



Dear Rabbi:

Unfortunately for myself I am neither a gifted orator nor writer. As a consequence, try as I might, I have difficulty in endeavoring to shape my exact thoughts into actual words. This is especially difficult when I try to express the feelings of affection and pride that I entertain for you. However, I shall try to say just a few words.

I was present at the Temple on the occasion of your 25th anniversary and observed the spontaneous ourbursts of enthusiasm and friendship manifested towards you by the public from all walks of life, and regardless of their race, religion or creed. I know that this display of affection was sincere as well as it was deserved. I personally derived a great deal of "naches" in observing this demonstration.

The speakers stressed that you are America's outstanding Rabbi; that you are a national figure, and that you possess the spirit of the prophet within you. It is these qualities which enable you to go forth and give the proper perspective to the world in general and to Israel in particular. I agree fully with these views, but what I wanted to stress primarily was this:

The position of Rabbi, as you yourself have often said, has been that of a teacher in Israel. The Rabbi could narrow his tasks; confine his activities to being learned and to teaching and his duties would be fully performed. You, however, have chosen the hard way. You have deliberately accepted burdens, responsibilities and duties that would have staggered an average man.



I received the invitation to participate in the celebration of your Twenty-fifth Anniversary as Rabbi of your Temple. I don't have to tell you how eager I would be to attend and to congratulate you personally. However, Cleveland is far away, and I will have to express myself in a letter.

It is now many years ago that I heard you for the first time at the Zionist Conference in Lucerne, Switzerland. From that day on, I have never ceased to believe in you. My dear Rabbi,

I hope it isn't too late to offer you my most sincere congratulations on your Twenty-fifth Anniversary as Rabbi at the Temple of Cleveland. I hope that you will

celebrate many, many more Anniversaries there.

I was sorry that I had to work the evening that you spoke her in Erie, on the the Temple Men's Club course. But I had always hoped that sometime I would have the oppurtunity to see you in person, when I could talk to you. For Rabbi, I owe you a great vote of thanks. This is a thanks that mere words do do express. In my heart I know what I would like to say but somehow I just can not put it in words.

Rabbi, I don't think that you will recall this incident, but I'm hoping that you will, but I will never forget it. I'll try to explain the way it happened,

so here goes.

A long time ago, in fact I think it was 26 years ago, our family lived in Wheeling W. Va. and right after this incident you left Wheeling for Cleveland I believe. As my Father was not living at home at the time, my Mother made a living for her family of three children, by selling chickens. And as small as I was I helped by delivering chickens on Thursday nights to the Jewish trade. Most of my deliveries was up around 11th and Chapline street. And I used to ride a street car up and deliver the orders from a large market basket. Then I would walk home with the empty basket. I recall that it was around the holiday season when Hanakah and Christmas came out about the same time, and on my way home I stopped in the Hub to visit Toyland. There I saw you and spoke to you and I remember that you asking me what I would like for Hanakah. How I wanted to say a tricycle of some sort but I looked downaat the old dirty market basket with the bottom covered with blood and feathers from the chickens and something made me say " A WAGON". And you, Rabbi, bought me the largest wagon in the store. I ran home as fast as my legs would carry me and told my Mother and how proud I was when the big Coaster Wagon was delivered to me on Friday night. Was I proud! I don't think that I slept at all that night.

Well Rabbi, I don't think that you ever realized what that wagon did for us. It made our load a lot
lighter for years to come. For all we ever had to haul
our chickens out to market on was an old wheelbarrow.
But from then on we always had a wagon to haul our chickens
on, whether it was to "orth, South, East Wheeling or the

Many and many are the imes that I wanted to write you and thank you for all this, which to you may of

been very small, but to me was a great event. Now as I tell this to my children, every so often and as I write this letter I get a big lump in my throat and tears come to my eyes, but all I can say is THANKS A MILLION.

And, Rabbi, I hape that I will be this close to Cleveland when you celebrate your Fiftith Anniversary, so that I will be one of the first to congatulate you instead of being so late. Why it is late is because I just saw last weeks Jewish Review at the store where I work.

And may I add that our two youngsters, Eugene age 13 and June age 11 both go to the Temple here in Erie and Rabbi Currick will tell you that they are both good Jews. Eugene, one of these days will be a leader in the Temple Sunday School. Neither one hardly ever miss a Sunday School class. And they put me to shame with the questions that they ask, and some I can't answer because I didn't go to Sunday School and learn the type of teachings that they get. Of course to them Rabbi Currick is tops.
