#### Dear Jack:

I will be pleased to be with you on March 16 and at Larchmont Congregation the night before. You mentioned my talk in San Francisco. I spoke there on liturgy and I presume that you want this evening to be devoted to this theme? Tell me something of its format. How much time you want for the lecture and how much time you would like for discussion. I am pleased with the invitation and looking forward to being with you.

To take advantage of this letter, may I remind you of our correspondence of last June and the desire of our Journal to publish an issue in June, 1966 devoted entirely to the theme of Shabuot - Confirmation - Revelation. We corresponded then about an article by you dealing with Confirmation curricula. I hope for something more than an analysis of current practices. The questions which suggested themselves were these: What curricula do you think lead spiritually and prychologically to the Confirmation service? In what areas do the congregations fail to raise relevant issues - spiritual and temporal, with the youngsters? What is the effectiveness and limitation of the rabbi as a teacher? What do you suggest as a standard for curriculum strengthening?

I have high hopes that our June issue will make as useful a contribution as did our single theme issue of last year on Prayer. With all good wishes for a happy Chanukah, I remain, as always,
