Thank you for your letter of August 18 and the outline of the Education Series. The title "The Walled Garden - The Sephardic Family" is entirely satisfactory.

I will discuss the Hispano-Jewish family from the Late Middle Ages into the period of the Inquisition. I will deal with the effect of persecution and secret Judaism on the Jewish family and the methods of preserving the family unit under hostile conditions. My lecture and the discussion to follow will attempt to clarify some of the issues confronting adults and youth today. RABBI DAVID S. HACHEN

David S. Hachen is the Regional Rabbi of the Northeast Lakes Council of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations.

Rabbi Hachen, whose office is located at 1101 Euclid Avenue in Cleveland serves as a resource to more than 60 congregations in Michigan, Indiana, Ohio, Western Pennsylvania and Western New York.

Working with youth and adults in areas of worship, education, religious action and synagogue administration, he attempts to help congregations to serve their own families, to support the Jewish People and to strengthen American society.

Rabbi Hachen was ordained at the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in Cincinnati in 1952. He served for two years as a Chaplain in the U.S. Navy. Rabbi Hachen has also been the spiritual leader of congregations in Wantagh, New York; Norwalk, Connecticut; and Cincinnati, Ohio.

In 1961 Rabbi Hachen received his doctorate in education from Columbia University, and has served for almost a decade on the Commission on Jewish Education of the Central Conference of American Rabbis and the Union of American Hebrew Congregations. In cooperation with Dr. Sylvan Schwartzman, Rabbi Hachen wrote a text for youth entitled MEETING YOUR LIFE PROBLEMS. Rabbi Hachen has written a paper on "THE AMERICAN REFORM RABBI" which appeared in Judaism, a quarterly journal.

Rabbi Hachen has been a member of the faculty of the HUC-JIR in New York and has also been a visiting lecturer in the graduate department of educational foundations at the University of Cincinnati.

Rabbi Hachen lives at 2328 Lamberton Road in Cleveland Heights with his wife Pearl. Mrs. Hachen, a native of Dayton, has been active in the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods, the Jewish Family Service and the League of Women Voters, and is a representative for Scholastic Publications.

Rabbi and Mrs. Hachen have three children. David is a teaching assistant in philosophy at the University of Wisconsin in Madison. Debra is a second year rabbinic student at the Hebrew Union College/Jewish Institute of Religion in New York. Daniel is a junior at the University of Rochester.
