

As I promised you, I am putting in writing the program for Saturday morning, November 15, 1980.


This convention is expecting approximately 400-500 delegates and arrangements have been made to give them a continental breakfast between 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. at Stouffer's Inn. Following this, they will be bussed to Silver Park where the program suggests a religious service at 10 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. with a Kallah to follow, until noon. A luncheon will be served for the delegates and their wives at which time it would be nice to have you address them, followed by a tour of The Temple, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver's Study, the museum, library etc. After which they will be taken back to Stouffer's Inn and allowed to be on their own.

On this Saturday, November 15, 1980, the responsibility for the program has been entrusted to the Temple Mens' Club. Rabbi David Hachen has offered his services for the Kallah. We would like you to conduct the service and give the lecture.

The theme of this Bi-ennial is "Brotherhood in the New Decade" and the topic suggested for the luncheon is "Jewish Experience in the 1980's." I am sending this information to you in advance so that you will have the opportunity to think about it before Lou Sternberg and I come out on June 18 at 9:30 a.m. to discuss this matter. 

Dear Av:

In accordance with our promise to you and Dave Krem, Lew Sternberg and the undersigned met with Rabbi Daniel Silver in his office at the Temple on June 18, 1980, at 9:30 a.m. and we discussed the program for the biennial scheduled for Saturday morning, November 15, 1980.

It was felt that following the continental breakfast to be held at Stouffer's Inn between 8:00 and 9:00 a.m., that the members will be boarded on buses by 9:30 a.m. and taken to Silver Park, which is approximately 5-1/2 miles away. At Silver Park a religious service will be held in the main Sanctuary between 10:00 a.m. and 10:45 a.m. In view of the size of the Sanctuary the delegates will be brought down front, close to the Ark, and ushers will be provided. The ceremony will include the temple organist, Mr. Gooding, and the cantorial part of the service will be sung by Mr. C. Smith. Rabbi Stephen Klein will officiate at the services which will include a reading from the Torah, but no sermon.

After the service, hosts will be provided and the group will be broken up into small groups and taken through the Temple on a tour, not only of the main Sanctuary, but also of Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver's Study, the Temple Museum, the Library, etc. Following the Temple tour, which it is presumed will perhaps take an hour, luncheon will be served at the Temple after which Rabbi Daniel Silver will deliver

at least a 20 minute lecture in conformity with the theme of the biennial. In view of the fact that it takes so much time to tour the Temple, to visit Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver's Study and possibly listen to one of his sermons or review part of the history contained therein, it was felt that it would be crowding things to attempt to work in a Kallah into this Saturday morning.

It is estimated that the group will be available about 1:30 p.m., possibly 2:00 p.m., to get back on the buses and taken back to Stouffer's Inn in order to get ready to attend the Chautauqua Dinner that evening.

I am sending you this tentative outline hoping that you will confirm it as I must get back to Rabbi Daniel Silver to confirm this with him also.
