Our constitution, with its bill of rights, recognizes that every man and woman possesses certain inalienable rights. It guarantees freedom of thought, freedom of speech, freedom of religion, and the opportunity to elect those who will govern us.

But let us beware of taking these privilages for granted. Every privilege which we possess carries with it certain inherent responsibilities. Our constitution acknowledges these rights, but it cannot enforce them without the will of the people. It is, therefore, our responsibility to recognize the implications of American citizenship. We must be enlightened, courageous, and alert to enforce the principles of democracy. The light of liberty must be guarded by every generation as it rededicates itself to the cause of freedom.
