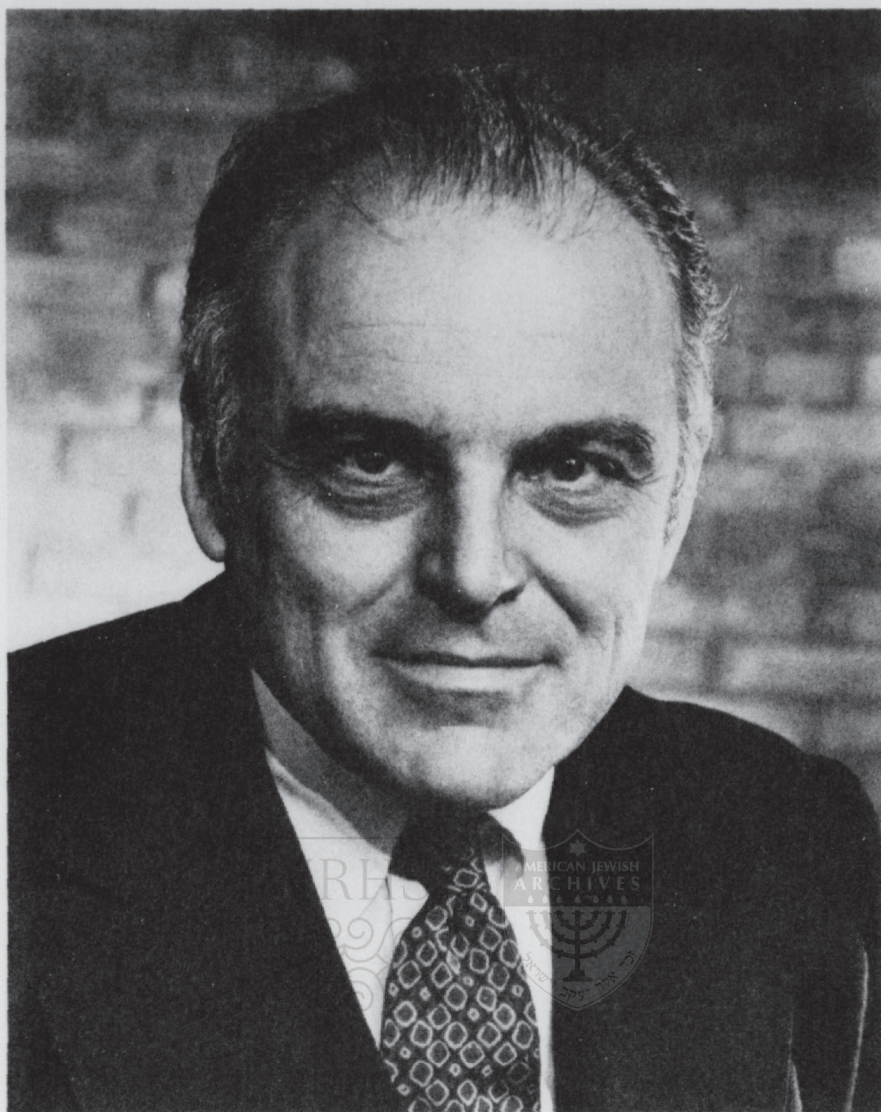

RABBI DR. DANIEL JEREMY SILVER

Rabbi Dr. Daniel Jeremy Silver, son of Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, graduated from Harvard College in 1948. He was ordained at Hebrew Union College in 1952 and served as spiritual leader of The Temple in Cleveland, Ohio from 1956 until his untimely death in December of 1989.

After completing a doctorate at the University of Chicago (1962), Rabbi Silver sustained an active and productive scholarly life side by side his manifold communal obligations and demanding pulpit responsibilities. Among his many publications are **Images of Moses** (Basic, 1984), **A History of Judaism** (with Bernard Martin, Basic, 1974: 2 Vols.), and **The Story of Scripture** (Basic, 1990, published posthumously). A proud son of Harvard, and a man of great intellect and even greater compassion, Rabbi Silver combined, with remarkable success, the active life with the contemplative life.

The Daniel Jeremy Silver Fellowship, established in Rabbi Silver's memory by his family and friends, seeks to continue this unique symbiosis between preacher and scholar by providing the opportunity for a congregational rabbi to spend a full semester at Harvard unfettered by the duties and responsibilities of congregational life. The Fellowship is intended to allow the recipient to begin, continue or complete a piece of serious research in some area of Jewish scholarship. To pursue his/her course of study, the Silver Fellow will enjoy full access to the unique resources of the University, its libraries, professors, staff and courses.
