Dear Rabbi Silver:

I am writing to ask if your busy life would permit you to visit the Academy to speak at one of our Sunday evening Vesper Services. Your father has done so on occasions in the past, ones which we have deeply enjoyed and appreciated, but cannot come this year as you may know, because of his heavy schedule and many travels.

May I suggest Sunday evening November 24. Our Vespers begin at 7 o'clock and usually run forty to forty-five minutes with the visiting speaker talking for fifteen to twenty. The services are quite non-denominational and usually consist of hymns, an anthem by our choir, a scripture passage, Psalm, prayers and a talk by a visitor. If you could come on this evening, we would be very pleased and would hope that you and Mrs. Silver could join Mrs. Hallowell and myself for dinner at our house after the Services.

Incidentally, one of our recent graduates, Sid Kaplan, has urged me for a couple of years to invite you. He is most enthusiastic about the things you could tell the boys here and feels sure that you would enjoy speaking to them. With best wishes.

Dear Rabbi Silver,

It was a pleasure talking with you this morning, and I hope your schedule might be open on the evening of Sunday, April 28th for you to come and speak to our students. Let me give you some of the details.

Our Vesper Service is at 7 p.m. Sunday evenings. The service itself is short, lasting a total of around 40 minutes, relatively non-liturgical in nature. Your part would be to give the sermon, announce the final hymn and offer the benediction. Also, some of our visiting Vesper speakers offer the short pastoral prayer which precedes the sermon. If this appeals to you, I recommend that would be a part of your responsibility. The sermon itself averages about 15 minutes.

After the service we have asked various groups of students in the Academy to join the Vesper speaker and Headmaster at the Headmaster's house for discussion groups, quite free in nature, at which no adults except the speaker participates. Though there have been some exceptions to this, by and large we feel this important. On the Sunday you would be visiting, the group coming would be all seniors.

Several faculty members have fond memories of your father's repeated presence here in the Vesper series and I hope you can see your way clear to continuing that tradition. I shall look forward to hearing from you at your early convenience.

Dear Rabbi Silver,

I was most pleased to receive your letter accepting our invitation to speak at the Vesper Service on Sunday, April 28. As it is now only three weeks until the time you will be here, let me expand on some of the details I provided in my letter of February 6. As indicated there, your responsibility will be to provide the sermon, announce the final hymn, and offer the benediction. If you would like to provide the pastoral prayer, I would be happy to have you do so, though you might let me know when you write me.

There are several items of information I would like to have from you in the next week or so. First, I will need a biographical sketch to use in introducing you; second, since we use senior students to read the Scripture lesson, I need the Scripture ahead of time so I can practise it with him in the Chapel; also a two or three sentance introduction to the Scripture lesson that will help set the scene for students unfamiliar with the passage. Last, this year we have been experimenting with the use of contemporary calls to worship, using two or three sentances from a modern novelist, theologian, poet, etc. to set the stage for the theme the speaker will be using. If it is not too much trouble, therefore, I would like to have you send on a call to worship that would illuminate your sermon topic, which I could use at the beginning of the service.

Let us plan to meet at the Chapel at 6:45 p.m., fifteen minutes before the service is to begin. If you need directions to the Academy, let me know and I will be happy to send them on. Unless you prefer, a robe will not be necessary.

We are very much looking forward to having you with us on the 28th.
