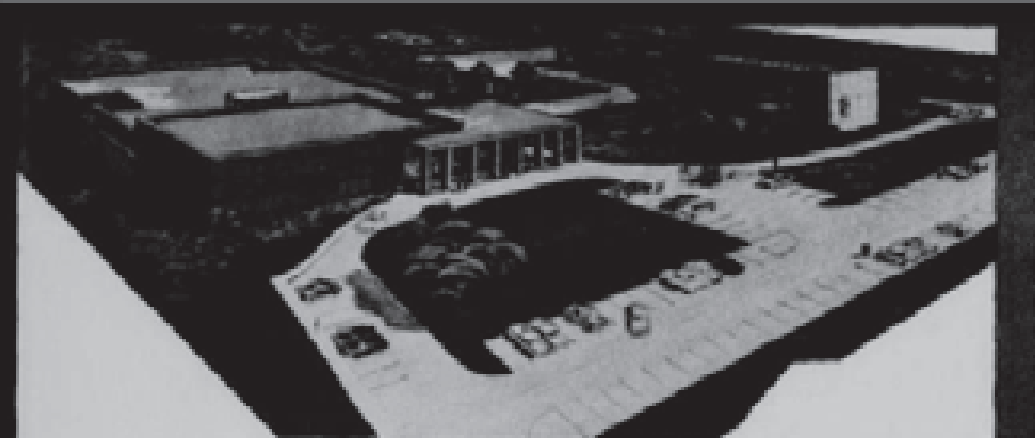
Dear Daniel:
