

OUR GUEST — FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

Even on our shrunken globe Australia is a far-away place. It is still the rare traveler who finds his way down under. Australia must be an exciting place—one of man's last open lands. Certainly it has made welcome a fine Jewish community which has found roots and security on this broad and still rather empty sub-continent.

Rudolph Brasch is Rabbi of Temple Emanuel, Sydney, Australia. He has led with distinction this fine and thriving congregation. Dr. Brasch left his native Germany for Australia during the early days of the Hitler persecution. He was trained for the rabbinate by the fine scholar Leo Baeck and was ordained by the Jewish Theological Seminary in Berlin. He brought to Australia learning and vigor and has become one of the most sought after and respected lecturers in his homeland where he is chairman of the Ecclesiastical Board of the Australian and New Zealand Union for Progressive Judaism.

I have asked Dr. Brasch to occupy our pulpit this Sunday morning and to tell us of Jewish life in the land of the kangaroos and koala bears. You will find him an exciting and interesting speaker. All of us will learn something of the opportunities and challenge for Jewish life on the world's largest island. I suspect that in many ways his Jewish world is not unlike our own.
