Meeting of Trustees of Abba Hillel Silver Charitable and Educational Fund

June 23, 1953

Present: Rabbi Silver, S. M. Friedman, B. J. Krohngold, and Elizabeth Rice

The meeting was held following a meeting on the Ansel Road Project. Miss Rice reported on receipts and expenditures to date. Mr. Friedman stated that there is still outstanding an unpaid pledge of \$500 from Ernest Siegler and \$1,000 from David Katz. Miss Rice will check with Mr. Bamberger regarding Mr. Siegler's pledge and if he knows nothing about the matter, Mr. Friedman or Mr. Krohngold will get in touch with Mr. Siegler. Mr. Friedman suggested that they wait until later in the year to talk with Mr. Katz.

It was agreed that a small supply of letterheads and envelopes be ordered.

There was brief discussion concerning the salling of the Chrysler Corporation stock and replacing it with General Motors stock or some good bonds paying $4\frac{1}{2}\%$. It was decided to take no action until the fall.

Rabbi Silver presented the following requests for allocations:

(1)	Dr. Menahem Glenn for the publication of a book	\$100
(2)	Mosad Harav Kook, for the publication of the works of Maimonides	\$250
(3)	World Memorial of Jewish Martyrs in Paris	\$500
(4)	Abba Hillel Silver Agricultural School in Israel	\$1000
(5)	Local YMCA Campaign	\$5,00

It was agreed that these allocations be made.

As regards additional contributions to the Fund, Miss Rice explained that with the resumption of publication of The Temple Bulletin in the fall, announcement of all such contributions will be made in order to stimulate additional gifts.

Dear Dr. Silver:

It gives me great pleasure to inform you of the further growth and progress of the Hebrew Academy, Cleveland's only All-Day School.

You undoubtedly recall your recent visit at the Academy during which you observed the School at first hand and were able to observe its great accomplishments in the field of intensive Jewish Education in our community.

The steady influx of Refugee families has greatly added to the overburdened budget of the School. Today over fifty refugee families avail themselves of the benefits of the Academy at little or no cost. Some of these families have been brought here through the efforts of the Jewish Family Service and are as yet somewhat dependent on the Family Service for support. These families, however, are deeply imbued with a Religious feeling and Jewish tradition and their greatest wish is to give their children an intensive Jewish education. Most of these children come from the Glenville area.

The intensive education offered by the All-Day School gives the students the type of education they need which is most beneficial to them when they go to schools of higher learning. A great many students of the schools of higher learning have had the type of intensive education offered by the All-Day School. Many of our leaders have had this type of intensive educational background.

The Academy, however, is faced with a very heavy deficit in its current operations as well as capital indebtedness which really brings about a very grave situation. On the one hand we feel it our duty to offer the services of the school to all those desiring an intensive Jewish education, for Jewish education insures the very survival of our Jewish Community.

It is with these facts in mind that we would like to approach you for four (4) scholarships for needy students from the recently established Abba Hillel Silver Educational Scholarship Fund. A scholarship is \$510.00 which is the actual cost of a student for one year.

I know you will give this request your due consideration.



Dear Rabbi Silver:

I am writing to you on behalf of my friend, Dr. James W. Parkes, who is now in this country on a lecture tour for the Institutes of Judaism sponsored by the Union of American Hebrew Congregations and the Central Conference of American Rabbis.

I have known Dr. Parkes for many years, through both his scholarly writings and his extraordinary personality. Even while I was yet a rabbi in Germany, I became acquainted with his definitive scholarly work on "The Conflict of Synagogue and Church," which, perhaps more than any other single volume, probes both the real relations and the distinctiveness of Christianity and Judaism, and which, likewise, establishes Dr. Parkes' thesis concerning the eternal value of Judaism and its position as an indispensable force in contemporary life. Scarcely do we have a more true and sincere friend in the English-speaking world.

It has recently come to my attention that there is grave danger that Dr. Parkes, through his labor of love having used up his own small inheritance, might find it imperative to take a country parish in England and thereby be prevented from continuing his research, his writing, and his lecturing in this field in which he is undoubtedly one of the most formidable forces for good.

This must not come to pass, and ways and means must be found to make it possible not only for Dr. Parkes to complete the yet far from finished historical writing on the relationship of the Church and the Synagogue, and the Jew and the Christian, but, likewise, even to expand this enterprise more and more to find devoted disciples.

There is a desperate need for at least such financial aid as will make it possible for Dr. Parkes to continue his present tasks. For this an amount of about ten thousand dollars annually will be required from our American-Jewish community, either from individuals, foundations, or organizations.

I trust that you may be able to be of comprehensive and tangible assistance in this pressing matter and that you will be able to procure at your earliest convenience a substantial part of the above-mentioned figure.

For tax-deduction purposes only, the Union of American Hebrew Congregation has kindly indicated its willingness to handle these funds, which will be segregated for the use of Dr. Parkes' work only. You can therefore make your check payable to the Union of American Hebrew Congregations -- Dr. Parkes Fund.



Dear Rabbi Silver:

Today it is a crime in South Africa for black and white to talk together in a public meeting, study in the same school, live in the same neighborhood, or sit in the same restaurant, movie or hotel lobby. It is high treason to attempt to alter this system in any way, even by democratic means. Any man, woman or child, black or white, who advocates democracy based on equality of rights may be branded, according to a South African law, a communist or a traitor.

Millions of South Africans understandably find these conditions intolerable. Recently, 160 persons -- black and white -- who have been outspoken in their denunciation of the government's racial policy were arrested and charged with treason. This story is told in the enclosed reprint from the CHRISTIAN CENTURY. Among them were such outstanding persons as Z.K. Matthews, 'Henry Luce Visiting-Professor' at Union Theological Seminary in 1952-53, who is widely known in the United States. If moderate men are suppressed, there is little chance for democratic evolution in South Africa.

We have been urged by the Bishop of Johannesburg, The Right Reverend Ambrose Reeves; Allan Paton; Father Trevor Huddleston and others to establish a defense fund here to be used in two ways: first, to help provide those under arrest with the best possible legal defense. Second, to help meet the critical needs faced by their families.

The American Committee on Africa is uniquely equipped to deal with this appeal and has accepted the task of establishing a special South Africa Defense Fund. Because I believe the crisis in South Africa to be so dangerous and the situation there so obnoxious to all people of good will, I have accepted the Co-chairmanship of this Defense Fund together with the Very Reverend James A. Pike.

The tragic urgency of this situation demands our immediate attention. There is much more at stake than the guilt or innocence of 160 persons in South Africa; we are witnessing a test of enormously important values to the free nations of the world. For what better distinguishes democracy from tyranny than the right of free men to seek change constitutionally? I urge you to help us with your generous contribution, whether it be \$100., \$20., or \$5. Let us not fail those in South Africa who stand at the front lines in this struggle.


It may well be some time in the middle of this coming February I will fly over with Mr. Lichter to conclude the final arrangements for undertaking the actual building.

Bonds for Israel


The Israeli Government has agreed to permit the College-Institute to use Bonds

As you probably know, the building of the Library will start in 1958. While in previous years we had to give priority in fund raising to those buildings which were most urgently needed at the time, we are concentrating at this time on the Library. In particular, we are planning campaigns for the Abba Hillel Silver Wing and the first campaign takes place during the month of February in Toledo, Ohio.

As you know, we have to organize our campaigns according to the conditions the local Welfare Funds impose on us. We don't have mass campaigns but limit ourselves to approaching the top givers in each community. Dinners organized by us can, therefore, never bring tremendous crowds. On the other hand, they will always bring together the most outstanding groups of a community.

As you may know, Ned Lynde is retiring as executive director of the Welfare Federation of Cleveland on March 1, 1959. In an attempt to give appropriate recognition to his magnificent contributions to the Welfare Federation, to the Cleveland community, and to the profession of social work, the Federation Board of Trustees has created the Edward D. Lynde Fund.

Income from the Fund, at Mr. Lynde's request, will be used for special projects or purposes within the Welfare Federation for which no other money is available or obtainable. The Fund will be administered by the Federation Executive Committee.

In making a substantial initial contribution to the Fund, Federation President Edward H. deConingh stated: "Ned Lynde's lifetime of service to his fellow man and his unmatched contributions to his community deserve far more recognition than would come from the type of gift or tribute often presented a man on his retirement.

"I suggested the possibility that Mr. Lynde accept the income from the Fund during his lifetime, and that he designate a community enterprise to be the subsequent beneficiary. Typically, he rejected this idea and requested that all the income go into a special purpose fund at the Welfare Federation.

"This is further evidence of his selfless devotion to the welfare of others, which has characterized his leadership through the years. It will, I hope, provide even one more incentive for people to participate generously in the Fund, to help perpetuate the ideals and principles for which he has stood."

The Federation trustees enthusiastically endorsed Mr. deConingh's action and urged that the widest possible notice be given to creation of the Fund, both locally and in other cities.

You are cordially invited to participate in this tribute by making a contribution to the Fund, in any amount you desire. Checks should be made out to: Welfare Federation Edward D. Lynde Fund. This contribution is deductible for Federal income tax purposes. At your option, your gift may be spread over a period of years.

Whether or not you send a contribution, we hope you will write a letter addressed to Ned, on your personal or business stationery, and forward it to the attention of the Sponsoring Committee. We plan to place these tributes in an attractive embossed book, and present them to Ned at an appropriate occasion near the time of his retirement. To be included in the book such letters must be received by January 31, 1959.

Tentative plans call for this occasion to be the Welfare Federation's annual public luncheon meeting on February 24, 1959. Please mark this date on your calendar now, and if at all possible, plan to attend.
