


Thanks for your letter of June 21st. I have spoken with the Secretary of the Venice Community, reported about your plans to bring there a group of 20-25 from Cleveland.

LAND PRICES: Tour prices are per person, based on two persons sharing a double or twin-bedded room with private bathroom with tub or shower. Tour price includes charges for planning, operating and servicing the tour. Thank you for your letter of July 30 concerning the above mentioned group. As we have already discussed, it will not be possible to arrange the tour as the Rabbi plans. To review the points one at a time, raised in your letter:

#1. It is illegal for a private individual to guide groups of passengers on sightseeing tours in Austria, Italy and France and therefore the Rabbi cannot be his own sightseeing guide. Sightseeing must be conducted by locally registered and authorized guides. If the Rabbi does hire his own motorcoaches, it is very likely if he started guiding, that he would be stopped by the local authorities.

In Prague, as this is an "Eastern block" country, we do not believe he would be able to conduct his own sightseeing tours there either. Whether he wants a local guide or not, one will be assigned to the group, to keep their eyes on the group during their entire stay.

#2. If the Rabbi wishes to hire buses locally, I do not know what rates he would be charged. (As American Express we would not wish to be involved in any such arrangements.) Destination Services Europe can provide motorcoaches as requested but these prices would be subject to being included as part of our tour arrangements and thus prepaid. The prices, subject to a minimum of 20 passengers on each coach would be:

- a) October 10 - \$13 net per person
- b) October 11 - \$24 net per person
- c) October 13 - \$32 net per person
- d) October 14 - \$32 net per person
- e) October 19 - \$18 net per person

Prices for a minimum of 15 passengers on each coach would be about 35% more per person.


