Dear Daniel,

Upon return from home leave, I received both your letters of August the 22nd and November the 3rd, with enclosures. We were both happy to hear that all is well with you.

Our vacation did not turn out to be a very happy one this time as I was tied up in Jerusalem for medical attention. Originally, we had planned to stay for a while in the States on our way back to Kathmandu, but this had to be cut short, and whilst we were there for approximately four days we could not contact you as we wished to.

Both our boys are now in the States. Eppie, the elder one, continuing with his studies, part-time teaching and preparation for participation in the forthcoming Van Kleiburn International Competition, to take place in spring or early summer of 1981. He is working very hard but I doubt if he will make it for the top since it is of such high standard and so demanding. He is beginning to give some recitals also outside Baltimore, so eventually he may turn up in Cleveland. Anyway, I am sure that it would be a pleasant surprise for him to be invited on an appropriate occasion for a piano recital in Cleveland, Ohio. My imagination does not go very far, but our Independence Day, for example, could be one such suitable occasion.

Uli, the younger one, is studying artistic photography and working for his living. He was accepted by the Pratt Institute but I am not sure whether he will attend the courses this year. He is presently undergoing a difficult period as his girlfriend does not intend to join him. She is a vocalist and was supposed to follow him shortly. Well, unfortunately there is very little we can do for him and as life has so much for all of us, I hope that he will find his way without too much pain and

I was very impressed, Daniel, by your presentation of Zionism. I had no time to read the other material yet, but shall certainly do so. Thank you very much for sharing your thoughts with me.

Whilst we found the economic situation in Israel not very encouraging — it was so good to be home. One feels that time is near for the "ingathering of the fruit" and to finally settle down and affirm the home for the children. All are building, and it would be wrong if we could not, after all these years, have our own place somewhere around Jerusalem, in which the children could see in the future as their own. So, we will try for it.


Elaine and I would be delighted to welcome you to Amiad, and very much look forward to meeting with you.

With all good wishes for a happy Pesach and l'hitraot.

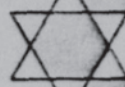

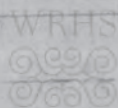
