THE POSITIVE VALUES of JEWISH LIFE



Reader

Lord, in the covenant made with Moses and the Jewish people at Mt. Sinai Thou commanded us to adopt guidelines to life which make us a Kingdom of Priests and a holy people. Your ten commandments have served as our guide for all generations. They have given us positive values which have raised our standards to an exalted level. Thy prophets interpreted and clarified the applications of Thy will to our daily lives. Help us to attune our hearts and minds to Thy will so we may benefit from Thine eternal wisdom. Amen.

For man to grow in the wisdom of God requires dedication and deep study; for man to live in ways of God requires a commitment to His rules. They believed that the God of Israel is a God of righteousness who demands righteous conduct from those who would best serve Him. We are the descendants of the greatest teachers of righteousness that the world has known, the prophets of Israel. May we be imbued with a measure of their vision and the courage to be like them, soldiers of righteousness, battling throughout our lives for justice. Proverbs says, "To do righteousness and justice is more acceptable to God than sacrifice. He who follows after righteousness and mercy finds life, prosperity and honor. He is a just man whose children will be happy after him. Whosoever walketh uprightly shall be saved, but he that is perverse in his ways shall fall at once. When the righteous are increased, the people rejoice, but when the wicked rule the people sigh. The righteous take knowledge of the cause of the poor; the wicked do not understand knowledge. An unjust man is an abomination to the righteous; and he that is upright in the way is an abomination to the wicked."

Let Justice well up as waters, and righteousness as a mighty stream.

Justice to the stranger, to the fatherless, to the poor, was ordained by God and taught by the prophets. Jeremiah demanded justice from the King if Jerusalem was to be saved from destruction. Isaiah asks for justice to prevent the dissolution of Israel. Deuteronomy urges: "Justice, justice shalt thou pursue, that thou mayest live and inherit the land which the Lord thy Gcd giveth thee."

Reader

The Hebrew prophets emphasized that a man with a full stomach should not be happy if his fellow man is hungry. They stressed the fact that Tzedakah was basic to being a complete person. The Bible commands, "Leave the corners of your field for the poor to glean so they shall not go hungry; to care for the widow and orphan; to give shelter to the stranger." These beliefs have found expression in our day in the magnificent record of Jewish philanthrophy. Tzedakah, charity, is a cornerstone of Jewish life.

Responsive Reading

Reader:

Maimonides enumerated the eight degrees of charity. The first and lowest degree is to give, but with reluctance. This is the gift of the hand, but not of the heart.

Congregation:

The second is to give cheerfully, but not proportionately.

The third is to give cheerfully and proportionately but not until solicited.

The fourth is to give cheerfully, proportionately and even unsolicited; but to give personally thereby creating shame on the recipient.

The fifth is to give so that the distressed may receive the bounty, and know their benefactor, without their being known to him.

The sixth is to know to whom we give, but to remain unknown to them.

The seventh degree is to give in such a way that neither benefactor or recipient know each other.

The eighth, most meritorious of all, is to anticipate charity by preventing poverty.

It should be done by assisting our fellowman by gift, loan of money, or by teaching him a trade or business, so that he may earn a livelihood and not be forced to hold out his hand for charity. This is the highest step and the summit of charity's golden ladder.

Silent Prayer

O Lord, give me the wisdom to recognize the positive values my religion teaches. Enable me through these teachings to achieve a better life, one which is whole and complete; satisfying in the knowledge that by following Thy ways comes fulfillment. May love of my fellowman spread throughout the world and bring unity. Heighten our concern with life . . . the sanctification and perfection of it . . . through moral effort and self-discipline so that we may achieve true wisdom and length of days in the awareness that all life is holy.

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
