Cleveland, Ohio, January 14, 1958

Gentlemen:

"YEAR OF ACHIEVEMENT" was the theme for Greater Cleveland Council Scouting in 1957. This is the report . . . concise . . . to the point . . . Here are important facts and figures . . . many of which were calculated one year ago.

You will not find the story of Scouting on these pages, however . . . Character building is not a statistic . . . citizenship training is not charted . . . physical fitness is not something we can state on paper . . . Because of sound financing we were able to deliver an inspirational program.

The countless thousands of Den, Patrol and Crew meetings are not here recorded . . . You must read between the lines . . . beyond the fund-raising....and manpower....and reports of membership . . . for the real story of Scouting is found in the lives of boys.

I. MEMBERSHIP - Membership-wise it was a good year . . . The Greater Cleveland Council closed year with overall gain of 8% in boy membership . . . Council membership, including volunteer leaders, now numbers 38,796 . . . During 1957 total of 41,473 boys enrolled (including ins and outs) . . . Boys do grow ! ! January 1, 1958, we had 890 Units, gain of 80 over same date in 1957 . . . Grand Total adults and boys participating in 1957 was 56,437. Every fourteen seconds a new boy is born in America . . . a potential Cub and Scout in years ahead !

...Boys' Life Magazine...Council stands second in nation in percent of Scout-readers among Metropolitan Councils.

II. FINANCE - First Capital Funds Campaign in Council's history staged in 1957 . . . \$1,100,000 goal met successfully . . . Ellsworth H. Augustus led 4,000 workers in drive . . . Chief Scout Executive, Arthur A. Schuck, present for Campaign Kick-Off . . . Funds raised for new long-term camp, improvement at Beaumont and Chagrin Scout Reservations, development of short-term camp for west and southwest Units, and new Service Center. Beaumont improvements include: New swimming pool (through Beaumont Foundation) . . . Broadbent Lodge . . . Staff Lodge . . . new and improved roads . . . additional equipment and campsite improvement. Chagrin improvements include: Renovation of dining hall to serve 225 campers . . . storage building . . . new roads . . . general re-

novation of cabins . . improved water system.

NEGOTIATIONS have been started for new and larger long-term camp in Clendenning Area of Muskingum Water Conservancy District.

AGREEMENT REACHED WITH CITY OF CLEVELAND FOR LAND FOR NEW SERVICE CENTER.

We hope that our new Service Center will be under way in 1958 . . our offices are getting mighty crowded!

SUSTAINING MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM GOAL OF \$150,000 pointing up rapid growth of Council and increased membership potential . . Sam H. Elliott selected to serve as Chairman . . initial stages launched in 1957.

COUNCIL IS APPRECIATIVE of Welfare Federation and Cleveland Community Chest support . . (And by the way . . THE COUNCIL CLOSED THE FINANCIAL YEAR IN THE BLACK !!)

III. CAMPING - Long-Term camping . . six days or more . . More Scouts and Explorers camped at Beaumont and Chagrin Reservations than ever before . . Chagrin had centralized feeding for first time, in renovated, reconditioned Hard Hall . . 321 Unit Camps in summer of 1957, increase of 10% . . 4,236 different Scouts in long-term camping . . a gain of 500 boys . . 1,684 short-term Unit Camps....attended by 20,956 Scouts and Explorers . . increase of more than 1,000.

PRE-JAMBOREE TRAINING ON THE MALL - First time City of Cleveland has turned this area over to anyone for camping - (officially !!) Compliments by Mayor Celebreeze on successful camp !

CLEVELAND'S PARTICIPATION in NATIONAL JAMBOREE was probably our biggest event . . Council sent 439 Scouts and Leaders to Valley Forge . . save for the host councils (Valley Forge and Philadelphia), Cleveland's was the largest delegation in America ! Sixteen of our finest Explorers and Earl Nelson, East Shore D.C., represented Council at British Jubilee !

District Camporees . . total of 4,273 Scouts and Explorers . . . 417 Explorers at Council Explorer Expedition at Beaumont in October . . 45 Explorers had mountain-top experience at Philmont Scout Ranch, New Mexico.

IV. LEADERSHIP TRAINING - Training program reached new high with 66% of top Unit Leaders trained . . increase of 10% . . 240 basic training courses conducted . . 1,714 Scouters receiving Certificates . . Scouter Keys and Awards presented to 132 . . Ten Den Mothers' Workshops provided training for 613 Den Mothers . . Four Junior Leaders' Courses trained 272 Junior Leaders . . 140 Senior Patrol Leaders trained for camp responsibility . . 87 Den Chiefs trained in four courses . . Monthly Roundtable programs throughout the year had attendance of 9,522 Scouters . . Other events included two Cubbers' Pow Wows . . Commissioners' Training Conference . . Charter Review Training sessions . . "Train the Trainer" courses . . Scouter Family Training at Philmont Scout Ranch . . Weekend Training at Schiff Scout Reservation, Mendham, New Jersey.

V. HEALTH AND SAFETY - 435 Unit meeting places inspected . . Rifle Range established at Chagrin Scout Reservation . . Scout and Explorer recognitions included 15 Scout Life Guard Awards . . 74 Emergency Service Explorer Awards . . 92 Life Saving Merit Badges awarded . . Every Scout camper received a physical examination.

VI. ADVANCEMENT - Increased interest in advancement resulted in 41% gain in Cub Advancements . . . 20% in Scout Advancements . . . 67% in Explorer Ranks . . . Totals - Cub Ranks, 10,132 . . . Scout Ranks, 3,793 . . . Explorer Ranks, 530 . . . Merit Badge work rose 20% to total of 7,450 Merit Badges in 94 different subjects . . . 76 Scouts and Explorers earned Eagle Rank . . . 18 Explorers earned Explorer Silver Award . . . Eagle Scout Association established, men who earned Eagle Rank as boys . . . Training of Merit Badge Counsellors . . . Grand Total Ranks Earned . . . 14,549.

VII. ACTIVITIES - 1957 was year of great activity in every phase of program . . . Outstanding Council-wide activities include Twenty-Fifth Annual Good Turn for Goodwill, Scouts collected 9,000 bags of clothing from 101,000 homes . . . Co-Ed Capers . . . Explorer activity with 245 young men and young women participating . . . Explorer Career Conference at Western Reserve University, annual highlight for young men looking forward to college . . . 300 in attendance . . . Boy Scout Week Celebration . . . Window Displays . . . Blue and Gold Banquets . . . Troop Reunions . . . Religious Activities . . . and thousand upon thousand of Daily Good Turns.

VIII. RELATIONSHIPS - Boys intensely desire to become Scouts . . . adults willing to support the program . . . when they learn of Scouting . . . Publicity media . . . newspapers . . . radio . . . television . . . house organs . . . have helped in telling our story . . . Thanks a Million ! !

Council has responsibility to make sure that sponsors and potential sponsors understand program and accept it . . . Great progress in 1957 in relationships . . . Protestant Church Federation . . . Roman Catholic Church . . . Jewish Temples and Synagogues . . . Scouting works ever closer to these basic institutions of our community.

Ad Altare Dei Medal (Catholic sponsored) earned by 62 in 1957 . . . God and Country Award (Protestant Sponsored) earned by 41 . . . Ner Tamid Award (Jewish Sponsored) earned by 5 . . . Parvuli Dei Award for Cub age boys of Catholic Faith adopted by Diocese of Cleveland . . . Annual Sisters' Conference attended by 110 nuns . . . 92 Scouts and Explorers, pastors and parents attended God and Country Award Recognition Dinner.

Hyer Martin, from Louisville, Ky. . . John Claerhout, Director of Relationships, from Toledo . . . Don Garrett, from Trans-Atlantic Council, Heidelberg, Germany . . . Don Sater, one of our own Cleveland boys . . . These fellows, along with 22 other capable staff men are helping to bring the Greater Cleveland Council to the top among metropolitan councils.

F-L-A-S-H . . . Hyer Martin became a Field Director on January 10, 1958 . . . Garrett succeeds him as District Executive of Southwest District.

We can be proud of the type of man who serves on our Executive Board. No doubt this has a lot to do with the quality of Scouting in the Greater Cleveland Council . . . Council Committees deliberate constantly in effort to fulfill responsibility to administer Scouting in Council . . . Scouting goes on every hour of the day and every day of the year among thousands of men and boys !

The Greater Cleveland Council is proud of all of its Scouters and their grand accomplishments in the year 1957 !

MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING

Greater Cleveland Council - Boy Scouts of America

May 19, 1959

The May meeting of the executive board of the Greater Cleveland Council, Boy Scouts of America, was held in the Ohio Room of the Statler Hilton Hotel on Tuesday, May 19, 1959 with President Joseph R. Fawcett presiding.

SUMMARY OF ACTIONS TAKEN - - The board took the following actions;

1. APPROVED the development of a resolution in the memory of George D. Webster to be prepared, adopted and a copy sent to Mrs. Webster. Motion made by Mr. McIntosh; seconded by Mr. Bauhof and passed unanimously.
2. APPROVED the minutes of the April 21st executive board meeting. Motion made by Mr. Firman; seconded by Mr. Hauserman and passed unanimously.
3. APPROVED the April Treasurer's Report as presented by Mr. Bauhof. Motion made by Mr. Clements; seconded by Mr. Bicknell and passed unanimously.
4. APPROVED the appointment of Mr. Frank Merrill to serve as the district commissioner of the Southeast District. Motion made by Mr. Peebles; seconded by Mr. Hauserman and passed unanimously.
5. ADOPTED a resolution, as recommended by the finance committee, authorizing the raising of the council supply service credit limit from \$4,500 to \$8,500 during the camping season of 1959. Motion made by Mr. McIntosh; seconded by Mr. Gries and passed unanimously.

6. ADOPTED three resolutions as presented by the camping committee:

- A. That the executive board adopt a proposed reallocation of capital funds previously allocated for camp development. Motion made by Mr. Firman; seconded by Mr. Thayer and passed unanimously.
- B. That the executive board appropriate from the capital fund an amount to be used for the purchase of the Bower, Siwinski and Douglas properties to form a new short term camp and authorize the camping committee to complete the purchase of the same. Motion made by Mr. Firman; seconded by Judge Jackson and passed unanimously.
- C. That the executive board authorize the camping committee to:
 - (1) Negotiate for acquisition of a five to ten acre section of land at the northeast corner of the Kolenski property.
 - (2) Negotiate for the acquisition of additional acreage south of the Bower, Siwinski and Douglas properties.

Motion made by Mr. Clements; seconded by Mr. Eisele and adopted unanimously.

SUMMARY OF DISCUSSIONS AND REPORTS

- I. CALL TO ORDER - - The meeting was called to order by Council President Joseph R. Fawcett. Mr. Fawcett called to the attention of the board members present the following items contained in their board folders; the April finance report, the April membership report, and a copy of the Cleveland Press editorial entitled "Those Who Serve Youth Serve America."

Mr. Fawcett called on Dr. Brown, chairman of the Protestant Committee on Scouting, who made an announcement concerning the first annual retreat for Scouts of the protestant faith to be held Friday and Saturday, June 26 and 27, 1959 at the Chagrin Scout Reservation.

Mr. Fawcett also reported briefly on the results of a staff morale survey made by Sears Roebuck Company some months ago. He advised the board that the study revealed a very high morale in the professional staff and not so high in the office staff. The Scout executive is taking steps to correct the latter situation.

Mr. Fawcett invited interested board members to participate in making approximately \$100 worth of camping equipment available to Scouts at the Hudson Boys' Farm.

Mr. Fawcett asked the pleasure of the board regarding a resolution to be developed and adopted in the memory of the late George D. Webster. It was moved by Mr. McIntosh; seconded by Mr. Bauhof that a proper resolution be prepared, adopted and a copy be sent to Mrs. Webster. Motion passed unanimously. Mr. Fawcett asked Dr. Broadbent to prepare such a resolution.

(Call to Order - Continued)

Mr. Fawcett advised the board that Mr. Harry Jackson, a member of the executive board, had been reported ill and in Lakeside Hospital for observation.

The next executive board meeting will be held Tuesday, June 16th in the Pine Room of the Statler Hilton Hotel.

- II. MINUTES OF THE APRIL MEETING - - Copies of the minutes of the April executive board meeting had been mailed to each member. It was moved by Mr. Firman; seconded by Mr. Hauserman that the minutes be approved as mailed. Motion passed unanimously.

- III. TREASURER'S REPORT - - Mr. Bauhof, vice president and treasurer, reviewed the April finance report and provided a copy for each board member. Mr. Bauhof pointed out that there were five budget items running over the seasonal budget allocation and gave a detailed explanation on each item. A copy of the comments is attached with the finance report and the executive board minute book. The report showed a total of \$22,846.66 cash on deposit in the operating, revolving and sundry accounts as of April 30, 1959 and total net resources of \$224,844.93. Budget requirements for the balance of 1959 totaled \$248,568.50, thus leaving \$3,723.57 needed to balance.

The capital account report showed a cash balance of \$30,706.40 as of April 30, 1959 and total capital resources in the amount of \$336,261.70. It was moved by Mr. Clements; seconded by Mr. Bicknell that the Treasurer's Report be accepted as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

- IV. SCOUT COMMISSIONER'S REPORT - - Mr. Peebles, Scout commissioner, reported on the activities and administration of the council commissioner program and called the attention of the board to the membership report included in each board member's folder.

Mr. Peebles presented the name of Frank Merrill for appointment to serve as the district commissioner of the Southeast District. It was moved by Mr. Peebles that Mr. Merrill be appointed; seconded by Mr. Hauserman. Motion passed unanimously.

- V. STATUS AND PROGRESS REPORT - SUSTAINING MEMBERSHIP CAMPAIGN - - Mr. Bauhof, chairman of the 1959 Sustaining Membership Enrollment Program, reported in considerable detail the status and progress to date of the Sustaining Membership Enrollment. Mr. Bauhof reviewed all phases of the campaign and pointed out the particular areas where help and attention were needed. He emphasized that particular help was needed from board members in the Leadership Gifts section. This phase must raise \$60,000 of the \$182,000 campaign goal. A detailed copy of Mr. Bauhof's report is included with the official minutes.

VI. COMMITTEE REPORTS

A. Finance Committee

Mr. McIntosh, council chairman of finance, reported briefly on the May meeting of the council finance committee and presented a resolution approved and recommended by the finance committee for adoption by the executive board.

BE IT RESOLVED: That the executive board authorize the raising of the council supply service credit limit from \$4,500 to \$8,500 during the camping season of 1959 as approved by the finance committee.

SCHEDULE OF PREPARATION:

Approved by the council finance committee - May 11, 1959.

It was moved by Mr. McIntosh; seconded by Mr. Gries that the resolution be adopted. Motion passed unanimously.

B. Camping Committee

Mr. Firman, chairman of the council camping committee, made a chart presentation of a proposed reallocation of capital funds for camp. Mr. Firman told the group that the reallocation had been developed by the council camping committee, studied and recommended by the capital funds committee, studied and approved by the council finance committee and approved by the executive committee.

He then presented a picture of the proposed new short term camp near Belden, Ohio and reviewed in detail with the board members the properties the camp committee deemed necessary for the acquisition of an adequate short term camp as provided for in the Greater Cleveland Plan. Mr. Firman then presented the following resolution for adoption by the executive board:

BE IT RESOLVED: That the Executive Board of the Greater Cleveland Council, Boy Scouts of America, adopt a proposed reallocation of capital funds previously allocated for camp development, as developed by the Council Camping Committee, recommended by the Capital Funds Committee and approved by the Council Finance Committee. A copy of the reallocation details are attached to this resolution.

SCHEDULE OF PREPARATION:

Recommended by the Capital Funds Committee - May 11, 1959.

Approved by the Finance Committee - May 11, 1959.

Approved by the executive committee - May 12, 1959.

Adoption of the foregoing resolution was moved by Mr. Firman; seconded by Mr. Thayer. The resolution was adopted unanimously.

(Camping Committee Report - Continued)

Mr. Firman then presented a resolution to authorize the purchase of three main tracts of land needed to form the new short term camp.

BE IT RESOLVED: That the Executive Board of the Greater Cleveland Council, hereby, appropriates from the Capital Fund, such amount as the Executive Committee of the Board has or may, hereafter, approve, to be used for the purchase of the Bower, Siwinski and Douglas properties to form a new short term camp near Belden, Ohio, and authorizes the Camping Committee to complete the purchase of the same.

SCHEDULE OF PREPARATION:

Recommended by the Camping Committee - April 29, 1959.
Approved by the Capital Funds Committee - May 11, 1959.
Approved by the Finance Committee - May 11, 1959.
Approved by the Executive Committee - May 12, 1959.

Adoption of the foregoing resolution was moved by Mr. Firman; seconded by Judge Jackson. The resolution was adopted unanimously.

Mr. Firman then presented a third resolution to authorize the camp committee to negotiate for certain small adjacent tracts needed to complete the new short term camp as outlined in the Greater Cleveland Plan.

BE IT RESOLVED: That the Executive Board of the Greater Cleveland Council, at the request of the Council Camping Committee, authorize the Camping Committee to:

- A. Negotiate for acquisition by purchase or exchange, a five to ten acre section of land at the northeast corner of the Kolenski property so as to control the main stream running through the new short term camp.
- B. Negotiate for the acquisition of additional acreage south of the Bower, Siwinski and Douglas properties to provide sufficient land for the effective development and the use of the new short term camp.

SCHEDULE OF PREPARATION:

Recommended by the Camping Committee - April 29, 1959.

Adoption of the foregoing resolution was moved by Mr. Clements; seconded by Mr. Eisele and the resolution as adopted unanimously.

May 19, 1959

Following the adoption of the three resolutions Mr. Dixon, chairman of the Frontier District, thanked Mr. Firman and the council camping committee on behalf of the boys and leaders in his district for all the work done to secure the new campsite. Mr. Eisele, chairman of the Thunderbird District, and Mr. McIlvain, chairman of the West Shores District, expressed their sincere appreciation for the work of the camping committee and the decision of the executive board in making the new short term camp possible. They praised all concerned for the decision to serve the needs of boys first.

There being no further business to come before the board, the meeting was adjourned to meet again on Tuesday, June 16th in the Pine Room of the Statler Hilton Hotel.
