Dear Rabbi Silver:

I take great pleasure in acknowledging your acceptance to speak in Cincinnati on Wednesday, May 1st, on the occasion of our community-wide local observance of Israel's 20th Anniversary. All Jewish organizations in the city are combining their efforts into this one large community celebration.


Dear Dan,




