Dear Rabbi Silver:

We are most pleased that you can accept our invitation to meet with the elders of Heights Christian Church at 6:00 P.M., Monday, April 5, 1965, at the church, 17300 Van Aken Boulevard. Dinner will be served and the meeting will follow.

We are hopeful that at least three things can come from the evening: First, an appreciation of the meaning of Judaism as a religious faith, in something of an existential sense; second, some factual information about historic and contemporary movements in Judaism, especially the present similarities and differences between Orthodox, Conservative and Reform; and third, your views on both the points of similarity and the points of tension between contemporary Judaism and contemporary Protestant Christianity. Also, you should feel free to discuss the Zionist Movement, its meaning, and the meaning for Jews of the State of Israel. This may seem to be something of an overwhelming assignment, but these suggestions are meant to be no more than general guidelines.

Perhaps a word or two about the evening's format would be appropriate. As you know, it was just about a year ago that we had a delightful evening and a profitable one in conversation with Father Eugene Best of the Roman Catholic Church. We plan to follow a format somewhat similar to that evening. We will begin promptly at 8:00 o'clock, and you would have say up to an hour for your presentation. Following that, we will have a period that will last as long as seems appropriate, though not past 10:00 o'clock. Light refreshments - coffee and cookies, etc. - will be served. There might be some continuing informal discussion during the refreshment period.

Last year we found it to be a very good thing to have each of our elders invite a Catholic friend for the evening; we should like to follow the same plan this time with each of our elders inviting a Jewish friend to be present. Unless you feel this unwise, we will follow that procedure. This means that the group would consist of probably twenty-five of our elders and another twenty-five of their

Jewish friends. This could mean, of course, that some Orthodox and Conservative Jews would be present. We hope that this approach allows for both a small enough group and one with personal warmth to it in order to provide a proper setting for dealing with Protestant-Jewish relationships.

On behalf of our elders, as well as myself, I want to express deep appreciation to you for your willingness to take time out of your busy schedule to meet with us.

We are looking forward to seeing you.


