My Visit to Israel, 1966.

Israel - 1966
Rabbi Daniel Jeremy Silver

The sandy brown uniform of the army is omnipresent. Universal military service is the law of the land and required of young women as well as young men. Israel's borders are the scene of nightly incidents for her neighbors have not abandoned their hopes of destroying the new state.

Can there be peace in the Middle East? Israel desires peace and is prepared to negotiate directly with all her neighbors. The Arabs refused the Secretary General of the United Nation's plea for such negotiations. Damascus boasts openly of the dynamiting and murder achieved by El Fateh marauders who cross into Israel at night on missions of murder.

The Near East is tense and Egypt's ex-nazi propagandist, Ahmed Sukheiry, has received Red Chinese arms and Kuwait oil royalties sufficient to bring into being a legion of 12,000 Arab ne'er-do-wells whose sole purpose is to "liberate Palestine." The arms race has been accelerated. The Soviet Union has sent 550 war planes, 1200 tanks, 80 warships and 100 ground-to-air missiles and an undetermined number of technicians to Egypt in the past two years. Russia has sent more than two billion dollars worth of military aid to General Nasser and almost a billion dollars of hardware to Syria. Jordan has received American tanks and planes. Israel has had to buy counterbalancing weapons from the West.

El Fateh marauders are in the field and Arab fire power has increased; but the time does not seem likely for a co-ordinated Arab attack. Fifty thousand of Nassers best troops are committed to his ambition in the Yemen. Egypt's economy teeters on the brink of bankruptcy. The ancient division

between Jordan and Egypt has been exacerbated by the new Jordan-Saudi Arabia anti-Nasser Alliance and Radio Cairo has called for Hussein's assassination. Syria has had three governments and five revolts over the past 18 months. Inflation is rampant and the economy disrupted. The most professional Syrian Army officers are in exile in Jordan apparently planning a new coup.

But recent events make it clear that Syria is throwing caution to the wind. Perhaps General Jadid wants to detract public attention from the near anarchy in Damascus. His hope lies in broad scale and effective Russian support. Syria is emerging as Russia's first Near Eastern satellite. The Red Guard upholds the present regime and Communist officers have been placed in every army unit.

Moscow will determine whether there will be peace in the Middle East and for her own reasons in the past year Moscow has pledged Syria complete support. Russia's long term ambition is to replace the West as the dominant economic factor in this part of the world. If Russia sincerely wants to co-exist with the West she can restrain the Syrian hot-heads. If she wishes to embarrass the West and open up a second front to make our involvement in Viet Nam even more difficult she can in the Middle East without too great cost to herself. A Syria, with full Russian backing, feels herself more powerful than Israel with uncertain support. Because of Russia's actions and ambitions, the United States must become more involved. Washington has been building a Saudi Arabian-Jordan-Iranian Alliance to counterbalance Russian influence in the United Arab Republic. The danger here is that we



are backing royalist and feudal governments and a time for reform and revolution must come. Only Israel is democratic and under the rule of law. American and Israel interests coincide and Washington would do well to consider a public guarantee of Israel's borders. The cold war has involved the Middle East. Peace in that troubled part of the world depends on the co-existence of the two great power blocks. It can come, but it will take some doing.

ON THIS ELECTION — FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

Election time brings out the best and the worst in the American character. A citizen struggles to select and evaluate candidates. Candidates are mounting extensive campaigns to tell the voters what the polls reveal the voters want to be told. Usually this entire masquerade is harmless, but not this year. Ours is a political nation and when politicians fit their speeches to the backwash of racial fear something precious in our heritage is defaced. Would that we had more candidates like the Congressman from Georgia who withdrew his candidacy, though he had won his primary, because he was required to take a pledge of loyalty to a ticket headed by an ignorant racist rabble rouser.

I am particularly troubled by the promises of a quick and painless military victory in Viet Nam which are being made by candidates and ex-presidents. These men piously back off from insisting that the bomb be dropped now, yet such is unmistakably their program and it is a contemptible and inhuman one. Not only would it destroy untold oriental lives (which do not seem to count for too much) but it would destroy our lives. If Viet Nam teaches any political truth it is the stark fact that the enemy can respond to any act of escalation. The presence of American volunteers brought North Viet Name insurgents into the field. Three-hundred thousand American troops brought the regular North Viet Name army into the demilitarized zone. The bombing of North Viet Nam


