

Rabbi Silver has refused to accept any commemoration gift of a personal nature.




I noticed in the newspaper today that you observed your tenth year at the Temple on October 24th.


You are to be commended for the wonderful work that you are doing to preserve and promote religious principles of brotherhood, understanding, and tolerance.

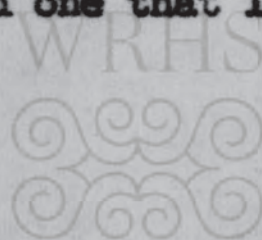

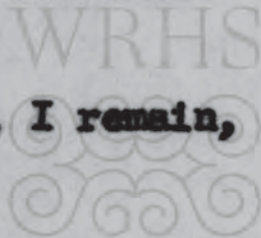



'Rabbi Dan' Silver to Mark 10th Year at The Temple

A person can count on his fingers the number of Reform Jewish congregations in the United States that have 2,000 or more families. And Greater Cleveland proudly boasts two of them: The Temple, at University Circle and Silver Park N.E. (2,340 families) and Fairmount Temple, 23737 Fairmount Boulevard, Beachwood (2,300 families).

For two generations the name Silver has meant The Temple.

The Temple rose to international prominence under the famed late Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver. It continues in its tradition of modern religion and service to mankind under the leadership of Rabbi Daniel J. Silver, his son.

RABBI DANIEL Silver first joined his late father in The Temple's pulpit 10 years ago tomorrow.

That 10th anniversary will be observed when the 37-year-old Harvard-educated rabbi steps into his pulpit at 10:30 a.m. tomorrow and reflects on a decade of preaching. He will speak on "The Last 10 Years and the Next."

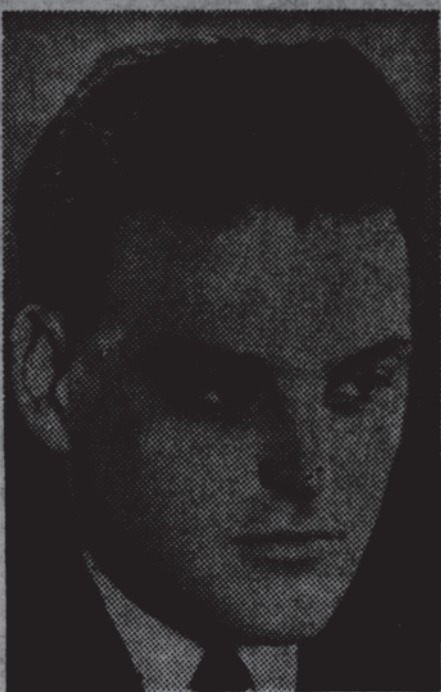
"Rabbi Dan," as the young cleric is called by many of his flock, will emphasize the crucial importance of religious life in a 20th century congregation.

"I will spell out the difference between right and wrong," he told The Plain Dealer.

Three crucial 20th century problems have been traditional focal points for The Temple's pulpit, he said. These are peace, race and the purpose of life.

AMONG RABBI Silver's deepest convictions is one that all men should replace good words with personally-done good works, rather than leaving the deeds to someone else.

Practicing what he preaches, he has taken a leading role in numerous national and local organizations. These range from serving as editor of the quarterly journal of the Central Conference of American Rabbis to filling a recent term as foreman of the Cuyahoga County Grand

Jury. A fuller list would include the following:

- President, Cleveland Zionist Society.
- Co-chairman, Greater Cleveland Conference on Religion and Race.
- Chairman, public welfare committee, Jewish Welfare Federation.
- Member visiting committee for the humanities, Western Reserve University.
- Member, liturgy committee, Central Conference of American Rabbis.
- Member of the executive boards of the Jewish Welfare Federation; United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF); United Appeal of Greater Cleveland; Consumers League; Cleveland Council on World Affairs, and the National Advisory Committee of United World Federalists.

These accomplishments almost make him a doer-personified.

BORN HERE and confirmed in The Temple, Rabbi Silver later graduated from Harvard with honors. In 1952 he was ordained into the rabbinate at Hebrew Union College. He holds a Ph.D. degree from the University of Chicago.

A scholar as well as a preacher and civic leader, the rabbi has written one book and collection of essays, the latter called "From the Rabbi's Desk."

His wife, Adele, frequently reviews books for The Plain Dealer.

The Silvers live at 2841 Weybridge Road, Shaker Heights.
