Dear Rabbi Silver:

We are much delighted to learn from Paul Walter of your willingness to accept membership on the National Advisory Board of United World Federalists and by the addition of your name to the ranks of those who actively support our principles.

Although there are no regularly scheduled meetings of the Advisory Board, we call on members of the group from time to time to fill speaking engagements as well as for advice on various policies which are under consideration.

As you know, UWF has conducted vigorous programs in support of the establishment of the Disarmament Agency and in the last session of Congress we were out front in the UN Bond fight. Currently we are striving to assure that the U.S. Arms Control & Disarmament Agency is continued on a permanent basis and that it receives its full budget request. Related very directly to this is the negotiations of a test ban treaty and the possible action by the Senate in case such a treaty is tabled by the President. At the moment the climate does not appear to be favorable for getting any such treaty ratified. Thus we are joining hands with numerous other groups to carry on a public education campaign to indicate that a test ban treaty is in the general interest of the United States.


