

NOTES FROM THE CENTRE

An all-day session of the Governing Body of the World Union for Progressive Judaism took place on the 11th January, 1959, at 28, St. John's Wood Road, London, N.W.8.

Rabbi Dr. Leslie I. Edgar was in the Chair. The President of the World Union for Progressive Judaism, the Hon. Lily H. Montagu, warmly welcomed our overseas visitors, Rabbi Dr. Jacob K. Shankman, American Director of the World Union for Progressive Judaism, Rabbi J. Soetendorp of Amsterdam, Holland, and M. Maurice N. Greilsammer of Paris, France.

A most encouraging report was given by Rabbi J. Scetendorp, who informed the meeting that membership of his congregation and that of the Dutch Progressive

Youth Group had increased enormously; so much so, that there were more worshippers than seats available at the synagogue. The Board of the Kerkgenootschaap Liberaal Joodse Gemeente, therefore, have decided to build a larger synagogue.

By the combined efforts of Rabbi Soetendorp and his community a new liberal congregation had been established at The Hague.

The Chairman congratulated Rabbi Soetendorp on the production of his book on "Symbols in Judaism". Rabbi Soetendorp had notably added distinction to the Jewish community by his lectures in several Universities in Holland, and his eminent position had been naturally recognised by invitations to attend State functions.

Equally heartening was the report received from M. Maurice N. Greilsammer. As previously reported, the Union Liberale Israelite of Paris put their synagogue in Rue Copernic at the disposal of the English-speaking colony in Paris for the High Holydays and it was filled to capacity with worshippers. The demand for Englishlanguage services has resulted in the introduction of regular Sabbath services for the English-speaking colony. The membership of the Union Liberale Israelite has grown to such an extent that the synagogue in the Rue Copernic has proved too small even for regular services, and therefore it has been decided to build a larger Liberal Jewish synagogue in Paris.

An additional Liberal synagogue was opened at the Institut International d'Etudes Hébraiques, where the associate Minister, Rabbi I. Jerusalmi, officiates.

Mr. Schalom Ben-Chorin informed the Centre that on Sabbath (Bo) 17.1.1959 the Jerusalem Group (CHUGIM LE HITHCHADSCHUTH HACHAJIM HADATHIM) celebrated the first anniversary of their establishment. Mr. Ben-Chorin based his sermon on the text of Isaiah 40, 29 - 31:-

> "He giveth power to the faint; And to him that hath no might He increaseth strength. Even the youths shall faint and be weary, And the young men shall utterly fall; But they that wait for the LORD shall renew their strength;

They shall mount up with wings as eagles; They shall run, and not be weary; They shall walk, and not faint"

indicating that despite strong opposition from the Orthodox the small group of religious Progressive Jews in Jerusalem had increased their membership. The service was made more impressive by the introduction of the "Hallelujah" by Mozart, sung by Miss Shila Amith, accompanied by Mr. Ahron.

On Sabbath (Shira) 24.1.1959 the New Year of the Trees (Tu-be-Schwat) was given a religious content and celebrated within the synagogue for the first time in Israel.

At the Amsterdam Conference of the World Union for Progressive Judaism, held in July, 1957, it was decided to assist the Leo Baeck Secondary School by providing 100 scholarships at £50 each for the year 1958.

Most of the constituents responded vigorously to this appeal. With the

provision of these scholarships Dr. M. Elk, the Director of the Leo Baeck Secondary School, was able to admit more pupils and to employ more teachers. Although restricted by the lack of classrooms, the standard of education was much improved.

The Governing Body of the World Union for Progressive Judaism at their last meeting unanimously decided to continue their efforts to provide further scholarships for this Secondary School, the only one in Israel, or anywhere else, which is based on Progressive Jewish principles.


The major parts of the program have already been completed, but there may be some assignments which will be based upon actual attendance.


Dear Daniel:

Dear Daniel:

On behalf of the American Board of the World Union for Progressive Judaism, I should like very much to ask you to occupy the pulpit of the Union Liberale Israelite, 24 Rue Copernic in Paris, next summer.

Several years ago, we introduced American Reform services in the Synagogue in Paris for the benefit of the resident American Jewish community and for such transients who would be there. To achieve success in this program, it is necessary for us to ask the cooperation of our colleagues. We regret very much that we cannot remunerate them for any expenses involved in going to Paris, nor can we offer them any honorarium whatsoever.

However, it is a great act of service and one that can be very helpful in the promotion of our Liberal religious movement. It would, therefore, be a source of great satisfaction to me and to our Board if you would find it convenient to occupy the pulpit there on Friday evening, July 31st, 1959, to conduct the service from the Union Prayer Book and to preach a timely sermon to the Congregation. Naturally, the entire service will be in English.

Dear Daniel:

I want to take this opportunity to thank you for cooperating with the American Board and for having conducted one of our American Reform services in Paris this past summer. I trust that this was an enjoyable and rewarding experience and that it gave you some satisfaction.

I would appreciate it very much if you would let me know your reactions to the service, how many attended, and what the general impressions were.

While we offer no honorarium for your efforts and trouble, and since the Rabbis volunteer their services, it would seem that these services cost us very little. Nevertheless, the music each time cost more than \$50 and the announcements in The Herald Tribune were also expensive, and thus these services will have cost the American Board of the World Union approximately \$700. I think that psychologically they were worth far more, but would appreciate your own opinion and estimate.

Dear Rabbi Shankman:

In reply to your letter of September 18th, it is my feeling that the service performs a definite function and ought to be continued but that it is not receiving the proper support from either the local congregation or congregations in the United States. The Sabbath I was there some thirty-five people were in attendance, over half personal friends and members of this Temple. The attitude of the local congregation seems to be that they have no relation to the service except to welcome the rabbi and to provide the hall and music. Their own services immediately precedes. It is a fine service and was largely attended.

I presume that it is dispiriting for many to speak in this rather empty sanctuary. Certainly the visiting preacher can do little towards developing attendance, but you ought to be able to find individuals in our Embassy in business in Paris who would undertake this as their project. If you could get local support and some publicity in American bulletins, I think the services might become successful. If you cannot, then certainly they ought to be dropped.


