Love comes naturally to men and women. ~~They~~ When a young man and a young girl feel attracted to one another a new and wonderful change takes place in both of them. ^{Life takes} ~~They~~ on new meaning and brightness for their young people. They love for the other and feel these emotions and all their ~~surroundings~~ ~~can~~ ~~more~~ ~~keep~~ ~~than~~ ~~ever~~ ~~before~~.

The Bible deals with ~~the~~ ^{any phase of our life} ~~our~~ ~~life~~. It shows us how we should love. It understands us when we make mistakes. It comforts us when we are in pain or in grief. It contains also a band of poetry which vividly and unobtrusively captures our feelings when we are in love.

This Book is called "The Song of Songs". Its Hebrew title Shir ha Shirim means the song of songs. We call the book "The Song of Songs" because an ancient editor prefixed these poems to the song "The Song of Songs which is Solomon's". By this he probably meant that these were the finest song which Solomon had written. This is a tradition recorded in the Book of Kings that Solomon was a talented poet, the author of 1005 poems.

Actually we have no reason to believe that Solomon wrote these poems. The ancient ^{David} ~~said~~ ~~that~~ ~~the~~ ~~original~~ ~~work~~ ~~was~~ ~~written~~ by some famous person in the hope that they would receive a wide audience. So was probably the case with the unknown author or authors of these lines.

It is hard always to tell where each poem ends and another begins. The headings are not always adequate guides in this respect and the best guide is simply to read along until you feel that the tone and mood has changed.

It really does not make too much diff. where each poem ends and another begins. It only sets mainly to open about feeling & emotion rather than ~~concrete~~ ~~thought~~. The student puts it in context to mood. You should read it for its enjoyment - for the general impression it does with you.

You will never know young people much in love putting to one another their feelings - their delight in each other's being.

Some interpreters have tried to read the whole set of poems as a play in verse. ^{There is} ~~There~~ ~~is~~ no conclusive proof of this view but

The girl is really Israel, the King is really the personification of all worldly temptation. Israel, therefore, is pictured as resisting all worldly temptation and remaining ~~in~~ ⁱⁿ ~~faithful~~ ^{faithful} to God.
