Under the provisions of the Nationality Act of 1940, American nationality may be lost through being naturalized in, taking an oath or making a declaration of allegiance to, serving in military forces of, accepting employment under the government of, or by voting in the elections of a foreign state. • GENERAL INFORMATION

You may prepare in advance to meet certain requirements that will govern your return from abroad. The following information will assist you in avoiding inconvenience and delay at the time of your return to the United States.

• CUSTOMS SERVICE

The pamphlet "Customs Hints" has been designed to give you pertinent information about Customs requirements. To learn how these requirements apply to articles which you may acquire while traveling abroad, obtain a copy from your nearest Customs office. "Customs Hints" are available at U.S. diplomatic and consular offices abroad, and at Passport Agencies in the U.S. A separate pamphlet "Customs Hints for Non-Residents" is also available.

• PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE

A smallpox vaccination within three years is an entry requirement when returning to the United States. Yellow fever and cholera vaccinations are also required if you visit an infected area. The vaccination(s) should be obtained before you leave. Vaccinations must be recorded on Form PHS-731, "International Certificates of Vaccination", and validated by a local or state health officer. You may obtain additional information from local health offices or the nearest Public Health Service facility.

• AGRICULTURE

The importation into the U.S. of certain agricultural items is restricted or prohibited entirely because they often contain pests or diseases that could cause immense damage to our crops, forests, or livestock. Import permits are required for most plants, seeds, bulbs, soil, meat or meat products, fruits, or vegetables. General information on this subject is contained in the pamphlet "Customs Hints". • TREASURY

2. Americans residing or sojourning abroad should apply for passports through the nearest American consulate.

4. Under the provisions of the Act of May 16, 1932, American passports are valid for two years from the date of issue unless limited to a shorter period. ABSTRACTS FROM PASSPORT REGULATIONS

1. Passports are issued in the United States by the Secretary of State, through the Passport Division, Department of State, Washington, D. C. Applications for passports should be made in person through clerks of Federal courts, clerks of State courts having jurisdiction in naturalization matters, or through passport agents of the Department of State. Passport agents of the Department of State are stationed at New York, Boston, Chicago, San Francisco, and the Department of State, Washington, D. C. Applications should be filed from 2 to 4 weeks before the passport is required, depending upon the distance from Washington.

2. Persons in the Philippine Islands desiring passports should make application to the United States High Commissioner, Manila. In the Virgin Islands, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, Guam, and American Samoa application should be made to the chief executives of those islands.

3. The passport fee, including \$1 for the execution of the application, is \$10. The fee for renewal of a passport is \$5. In the United States, passport and renewal fees should be submitted in currency or in postal money orders made payable to the Secretary of State, Washington, D. C.

4. The regulations provide that when the presumption of having ceased to be an American citizen has arisen against a naturalized American citizen under section 2 of the act of March 2, 1907, because of protracted foreign residence, his passport shall not be renewed until he shall have submitted to the Department of State or to a diplomatic or consular officer of the United States, evidence showing that the reason for such foreign residence comes within the rules prescribed by the Secretary of State whereunder such presumption may be overcome.

5. Americans making their homes or residing for a prolonged period abroad should register at the nearest American consulate.

IMPORTANT

Under the provisions of the Nationality Act of 1940, American nationality may be lost through being naturalized in, taking an oath or making a declaration of allegiance to, serving in military forces of, accepting employment under the government of, or by voting in the elections of a foreign state. Naturalized nationals may be expatriated by residing in the state from which they came for 2 years if through such residence the nationality of such foreign state is acquired, or by residing in such state for 3 years, or in any other foreign state for 5 years.

American nationals abroad may consult the nearest American diplomatic or consular officer for information as to specific provisions of the Nationality Act.

2. A person to whom a passport has been issued, who uses or attempts to use it in violation of the conditions or restrictions contained therein, may have the protection of the United States withdrawn from him while he continues to reside abroad and may be liable for prosecution under the provisions of section 221 of title 22, United States Code.

CAUTION
