
Dear Dan:

Dear Rabbi Silver:

Your letter of agreement to participate in the Case Institute Commencement Convocation on June 13 has been received by Dr. Glennan. He asked that I extend to you his appreciation for your acceptance and suggested that I answer your question of protocol.

Robes and hoods are worn for this Convocation by all members of the faculty and the principal participants of the Commencement ceremony. Therefore, you should wear robe and hood. I note you have your own. Since the Commencement participants will robe in Dr. Glennan's office after the luncheon in the Tudor Arms Hotel, I suggest that you leave your robe and hood with Dr. Glennan's secretary, Miss Thorley, on your way to the Tudor Arms Hotel unless you find that inconvenient.

Now may I ask you a question? The faculty and candidates for graduation will wear the traditional academic caps. Do you prefer to wear your own cap or may I provide the conventional cap for you? This should be a matter entirely of your preference. As an aid for you I am enclosing a copy of the Commencement program of last year since the relative order of the invocation will be the same this year. The invocation is given without introduction and it follows the National Anthem.

We are delighted that you and Mrs. Silver will attend the luncheon at the Tudor Arms Hotel on Thursday, June 13 at 12:00 Noon. The principal figures of the Commencement exercise to follow have been invited to this luncheon and approximately 45 people will attend. It is informal. Dr. Glennan will ask you to return thanks before the luncheon.

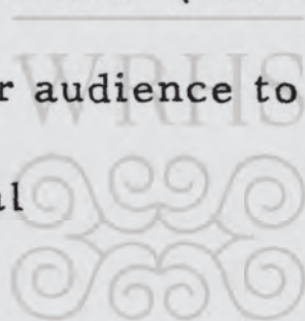

Candidates for the Bachelor's degree will be presented by Dean Karl B. McEachron, Jr. All degrees are awarded upon the recommendation of the faculty and by authority from the Board of Trustees.

McEachron: Will all the candidates for the degree of Bachelor of Science please rise.

Mr. President: I have the honor to present the candidates for the degree of Bachelor of Science. These men, whose names appear in the program of the day, have completed the requirements prescribed by the faculty.

President: I confer upon each of you the degree of Bachelor of Science in your respective field as designated in the program, together with all the rights and privileges and responsibilities pertaining thereto. Will you please come forward and, as your name is called, receive your diploma.

President: In addition to the degrees conferred, I confer IN ABSENTIA, the degree of Doctor of Philosophy on the following. (READ NAMES OF CANDIDATES WHO HAVE FINISHED THEIR WORK BUT ARE UNABLE TO BE PRESENT.)

President: HONORARY DEGREES

The degrees just conferred have all been degrees in course, which means that the persons on whom they were conferred studied for them in residence and met specific requirements set up for each degree. In addition to these degrees in course, Case long has had the custom of conferring degrees of another sort. These are known as honorary degrees and are not based upon residence or upon specific requirements. Instead, they are of broader scope. In awarding honorary degrees, Case seeks to give recognition to men whose careers give evidence of rare achievement and outstanding service to mankind.

I now recognize Dr. Hrones, Vice President for Academic Affairs.

(Dr. Hrones steps forward.)

(Wolfgang Panofsky steps to the mark (x) designated on the floor near the center of the platform to face Dr. Glennan.)

Dr. Hrones: Mr. President: I have the honor of presenting Wolfgang K. F. Panofsky for the Honorary Degree of Doctor of Science.

President: Wolfgang K. F. Panofsky.....etc. (Read citation in diploma folder.)

(Dean Hooper hands the president the diploma, the president will present the diploma with his left hand and clasp the right hand in congratulation while Mr. Legge places the hood on the candidate.)

(Dr. Panofsky returns to his seat.)

Dr. Hrones: Mr. President: I have the honor of presenting Herbert A. Simon for the Honorary Degree of Doctor of Science.

(Herbert Simon steps to the mark (x) designated on the floor near the center of the platform to face Dr. Glennan.)

President: Herbert A. Simon.....etc. (Read citation in diploma folder.)

(Dean Hooper hands..... Mr. Legge places hood on the candidate.)

(Dr. Simon returns to his seat.)



Dr. Hrones: Mr. President: I have the honor of presenting William Prager for the Honorary Degree of Doctor of Science.

(William Prager steps to the mark (x) designated on the floor near the center of the platform to face Dr. Glennan.)

President: William Prager.....etc. (Read citation in diploma folder.)

(Dean Hooper hands.....Mr. Legge places hood on the candidate.)

(Dr. Prager returns to his seat.)

Dr. Hrones: Mr. President: I have the honor of presenting Warren L. Morris for the Honorary Degree of Doctor of Laws.

(Warren Morris steps to the mark (x) designated on the floor near the center of the platform to face Dr. Glennan.)

President: Warren L. Morris.....etc. (Read citation in diploma folder.)

(Dean Hooper hands.....Mr. Legge places hood on the candidate.)

(Dr. Morris returns to his seat.)

Dr. Hrones: Mr. President: I have the honor of presenting Marcel Roche for the Honorary Degree of Doctor of Science.

(Marcel Roche steps to the mark (x) designated on the floor near the center of the platform to face Dr. Glennan.)

President: Marcel Roche.....etc. (Read citation in diploma folder.)

(Dean Hooper hands.....Mr. Legge places hood on the candidate.)

(Dr. Roche returns to his seat.)

President: Will announce reception for graduates at Tomlinson Hall.
