# SILVER IS VOTED ONF YFAR ABR **Trustees Mark 15 Years of**

Service: Rabbi Leaves in October.

Rabbi A. H. Silver, who this year completes fifteen years' service as rabbi of the Temple, has been voted a sabbatical year by his congregation and will leave in October for a year in Europe, it was announced

last night.



The resolutions adopted by the the Temple's board of trustees offer the leave as "evidence and expression of our grateful ap-preciation."

"Rabbi Silver has been in the service of the Temple for fif-teen years," the resolution read. "Those of us who have been

more or less in-timately identi-ational activities fied with congregational during that period know that these years have been strenuous, fruitful and glorious. Under Rabbi Silver's leadership, Tifereth Israel has achieved unparalleled distinction. But his work has not have But his work has not been confined to Cleveland alone. Ungrudgingly he has answered the call of duty, from may have source it whatever emanated.

#### Years of Labor.

"This devotion to the cause of Judaism has entailed absorbing iabor. At its best the function of a rabbi involves exacting duties, and when that rabbi belongs not to one city alone, but to a people, its im-plications are multiplied many fold.

"We feel, therefore, that Rabbi Silver merits a leave of absence—a sabbatical year. For a long time he has dreamed of travel in European lands. In vouchsafing this privilege to him, we are not unmindful that our motive is not wholly unselfish. We feel, indeed, that not only will Rabbi Silver return to you a year hence, wiser, broader in outlook and more mellow, but that we shall reap the benefit of his further study and of his acquisitive mind."

Rabbi Silver expressed deep appre ciation last night for the action of his congregation.

"I have been wishing for some time for an opportunity to get away from the exacting routine of a minis-ter's life in a large congregation, to freshen up mentally and, as it were, to recharge," he said.

### Will Study Movements.

"I should like to see some of the significant movements which are taking place abroad a little more closely, perhaps contact with some of their leaders and gain a better in-sight into the forces which are at some work in the cultural and social life

of the world today. "I want to spend some time in Germany, Russia and Palestine, three of the most interesting laboratories of economic, political and na-tional experiment today. "I think that I shall be able to do better work among my people when I re-turn."

Rabbl Silver will leave in October. remaining here this summer to plan next year's Temple program. During his absence the Temple will continue with its regular religious education. Outstanding men of the nation, ministers and laymen, will join with Rabbi Feuer in occupying the Temple pulpit at the Sunday services. morning

## Will Start Tour in October After Planning Temple Program.

During Rabbi Silver's absence The Temple will continue its full program of religious and educational activities under the leadership of Rabbi Leon I. Feuer, who will have additional rabbinical assistance. Outstanding men of the nation, ministers and laymen, will join with Rabbi Feuer in occupying the pulpit.

A resolution expressing the appreclation of the congregation for Rabbi Silver's work has been adopted by the board of trustees of The Temple in granting the year's leave.

A FTER 15 years of zealous and successful service, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland Temple is voted a sabbatical year to spend in travel, study and rest. The congregation joins the board of trustees in declaring the honor and opportunity well merited by his long and effective work. We know of no one who has given more generously of his time and thought to civic enterprises than has Rabbi Silver. He has always been on call for Community Fund and other city-wide undertakings.

And his contribution has never been perfunctory. He always contributes an opinion thru the medium of his superb oratory, which adds something to right thinking on the subject at hand.

He is an orator who has never got in the way of substituting effective combinations of words, skillful as is his speaking, for effective thinking. His words are a medium of transmission, not merely a rhetorical demonstration.

### Rabbi Silver To Leave on Sabbatical Year

**R** ABBI ABEA HILLEL SILVER, who this June completes fifteen years of service as Rabbi of The Temple, Cleveland, has been voted a sabbatical year by his congregation, in recognition of his service to the congregation. He will leave at the conclusion of the fall holidays in October and, conditions permitting, will spend the year abroad in travel and study.

During his absence the Temple will continue its full program of religious and educational activities under the leadship of Rabbi Leon Feuer, who will have additional rabbinical assistance. Outstanding men of the nation, ministers and laymen, will occupy the Temple pulpit at the Sunday morning services.

Rabbi Silver accepted the call to the pulpit of the Cleveland Temple in June, 1917. Since that time the membership of the congregation has more than doubled, numbering today over sixteen hundred families. The beautiful new Temple and school building at Ansel Road and East 105th Street were built. The Religious School was enlarged numbering today about twelve hundred children, and high school and college departments were added to it. The study of Hebrew was made compulsory in all classes.

Rabbi Silver reinstituted the Sabbath eve and Saturday morning services, in addition to the Sunday morning service. Under his leadership a new Temple policy was adopted which eliminated the purely recreational and social features from the life of the Synagogue and confined the functions of the Synagogue to religious and moral education, worship and Jewish studies. The Temple abandoned the idea of the institutional Synagogue which it was the first to adopt in the early nineties of the last century. Rabbi Silver was instrumental in founding the Bureau of Jewish Education of Cleveland and has been its president since its inception.

He has been a pioneer of Unemployment Insurance in Ohio: was chairman of the committee which drafted the bill for Unemployment Insurance submitted to the Ohio State Legislature and was recently appointed a member of a State Commission on Unemployment Insurance created by the Ohio State Legislature. He was also appointed last year, by President Hoover, a member of his Unemployment Relief Commission.

## Others Also Join in Praises as Rabbi Begins 16th Temple Year.

With congratulations and praises of religious and civic leaders from all parts of the country ringing in his ears, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver today started his sixteenth year as leader of The Temple congregation.

Messages from Catholic and Protestant leaders, from judges and statesmen, and others in all walks of life were read last night at the eighty-second annual meeting of the congregation and the fifteenth anniversary of Rabbi Silver's ordination as its leader. And then as a climax, Bishop Warren Lincoln Rogers of the Ohio Episcopal diocese praised Rabbi Silver as a man who is a "blessing to Cleveland and a true man of God."

More than 500 members of the congregation attended the meeting at Hotel Cleveland:

### Leaders Tell of Services.

Charles E. Adams, general chairman of the Community Fund, told of Rabbi Silver's contribution to the community and Dr. A. H. Friedland, chairman of the Bureau of Jewish Education, told of his contributions to education.

Eugene E. Wolf, president of the congregation, reviewed the progress of the Temple during the last year and Rabbi Leon Feuer, minister of education, who will take Rabbi Silver's place when the latter leaves for Europe on a year's tour, told of the religious work in The Temple.

Mr. Wolf made formal announcement of the action taken by the trustees in giving Rabbi Silver his year's leave of absence.

Mr. Adams mourned the loss of Rabbi Silver even for the one year he will be gone from the city.

### Educational Work Lauded.

It was due to Rabbi Silver's labors, Dr. Friedland said, that the bureau of education has succeeded in weathering the storm of recent years.

Simplicity was the keynote of Bishop Rogers' address.

"I come to pay tribute to a dear friend," he said. "I come to pay tribute to a great man, great teacher and a great speaker. When Rabbi Silver speaks, somehow you can feel it clear down to your boots.

# HAIL 15 YEARS OF SERVICE BY RABBI SILVER

Congregation and Civic Leaders Hear His Plea to Put The Temple First

"Take nine-tenths of the tributes to Rabbi Silver and give them to the Temple. The Temple is greater than any one man."

That was the response of Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver at the congregation's 82d annual dinner meeting, attended by more than 1000 at Hotel Cleveland last night.

Leaders among Cleveland Jewry, civic and church leaders gathered to pay tribute to the leader who has completed 15 years of service at the Temple.

"I come as an admirer and a friend to my brother, Rabbi Silver," was the tribute of Bishop Warren Lincoln Rogers of the Episcopal diocese of Ohio, who delivered the principal address.

### **Hailed** in Education

Charles E. Adams, head of the Cleveland Community Fund, praised Rabbi Silver for his activities in the city's community life and Dr. A. H. Friedland, head of the Cleveland Hebrew School of Institute, hailed the rabbi's activities in religious education.

Members of every confirmation class since Rabbi Silver came to the Temple 15 years ago were represented at class tables. Felix Lowenstein, member of the 1918 class, delivered a message of gratitude, while Miss Martha Joseph spoke for the 1932 class.

"I am altogether unworthy of such tribute," said Rabbi Silver. "Whatever measure of achievement has been mine has been due entirely to the support and confidence this great, historic congregation has given me. You gave me a free rein, demanding only sincere utterances, and you never asked me for sensationalism or showmanship."

### Proud of Temple

Rabbi Silver said he is grateful to the 1522 boys and girls he was privileged to confirm, and proud of the beautiful temple which the congregation built.

gregation built. "Fifteen years as head of a large temples takes a great deal out of a man, both physically and mentally," the rabbi said. "I want to regard the one-year sabbatical leave the Temple has given me to recharge, restock and refresh myself."

Rabbi Silver said he plans to visit Germany, Russia and Palestine to study problems of Jewish life there. Following his departure in the fall the congregation will be led by Rabbi Leon I. Feuer.

## TRIBUTES 'STEAL' SILVER'S SPEECH Rabbi Hunts Words to Say 'Thank You' at Annual

Temple Meeting.

Rabbi A. H. Silver, known as one of the outstanding orators of the city, faced an audience of more than 500 last night and stood speechless for several seconds while he ran his finger nervously around his collar befor he could say his "Thank you."

He had heard his own people tell of his place in their lives, had listened to Bishop Warren Lincoln Rogers of the Episcopal Diocese of Ohio call him a blessing to Cleveland, and had sat quietly while Charles E. Adams termed him a tower of strength to the Community Fund, as he completed his first fifteen years of ministry at the Temple

The occasion was the S2d annual meeting of the Temple congregation, which had been planned as an anniversary service for Rabbi Silver. It was held in the ball room of Hotel Cleveland and was followed by a dinner dance.

dinner dance. "There could not have been a Community Fund without the kind of cooperation Rabbi Silver has given." Adams said. "People in this town trust him. When he stands on a platform and indorses something his indorsement is as good as any man's in Cleveland.

"I'm not worried about his going

away for a leave of absence nextyear. But I am worried about his not coming back. We have peculiar times ahead of us. It is men of wisdom and the courage of their convictions, like Rabbi Silver, who have got to visualize the future and mark out the trail."

### Pays Tribute to Friend,

Bishop Rogers paid tribute to Rabbi Silver as a friend.

"He is a man whom we know as well as you do," the bishop said. "I come as a lover of a great man. I'm always envious of him when he speaks. What a golden voice he has and what a heart he puts into what he says. He makes you feel it down to your boots."

Dr. A. H. Friedland, educational director of the Bureau of Jewish Education; Rabbi Leon I. Feuer. educational director at the Temple; Felix Lowenstein, member of Rabbi Silver's first confirmation class in Cleveland, and Miss Martha Joseph, representative of this year's class, also paid tribute.
