MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CLEVELAND MUSEUM OF ART. Held at the Union Club, Cleveland, Ohio, on Thursday, November 15, 1973 at 11:45 a.m.

Taft, Paul J. Vignos, Jr., John S. Wilbur, Lewis C. Williams, and Mrs. Joseph E. Gardner, ex-officio. Also present were A. Beverly Barksdale, Assistant Secretary and Acting Director, and Albert J. Grossman, Assistant Treasurer and Operations Administrator.

Mr. Lewis C. Williams, Fresident of the Board of Trustees, presided and called the meeting to order. The Assistant Secretary certified that a quorum of duly elected Trustees was present.

The President offered the reading of the Minutes of the last Annual Meeting of the Board of Trustees held on December 4, 1972, and stated they had been circulated.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was voted to accept the Minutes as prepared and circulated.

The President offered the reading of the Minutes of the last regular meeting of the Board of Trustees held on August 15, 1973 and stated they had been circulated.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was voted to accept the Minutes as prepared and circulated.

Mr. Barksdale said that there had been four resignations but that only one person, Mr. Burton, who was in charge of Public Relations and Membership, would be replaced. He commented on certain additions to the staffs of the Library and the Department of Art History and Education. Dr. Vignos asked how many additional persons this represented and Mr. Barksdale replied that it was a net of two. (N.B. With two retirements scheduled for January 1, the net figure will be reduced to zero.)

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was

VOTED: to reappoint the Staff as listed above and recommended by the Acting Director.

Mr. Barksdale gave the Membership Report for the third quarter of 1973 and also that of the month of October. He noted that we continue to hold a gain over the same periods in 1972. He said that over the past two years we have experienced a little more growth during this particular period of the year, but because of the fact no one has been in charge of Membership since Mr. Burton left in August, the gain was not as appreciable. (Copies are attached as Appendices B and C).

The President noted that a group of public relations specialists have been formed into an Ad Hoc Advisory Committee under the leadership of Henry Hopwood to assist the Museum and evaluating its public relations program. As a result, the Museum has engaged

Fred Walker as a consultant, and he is currently serving as Acting Head of the Public Relations Department. Mr. Barksdale added that a nationwide search is underway and it is hoped the field will be narrowed to two or three of the most promising candidates to be interviewed by Sherman Lee when he returns in December.

Upon the recommendation of the Curators concerned and the Director, and upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was

VOTED: to approve the loans with the understanding that the usual expenses and other conditions required by the Museum be met.

Upon the recommendation of the Curator concerned and the Director, and upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was

VOTED: to approve the action of the Director in declining this loan.

Mr. Barksdale reminded the Trustees that for the past several years it had been customary for the Board to authorize the Director to spend up to \$100,000 for possible purchase of works of art in Japan. This was presented to the Accessions Committee at its meeting on October 15. He said Mr. Millikin had suggested that this be increased to \$125,000 because of the rising prices within the last year. This was approved by the Accessions Committee and the ratification of the Board of Trustees is needed.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was

VOTED: to ratify the action of the Accessions Committee in authorizing the Director to spend up to \$125,000 for possible purchase of works of art in Japan.

The Accessions Committee approved a change in the Minutes of its meeting of September 8, 1971 to correct an entry which read:71.107 Drypoint by Milton Avery, "Gift of Lucia McBride and Malcolm R. McBride in memory of their mother, Lucia McCurdy McBride" to "Gift of Barbara Bradley in honor of Mary G. Ballou".

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was

VOTED: to approve this change in the Minutes of the meeting of the Accessions Committee of September 8, 1971.

Board ratification is needed for the approval given by the Accessions Committee to a request of the Textile Department for removal of the following items from the collection (these are all needed for the Buyid Research Project):

- 68.225 Fragment (6x72cm) removed from smaller piece of this textile, Iran, Buyid period, silk weave. Purchase from the J. H. Wade fund.
- 68.230 Fragment (ca. 8xll cm) removed from sleeve portion of fragmentary tunic. Iran, Buyid period, silk.
   Purchase from the J. H. Wade Fund.
- 68.247 Whole piece (8.3x34.2 cm) sent. Iran, Buyid-10th century, silk weave. Gift of Mr. Ayyub Rabenou.
- TR 15730/8 Being acquired as apparatus from Loewi-Robertson for this purpose exclusively. Iran, Buyid, period, silk weave.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was

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VOTED: to ratify the approval of the Accessions Committee of the request of the Textile Department for the removal of these items from the collection.

It was requested that the loan dates of the Italian Renaissance Exhibition be extended from June 15 to October 7, to June 15, 1973 to January 13, 1974, in order that the

exhibition might also be shown at the California Palace of the Legion of Honor, San Francisco. This involves 52.109 Book Cover, silver and niello with silver gilt borders, Italy, Florence, ca. 1467-1469.

Upon the recommendation of the Curator and the Director, it was

VOTED: to approve this loan extension and the inclusion of the showing in San Francisco.

It was stated that the Asia Society of New York had requested this Museum to put together for them an exhibition of our own works to be entitled, "The Colors of Ink". It involves the loan of 47 Chinese paintings and 19 Chinese ceramics which will be shown there between January 10, 1974 and March 3, 1974. This exhibition is to replace another which had been cancelled. This loan request was approved by the Accessions Committee and needs to be ratified by the Board of Trustees. A complete list of these works is attached as Appendix D.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was

VOTED: to ratify the action of the Accessions Committee in approving this request for loan.

The President reminded the Trustees of the continuing resolution authorizing the Director to accept gifts to the Museum between the last Trustees Meeting and the end of the calendar year (reference: Trustees Meeting, 12/4/61.

The President asked the Chairman of the Finance Committee and the Operations Administrator to discuss the proposed Budget for 1974 as distributed to the members present. The Chairman recommended that the Board of Trustees accept it as presented and, further, that they request appropriations from The John Huntington Art and Polytechnic Trust in the amount of \$870,000 for operations, \$80,493.87 to cover the accumulated operating deficits of the past two years, and \$500,000 to be added to The John Huntington Fund for Operations; and that \$75,000 be requested from The Horace Kelley Art Foundation. This will leave an estimated deficit for 1974 in the amount of \$158,220.49.

The requests to the Trust and to the Foundation are in accordance with the basic agreement among the Trust, the Foundation and the Museum dated May 10, 1955, but effective as of May 1, 1955.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried (with the exception noted below), it was

VOTED: to approve the Budget for 1974 for \$3,649,136.46 and to authorize the President and the Director to submit written requests to The John Huntington Art and Polytechnic Trust for appropriations totaling \$1,450,493.87 and The Horace Kelley Art Foundation for an appropriation of \$75,000.

During the discussion of the Budget, Dr. Silver asked Mr. Grossman about the budgeted deficits of the Sales Desk and the Restaurant. Mrs. Gardner said that the Junior Council is attempting to work out a plan to provide volunteer help for the Sales Desk. If successful, this would be in lieu of one salaried person and some part-time help. Dr. Silver

asked how much of the budgeted deficit for the Restaurant is attributable to the 50% discount offered to members of the Staff and further stated that our prices to the public ought to be raised sufficiently to put the Restaurant on a break-even basis. The President asked that the Staff make a study of this and suggested that the Officers meet with the Staff to consider this.

The President stated that the letters of solicitation for Phase IV of the Gallery Renc-vation Program would be going in the mail to members and friends of the Museum the next day, November 16. Mr. Barksdale said that this project is budgeted at \$297,000, one-half of which has been requested from the National Endowment for the Arts and the other half to be raised as we did for Phase III. The National Council meets on November 30 and December 1. We should have informal word shortly thereafter as to what we may expect.

Mr. Barksdale requested the Trustees to appropriate the following sums for the use of the Accessions Committee to cover purchases authorized at their meeting of October 15, 1973:

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was

VOTED: to appropriate for the use of the Accessions Committee the amounts they have requested as hereinabove listed from the income of the funds available for the purchase of works of art.

Mr. Barksdale stated that the Director suggested that we institute in 1974 the practice of charging our affiliate organizations (Junior Council, The Print Club of Cleveland, The Textile Arts Club, and The Musart Society) for labor in addition to the cost of supplies for work done in the Print Shop. This would relieve the deficit of that operation by about \$2,000 a year.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was

VOTED: to institute a charge for labor in the printing of material for our affiliate organizations, and to so inform these organizations immediately.

Mr. Barksdale reported that the Museum had been given a mantelpiece from one of the Goldsmith houses around Painesville by Mr. and Mrs. Peter Hitchcock in 1963. It already had a Goldsmith mantelpiece which was given by Mrs. A. Dean Perry in 1959. Recently Mrs. Hitchcock requested that the Museum release this mantel, which has never been on display, to The Western Reserve Historical Society for placement in a Goldsmith house which is being reconstructed at the Hale Homestead and which is lacking a mantel on the second floor. Since it is felt by both the Director and Mr. Hawley, the curator in charge, that we will never need two mantelpieces, they recommend to the Board of Trustees that this mantel be released to The Western Reserve Historical Society as requested by Mr. and Mrs. Hitchcock, and the desire for the mantel confirmed in a letter from Meredith B. Colket, Director of The Western Reserve Historical Society.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was

VOTED: to release this mantelpiece to The Western Reserve Historical Society with the understanding that it be used in the reconstruction of the Goldsmith House at the Hale Homestead.

Mr. Barksdale announced two recent grants to the Museum:

(1) \$20,000 from the Ohio Arts Council to be divided as follows:

\$10,000 for support of educational projects, particularly those in conjunction with the African Show;

\$ 5,000 for Extension Exhibitions;

\$ 5,000 for conservation.

(2) He has been informed by phone that the Lincoln Electric Foundation is going to make a grant in the amount of \$2,500 to the Museum in early 1974 to be used primarily in support of educational work for children. He commented that this was inde∈d a break-through because this particular foundation has not supported any cultural organization in the past and is not only making grants to our organization but to the Cleveland Orchestra, The Western Reserve Historical Society and The Cleveland Museum of Natural History.

The President then asked Mr. Ireland to report on his conversation with The Medical Center Co. with regard to the energy crisis and heat and electricity for the institutions in the University Circle which subscribe to its services. Mr. Ireland said that he had been informed that there is no immediate prospect of there not being enough heat to take care of the University Circle organizations through the approaching winter. Ee said that he was asked two very pertinent questions which he had passed on to Mr. Barksdale for further study:

- (1) In the event of emergency, what is the lowest temperature the Museum could tolerate to keep its collections in good condition and its programs in operation?
- (2) In the event of really serious emergency, what are the absolute minimum requirements for maintaining the collections in good condition?

Mr. Barksdale added that this will be discussed at the next meeting of the curators and that he will also consult with our conservators and with Mr. Yencho.

## JANUARY 1973 -- JANUARY 1974

A scholarly and most successful lecture series, "Buddhism and the Arts of Thailand", was sponsored by the Junior Council in coordination with the exhibition, "The Sculpture of Thailand". The four lectures, beginning January 9th and concluding February 6th proved to be most popular with a wide segment of the community and the net profit exceeded that of any previous lecture series.

The Council revised its Rules and Regulations to incorporate a new category of membership known as Contributing. The purpose of this was to provide council members who have completed ten years of active service, an opportunity to decide each year whether they would like to continue in an active status or select the contributing category which contains all the rights of membership without the volunteer obligations.

A highlight of the year was the letter from Dr. Lee inviting the chairman of the Council to serve as an ex-officio member of the Board of Trustees.

The continuing services of the Council are the Information Desk, the supervision of the display of flowering plants in the Garden Court and the Art Carts in University and St. Luke's Hospitals which happily acquired a large number of prints from the closing of the Museum's lending library print collection.

Seventy-eight members gave willingly of their time to help with seven special events which included a number of home dinner parties and, for the first time, council members assisted the Museum staff with May Show registration entries as well as the usual sales help during the preview and opening day of the May Show.

The Council chairman and program chairman represented the Museum at the four-day convention of the Volunteer Committees of Art Museums in Baltimore in October.

The President asked Mr. Perry, Chairman, for the report of the Finance Comittee and the presentation of the budget for 1974. Mr. Perry stated that the Committee had met the preceding day and accepted the proposed budget. Copies were distributed to the Trustees. Mr. Perry then asked the Director to review the pertinent points and to make appropriate explanation. After this was done, the Chairman recommended that the Board of Trustees accept the Budget as presented and further, that they request appropriations from The John Huntington Art & Polytechnic Trust in the amount of \$1,100,000 for Operations, and that \$85,000 be requested from The Horace Kelley Art Foundation. This will leave an estimated deficit for 1975 in the amount of \$120,144.05.

The requests to the Trust and Foundation are in accordance with the basic agreement among the Trust, the Foundation and the Museum, dated May 10, 1955, but effective as of May 1, 1955.

The Director reminded the Trustees of the continuing resolution authorizing him to accept gifts to the Museum, between the last Trustees' meeting and the end of the calendar year (Reference: Trustees' Meeting, 12/4/61).

The Director reported that Phase IV of the Gallery Renovation program is nearing completion and that the collection of 19th century art was now being reinstalled in the West Wing. All of this should be ready in time for a Donors' Reception and preview of the galleries on Monday afternoon, December 16. He said that the two galleries housing the reinstalled collections of African and Oceanic Arts were opened around the beginning of September. To date we have raised \$151,877.00 to match the grant of \$50,000 from the National Endowment for the Arts.

Phase V, the final part of this program, is slated for 1975 and will involve the galleries of the 1916 building. He said that these plans are still being formulated and would be more complex than those of the earlier phases because of the necessity of aiding climate controls to specific areas of the building. The Director said that Mr. Hawley, Curator of Post-Renaissance Decorative Arts, had requested permission to dispose of eight plates and eight glasses made by Tiffany around the turn of the century, which came to the Museum as part of the Bequest of Edgar A. Hahn. Two plates and three glasses have already been accessioned and this is all that we could possibly exhibit. The Director added that there were no restrictions in the Hahn Bequest. Mr. Hawley proposes that they be sold at auction at Parke-Bernet where they will bring the best prices. Any monies realized in this fashion will be used for purchase of late 19th and early 20th century decorative arts. He recommended approval of Mr. Hawley's request.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was

VOTED: to approve the sale at auction of the eight plates and eight glasses made by Tiffany which were part of the Hahn Bequest.

The Director reported that letters of appreciation had been received from Mrs. Thomas Munro and Mrs. Paul D. Wurzburger after they had received copies of the Memorial Tribute to their respective husbands.

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#### IN MEMORIAM

### RALPH S. SCHMITT

1894-1974

The death of Ralph S. Schmitt on September 1 was a great loss to The Cleveland Museum of Art, where he served as a Trustee since 1952. He was its Treasurer from 1954 until 1969, a member of the Finance Committee from 1952 to 1971, and chairman of that committee from 1962 to 1968.

He started his business life in Cleveland as a stockbroker and later held executive positions with several organizations. A few years ago he retired as Vice President of the Cleveland Twist Drill Co.

In addition to the Museum, he had wide civic interests and assumed leadership in numerous other areas. He was a long-time Trustee of The Musical Arts
Association and of The Cleveland Institute of Music, of which he was President,
Vice President, and Treasurer at various times over forty years. He was also
chairman of the committee for the construction of the present Institute building. In the health field he was a Trustee and President of St. Luke's Hospital
and President of the Blue Cross and of the Cuyahoga County Hospital Association.
He was a Fellow of Case Western Reserve University and a Trustee of the University Circle Development Foundation. In 1962 the Cleveland Chamber of Commerce
gave a joint award for public service to Mr. Schmit: and his wife, Dorothy.

In all of these activities he gave generously of his time and talents.

His sound judgment and unusually well-developed common sense helped to solve many difficult problems for the organizations he served so well. His warmth of personality and his dedication to all of his responsibilities will long be remembered by the Museum and by the community at large.

### JANUARY 1974 -- JANUARY 1975

A lecture series entitled "Nineteenth Century Tastes and Fancies" was presented during the month of January. While all the speakers gave scholarly dissertations on generally little-known facets of nineteenth century art, attendance and profits were lower than the previous year. A one-speaker, seminar-type format will attempt to revitalize this event next year.

Approximately forty Council members and Trustees enjoyed a four-day whirlwind tour of Chicago museums and private collections in May.

This year emphasis has been placed on the need for additional and responsible volunteer commitments. An interest in art is no longer sufficient recommendation for a new member. The time and the interest to work in capacities designated by the Museum are the current criteria for membership.

As of October 1, the Council furnishes a volunteer at the Sales Desk four days a week, from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Plans were underway for a 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. volunteer, but the former time was what proved to be needed.

The Art Cart project at St. Luke's and University Hospitals have recently been revitalized by the promise of new prints to replace many which were unfortunately covered with a browning varnish.

The Information Desk has been operating more efficiently as some of the new members welcome the weekend time slots.

The Council assisted the Museum staff with May Show registrations and sales, as well as sales for the Art for Collectors Exhibition. They supervised the display of flowering plants in the Garden Court and North Lobby, gave a number of dinner parties, made flower arrangements and served as hostesses at the patrons' previews.

The membership was delighted to have attained the category of Benefactor and to have the Council name inscribed on the Museum wall.

We are most grateful to Dr. Lee for speaking at three Council meetings this year. His first talk on his trip to China was an open meeting attended by over 200 members and friends. He also highlighted the "Year in Review" and then gave a most

comprehensive preview of the Chinese Exhibition which preceded a Council sponsored two-day tour of Toronto and the Royal Ontario Museum.

The simple, friendly gesture of coffee before many of the meetings, the summer dinner and treasure hunt, and the trips to Chicago and Toronto seem to have contributed to a stronger feeling of unity and a greater sense of responsibility for Council activities.

(January 21) that in late September of 1974 the Museum was advised of the

August 8 death of Charlotte Frank. Mrs. Frank was a London art dealer

who had filed a suit against the Museum and its Director Sherman E. Lee in

early January of 1974.

Mrs. Frank's death was brought to the attention of the court by both the counsel for the plaintiff and the counsel for the Museum, and neither the estate nor the heirs of Charlotte Frank have made an appearance in the action.

On January 17, 1975 District Judge Robert B. Krupansky entered judgement dismissing the suit, which had alledged breach of contract in regard to the purchase of a painting known as "Terminus, The Emblem of Erasmus of Rotterdam."

# THE PLAIN DEALER Wednesday, January 22, 1975 8-D Suit against the museum of art over disputed painting dismissed

A suit against the Cleveland Museum of Art and its director, Sherman E. Lee, brought by a London art dealer, has been dismissed in U.S. District Court because the dealer died last August.

Charlotte Frank claimed in her suit a year ago Lee had given her only \$500 for a painting by the German master Hans Holbein the Younger done in the early 1500s. The work is "Terminus: the Emblem of Erasmus of Rotterdam." Lee donated it to the museum in 1971.

Mrs. Frank sald she gave the painting to Lee in November 1970 to determine whether it was a genuine Holbein and he was to give her \$225,000 if it was genuine.

A museum spokesman said the painting has been attributed to Holbein, although museum officials are not being as definite as Mrs. Frank was. The museum had the painting evaluated and it is worth "substantially less" than the \$225,000 Mrs. Frank had quoted, he said.

#### IN MEMORIAM

Willis B. Boyer

1915 - 1974

The death of Willis B. Boyer on January 31, 1974, shocked and saddened all who knew him personally or by reputation, including especially his fellow Trustees of The Cleveland Museum of Art.

Bill Boyer possessed a rare combination of determination, high intelligence, and pragmatism, coupled with an affection for his fellow man, whom he understood uncommonly well. He rose to high positions of responsibility in business and community affairs and his judgments were unfailingly sound.

He demonstrated repeatedly his high regard for the Museum and its objectives by contributing of his most valuable assets -- time and thought. His counsel was sought and heeded. He was elected a Trustee in 1967, served ably on the Finance Committee and provided invaluable advice and assistance on the Building Committee for the 1971 addition.

Those who knew and worked with him will miss his straightforward approach to life, his desire to solve problems with dispatch, and his easy affability. The community and the Museum are much the poorer without him.

Mr. Barksdale gave the Membership Report and stated that there were three sheets distributed to the Trustees:

- 1. The report for the quarter ending December 31, 1973
- The work sheet for January 1974
- 3. The work sheet for February 1974

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He commented that we are continuing to show a slow but steady growth in membership. The receipts for February 1974 are down from those of the year before, but this was because there had been a bequest in the previous year. Copies are attached as Appendix A.

The Director then read a memorial tribute to the late Willis B. Boyer which was prepared by him and other members of the staff.

The President instructed that this statement be included as Appendix B, with the minutes of this meeting, that it be published in the Bulletin and that copies be printed and sent to the members of the family.

The Director gave a progress report on Gallery Renovation, Phase IV. The conversion of Classroom D into a gallery for Japanese prints and later painting is being partially financed by grants from Kelvin Smith and the Lubrizol Foundation. The galleries for African and Oceanic Art should be finished and reinstalled around June 1. The West Wing for the reinstallation of 19th century art should be completed by late October or early November and the collections reinstalled by early December.

The Director reported that the second letter to the members of the Museum was mailed in late March and was already producing results. Because the grant from the National Endowment for the Arts was substantially less than we had requested, it was necessary to refigure the whole of Phase IV which is now projected at a cost of \$254,098. We have in hand \$100,567 in contributions from members and friends, \$50,000 from the National Endowment for the Arts, plus \$21,181 which is a portion of an unrestricted bequest which the Executive Committee authorized be applied to Phase IV. This is a total of \$171,131. This leaves us with \$82,967 to be raised.

There followed discussion as to the means of accomplishing this. The Trustees considered a proposed letter designed to be sent to about 100 corporations, copies of which had been distributed. A number of helpful suggestions were made. The President said the letter would be redrafted and mailed out within the next few weeks. He called attention to the list of corporations which had also been distributed and asked that Trustees knowing anyone in those corporations follow-up the letter with a phone call.

The President said there had been discussion of the desirability of appointing a Chairman of the Advisory Council so that this group might meet one or more times a year independently of the Board of Trustees. The question was raised as to whether this might require an amendment to the Code of Regulations. Mr. Barksdale read Article III which is on Page 4 of the Code of Regulations. This clearly shows that the Trustees can make such an appointment if they desire. There was brief discussion, and it was felt that if such an appointment is made, it should be for one year at a time.

The Director then called attention to the list of recent staff promotions and new appointments which had been distributed and commented that none of these involve increases in any of the departmental budgets beyond those authorized by the Trustees for 1974. He called attention to the appointment of Miss Frances Stamper as Manager of Public Relations and Membership and mentioned that she had reported here in the middle of March; he also advised of the appointment of Ross M. Merrill as Conservator of Painting and Administrative Head of the Museum Laboratory, which will become effective on or about September 1. The complete list is attached as Appendix C.

Mr. Grossman reported on the status of the restaurant operation. The Executive Committee at its January meeting had authorized the use of the Members' Room as an auxiliary eating space, primarily for the staff. Enough of our outdoor tables and chairs were installed to provide seats for about 50 persons. At the same time the price of certain food items was increased. This report covered the period from January 23 through March 31. Probably because of increased prices, there were 438 fewer meals served than for the same period a year earlier. There was a gain of \$1,165 in income from lunches during this period. There was discussion, and it was felt that we should continue using this area for esting. Mr. Grossman pointed out that with the arrival of warm weather this furniture would have to be moved back to the terrace, and we would have to replace it with something, to have the increased space in event of bad weather. He was asked to get figures on renting tables and chairs versus buying them.

The Director called attention to the exhibition schedule for the remainder of 1974, 1975 and 1976 which was revised on February 25, 1974, copies of which had been distributed to the Trustees. He mentioned that the "Art of the American Indian" scheduled earlier had now been cancelled for the fall of 1975, but would be rescheduled for another year. Dr. Vignos asked about exhibitions which would be open during the Christmas holidays when many young people are here. Mr. Barksdale said that the Norbert Schimmel Collection of Ancient Art will have to be closed on December 24, a week earlier than scheduled at the request of the owner, in order to allow more time for packing and shipping the collection to Israel. The exhibition schedule is attached as Appendix D.

VOTED: to appropriate for the use of the Accessions Committee the amounts which they have requested as hereinabove listed from the income of the funds available for the purchase of works of art.

The President reported that there had been a series of orientation sessions for younger men, most of them not yet at age 40, held on two Saturday mornings and a Wednesday evening in March. Of the 40 or more who were invited, an average of 18-20 attended each session. The response was good and a lot of interest generated. He said some of them had requested a session on collecting which was promised for sometime in the future.

The Director officially reported to the Board of Trustees the theft of "Portrait of a Princess" attributed to Corneille De Lyon. The tiny panel was removed from its frame sometime on the afternoon of February 22, and to date there has been no trace of it. Since our insurance policy has a \$50,000 deductible clause and the value of the painting is below that amount, there will be coverage for this loss.

The Director stated that there have been certain changes in security procedures necessitated by damage to 12 pictures between mid-December and the present. All of it seems to be the work of one person. In every instance, it is a scratch 1" to 1-1/4" long, made with some object such as a

ballpoint pen or a key. We have tried several different types of barriers and have settled on an aluminum one, a section of which is presently installed in Gallery 27. This type will be continued there and in Gallery 28. In the galleries of the 1916 building, we plan to use wrought-iron stanchions with a specially designed rope. We are already using floral barriers in front of certain pictures such as "Cupid and Psyche", and we plan to have more of these for use elsewhere. The smallest pictures have already been placed in cases, and we are glazing other pictures as fast as possible. To date, 50 have been done, and we estimate that eventually 200 will have to be put under glass. The total cost of these devices will be in the neighborhood of \$11,700. He added that inasmuch as we finished 1973 with a small surplus, it would not be necessary to ask for a special appropriation.

Since mid-March we have been using off-duty University Circle police in plain clothes during open hours in the hope of catching the vandal. As we complete the giazing of pictures and the installation of barriers, the need for the police will taper off, and by summer we should not require them for this duty. Dr. Silver suggested that perhaps someone on the staff at Hanna Pavilion might create for us a psychiatric profile of such a vandal. He said that the Church of the Covenant had a problem 1-1/2 years ago, and the profile created for them served to identify and trap the offending person.

Mr. Wilbur reported that the Education Committee had a very fruitful session with Dr. Weisberg who outlined the various programs of the department, such as continuing education, the joint program in Art History, the advance placement program at the high school level, and various programs for young people. He expressed the feeling that this department is in very good shape with excellent prospects for continued development.

Mr. Grossman reported that as of March 1, expenditures and income were on target. We had under-estimated income for the two months, but expense was also under. He said that there had been a net surplus of \$31,963.00 for 1973 and that The John Huntington Trust had provided \$80,494.00 to cover the 1971 and 1972 deficits.

There being no further business to transact, and upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned.

#### RELOCATION AND RENOVATION OF SALES DESK

The Director said that after rejecting earlier plans of the architect, a revised version has been submitted. John Wintereich & Associates have provided an estimate of \$60,300, which figure is valid until October 30, plus architect's fees at \$7,236, making a total of \$67,536. The need for this revision was carefully considered by the Planning & Development Committee. After discussion it was decided that work should begin as soon as possible and that the Museum might request funding in this amount from the Huntington Trustees.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was

VOTED: to approve these plans for the Sales Desk and to request funding from the Huntington Trustees.

There was further discussion as to the operation of the Sales Desk. The Director reported that the Junior Council is now supplying a volunteer each day Tuesday through Friday, for the peak period -- between 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. It is expected that this may be increased to 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. four days a week by early 1975. Dr. Silver suggested that we have a sale at substantially reduced prices on items which have not sold well. The Director said that this could be done but that it should not apply to such non-ephemeral things as catalogs of the collection.

#### NEW WALL COVERING IN GALLERY 10

The Director requested authorization for the expenditure of approximately \$4,500 for new fabric on the walls of Gallery 10.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, it was

VOTED: to approve the expenditure of approximately \$4,500 for this purpose.
