

A Bond can be issued to more than one person. This can be done by joining the names by "AND"; for example, if Bond is made out in the names of "Albert Green AND Ruth Green," they will be joint tenants with right of survivorship. This means that if one dies the other is the complete owner. It is also possible to register Bonds in the form of "Albert Green OR Ruth Green."

It is very important to notice, however, that if Bonds are registered in this alternate form, both Albert Green and Ruth Green must sign the statement set forth below:

The Undersigned agree with each other that the State and the Fiscal Agent may treat either of them, or the survivor, as the sole owner hereof for all purposes and agree to indemnify the State and the Fiscal Agent from all liability resulting therefrom.



Colonel Ezer Weizmann, Commander of the Israel Air Force, and one of his country's outstanding flying heroes, who was seen by millions of Americans on Ed Murrow's recent "See It Now" television documentary on the Middle East, will be the principal speaker at a "Sponsor's Tea" for Israel Bonds in the home of Mrs. Jack N. Colonel Weizmann is a nephew of the late Dr. Chaim Weizmann, first President of the State of Israel. He is a "Sabra" or native of Israel, born in Tel Aviv 32 years ago. Zionists Hail Rabbi Silver at Banquet

Purchase Israel Bonds at
\$1,000 to Attend

More than 600 persons filled the Hotel Hollenden ballroom last night to pay tribute to Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, newly named national chairman of the Israel bond organization's board of governors and to launch the 1956 Israeli bond campaign here.

Admission was by purchase of \$1,000 in Israel development bonds. In addition, about \$164,000 in bonds was purchased from the floor, bringing the total so far this year to \$647,250. The goal is \$1,350,000.

Guest speaker was Spencer D. Irwin, associate editor of the Plain Dealer. He held that conflict would not materialize in the Middle East despite American refusal to sell arms to Israel "because Israel is still strong enough to discourage Arab attacks."

Rabbi Silver, in an impassioned address, denounced "blunders of western powers" which he said denied defensive arms to the lone democracy in the Middle East while Arabs were given more arms than they could digest.

rically opposed to America's foreign policy.

Why is Israel singled out not to enjoy this defense, he asked.

"America's Middle East eyes are riveted exclusively on oil," he said. He added that the political situation was bound to change, since there was no logic underlying our policy in the Middle East.

The rabbi underscored that Israel was founded by men of brave hearts and would be built by men whose devotion remained unshaken through present and future crises.

He praised Irwin as "a constant and understanding friend of Israel and humanity who has served much with his gifted pen for many years."

In his address Irwin said he was there to honor a state which was very much the concern of the entire world.

Pointing to arms Israel got from France, Irwin said Arabs could not win an immediate and resounding victory over the tiny state, a situation necessary before the Arabs would attack.

He said the recent display of military might by Egypt was "only so much meaningless froth to keep Egyptians satisfied."

Analyzing the present lull along the Gaza Strip, Irwin said it would be foolish to consider

this part of a real peace. He warned that there would be a continuation of saber rattling and that Americans must do all within their power to build a strong Israel.

Irwin praised Rabbi Silver as a man "who does not belong only to the Jews but belongs to all America and the rest of the world."

Abba Eban, Israel's ambassador to the United States, was to have been the guest speaker, but was recalled to Israel at the last minute for an important conference.

A scroll certificate was presented to Rabbi Silver by A. M. Luntz, chairman of the dinner. The event was presided over by David I. Siegel and Jack N. Mandel, Cleveland general chairmen of the bond drive.


