Dear Rabbi Silver:

All of us were so pleased to learn from Samuel Charen, Chairman of our Annual Meeting Committee that you had so graciously consented to address this meeting on October 29th. We are confident that your message will serve as an inspiration to all of us and stimulate our leadership to appraise our continuing broadening role and responsibility as a Jewish community in the total American scene along with our traditional obligations.

Our Program Committee selected as a topic for this annual meeting "The American Jewish Scene - - Our Stake and Responsibility". They would like the thesis developed on the responsibility of American Jewry to become involved and participate as individuals and an organized community in the basic social issues facing our country. Your activities in the Health and Welfare Council of Cleveland and the poverty program certainly brings you close to these problems. At the same time what is our continuing responsibility in the Mid-East, especially in view of recent events?

Now, something about our community: Our Jewish population is 15,000. We have the usual services, namely, a Family Service, a Community Center, a Bureau of Jewish Education, a Community Relations Council and operate a welfare fund. We support the usual group of national agencies, though allocate less than the national average to them except the religious agencies. This community traditionally has been allocating more than the national average to the Seminaries. Locally, our greatest beneficiary is Jewish education; we support all Hebrew schools and all of them are under congregational auspices, except Midrashah which is on a community basis and we have the beginnings of an inter-congregational high school. Our welfare fund raises somewhat less than the median but has been increasing for the last several years at a higher rate than most communities. If there are any other facts about our community which you would like to know, please call or write and I will be glad to supply you with this information.

Now for travel arrangements: I suggest that you leave Cleveland on the 3:30 flight which is due in Philadelphia at 4:32; we will have someone meet you at the airport.

Our dinner meeting will be preceded by a reception beginning at 5:30. If you prefer to leave Cleveland later you can make the 5:00 flight which arrives in Philadelphia at 6:02. While this will bring you here in time for dinner, it will be rather close. You have the choice of either returning that night on the 9:40 flight or the following morning at 7:15, 7:20 or 10:20; all flights take one hour and ten minutes. I suggest, if satisfactory to you, that you leave on a morning flight so that there will be no rush. If you decide to stay over, we will make reservations for you at the motel adjacent to our Community Center where the meeting will take place. When you advise me of your choice I will make reservations and send you the flight tickets.

Again, thank you so much for accepting our invitation and we look forward to a stimulating evening.
