the repeal of which they consider would be giving an advantage to France and Britain."

"Not all those who cry for peace," the sage concluded, "are really friends of peace."

As Cityzen Silver Foresaw

A More than a year ago, on February 26, 1938, Cityzen Abba Hillel Silver dis-cussed "The Rights of Minorities and the Next War" in a City Club address. As always with Rabbi Silver's speeches, it thrilled his audiences.

Today this address, pre-Munich and pre-war, reads like a startling prophecy. The Temple Bulletin, sensing its timeliness, reprints excerpts, some of which are well worth a place here:

"Europe is heading back toward 1914. The same desperate game of Empire is being played again - in the same area of friction and conflict - and in this game minorities are again being used as pawns. Hitler is leading in this game. Hitler is not interested in the protection of minorities as such. He is interested in using the German minorities in adjacent lands for political and economic penetration, to expand the Reich."

ASCH'S 'NAZARE PRAISED BY SILVER

Rabbi Says Story Is Completely Human

With the growth of intellectual and spiritual tolerance there has come about a perceptible change in the attitude of thoughtful Jews and Christians to each other's faith, Rabbi A. H. Silver said in a lecturesermon devoted to "The Nazarene," by Sholem Asch, at the Temple yesterday morning.

"In place of apologetics and polemics, there has set in an earnest effort to explore the common basis of both faiths," Rabbi Silver said. "Christian scholars are tracing back Christianity to its Jewish origins and are discovering more and more that the Pharisaic Judaism of that day was not a legalistic and particularistic religion from which Jesus came to deliver his people, but a very noble and spiritual faith which Jesus shared in doctrine and practice.

"And, simultaneously, Jewish scholars are studing the New Testament in a dispassionate and scientific manner without bias or prejudice. And the personality of Jesus and His immortal story are intriguing more and more Jewish students and writers.

"The most recent effort by a remarkably gifted Jewish writer to interpret anew the life and teach ings of Jesus has been made by Sholem Asch in his book, 'The Nazarene.' Sholem Asch is altogethe equipped for the task. He has both scholarship and imagination and deep human sympathies. HOPE OF JEWISH PEOPLE RESTS ON

Rabbi Silver Sees Anti-Semitism Then Subsiding; Speaks at Forum in Community Center.

The wave of anti-Semitism that has been sweeping the world will subside with the downfall of the Hitler regime, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, Litt.D., told a forum audience at the Jewish Community Center last night.

Using anti-Semitism as a political weapon, the Nazis have sent agents all over the world to divide the people of the various nations into hostile camps, Dr. Silver pointed out. Pogroms have been instituted against the Jews before, but never have the Jews been used in a program of imperial expansion until now, Dr. Silver said. The present German government is the first government in all history to use anti-Semitism as a political instrument, he declared.

Confident Allies Will Win.

A German victory in the present war would give courage to other peoples of the world who likewise would like to use the Jew to atain political ends, Dr. Silver hought. Expressing confidence in an Allied victory in the pro-war, Dr. Silver said that if Nazi government does fall, whether it is soon or a year or two hence, anti-Semitism will fade throughout the world.

If the beacon lights of democracy are extinguished in England and France, it will not be long before democracy will crumble in the United States, Dr. Silver warned,

The Jewish race has survived through 35 centuries of hate and persecution, Dr. Silver said. There are more Jews in the world today than ever before, he declared.

Even Hitler realizes today that he cannot get rid of the Jew, Dr. Silver thought. Germany had only 500,000 Jews before it acquired its

There can be no democracy if the people do not have confidence that they can make it work, he declared, but the people must take time to discuss and think things out to a sane, lagical and realistic conclusion.

The need for such a fund was emphasized by the principal speaker, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, of Cleveland, national president of the United Palestine Appeal.

"In the last 20 years," he said, "anti-Semitism has been exploited as a political weapon. Never in history hav we seen such a terrifying spectacle as a government of 85,000,-000 persons regarding it as one of its prime functions to preach anti-Semitism an to propagate it throughout the world.

"The German Government doesn't do that because they hate Jews, but because it has discovered it can be used to destroy the national integrity of those peoples whom the German Government wishes to conquer in its march toward imperialism.

Calls Family 'Stronghold of Spiritual Security'

At a time when the world outside is so full of change and confusion, it is more important than ever to look to the home as the one re-maining stronghold of spiritual se-curity, said Rabbi A. H. Silver, in a lecture-sermon on "Parents a lecture-sermon on "Parents— Children," at the Temple yesterday morring. A capacity congregation heard the address. The Jews, throughout their his-

ory have regarded a noble family life as the consummation of all human happiness, and they sought to safeguard the integrity and nobility of the family in every

and nobility of the family in every way. Dr. Silver said.
"During ages of persecution the home was the refuge of the Jewish spirit," Dr. Silver continued.
"The home shut the hard world out and inclosed a sweet world within, in which the Jewish spirit could find shelter, security and refreshment. It was because of the could find shelter, security and re-freshment. It was because of the preservation of culture in family life that the Jews were able to enter the world of the twentieth century not as pariahs and outcasts, but as a race of scholars, scientists, philosophers, artists and pathfind-ers for men.

Duties of Parents

"The duties which parents owe their children are to rear them in the way of righteous living, to set them on a career and the earning of an honest living and help them found a home of their own as early as possible.

"Parents have a positive duty to

give counsel and guidance, but not dictation, in the choice of their children's careers. Due respect must be given to the child's nature and capacities. It is undesirable for a parent to make a blueprint for the child's whole life. And the parent should teach the child that, beyond all profession or vocation, the real career to be desired is that of a well-rounded, complete human being, a good man, or a good woman, living a life rich in fine interests and fine attitudes. The great-est contribution, the most precious legary, that parents can leave their children is that of an inspiring ex-

ample.

"Children, for their part, owe their parents loyalty and the sharing of burdens. Some children think their greatest contribution to the home is to eat three square meals in it and use it as a rendezyous. Such children, who too ofter look upon their parents as in-dividuals who pay bills and are de-pendable packhorses, are chiselers and grafters.

"Loyalty to parents includes re-spect for their freedom and solitude. Parents have lives of their own which should be respected, just as children have individual rights of personality which parents should not invade. And children should attempt to realize the dreams their attempt to realize the dreams their parents have for them, for nothing helps so much as the pride which parents have in children who have realized their hopes and pride which children have in parents who stand for integrity and noble living. "Your children will follow after the pattern you have modeled for them. If you want them to have a

the pattern you have modeled for them. If you want them to have a beautiful home in the future you must first show them the example of one, and a beautiful home is not built out of things but out of spiritual qualities. It is a thing of memory and influence, a copy of "the heavenly Jerusalem above."



Freedom is not a new thing born of the twentieth century, Guedalla said. Each century, he said, is the child of the preceding centuries. The nineteenth century was "a period of the greatest progressive emancipation for all walks of life." Guedalla said this came from th American Revolution in 1776 and the French Revolution in 1789. But before that, he continued, there was Cromwell's revolution in England.

He said that in America the revolution spread liberty "across a con tinent from sea to sea. while Britain spread freedom to more than one continent."

Liberty is a great "continuing process," Guedalla asserted, in which the things that happen to-day are but fragments of the whole arch of history.

"I am not discouraged," he said, "by the momentary efforts to stop the march of freedom. Men are marching toward a freer life everywhere."

NEW YORK, Dec. 12. (JTA) -- Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland last night arged Jews to launch an offensive against injustice and oppression, in emulation of the Maccabees of old. He addressed some 250 persons attending the 13th annual Chanukah dinner of the Metropolitan Conference of Temple Brotherhoods at the Hotel Commodore.

"The struggle of the Maccabees anticipated with amazing fidelity of detail the elemental struggle now raging in the world," Dr. Silver said." .. "Israel was the only dissident, non-conforming people in the whole of antiquity. They refused to accept 'Gleichshaltung.' The Maccabees carried on what we would call today an underground movement. Israel has always had as its adversaries the greatest empires of the period, and Israel has survived. Israel has again been singled out for especial fury by pagan imperialism. We again accept the challenge. The victory in the most recent struggle between the sovereignty of the mind and spirit and the tyranny of political culture reinforced by dictatorship belong today, as in the days of old, to those who are not afraid to belong to a minority, to those who are ready to suffer for those things which alone make life worthy of suffering."

Heart Will Win Out

The last decade has been one of the most disastrous in the annals of the world, but in spite of all of the world, but in spite of all that has happened the human mind and heart have not given up their pursuit of the ideals of justice and kindness, Rabbi A. H. Silver said in a lecture-sermon entitled "The Disastrous Decade, 1930-1940," at the Temple yesterday morning.

Dr. Silver said in part:

"For the world this has been one of the most disastrous decades in its annals. It witnessed the liquidation of the ideals of the self-determination of peoples, the rights of minorities, the outlawry of war,

of minorities, the outlawry of war, collective security and disarmament which were generated by the last World War. It witnessed the col-lapse of the League of Nations, and all efforts at world organization for

"It saw the destruction of demo "It saw the destruction of demo-cratic governments and the defeat of the democratic principle in one country after another, the suppres-sion of hard-won liberties and precious human rights, the enthronment of despotism over vast areas of the earth, and the increas-ing subjection of peoples to force, terrorism and espionage. It saw the steady surrender of the individual to the state, and the state to the

Three Cruel Names

"Three names dominated the life of Europe, and to an extent, the life of the world—Hitler, Mussolini and Stalin-and each is associated with cruelty, deceit, double-dealing, purges, persecutions and aggressions. Each has been a breeder of hate, a destroyer of liberties and a maker of wars.
"Human ideals slumped lamen-

tably during the last decade. Power-ful governments taught men to hold the classic ideals of mankind—lib-erty, freedom, peace, tolerance—in contempt. They were taught to hate men in the name of race. They hate men in the name of race. They were taught to destroy men in the name of class. They were directed to exterminate weaker neighbors in the name of national destiny.

Scourges were set over human thought. Law as a force for justice and civilization eased. Education and civilization were prostituted in the

and civilization ceased. Education and culture were prostituted in the interests of political and economic despotism. The spirit of man was brutally assaulted, and as a result, the foundations of belief and conviction have been dangerously

"For the Jews this decade has been one long agony. One-third of our people were shattered. Millions were not merely persecuted but outlawed, and homeless, stripped and impoverished wanderers filled."

The sum available for Colholics is to be presented to the Pope through Bahob Bernerd J. Shail of Chicago as a memorial to the late Pope Pius XI.

Discussing the recent decision to contribute to funds sponsored by Christian charches for non-Jewish refugee work Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver and Rabbi Jennis B. Wise national chairmen of the United Jewish Appeal, pointed out that the refugee problem was by no means only a Jewish one, but that it included refugees of all faiths. In a letter to Bishop Sheil, Rabbi Silver and Rabbi Wise said that the Jewish people would never forget "the magnificent struggle" that Bishop Sheil made to combat "the ungodly doctrine of racialism which strikes at the very roots of the religious faith of civilized man."

The letter also declared that the

The letter also declared that the Jewish peopls "will always remember his unflagging efforts to vindicate the divine doctrine of the fatherhood o' God and the brotherhood of man, which alone can being

hood of man, which alone can being peace on earth."

In communicating with Dr. Buttrick Rabbi Silver and Rabbi Wise declared that it was falt to be "appropriate and fitting that a fund of \$125,000 showld be put at the disposal of the Protestant Churches of America as an acknowledgment on our part of the sympathy and support of the leaders of the Protestant Church for all victims of religious and racial persecution."

"We realize that the problem of the refugee s by no means a Jewish one, but that it includes members of all faiths who have suffered most cruelly from the tyranny of those governments whose programs are foreign to American thought and the American way of life," the communication said.

In accepting the contribution made to be Catholic Church Bishop Shell, administrator of the Archdicesse of Chicago, said in a letter to Rabbi Silver and Rabbi Wise:

Message to United Palestine Meeting Cites Haven Offered to Victims of Persecution

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6. The fate of the Jewish community of 3,000,-000 in Poland was the principal concern of the speakers at tonight's opening session of the National Conference of the United Palestine Appeal. Several references were made to the further burden on the absorption capacity of Palestine which the Polish Jews would constitute in the near future.

Governor Lehman of New York, who telegraphed a message to the meeting, did not mention Poland specifically, but left little doubt that he believed Palestine could offer a haven to many refugees from that part of the world.

"It is a source of very great regret to me that it is impossible for me to attend the National Conference of the United Palestine Appeal to be held in Washington, on Jan. 6 and 7," Mr. Lehman's message said. "Unfortunately, however, the pressure of my work and official engagements make it impossible for me to leave the State at this time. It would have been a source of very great satisfaction and pleasure to have given public expression once more to my very great interest in the social and economic development of Palestine.

"The tragic situation abroad, where countless hopeless men and women have been driven from their homes and places of worship by relentless persecution and hatred, compels the sympathy and cooperation of every right-thinking person. 35,000 Refugees Settled in Year

In the year ending on Sept. 30, 1939, a total of 35,000 Jews from Germany, Austria, Poland, Bohemia, Moravia, Rumania and other European areas had been settled in Palestine, he added, and 9,400 refugees had been taken in since the start of the European war.

Dr. Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, said in his keynote address that 500,000 Jews, representing "the fifth largest Jewish community in the world," now lived in Palestine. He said that Palestine was a portion, the world where "hone is restored to men robbed of to be, and pilde to the humbled and the gift of mission and testiny to those cut off, spiritually dispossessed, and cast out of all theritahee."

Had the same number of Jewa lived on the national soil in Palestine their fate, under the most adverse circumstances, would have been quite different, he said.

Dr. Geldstein reviewed the progress in land purchase and development in Palestine, reporting that in 1939, despite adverse political and international conditions, the Jewish National Fund, through momes raised by the United Palestine appeal, had purchased a larger amount of land than in any preraised by the United Palestine appeal, had purchased a larger amount of land than in any previous year in the past three decades. "What is it now? Five tundred thousand people, mostly young and vigorous. Settlements from Dan to been sheba. Jews who never held a stide have become adjusted to a model type of peasantry. There are various types of agriculture. There are collective farms, individual farms and communal farms all working out in peace and freedom.

Calls Lecation a Benefit

"This country, which has no ceal, no iron no mineral to speak of, bun a favorable geographical position at the crossroads of the world's great highways, has a situation that is destined to make it great.

"We have mude progress, Verily I say that we could hardly have chosen a worse time, with Jewry broken and in constant state of tension. We have not had a single stable year.

"The Arabs were willing to accept us 20 years ago. But we did not work quickly enough. Thesy concluded: The Jews don't mean it. The real Jews with the bank accounts sneer at Zionism." But today the Arabs know that we are a factor. It is clear to them that the homeland cannot now be destroyed.

"Another great obstacle has been that many Jews were not Zionists. It was difficult to expect British statesmen to believe more in the reality of Palestine than the Jews themselves. Tragic Import Stressed in Analysis of Aims

The present war is neither an "absurd war," a "phony war," an "imperialist war" nor a "criminal war," but a tragic war whose full toll of suffering no one can foretell, Rabbi A. H. Silver said in an address on "What Is Europe Fighting For?" at the Temple yesterday

"After discounting the immediate provocations of this war, one finds two basic factors which made it inevitable: the collapse of the League of Nations and the rise of totalitarian dictatorships," Dr. Silver said. "The first cleared the way for aggression. The second provided the dynamics.

"If, after the war, totalitarian dictatorships remain, or if an indeterminate peace is patched up, as some suspect and others advocate, this war will again prove one of the most senseless and futile in history. It has finally dawned upon the re-sponsible statesmen in the democratic countries of Europe that dictatorship is not an internal affair merely, and that Europe cannot permanently remain half free permanently remain half states and half slave states."

Proposing a new international order when peace comes, he continued:

"The American people have been talking and writing about the peace which is to follow this war. Round table discussions are popular in American cities, and many plans are devised for the salvation of Eusame unpardonable act of 20 years But let us not commit the go when we sired and begot a League of Nations and left it on the doorstep of Europe. Europe has plenty of good plans. They do not need us to tell them what is good and desirable. They need us to help them achieve what is good and desirable for them and for us. If we are not ready to assume responsibility, a share in the burdens and the risks in any plan of international reconstruction, w ought to have the grace of keeping

"The American people should also remember that all the peace plans which are being discussed by them have a chance only if England and France win this war. While admitting that the inconsistencies in Jewish history made it difficult to predict the future of his race, Rabbi Silver pointed out that the Jews were the only existing race which had continued unbroken through the last thirty-five centuries. Had this people been made of "weaker stuff" it would long since have been assimilated or destroyed, he asserted.

When young Jews identify themselves with movements of economic reconstruction they must keep in mind that improvements must be brought by traditional, democratic American precedure, Rabbi A. H. Silver of the Temple told 750 at the first annual youth conference of the Ohio district of the Jewish Welfare Board yesterday.

"No Jew ought to forget," he warned, "that our only chance for peace and security anywhere in the world is a bill of rights, a constitution and democracy."

Rabbi Silver advised his listeners to join every liberal organization attempting to find a solution to unemployment, but cautioned them against joining groups organized only to "exploit youth." He also urged them to bring "service, counsel and helpfulness" to the activities of Jewish life generally.

"It is not that we are short of organizations" he said. "but that not enough of our people belong to these organizations."

Yet too much thought and re-sponsibility should not be trans-ferred to agencies and institutions,

he added.

A great lover of flow-ers, Mr. Untermyer in his later years was rarely without an orchid, usually a lady-slipper, in his lapel.



Sound, Rabbi Says

President Roosevelt ought not to stand for election for a third term, in the opinion of Rabbi A. H. Silver, expressed in an address before a capacity audience at the Temple yesterday morning.

"The tradition of rotation and restricted tenure of office is a sound one," Rabbi Silver asserted. "With this salutary tradition we have come a century and a half through many crises, some of which, in my opinion, were graver than that of today. The whole genius of Amer-ican political life is against the one-man savior. The philosophy of dictatorship is the very antithesis of the philosophy of democracy. The strength of democracy is not its faith in the man, but in the people.

"It is not a law but a tradition there should be rotation in the office of chief executive every four or eight years. In this case the tradition or custom is more powerful than a law.

Should Demonstrate Faith

"The real question over the third term for President Roosevelt is whether the times are so desperate as to warrant a break from tradition, and I for one say no.

"At this time I think it is par-ticularly desirable that a president should demonstrate his faith in democracy by voluntarily relin-quishing office. To insist on the re-election of a president on the ground that he is the sole leader who can save the people is to acknowledge publicly the bankruptcy of democracy. Silver Terms Palestine Jews' Maginot Line

BOSTON (P)-U. S. Senator William H. King (D-Utah) urges Great Britain to facilitate the rebuilding of the Jewish National Home in Palestine if it wants to "restore justice in Europe."

He told an emergency conference of the United Palestine Appeal last night that it was "our duty" to irnpress upon England the importlance of "extending rather than cur tailing" the development. A new British policy restricting the purchase of land by Jews in Pales-ine, he added, "runs counter to bliedges contained in the Balfour Declaration and the mandate of the League of Nations,"

Declaring that Palestine was the "Maginot Line" of Jews "shouting defiance to a world bent on its destruction," Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland urged American Jewry to broaden its support of the re building of the Jewish homeland.

"Recent discussion of the unjust, inwise land legislation enacted for Palestine by Colonial Secretary Malcolm MacDonald," he declared, has obscured the fact that in the free zone alone, there is twice as much land still to be bought as the Jewish national fund was able to acquire in 38 years."

He said that an additional 60,000 refugee families from distress areas in central and eastern Europe could be settled in Palestine on land immediately available for settlemenet. Senator King described the Nazi

In Palestine lies "a Maginot Line for Jews shouting defiance to a world bent upon its own destruction," Rabbi A. H. Silver of Cleveland, national chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, told 900 delegates at an emergency confer-

Urges Counter-Espionage, War on 'Fifth Columns'

The wholesale treason which betrayed Norway into the hands of a ruthless invader should be a warning to the people of America that "Trojan horses" are possible here as well as in Norway, said Rabbi A.
H. Silver in an address entitled "Trojan Horses" at the Temple yesterday morning.

"It is therefore needful for us and for democracy everywhere to begin to anticipate and attack these 'Fifth Columns,' to develop counterespionage, to become more wordlywise and more cunning, in dealing with Nazi and Fascist groups," said

Dr. Silver.
"The story of how a free and unsuspecting people and its govern-ment and king were helplessly handed over to the invader shocked the peoples of the world, and yet there should have been no occasion for surprise. It was common knowledge that Nazi agents were at work, sending 'Fifth Columns' into every country, and the negligence of governments in dealing with these movements can only be explained as a leftover from the policy of ap-

Seek World Hegemony

"The Nazis have never attempted to cover up their real intention to subjugate Europe. They are out to give the German race, which they conceive to be the superior race ost fit to rule, the and therefore me hegemony over the whole world. They plan to gear the whole life of Germany, with its population of 80 millions, for the one supreme effort, the exclusive pursuit of power.

"They bore from within, these Nazis, and they have a new technique which has been tremendoussuccessful. Espionage is not w. What is new is the setting up of political parties and factions to stir up trouble, to disrupt the spiritual unity of a country and to undermine its morale.

"The anti-Communist propaganda of the Nazis was a Trojan horse by which they got themselves into ower in Germany. They posed as he saviors of the country from the Bolsheviki. Actually, the followwhich Bolsheviki. ers of Hitler were not concerned with Communism, but with the political control of the state.

Salved Germany's Feelings

The Jewish Carpenters Union has contributed \$2,400 to the Jewish Welfare Fund's campaign for \$861,-800, fund officials said last night.

They added that the Jewish members of the International Ladies' Garment Workers Union had decided to contribute a half day's pay to the fund for the second year.

Pledges reported at a campaign luncheon yesterday at Hotel Statler boosted the fund total to \$544,250. This figure represents the contribu-

tions of 13,262 donors.

Speakers at the fund rally ineluded Rabbi A. H. Silver, general chairman of the drive, who emphasized that the outcome of the campaign depended upon rounding up all pledge cards; Dr. Robert B. Whyte, minister of Old Stone Church, and Rabbi Jonah B. Wise of New York, national co-chairman of the United Jewish Appeal.

The speaker at today's report meeting at Botel Statler will be Dr. Manfred Arie, former judge and district attorney in Vienna. The campaign will close with a dinner

meeting tomorrow night.

\$763,548 Pledged in Jewish Drive

Total by 7 Per Cent

With an increase of 7 per cent over pledges made last year, the Jewish Welfare Fund campaign was at an end today with total contributions of \$763,548.

Final figures were announced last night by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, general charman, at a closing dinner meeting in Hotel Statler which was attended by 1000 persons.

The sum raised was \$98,252 short of the campaign goal of \$861,800. Nathan Loeser, one of the drive leaders said, but he declared additional pledges are outstanding to

reduce that amount considerably.

In an address tabbi Silver said:
"The emergency is here to stay. We have to key urselves to a new standard, for a new era is here. We must learn to throw up dikes of

money, of sacrifice in the face of what threatens. We must organize our lines to a higher pitch in this disorganized world."

Rabbi Barnett R. Brickner of the Euclid Avenue Temple, who was cochairman of the campaign, discussed the religious and spiritual

values of giving.

Samuel Goldhamner, executive director of the campaign, expressed thanks of the organization to the 3000 workers who took part, Max Freeman presided.

H. Silver in an address entitled "Trojan Horses" at the temple yesterday morning.
"It is therefore needful for us and for democracy everywhere to begin to anticipate and attack these 'fifth columns,' to develop counterespionage, to become more worldly wise and more cunning in dealing with Nazi and Fascist groups," said Dr. Silver. "The story of how a free and unsuspecting people and its Government and King were helplessly handed over to the invader shocked the peoples of the world, and yet there should have been no occasion for surprise. It was common knowledge that Nazi agents were at work, sending 'fifth columns' into every country, and the negligence of governments in dealing with these movements can only be explained as a left-over from the policy of appeasement. SEEK WORLD HEGEMONY "The Nazis have never attempted to cover up their real intention to subjugate Europe. They are out to give the German race, which they believe to be the superior race and therefore most fit to rule, egemony over the whole world. They clan to gear the whole hife of Germany, with its population of 88,000,000, for the one supreme effort, the exclusive pursuit of power.

"They bore from within, these Nazis, and they have a new technique which has been tremendously successful. Espionage is not new. What is new is the setting up of political parties and factions to stir up trouble, to disrupt the spiritual unity of a country, and to undermine its morale. "The anti-Communist propaganda of the Nazis was a Trojan horse by which they got themselves into power in Germany. They posed as the saviors of the country from the Bolsheviki. Actually the followers of Hitler were not concerned with communism, but with the political control of the state. SALVED GERMANY'S FEELINGS "Anti-Semitism was another Trojan horse. It was welcome salve for the hurt feelings of Germany. It gave the people a welcome compensatory myth, exploited by the Nazis to overthrow the German Republic and gain control of the country.

"In this country anti-Semitism is chiefly a political weapon, used by organizations receiving instructions from abroad as a means of keeping aid to the Allies at a minimum. So also is the kind of propaganda which speaks for social justice, but which really has the motive of introducing the Fascist corporate state.

"The saying, 'Eternal vigilance is the price of liberty,' was never truer than it is today. Norway, Poland, Austria have been successive victims of neglect of vigilance. Clevelanders Raise Pledges 7% Over 1939's

Even greater sacrifices of the 91,-000 persons of Jewish extraction in Cleveland to combat the threats of the new era now confronting the world were urged last night by Rabbi A. H. Silver, general chair-man of the Jewish welfare fund campaign, as the total raised by the 10-day drive was announced as \$763,548.

Although this falls short of the goal of \$861,800, the money and pledges raised by the 3,000 workers of the 26 divisions was 7 per cent. greater than in 1939, Nathan Loeser, one of the campaign's leaders, announced at the drive's closing banquet at Hotel Statler. More than 1,000 attended.

Enough pledges are still outstand-ing to insure success of the drive, Loeser added.

Fears for Services

In the closing address of the meeting, Rabbi Silver, while complimenting the givers in the low-income brackets, frankly admitted the results of the campaign were not so satisfactory as they might have been.

The rabbi particularly criticized well-to-do and rich persons in the Jewish community, asserting that many such persons failed to give amounts which they were able to

He warned that the 90 agencies here, in the nation and abroad which stood to benefit by the overall appeal of the Jewish fund drive would have their services seriously impaired by failure to make up the difference.

"The emergency is here to stay," Rabbi Silver said. "We have to key ourselves up to a new standard of existence, for a new era is here. We must learn to throw up dikes of money, of sacrifice in the face of what threatens. We must organize our lines to a higher pitch in this disorganized world."

Spiritual Leader of The Temple

Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver has been the spiritual leader of The Temple, E. 105th Street and Ansel Road, since 1917, and during that time has more than doubled the membership of the congregation. The membership of 1,600 families is the largest Jewish congregation in the United States Since coming to Cleveland he has confirmed more than 2,300 boys and girls. His Sunday morning lectures have become a civic institution.

The religious school of The Temple has, for many years, been a model religious educational enterprise. Classes extend over a period of 15 years, from the kindergarten through the college department. Nearly 1,000 are enrolled. The annual confirmation services conducted by Rabbi Silver are the most impressive of the year.

When Rabbi Moses J. Gries retired from active service in 1917, Rabbi Silver was called from Wheeling, W. Va., to The Temple. He was then 24, probably the youngest clergyman ever called to take the leadership of a large religious institution in Cleveland. Under his ability as preacher, lecturer and organizer, the membership of the congregation grew rapidly until, in 1924, it became necessary to erect the \$1,000,000 structure on E. 105th Street at Ansel Road.

Rabbi Silver has taken an active part in promoting the social and civic welfare of the community. He has been a staunch advocate of the rights of free speech and free assembly, of social security and unemployment insurance. He has stood for everything that will advance the rights of the individual. He was one of the leaders in the movement for the city manager plan of government.

The Temple will celebrate its ninetieth anniversary on Sunday, May 26, and Rabbi Silver will preach the anniversary sermon at the morning service. In the evening there will be a banquet in Hotel Statler, with the Honorable Harold L. Ickes, U. S. secretary of the interior, speaking on



ROLE OF RELIGION IN DEMOCRACY STRESSED BY SILVER AT TEMPLE'S 90TH ANNIVERSARY RITES

CLEVELAND, May 26. (JTA) -- Science without religion is a menace, democracy without religion is a failure and society without religion is a bloody battlefield, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver said today in a sermon commemorating the 90th anniversary

Asserting that all the brain children of science have been prostituted in the service of Mars, the Moloch, the Rabbi, spiritual leader of the congregation for 23 years, said the fault was not with science but with the uses to which scientific achievements had been put.

Pointing out that British statemen in recent years have forgotten God and the moral law, bringing their people from one disaster to another, he added that this was a fitting time to proclaim the immortal character of religion.

"There is hardly a generation which is not brought sooner or later to the brink of disaster, because of spiritual blindness," he said. "We must equip the rising generation with a passion for democracy and the rights of man, and we can do this only by giving our young people a profound religious consecration."

Cleveland's Mayor Harold H. Burton expressed appreciation in behalf of the city for the leadership of The Temple, largest congregation in the nation, in cultural, social activities. Burton said The Temple was a great source of inspiration and guidance to Clevelanders, adding that the Hebrew prophets and their successors today were among the great leaders in the march of progress.

An anniversary banquet at the Hotel Statler was scheduled to be addressed tonight by Harold L. Ickes, Secretary of the Interior.

Tells Social Workers Fiction of Neutrality Is Over

Delegates to the 67th National Conference of Social Work were warned at a general session last night by Rabbi A. H. Silver of Cleveland that "the fiction of security through strict neutrality has been shattered forever," the Associated Press reported from Grand Rapids, Mich.

Rabbi Silver added: "Our defense program must now envisage an embattled America in a world of powerful neighbors whose way of life and whose political and economic creeds are the potential enemies of America/

The future of the United States, he said, was inextricably bound up with battles now raging in Europe.

"If the Allies win, victory can come only after a prolonged and exhausting war which will shake the very foundations of the social, political and economic life of Europe," Rabbi Silver asserted.

Etreamlined Barbarism"

. "If they lose, Europe will be turned over to the moral anarchy of this streamlined barbarism of the 20th century and the rest of the world will not long escape the effects of it."

While discounting any immediate dangers of foreign invasion in event of an Allied defeat, Rabbi Silver said Nazi triumphs overseas would mean "our American world will become closely encircled by a hos-tile world."

"Our greatest dangers," he warned, "will come from within. A victory for the Nazis abroad will lay the world at their feet, will hearten and inspire their agents, friends and admirers here. Fascist and Nazi sympathizers, adventurers and, would-be Hitlers will spring up like mushrooms all over our country."

To counteract this danger, Rabbi Silver called for a clear definition of our foreign policy in relation to the 21 countries of this hemisphere, constant exposure and elimination of "the forces hostile to our form of government, to our free institu-tions," and education of United States citizens in the technique of modern propaganda and how to detect it.

Calls for Social Justice

"Sound American patriotism must quickly translate itself into an intelligent and ardent program for social justice, for a fairer distribution of the social goods, for a larger measure of protection of our people against the hazards of unemployment, sickness and old age," he

"Sound patriotism will look upon slums, jobless and hopeless youth, the underpaid worker, the unsheltered aged as the real Trojan Herse which leads a free people to destruction. People who feel that and can see the promises of greater happiness and well-being for their children will not be inveigled by the foreign propaganda of a totalitarian millennium."



Rabbi Silver Assert They

Keep Democracy Alive

A people accustomed to 150 years of elections took also this one in its stride, said Rabbi A. H. Sil-ver, speaking on "After the Elec-tion-What?" at the Temple yester-

day morning.
"Unlike the phony elections in the totalitarian states, the winning candidate did not receive 99.9 per cent. of the vote," Rabbi Silver said. "Twenty-two million people said 'No' to him, and to one or another of his policies. This very substantial minority remains as the government's loyal opposition, not to sabotage or conspire, but to offer criticism and to keep alive its own conception of government.

"This is the critical difference be-

tween dictatorship and democracy. Dictatorship cannot survive with an opposition party. Democracy cannot survive without it.

"To ignore completely the 22 million would be a great mistake. To yield to them completely would be to betray the will of the majority of 26 millions. Wise statesmanship will try to reconcile and conciliate.

"The election gave a clear mandate, an almost unanimous mandate, to the president to go forward in his foreign policy. Both President Roosevelt and Mr. Willkie call for maximum assistance to Great Britain. Americans wish to stand

by England.
"There was a clear mandate to the president to go forward with his good neighbor policy in this hemi-sphere and for a policy of mutual defense among all the American re-presidency of the United States is publics.

"It cannot be said that a similar unanimous approval has been given to the New Deal, to President Roosevelt's domestic policy.
"I believe that President Ro

Silver Tells City Club Idols Replace Dethroned God

Humanity, schened of its godless civilization, must return to the light of God, social promets and human freedom guided by the ideal of the sacredness of the individual, Rabbi A. H. Silver of the Temple said in an address at the City Club forum

"Because the spiritual interpreta-tion of human destiny was allowed to languish, other interpretations have come to life and are now driving mankind mad," Rabbi Silver told the crowded audience.
"For when God is detherned His

"For when God is dethroned, His throne does not remain empty for long. Some false god, some Wotan, Moloch, Mammon or Mars, soon occupies it. In place of piety, com-passion and self-sacrifice other qualities-insolence, cruelty, aggresion and combativeness-are now extolled.

"Because men have rejected the ideal of the sanctification of human life under God, they now have world in which human life is held cheap, in which the stature of the individual has been reduced, his rights usurped by the state, his labor looked upon as a commodity and his life, but a statistical item."

Reviews History

Rabbi Silver reviewed the religious origin of the democratic idea in the modern world through the struggles of the Protestant reformation, the peasant wars and the birth of Anabaptist sects and said their inspiration was from "religion and revelation." He called American democracy. "an inheritor of vic-tories won for religious freedom on the battle fields of the spirit."

"Struggles for human freedom, uninspired by a living faith in God, often lead mankind to disaster," Rabbi Silver asserted. "Russia attempted to build a free and happy society without God. It succeeded only in forging a dictatorship and an enslaved society. Fascist and Nazi states in Europe also sought to build happier socialized communities on the basis of a godless materialism, vitiated still further by an anti-spiritual racism and chauvinism.

"They succeeded only in effecting, with the aid of rubber truncheons and concentration camps, a brutally regimented and terrorized society. The 'new orders' which these godless revolutionary movements achieved were only variant forms of older despotisms.

Not Young-Only Raw

"Although they pride themselves on being young and dynamic, they are so only in the sense of being immature, raw, untempered and

"A society achieves real renewal only through inner spiritual renewal. If freedom is ever to speal again everywhere, its speech, to quote Heine, will again have to be biblical."

Present-day enemies of human liberties persecute religion because religion is their death warrant, Rabbi Silver continued. The foes m and Christianity 'the last unwearied watchmen over the ramparts of human liberties, who must be destroyed before their own freedom-annihilating materialistic revolutions can be firmly established," he added.

"The spiritual foundations of modern democracy lie deep in the religious dogmas of Judaism and Christianity-in the concept of man as a child of God, physically circumscribed, but capable of reaching levels where he is just a little lower doing justice, loving mercy, walking humbly and seeking peace as the only ways of reaching those high levels, and in the concept of human brotherhood," he went on peace."

Rabbi Silver Says Agency Civilizes People's Hearts;

First Report Today

The principal address of the afternoon was delivered by Rabbi A. H. Silver of the Temple, who termed the Fund "an agency which is civilizing the hearts of our people."

"There are three types of civilization in the world." Dr. Silversaid, "civilization of the head, of the hand and of the heart.

"There have been people and ages."

"There have been people and ages which have emphasized civilization of the head, regarding as the highest good the acquisition of knowlest good the acquisition of knowledge. These ages produced great scholars, great scientists. Ofter, however, such civilizations became decadent and destroyed themselves. They were like a tree with beautiful foliage, but too few roots.

Third Type Lacking brought men together in closer propinquity in the cities. But al-"There have been ages which emphasized ivilization of the hand which strove after mechanical perfection and prided themselves on —which strove after mechanical perfection and prided themselves on technological skills and the acquisition of great wealth. These ages produced great inventors, great industrialists—and many great millionaires. Quite often such ages became too materialistic and competitive and destroyed themselves. "Today we have both such civilizations in our world—civilizations of head and hands—and both are perishing in the war and horrors and social chaos of our day, because both lacked the third, which alone could saye them.

"The auman heart alone can save man from being destroyed by his mind de by his handiwork."

Dr. Silver recalled how much of the earth is cotted with schools and filled with inventive genius, and his voice rose a little when he said:

"Yet here is our world in the grip of the second world war in 20 years, and all of man's knowledge and scientific skill is being directed toward the destruction of munkind. The people of the earth are slaying each other by land, by sea and in the air.

"What is wrong? There has been though they have never lived closer together, they are completely estranged unless something else enters into the picture. The tig city, Dr. Silver pointed out, cestroys neighborliness unless civilization of

He told of the building of the great temple in Jerusalem, and how everyone helped, and how the poor people themselves built the west-ern wall with stones which they themselves had hewn from the quarries, and how, when it was done, the western wall was admired more than any other part of the great edifice. great edifice

"Our Community Fund for 22 years has tried to civilize the heart of the people of this community. It has reminded us, and still is reminding us, not to overlook the human casualties of our modern industrial civilization, nor to disregard the weak who need other men's strength to carry on. 

Silver, national chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, said in a statement released yesterday through the organization's headquarters in the organization's headquarters in

Rabbi Silver also announced the decision of the administrative committee of United Palestine Appeal to inaugurate a nation-wide war emergency campaign for \$12,000,000 in 1941 to rally support behind Palestine as a major haven of refuge for homeless Jews and as a vital point in British defense in the Mediserrance.

\$12,000,000 IS GOAL IN PALESTINE DRIVE

Fund to Be Sought in 1941 Will Be Used to Support 'Major Haven of Befrige' PLAN WOULD AID BRITAIN Jews Playing Increasing Role in Allied Forces, Chairman

The United Paleatine Appeal, through its national chairman Dr. Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, announced here yesterday that it would launch a \$12,000,000 nationwide drive in 1941.

The fund, according to Dr. Silver, will be used to rally the widest possible support behind Polasilne as a "major haven" of criuge for the oppressed and flomeless Jews of European nations and "as a vital point in the defense of the British Commonwealth and democracy in the Mediterranean zone."

Pointing out that the 1941 drive

Pointing out that the 1941 drive would constitute the largest campaign for Palestine aid ever under-taken by American Jewry, Dr. Silver said that in the last two decades the aid given the Jewish na-tional home in Palestine had increased the population of the com-munity from 55,000 to 550,000. At present Palestine is the second largest free Jewish community in the world, he said, the first being the American Jews,

the world, he said, the first being the American Jews.

The fund raised in the campaign will be administered by the Jewish Agency for Palestine, which is recognized by the League of Nations Mandate as the Jewish authority in the rebuilding of Palestine, and the Jewish National Fund, the land-purchasing and land-reclaiming agency of the Jewish people.

"The resolution of America to share in resisting the encroachments and devastation of dictatorship will find its parallel in the willingness of Jews to give generously of their substance so that the Palestine Jewish community may continue to guard one of the most vital battle fronts for civilization," Dr. Silver predicted.

"The ability of Palestine to defend itself and to give manpower for its security may help determine the outcome of this struggle.

"In the first year of the war 24,000 Jewish men, women and children came to Palestine's shores from Nazi-reid Europe. A total of 280,000 such refugees have come to Palestine in the last eight years from Germany, Czecho-Slovakia, Poland and elsewhere.

"Today the Jews of Palestine, playing an increasing role in the Allied forces, are giving to Jews everywhere a symbol of sacrificial loyalty and of steadfast faith in the ultimate triumph of justice—justice for Israel and for humanity.

"American Jewry cannot—the United Palestine Appeal is confident it will not—let down these Jews in Palestine who are our front-rank soldiers in the war for the liberation of mankind."

Dr. Silver asserted that the collapse of the European democracies which had previously contributed substantially to the reconstruction enterprise in Palestine had been instrumental in setting the national campaign at the \$12,000,000 figure.

peal. The cost will be \$175,000.

It is expected that the entire trip will be completed within a month.
Immeration ortification in Palestine have been as used by the British
Government, while the Soviet and Japan have cooperated by granting the necessary visus, Dr. Silver said. The undertaking is the first major step in the \$12,000,000 war emer gency campaign for the immigration and settlement of refugees in

gency campaign for the immigration and settlement of refugess in Pales ine.

The refuges group, many of whom fled to Vilna and Kaunas in Lithuania iuring the Nazi conquest of Poland in September, 1939, includes a considerable number of German Jews who had found temporary refuga in Poland.

Dr. Silver made an appeal for financial aid for 7,100 others in various parts of Europe who are in possession of entry permits to Palestine but lack the necessary funds for transportation.

In the fourteen months since the outbreak of war, more than 28,000 Jewish refugees have entered Palestine, Dr. Silver said. He pointed out that the continued agricultural and economic development of the countsy had increased its capacity to absorb large numbers of Jews despeastely in need of refuge.

Of the \$175,000 furnished by the appea for the transportation of the refugees, \$30,000 was contributed by Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization.
